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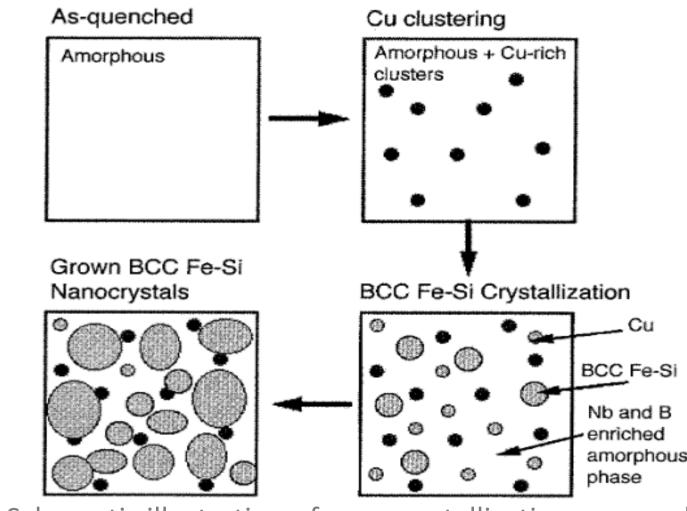

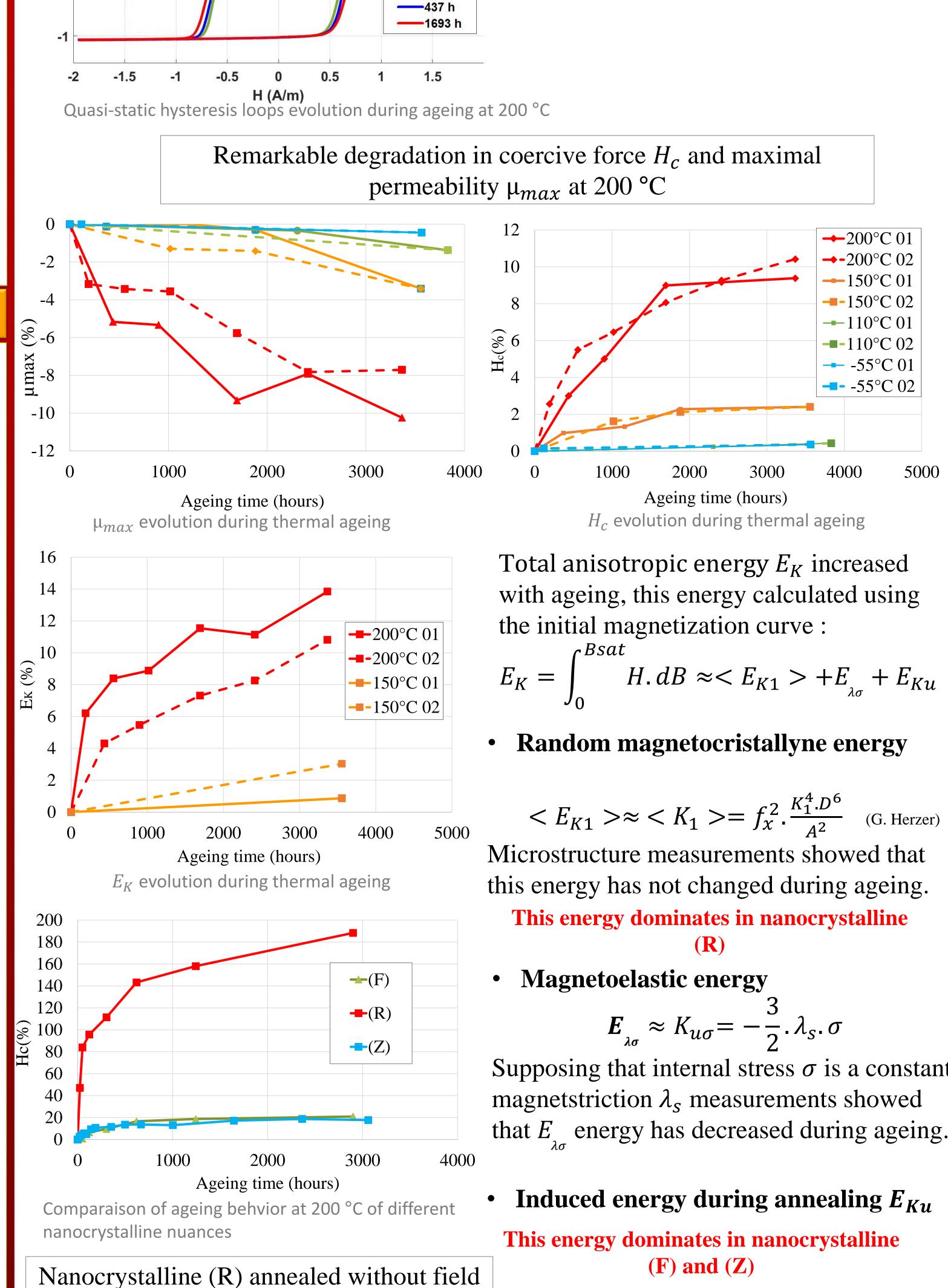

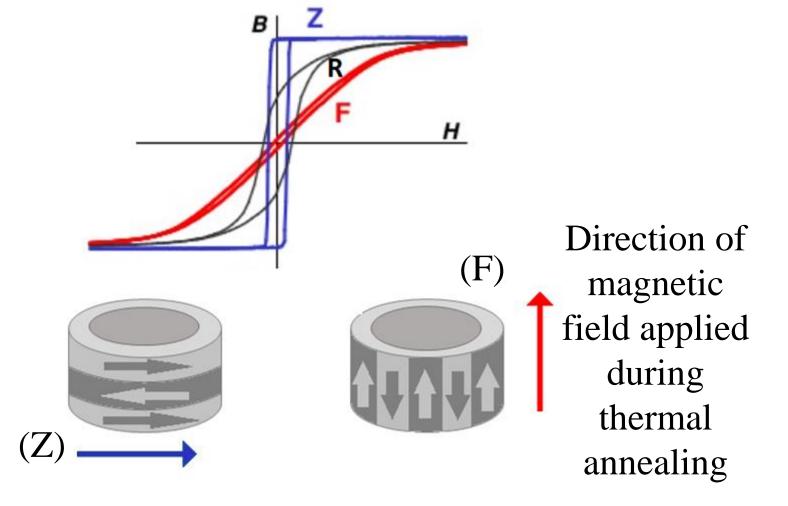
- Due to the applied field during the annealing, domains are forced to follow a specific direction so the new energy introduced by ageing disturbs the domain less than the case of materials annealed without field.
- We assume that the degree of this disturb depends on the competitiveness of the introduced energy with ageing compared initially the anisotropy energy to dominating in the material.
- Kerr images will be observed in further studies in aim to prove these hypotheses.
