## **3.** Combustion Kinetics

- Kinetic models to understand:
  - Complex behaviors (ignition, NTC, ...)
  - Reactivity (fuel conversion, heat release)
  - Products / pollutants formation
- Detailed Chemical Kinetic Models: 105
  - Chain reaction mechanism
  - Composed of elementary reactions

Regulated pollutants (road transport, Euro VI):

CO, Total Hydrocarbons (THC), Non-Methane Hydrocarbons (NMHC), NO<sub>X</sub>, Particulate Matter (PM)

Secondary pollutants: ozone

Unregulated pollutants: oxygenated compounds (alcool, aldehydes, ...)

- Thermodynamic data for each species
- Kinetic data for each reaction ٠
- Size of mechanisms grows with molecular size
