### Nanosecond Compact Eye-Safe Erbium Lasers with 190 kW Peak Power

Spinel (MgAl<sub>2</sub>O<sub>4</sub>) single crystals doped with cobalt ions (Co<sup>2+</sup>) are known as efficient saturable absorbers (SAs) of eye-safe erbium (Er) laser emitting at 1.5–1.7 µm. Their saturable absorption originates from the  ${}^{4}A_{2}({}^{4}F) \rightarrow {}^{4}T_{1}({}^{4}F)$  transition of Co<sup>2+</sup> ions located in tetrahedral (T<sub>d</sub>) sites. Recently, Co<sup>2+</sup>-doped spinel transparent polycrystalline ceramics and transparent nanophase glass-ceramics (GCs) were proposed as competitive materials for the single-crystal technology [1,2]. Among them, transparent GCs feature high laser induced damage thresholds (~20 J/cm<sup>2</sup>) and the possibility to modify the composition of spinel nanophase [1]. We report on a compact passively-cooled eye-safe Er laser passively Q-switched (PQS) by GC-based SAs suitable for compact range-finders.

The scheme of the laser is shown in Fig. 1(a). The cavity is formed by a concave (RoC = -1.5 m) HR end mirror and a flat output coupler (OC,  $T_{OC} = 13\%$ ). The rod-shaped laser element ( $\Phi$ 1.0 mm × 10 mm) made of Er, Yb:glass is side-pumped by a laser diode array at 940 nm. The passively-cooled laser is housed by a ZrO<sub>2</sub>-coated glass pump chamber with dimensions of only  $\Phi$ 15 mm × 25 mm. In the free-running regime, Fig. 1(b,c), the laser generates ~3.8 ms long pulses with a maximum energy of 40 mJ and a slope efficiency of 17.7%. As SA materials, two transparent GCs based on gallium-containing spinel phases (Mg(Al,Ga)<sub>2</sub>O<sub>4</sub> and  $\gamma$ -Ga<sub>2</sub>O) were selected. They exhibit high GSA cross-sections at ~1.54 µm, Fig. 1(d), determined from the absorption saturation experiments. The uncoated SA is inserted at the Brewster angle between the laser rod and the OC. The initial transmission of the SAs  $T_{SA}$  was varied by the heat-treatment regime of the initial glass and by its thickness.

After inserting the SA, very stable passive Q-switching was achieved. The laser generated a single giant pulse per each pump pulse (pulse repetition rate: 1 - 5 Hz), Fig. 2(a). Using a  $\gamma$ -Co:Ga<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub> based GC saturable absorber with  $T_{SA} = 85.4\%$ , the pulse duration (FWHM) of 7.2 ns was obtained corresponding to a pulse energy of 1.39 mJ. The peak power thus reached 193 kW. The effect of the small-signal SA transmission on the pulse characteristics was systematically studied, Fig. 2(b,c). The PQS laser exhibited excellent long-term stability (studying >100 repetitive pulses):  $\pm 0.02$  mJ,  $\pm 0.2$  ns. No optical damage of the optical elements nor the SAs was observed. The laser wavelength was 1535.2 nm. The measured divergence of the laser beam was  $\Theta_{x,y} = 3.83$  and 4.60 mrad, close to the diffraction limit. The developed laser design is suitable for compact range-finders.
