### Microalgae = microorganisms with great potential





**Dunaliella salina**  $\beta$ -carotene producer





## Large-scale harvesting of microalgae is a challenge



### Flotation

- Cell capture by rising bubbles
  - Reduced harvesting costs
    - Non-damaging
- Requires prior flocculation (repulsive interactions)

Use of chemical flocculants to form flocs easier to separate from the water

### "Classic" harvesting technique

- > Centrifugation
  - Filtration
- Sedimentation

### Important costs (1/3 of total price) + cells damaged!

# Develop multi-scale approaches to understand these mechanisms for different microalgae species and different flocculants

## Chitosan is a bio-sourced flocculant widely used



This suggests that the flocculation mechanism may not be fully understood and may rely not only on electrostatic interactions!

### It seems that the flocculation mechanism is different depending on the pH!

# AFM reveals the flocculation mechanisms involved



Identification of a new flocculation mechanism based on specific interactions between chitosan and polymers from microalgae cells



At pH 8, chitosan precipitates and does not interact with cells anymore
