Redfish populations in the Northwest Atlantic have been extensively fished since the late 1950s Two species are present, *Sebastes mentella* and *Sebastes fasciatus*.

COSEWIC designated *Sebastes mentella* as endangered in 2010.

OBJECTIVE: TO GET A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF GROWTH PHYSIOLOGY AND METABOLISM TO BETTER ASSESS THE STOCK'S EVOLUTION. HOWEVER, STUDYING FISH CAPTURED AT DEPTH IS QUITE CHALLENGING FOR ECOPHYSIOLOGISTS.



- DFO - August 2018 scientific campaign

- Aboard the CCGS *Teleost*
- Campelen 1800 trawl
- Tows lasted 15 min at a speed of 3 knots



Redfish were captured at 7 different locations in the estuary and Gulf of St. Lawrence



At each site, heart, liver and muscle tissue were extracted on 10 individuals, from 20 to 23 cm, to insure having the same cohort



DNA was extracted



Microsatellite analysis confirmed S. mentella identification

Redundancy analysis (RDA)

Variation partitioning, relationship between genetic markers (Y), Site variables (X1) and Fish variables (X2).



Site:

Depth, Temperature, Oxygen concentration, and Redfish Biomass p = 0.002

Fish:

Length, Weight, Fulton condition index p = 0.011

PRELIMINARY RESULTS











PK (anaerobic metabolism indicator) is overexpressed at the site where the smallest S. mentella were captured



The lowest expression of Myosin is observed at the site where the largest fish were captured

PRELIMINARY RESULTS

Interestingly, COX is also overexpressed at ES (coldest site, smallest fish) and differences with some of the warmest sites

Again, overexpression at the coldest site where the smallest redfish were captured

But expression of IGF-1 seems related to average weight for the two extreme sites...

WORK ON RESULTS CONTINUES
