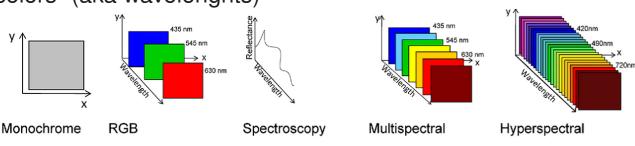

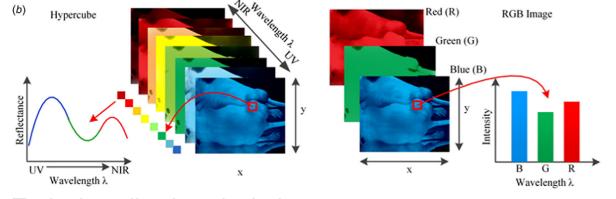

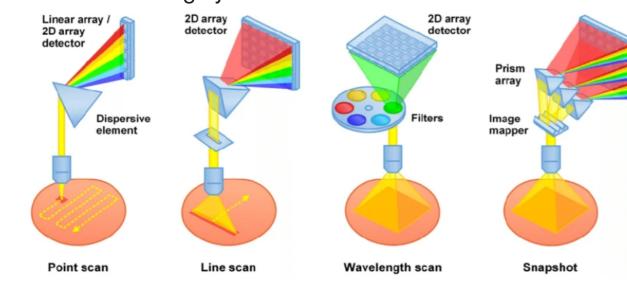
Hyperspectral Imaging (HSI)

► Hyperspectral cameras allow to see objects in many "colors" (aka wavelenghts)



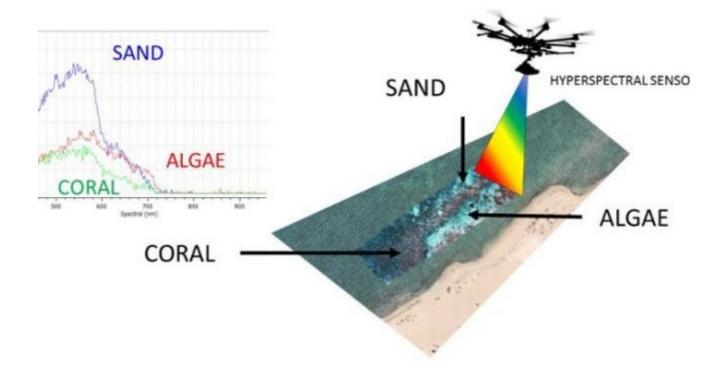


- ► Typical applications include:
 - ► Remote sensing (natural, industrial observation)
 - ► Safety (e.g., food and agriculture monitoring)
- Security
- ► Standard scanning systems:

Miniaturization for near in-situ observation (source: http://www.abc.net.au)

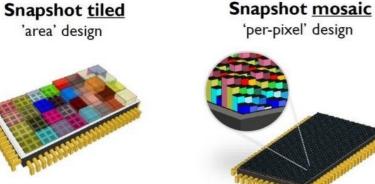


Strategies for miniaturized HSI sensors (on the left for images, middle and right for videos – Source IMEC).

Linescan



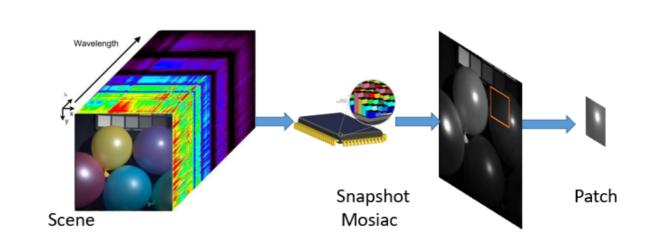


Movement needed Highest spatial and spectral resolution achievable (e.g. 100 spectral band images of 4MP x resolution today)

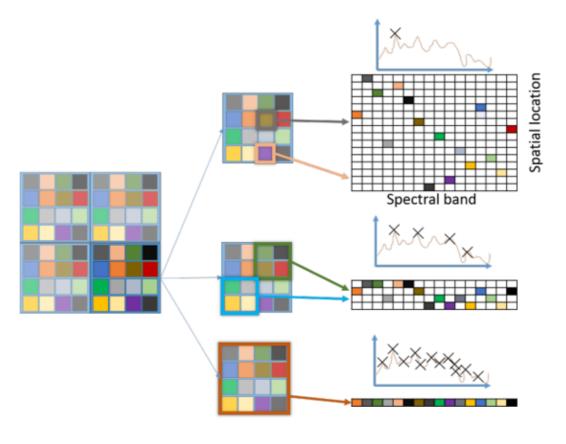
HSI data-cubes acquisition Spatial vs. spectral resolution trade-off (e.g. 32 band resolution today) Optical duplicator needed (e.g. lens-array today)

No scan= real-time No scan= real-time HSI data-cubes acquisition Spatial vs. spectral resolution trade-off (e.g. 16 band images of 256x256 | images of 512x272 resolution today) Potential resolution reconstruction increase by de-mosaicing algorithms

Acquisition and Demosaicing



Principle of image acquisition by a snapshot mosaic camera

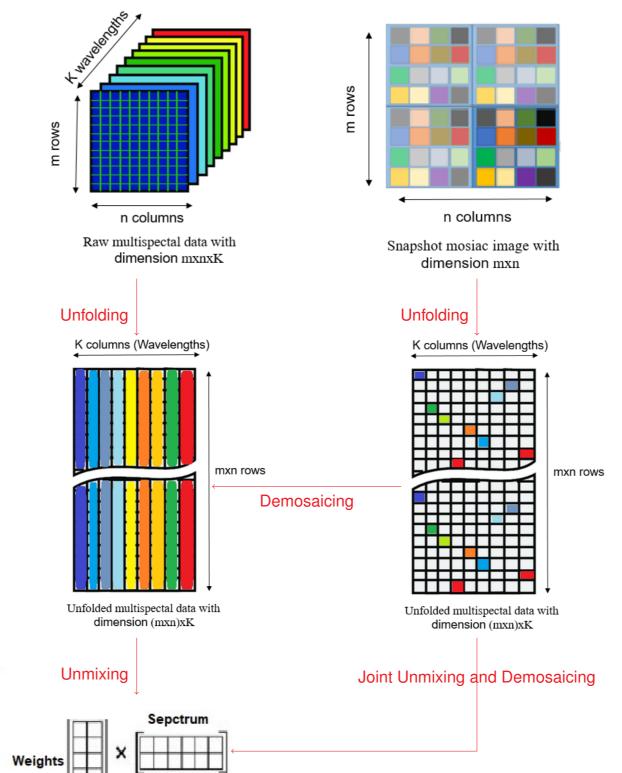


Trade-off between spectral information and spatial resolution [1]

- ► Demosaicing = providing a datacube combining full spectral information & good spatial resolution
- Various approaches have been proposed:
- ► Weighted bilinear interpolation (WB) [2] ► Iterative Spectral Difference (ItSD) [3].
- ► Multispectral demosaicing approach using a pseudo-panchromatic
- ► Graph and rank regularized method (GRMR) [1]

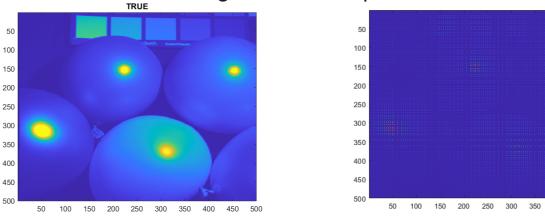
Goal of the Ph.D. thesis

- Performing classification after demosaicing provides a poor classification performance [1]
- ► In [5], joint low-rank matrix completion and factorization far more accurate than a two-stage approach (matrix factorization after low-rank matrix completion)
- Joint Demosaicing and Unmixing more efficient than a two-stage approach?
 - ▶ Ph.D. thesis started in June 2021
- Weighted NMF tested to perform joint unmixing and demosaicing
- ► Proposed approach based on Expectation-Maximization framework and inspired by [6]



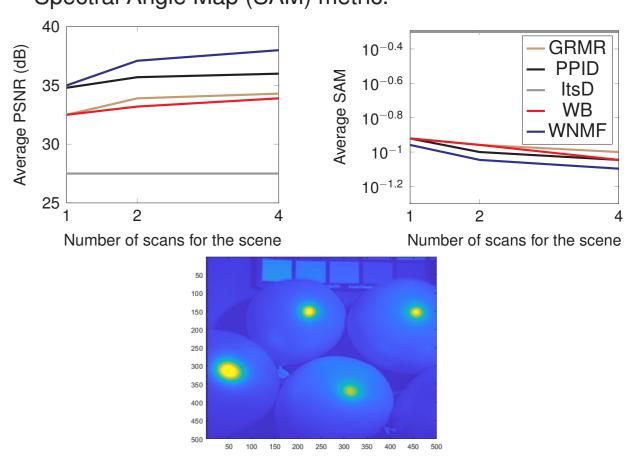
Experiment and results

- ► To validate the performance of the proposed approach, we conducted an experiment on CAVE dataset.
- ▶ We assume that the hyperspectral imagery in CAVE is acquired using a SSI camera system, equipped with a 4×4 spectral filter pattern.
- ► Simulations assuming an ideal snapshot mosaic filter



Left: original HSI to estimate. Right: observed image.

► Reconstruction quality is measured in terms of Peak Signal-to-Noise Ratio (PSNR, in dB) and of average Spectral Angle Map (SAM) metric.

Conclusion and Future Work

- ► Start of the Ph.D. thesis
- WNMF already provides better democaising performance than tested SotA methods
- ► Next steps:
- 1. Evaluate WNMF performance for unmixing
- 2. Apply the proposed method on real data acquired by an SSI camera
