Smart Nonlinear Photonics – From ultrashort pulse processing to multidimensional control & applications

We report on the experimental customization of coherent supercontinuum using an activelycontrolled photonic chip to prepare and tailor patterns of femtosecond pulses and tailor nonlinear fiber propagation [1]. Our results and potential perspectives are discussed in the framework of efficient optical wave-packet shaping compatible with demanding applications such as smart imaging.




Fig. 1: Example of experimentally recorded Frequency-Resolved Optical Gating (FROG) trace of an optical signal generated via an integrated system for the control of nonlinear fiber propagation: Pattern of 32 femtosecond pulses (90 fs duration) individually separated by 1 ps.
