# Circularly Polarized Luminescence of $\mathbf{E u ( I I I )}$ Compounds with chiral BINOL-derived Bisphosphate Ligands 

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$\left\{\left[\mathbf{D y}(\mathbf{h f a c})_{\mathbf{3}}\left((\boldsymbol{S})-\mathbf{L}^{3}\right)\right]_{3}\right\}_{\mathrm{n}}: 32.8 \mathrm{mg}(0.04 \mathrm{mmol})$ of $\left[\mathrm{Dy}(\mathrm{hfac})_{3}\left(\mathrm{H}_{2} \mathrm{O}\right)_{2}\right]$ were added to a solution of $30.3 \mathrm{mg}(0.04 \mathrm{mmol})$ of $(S)-\mathrm{L}^{3}$ or $(R)-\mathrm{L}^{3}$ in 5 mL of $\mathrm{CH}_{2} \mathrm{Cl}_{2}$. After 15 minutes of stirring, 30 mL of $n$-hexane were layered. After several days, the solution was slowly evaporated leading to a colourless and microcrystalline solid. $27.6 \mathrm{mg}, 44 \%$ yield for $\left\{\left[\mathrm{Dy}(\mathrm{hfac})_{3}\left((S)-\mathrm{L}^{3}\right)\right]_{3}\right\}_{\mathrm{n}}$. Anal. calcd (\%) for $\mathrm{C}_{177} \mathrm{H}_{129} \mathrm{Dy}_{3} \mathrm{~F}_{54} \mathrm{O}_{42} \mathrm{P}_{6}$ : C 45.90, H 2.79; found: C 45.82, H 2.94. Representative I.R. Slow evaporation from a solution in
$\mathrm{CH}_{2} \mathrm{Cl}_{2} / n$-hexane led to single crystals suitable for structural X-ray studies. $[\alpha]_{D}^{25}=-6.5$ for $\left\{\left[\mathrm{Dy}(\mathrm{hfac})_{3}\left((S)-\mathrm{L}^{3}\right)\right]_{3}\right\}\left(\mathrm{c}=1.0, \mathrm{CHCl}_{3}\right)$.
It crystallizes in the $\mathrm{P} 2_{1} 2_{1} 2_{1}\left(\mathrm{~N}^{\circ} 19\right)$ chiral orthorhombic space group (Table S2) and its asymmetric unit is composed of three $(\boldsymbol{S}) \mathrm{L}^{3}$ ligands and three $\mathrm{Dy}(\mathrm{hfac})_{3}$ moieties. The $\mathrm{Dy}(\mathrm{hfac})_{3}$ moieties are linked by the $(\boldsymbol{S})-\mathrm{L}^{3}$ ligands through the $\mathrm{P}=\mathrm{O}$ groups to form a onedimensional structure (Figure S 1 ). The Dy(III) ion is surrounded by eight oxygen atoms coming from three hfac anions and two $\mathrm{P}=\mathrm{O}$ groups. The arrangement of the ligands leads to distorted square antiprism ( $\mathrm{D}_{4 \mathrm{~d}}$ symmetry) coordination polyhedron for the three crystallographically independent Dy (III) centres. The deviation from the ideal symmetries are determined by SHAPE ${ }^{1}$ analysis and depicted in Table S3. From such analysis, it appears that the Dy1 and Dy3 adopt an almost regular square antiprism while the coordination sphere of Dy2 is close to a $\mathrm{D}_{2 \mathrm{~d}}$ symmetry (triangular dodecahedron). The average Dy-O bond length is (2.34(6) $\AA$ ) and the $\mathrm{Dy}-\mathrm{O}_{\mathrm{hfac}}$ are slightly longer than the $\mathrm{Dy}-\mathrm{O}_{\mathrm{P}=\mathrm{O}}$ bond lengths. The $\mathrm{P}=\mathrm{O} \mathrm{O}-\mathrm{Dy}-\mathrm{O}_{\mathrm{P}=\mathrm{O}}$ angles range from $139.9^{\circ}$ to $152.8^{\circ}$. The angle between the planes formed by the binaphtyl groups are found close in the three ( $\boldsymbol{S}$ )-L ${ }^{3}$ ligands of the asymmetric unit with values ranging from $75.0(3)^{\circ}$ to $86.0(1)^{\circ}$. The intra-chain Dy-Dy distances are found equal to $12.528(2) \AA$ (Dy1-Dy2), $12.339(2) \AA(\mathrm{Dy} 2-\mathrm{Dy} 3)$ and 12.662(3) $\AA$ (Dy3-Dy1). The crystal packing (Figure S2) highlights both $\mathrm{F} \cdots \mathrm{F}$ and $\mathrm{H} \cdots \mathrm{F}$ contacts to assume the cohesion of the crystal but no $\pi-\pi$ stacking has been found. The shortest inter-chain Dy-Dy distances are found equal to 11.447(2) A (Dy1Dy1) so slightly shorter than the intra-chain distances.
