


Categorization of the settlements on the map through the use of different police breaks (Plumejeaud 2013: 15)









Potential relationships

> Transport infrastructures





- > Threshold:
 - > distance-time
 - > distance calculations based on the testimonies of contemporaries

Functional relationships

Creating an analytical grid to formalize the knowledge process

Relations characterized by:

- > Timing and duration (start/end date)
- Form (hierarchical/non-hierarchical)
- Orientation (pole/subordinate city; exporting city/importer city)
- > Function (political-administrative / economic / religious)
- Social group at stake (institutional group / urban group / interpersonal group)







The cities interacting with Noyon (at least at a given moment in time)











Trajectories of the relative positions of the cities interacting with Noyon




