Conclusion


- Sublimity in musical context is a multi-component experience
- Even if we obtained a significative effect for the dimension « Negative emotion », the average report for this dimension was lower as compared to the other dimensions. This result could indicate that « negative emotion » is not a relevant dimension to evaluate an experience of the sublime elicited by music.
- The experimental context for musical experience probably minimizes the created sensations as compared to live music (especially for the dimension « being moved »).
- Results of study 1 revealed 2 dimensions linked to the diminished sense of the self; further studies should investigate whether music experience of the sublime impact the body or the cognitive aspects of the Self representation.

Study 1

Participants: 177 adults (66 males, age 37.55 ± 16.56)

Procedure:

Definition of a musical experience of the sublime




Questionnaire – 50 items (11 points Likert scales)
emotional, physical and cognitive sensations

Analysis:

- Exploratory Factor Analysis (EFA) on the items (Promax rotation, factor loadings : ≥ 0.5 , parallel analysis).
- ANOVA 8 Dimensions x 2 definition (sublime vs. beauty)


Evaluation of musical experiences of the sublime and the beauty



Study 2

Participants: 146 adults (31 males, age = 25.34 ± 16.56)

- one-way ANOVAs (5 tracks) for interesting dimensions (cf. Study 1)
