

Introduction/background

The fact that retinoic acid (RA), the active metabolite of vitamin A (or retinol; ROL) is important in testis homeostasis is well documented since decades, but its precise role at different steps of spermatogenesis is still debated¹.

RA, synthesized by the retinaldehyde dehydrogenases (RALDH1 to 3), binds to and activates nuclear receptors (RAR) either within the RA-synthesizing cells themselves or within neighboring cells. RALDH1 and RALDH2 are the main RA-synthesizing enzymes expressed in Sertoli cells and germ cells (GC), respectively, while RALDH3 is not detected in the seminiferous epithelium².

In the past we showed that RALDH-dependent synthesis of RA in the Sertoli cells is instrumental to initiate spermatogonia differentiation and therefore to launch the 1st spermatogenic wave at the onset of puberty³. Here we evaluated the role of RALDHs in the GC (*Raldh*^{Germ-/-} mutants).



Methodologies


I Generation of mutant mice lacking all *Raldhs* selectively in GC.

To generate *Raldh*^{Germ-/-} mutants, in which the RALDH genes were excised only in GC, mice carrying loxP-flanked alleles of the *Raldh1*, *Raldh2*, and *Raldh3* genes were crossed with mice bearing the Stra8-Cre transgene⁴, which is active only in germ cells from postnatal day 3 onward.

II Quantitation of retinoic acid and retinol in testis.

Retinoids were determined in the whole testis from 8-10 week-old *Raldh*^{Germ-/-} mutants and wildtype using validated methodology⁵.

III Induction of spermatogenic synchrony.



To analyse the chronology of GC differentiation in the prepubertal testis, 3-days old (PN3) *Raldh*^{Germ-/-} mutant and control mice were treated with RA (subcutaneous injection of 16mg/Kg all trans retinoic acid). This treatment induces differentiation of spermatogonia/gonocytes in a synchronized manner.

A and C : Seminiferous cords within the testes;

B and D : Histological sections showing heterogeneous states (B) or homogenous states (D) of cell differentiation at each time point.

IV Histology and immunohistochemistry.


For histology, testis samples were fixed in Bouin's fluid for 16 hours and embedded in paraffin. Histological sections were stained with hematoxylin and eosin.

For immunodetection of RALDH2, testes were fixed by intracardiac perfusion of icecold 4% paraformaldehyde in PBS, then kept in the same fixative overnight at 4°C, washed in PBS, dehydrated and embedded in paraffin. 5µm sections were immunolabeled with RALDH2 antibody (Abcam, ab75674) and with Alexa Fluor 488-conjugated peanut agglutinin (lectin) to label acrosomal systems.

For co-immunodetection of STRA8/ZBTB16 or KIT/ZBTB16, testes were fixed in icecold 4% paraformaldehyde in PBS, then kept in the same fixative overnight at 4°C, washed in PBS, cryopreserved using a sucrose gradient and embedded in the matrix for cryostat sectioning. 10µm sections were immunolabeled with antibodies KIT (Cell signaling, 3074), ZBTB16 (R&D systems, AF2944) and/or STRA8⁶.


Results

I *Stra8-Cre* efficiently excise *Raldh* in germ cells of adult testis.




II *Raldh*^{Germ-/-} mutants testis has disrupted retinoid homeostasis in adult testis.



III Raldhs of germ cell origin are dispensable in the adult testis.



IV Absence of RA synthesis by GC does not alter the kinetics of spermatogonia differentiation.

Conclusion

Here we have used a combination of cell-type specific genetic ablations and pharmacological approaches *in vivo* to show that RA synthesis in postpubertal testis relies on both somatic and GC, two sources that are functionally redundant.
