For almost any assignment (translation). Also when reading. Unfortunately, my vocabulary is not that wide, so in order to understand the text/translation, I almost always use an aid.

I use dictionaries with example sentences mainly when translating from both languages. I mainly look up words or phrases. I like the fact that example sentences give you some context, so that you can be more sure of finding the right word.

I use online dictionaries the most when I do translations. I try to make up my own sentences as much as possible, but often you really don't know a particular word. Then I use an online dictionary.

I never use it.

I think especially when reading texts in the foreign language. So that I can be sure that I understand the text correctly if, for example, it contains expressions that I do not (yet) know. pretty much everywhere. If I feel like I understand it, I do it first without any tools, and then I look at what options a machine translation gives me, or I do the back translation to see if it says the same thing. But I use this a lot to understand, because I find the texts/questions/phrases quite difficult.

I use machine translation mainly when translating. I never just copy the sentences given by a machine, but I use them as inspiration when I am at a loss.

When making translations to both Dutch and Spanish. Sometimes it is difficult to formulate a good sentence, and then machine translations are a useful tool. I personally like DeepL best, as this machine translation is the most accurate.

I actually only use Google Translate. Even if GT does not yet understand the nuances of the language, it is nice to be able to understand the main outlines of a Spanish text. It is also a control tool for me. For example, I write a Spanish translation and I use GT from Dutch to Spanish to compare it with my own translation. I also use GT to translate my own text from Spanish to Dutch to see if it makes sense. What is also nice about GT compared to a dictionary: in a dictionary you can often find separate words, but with GT I can more easily translate expressions (or words that belong together).

This year, we had to read a few books for Spanish. Some of these books contained such strange words, I thought, but it turned out that these were older words that are not used much any more. But I didn't understand them and when there were sentences with many of these strange words, I pasted the paragraph into, for example, DeepL and if it made sense, that was great. If not, I looked further.

Reading in the foreign language. Often I can deduce from the context what is meant, so I need less help from MT.

When reading texts in foreign languages. You can often work out from the text what a word or a sentence means.

Very specific texts such as medical texts for example, because I don't assume that Deepl knows all those medical terms.

Reading texts. This is about the core and not about the specific meaning of individual words or sentences.

I also use machine translations in class. Usually, what a machine translation says is correct. It gives a rough idea of what it is about. And this helps me a lot to understand the texts a bit, to follow the lesson.

Sometimes I use MT while studying. If I can't think of a particular verb conjugation, I can look it up quickly and easily with MT.

Occasionally, I use machine translations during the lesson. I'll be honest, sometimes the teacher suddenly asks questions about a text or sentence during the lesson. Then it is very convenient to have one or more sentences translated quickly by a machine translation.

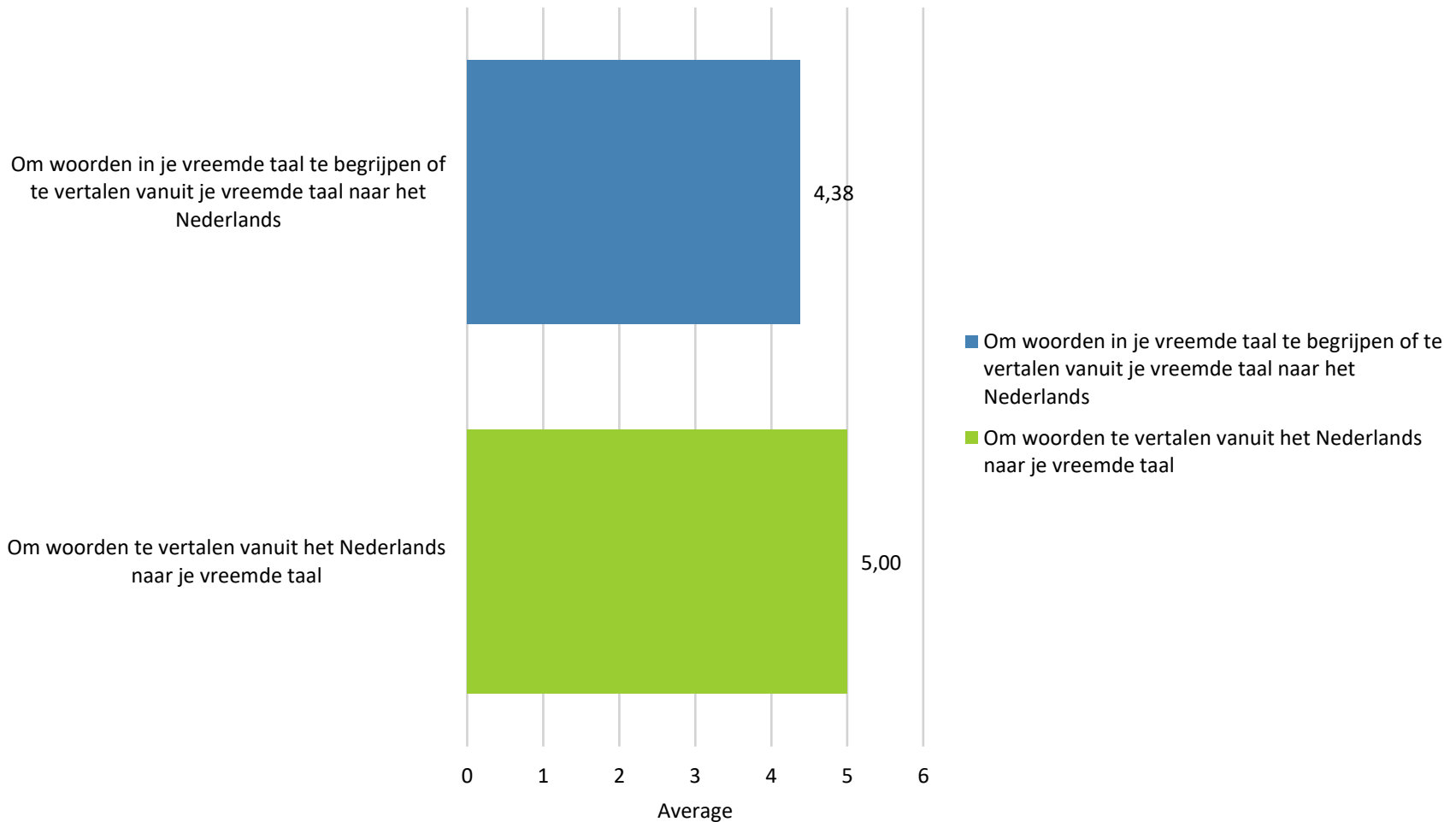
If I really don't understand what's in the texts during class, I sometimes put paragraphs in DeepL yes. So that I understand something.

I use the website esfacil.eu to look up conjugations of verbs. I also use Wikipedia. If there is a specific (cultural) term in the text, I look it up on Wikipedia and often there is an English or Dutch (from Spanish) or Spanish (from Dutch) page for it.

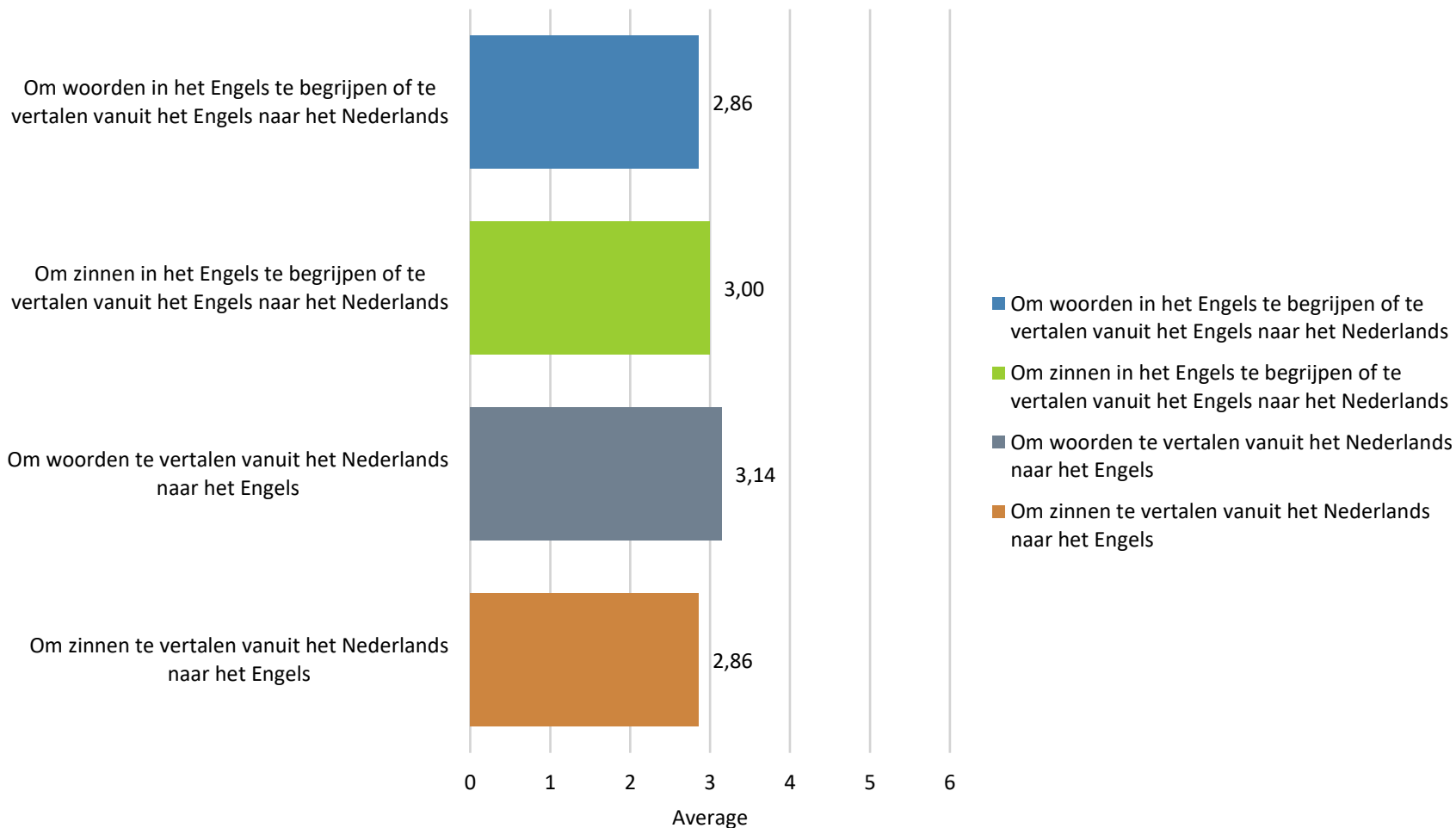

Sometimes I also watch videos about the subject and then I see if the term appears in them.

By looking it up on Google and seeing if the context is similar.

I find these very useful. They give a lot of context so you can see if a word fits into your text. However, you have to check carefully whether a solution is really correct, because the sources are not always reliable.

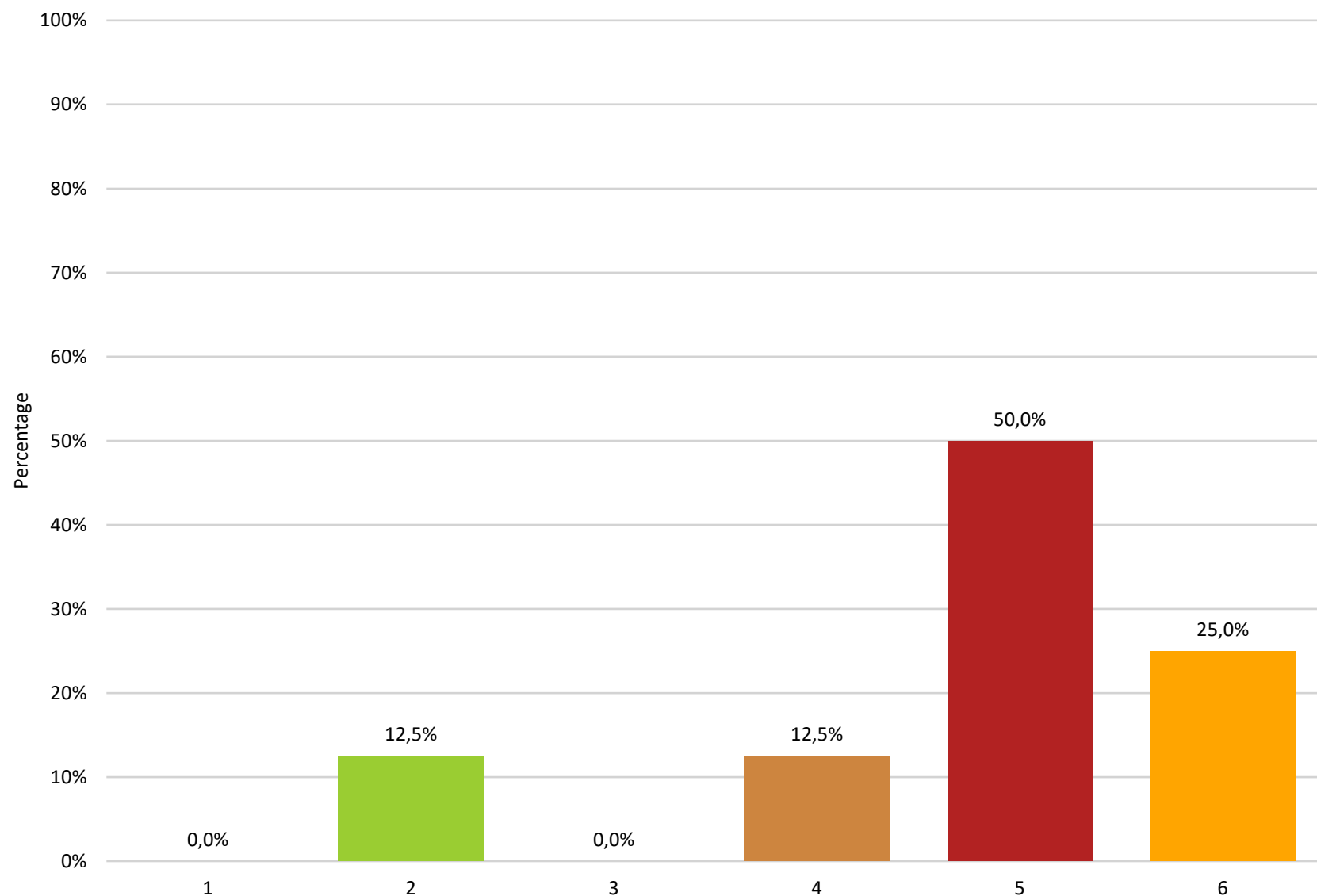
It gives a little more certainty that a certain translation of a term is actually correct. It could also be, for example, that the online dictionary you are using has actually displayed the wrong translation.

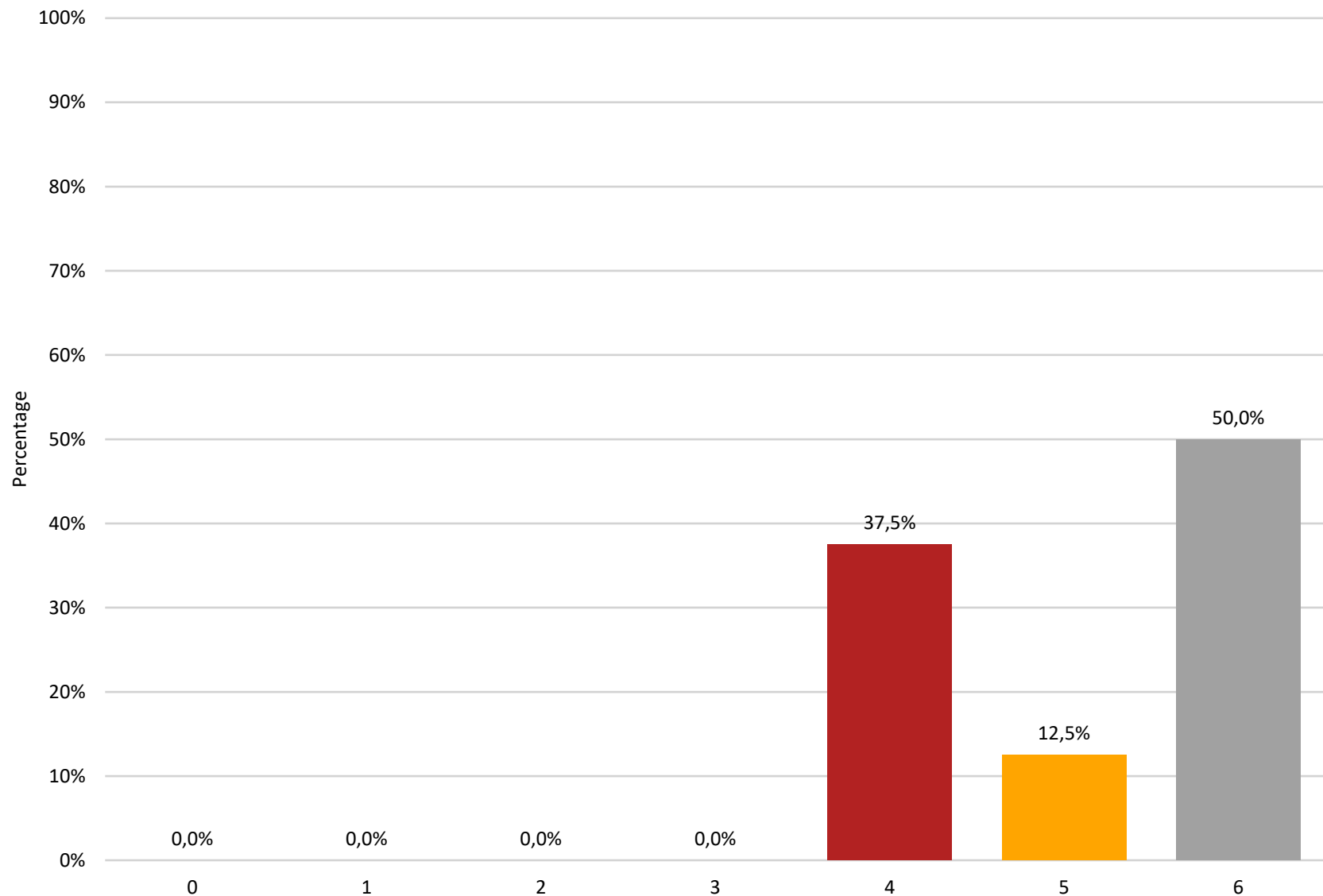

I find machine translations useful because they give you a quick solution, but often it is not quite right. So you have to check a lot and sometimes the solution given by the MT is not even useful.

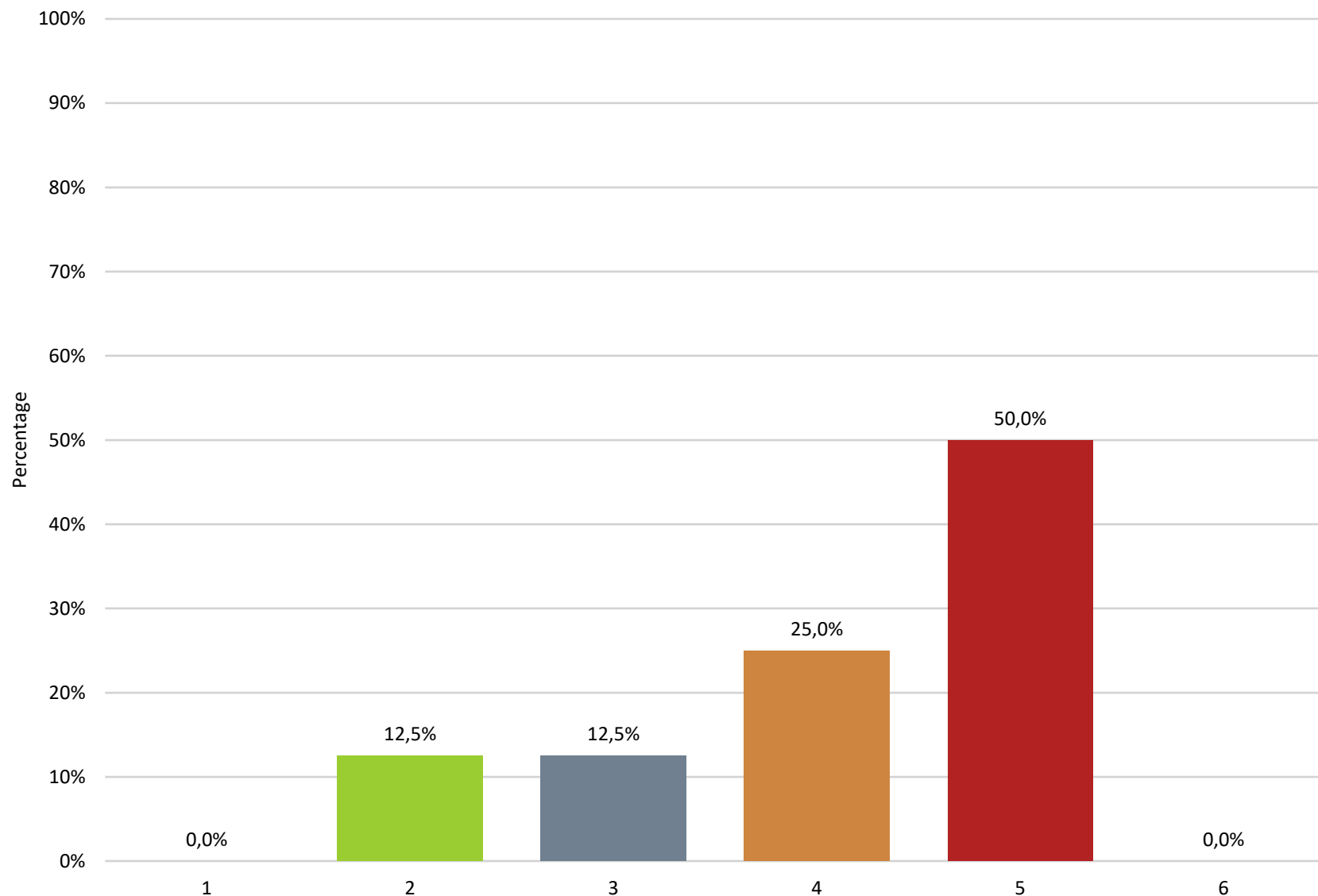
There are, of course, machine translations that are often wrong, such as Google Translate. That is why I use DeepL. It is usually correct and the most accurate.

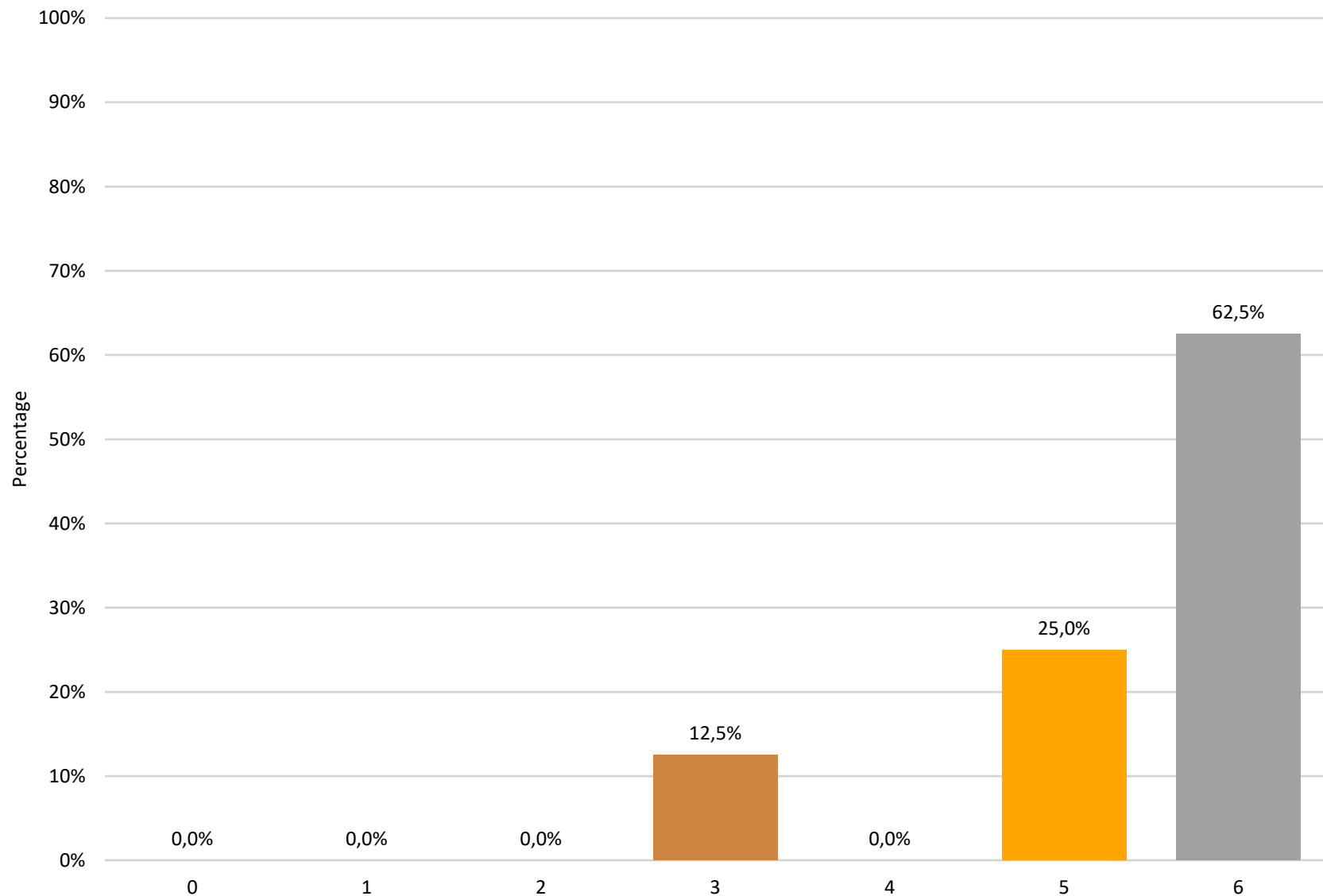

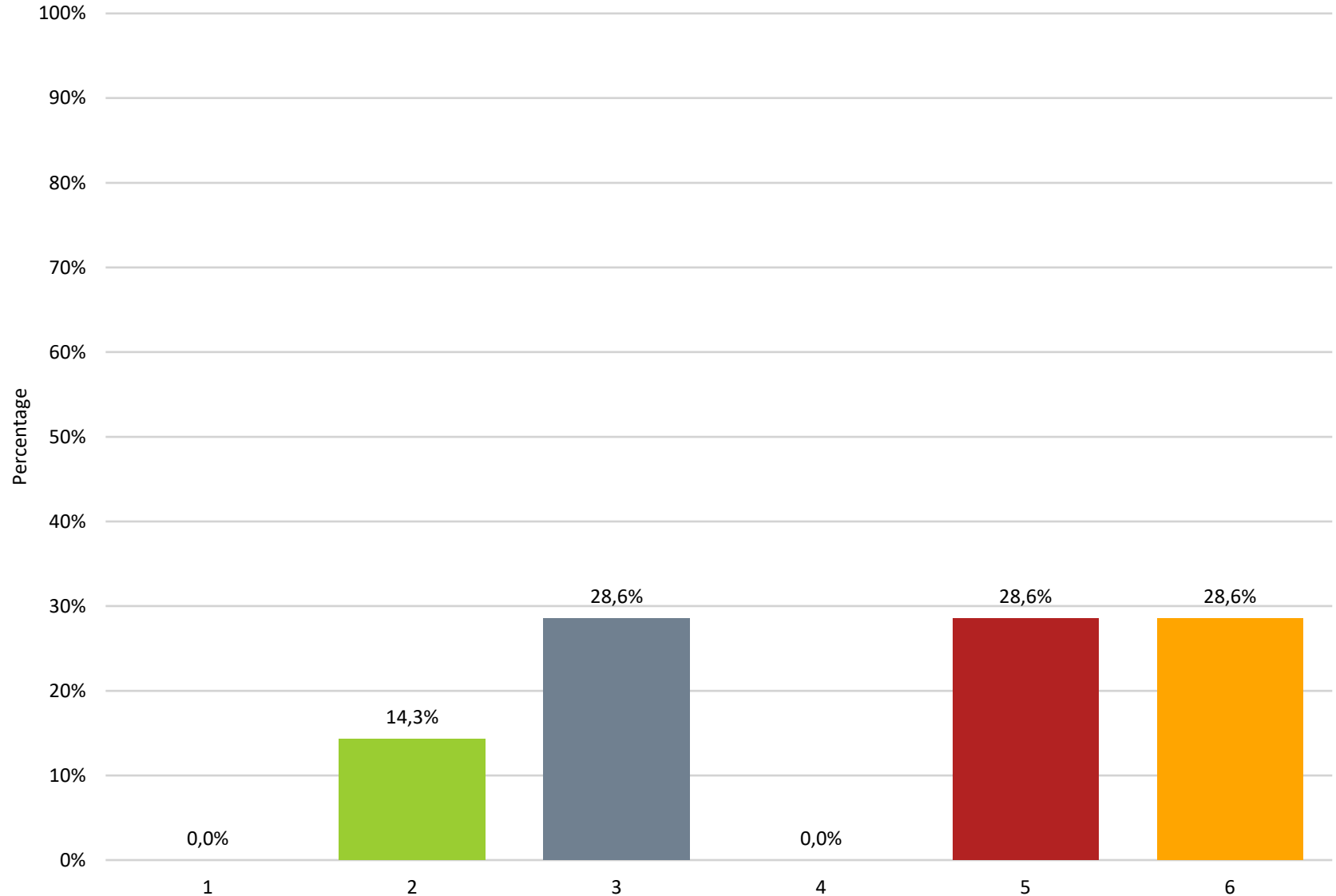
I would not say that traditional dictionaries are useless, but they are impractical in this day and age. Online dictionaries are more practical, quicker to use and actually always more complete.

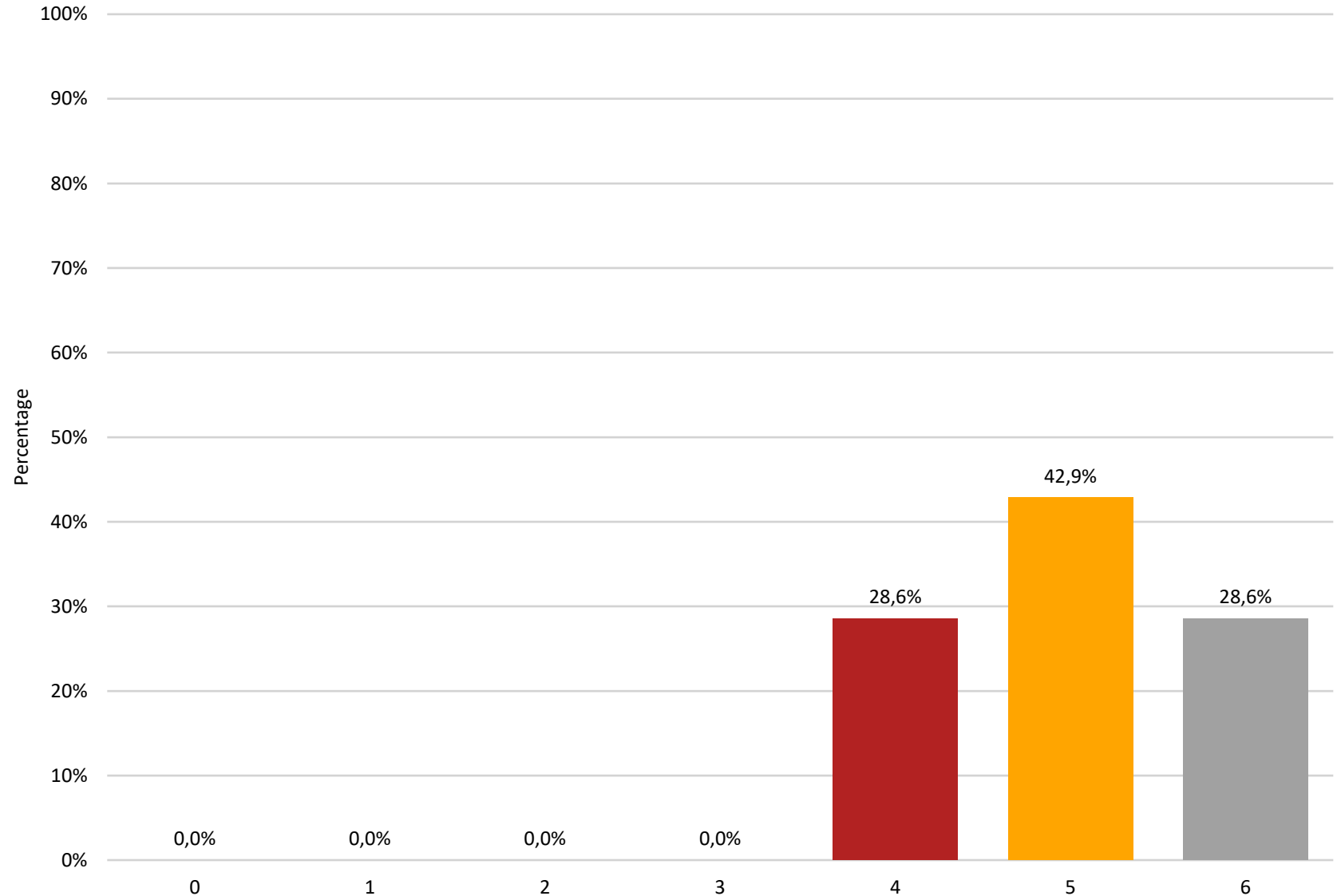

Resources like Wikipedia allow you to find a lot of useful background information, which I find very useful. However, it can happen that a page is not very comprehensive or that information is not quite right.

I find other digital resources such as Wikipedia, parallel texts, legal/technical/economic dictionaries etc. enormously useful. They give a bit more certainty and clarity about certain subjects and translations. This always prevents me from thinking up a translation that doesn't actually make sense.

Often, things cannot be found specifically in a dictionary. A site like esfacil.eu can help with conjugations.

As I said before, I use WRTS to learn words and conjugations of verbs. I really like this, because it's a lot quicker than writing everything down.

You can find almost anything on the Internet, as long as you know where to look and what information you can trust.
