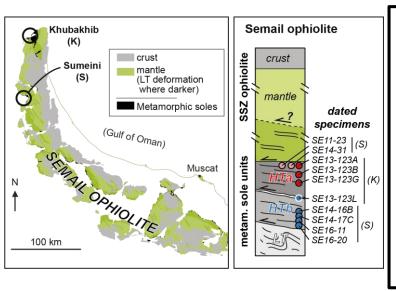

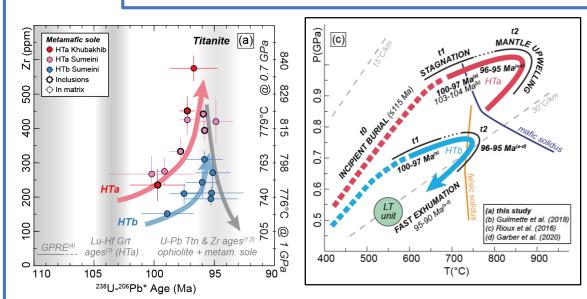


Timescale of oceanic subductions?

Our petrochronological study shows:

- Subduction initiated at a slow rate (<1cm/yr). It stagnated at warm conditions (15-20°C/km) from < 100 to 96 Ma before evolving into a faster (≥ 2–5 cm/yr) and colder (~7°C/km) regime.
- Subduction unlocking triggered the onset of slab retreat, large-scale corner flow and fast ocean spreading in the overriding plate (96-95 Ma).
