 - ♦ 100, 000 species unexplored

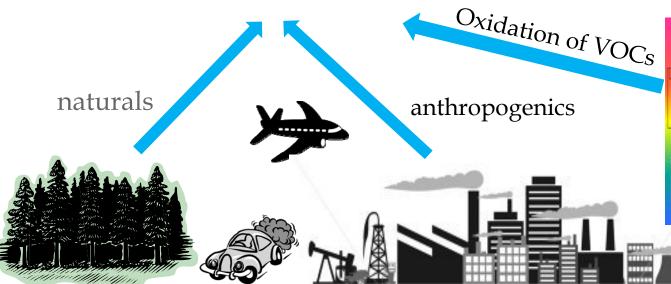

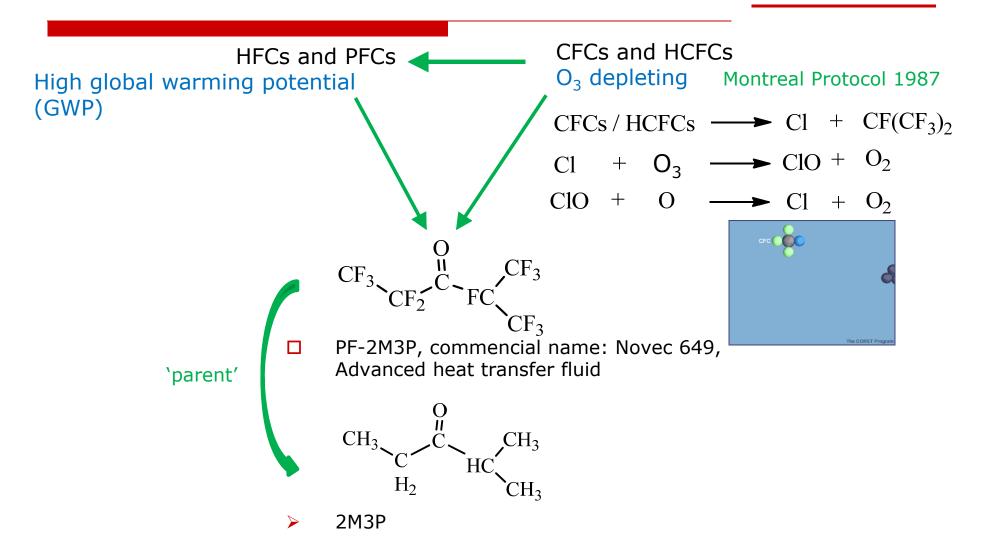

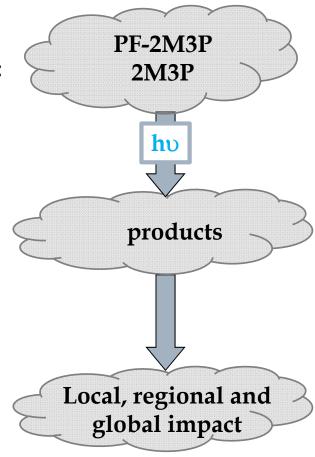
Introduction

Fluorinated organic compounds are less reactive toward OH radicals and have longer atmospheric lifetimes than their nonfluorinated counterparts.

✓ Atmospheric lifetimes :

$$\tau = \frac{1}{\tau_{hv}}$$

➤ Mechanism studies: Identification of Products



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Methodology

J measurement

Under sunlight conditions, PF-2M3P and 2M3P may be removed by photolysis, dilution and wall processes following the reactions:

$$\begin{array}{ll} (\text{PF-2M3P or 2M3P}) + h \upsilon & \longrightarrow \text{products} & J \\ \\ (\text{PF-2M3P or 2M3P}) & \longrightarrow \text{dilution and wall loss} & k_{\text{L}} \\ \\ \text{SF}_6 & \longrightarrow \text{dilution} & k_{\text{d}} \end{array}$$

Hence, the total decays of PF-2M3P and 2M3P are obtained as follows:

$$In([Compound]_0/[Compound]_t) = k_{tot} \times t$$

Then, photolysis rate of PF-2M3P and 2M3P are obtained as follows:

$$J_{meas} = k_{tot} - k_{L}$$

Methodology

J calculation

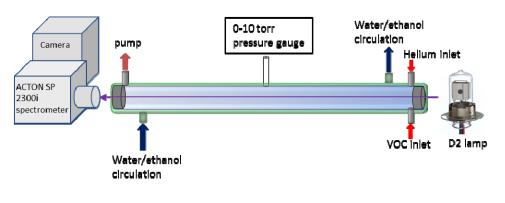
$$J_{calc} = \int \sigma(\lambda) \Phi(\lambda) F(\lambda) d\lambda$$

- $\sigma(\lambda)$ is the absorption cross-section;
- $\Phi(\lambda)$ is the quantum yield of dissociation
- $F(\lambda)$ is the actinic flux over the absorption 290 to 400 nm.

$$J_{\text{max}} = J_{\text{cal}}$$
 when $\Phi = 1$

An effective photodissociation quantum yield can then be derived from the ratio:

$$\Phi_{\text{eff}} = J_{meas}/J_{\text{max}}$$



Beer-Lambert Law:

$$I(\lambda, X) = I_0(\lambda) * 10^{-\sigma L} = I_0(\lambda) * e^{-\sigma' L}$$

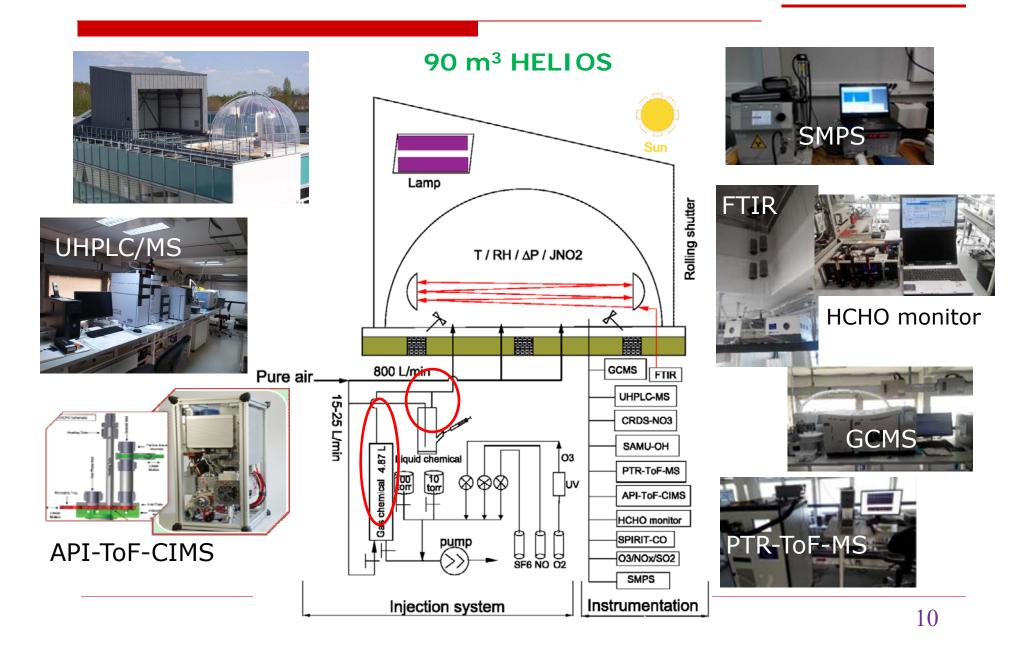
- $I_0(\lambda)$ is the light intensity in the absence OVOC
- $I(\lambda)$ is the light intensity in the presence of OVOC
- L is the path length of absorption cell (in cm),
- C is the concentration of OVOCs (in molecule cm⁻³).
- $\sigma(\lambda)$ is the UV absorption cross section

TROPOSPHERIC ULTRAVIOLET AND VISIBLE (TUV) RADIATION MODEL

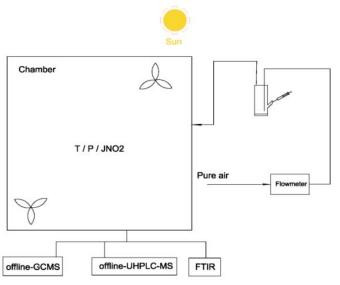

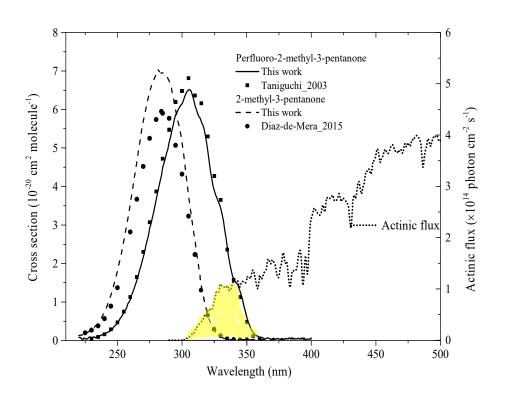

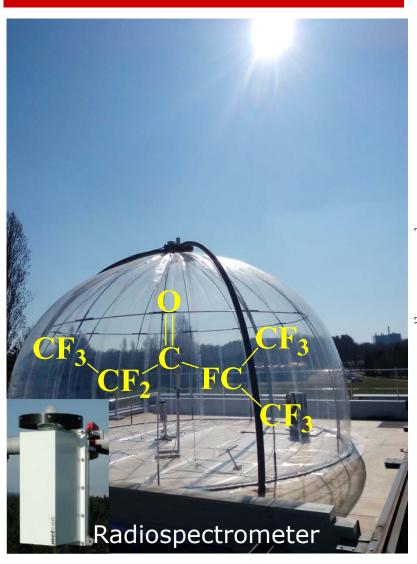
UV spectra:

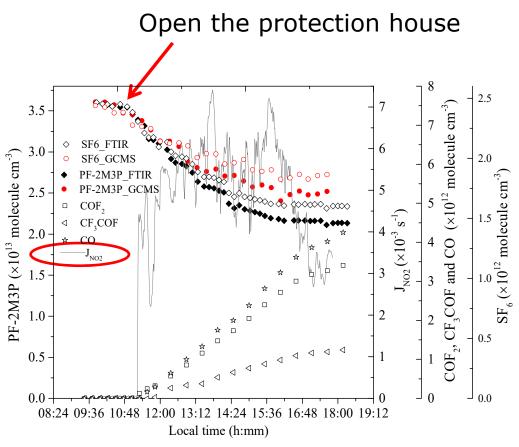
- > 2M3P: 284 nm- $\sigma_{\text{max}} = (6.99 \pm 0.28) \times 10^{-20}$
- PF-2M3P: 305 nm-

$$\sigma_{\text{max}} = (6.50 \pm 0.14) \times 10^{-20}$$

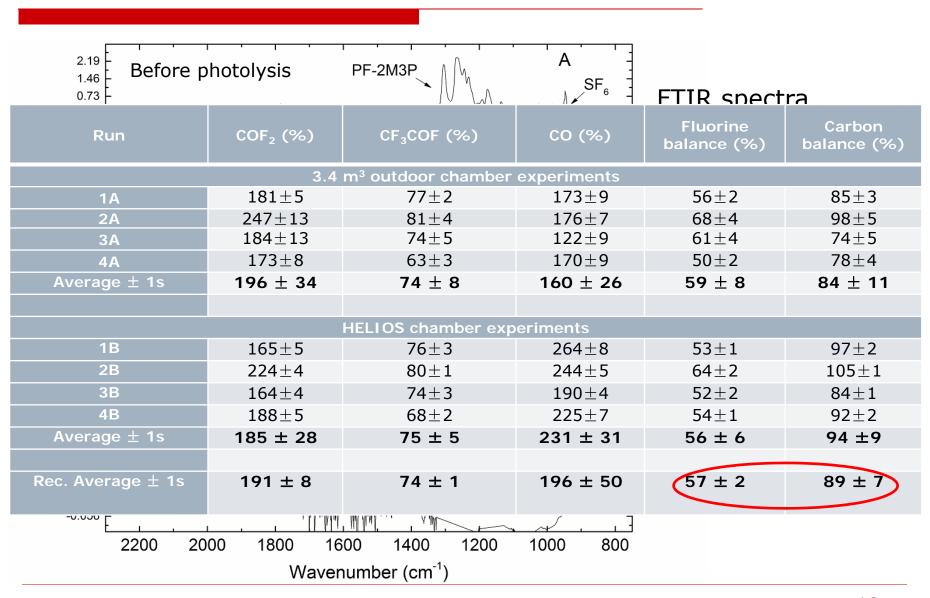

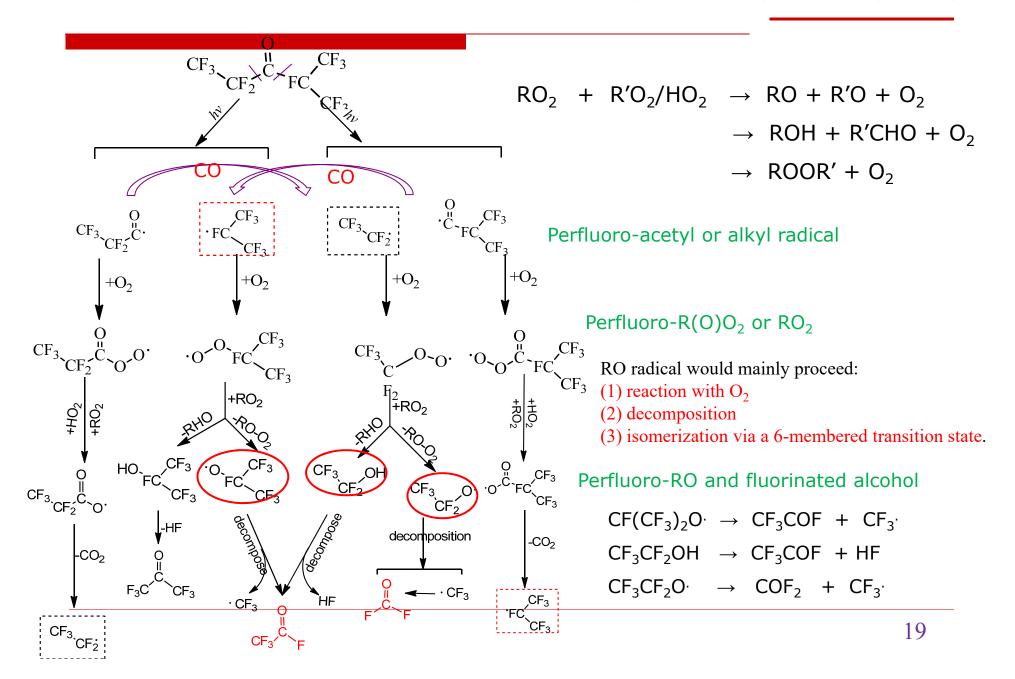

Products



Mechanism



 $AGWP_i$ is an absolute GWP for gas i (usually in Watts m⁻² kg⁻¹ year)

$$AGWPi(H) = RE_i * \tau * (1 - exp(-\frac{H}{\tau}))$$

REi is Radiative Efficiency for a species i,

τ is the lifetime

GWP (Global Warming Potential) is defined as:

$$GWP_{i}(H) = \frac{\int_{0}^{H} RF_{i}(t)dt}{\int_{0}^{H} RF_{CO2}(t)dt} = \underbrace{\frac{AGWP_{i}(H)}{AGWP_{CO2}(H)}}$$

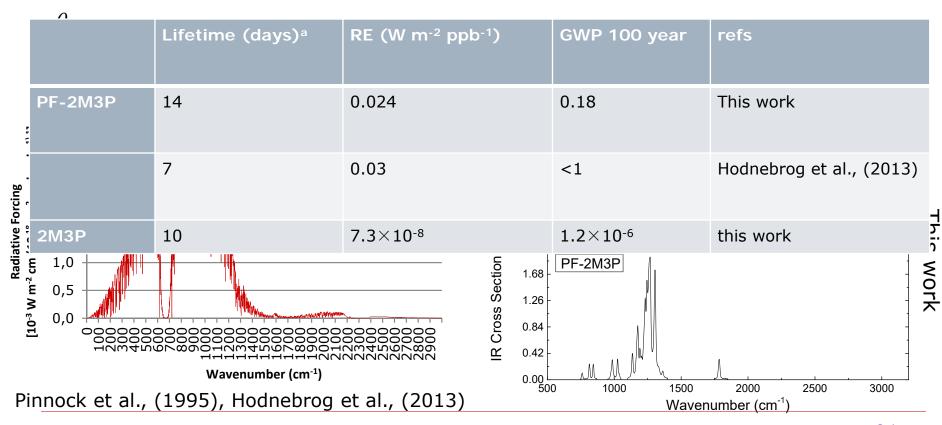
H is the time horizon over which the integration is performed (IPCC presented GWP as 20, 100 and 500 years horizon and Kyoto Protocol has adapted GWP as 100 years horizon),

Pinnock et al., (1995), Hodnebrog et al., (2013)

Results and Discussion

Based on the simple method outlined by Pinnock et al. (1995), in which RE was easily estimated as following:

$$RE = \sum_{\theta=1}^{n} (1) * \sigma_{\alpha \nu}^{\theta} * F_{\sigma}^{\theta}$$



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Conclusion

- The photolysis rate of PF-2M3P was obtained to be (1.1-3.8) × 10⁻⁶ s⁻¹, from HELIOS chamber (September, 2013) and 3.4 m³ chamber (July, 2010). The lifetime of PF-2M3P depending on photolysis was estimated to be 6-21 days
- The photolysis rate of 2M3P was obtained from HELIOS chamber (October, 2013) to be (1.9-3.4)×10⁻⁶ s⁻¹. The lifetime of 2M3P depending on photolysis was estimated to be 7.5-13 days
- $ightharpoonup CF_3C(O)F$, COF_2 and CO were identified to be the main products from the photolysis of PF-2M3P.
- ➤ Photolysis of 2M3P in the troposphere will lead to the formation of CH₃C(O)CH₃, CH₃CHO, HCHO and CO.
- ➤ The photolysis mechanism of PF-2M3P and 2M3P were proposed
- The TUV model shows that the photolysis of PF-2M3P and 2M3P mainly happens in the summer, especially the middle of the day (12am-2pm).

Experimental conditions and obtained results for the photolysis of 2M3P

$$\Phi_{\text{eff}} = \frac{J_{meas}}{J_{max}} = \frac{J_{meas}}{\int \sigma_{(\lambda)} \Phi_{(\lambda)} F_{(\lambda)} d\lambda} = \frac{J_{meas}}{\int \sigma_{(\lambda)} *1*F_{(\lambda)} d\lambda}$$

$$\rightarrow \Phi_{\text{eff}} = 0.139 - 0.179$$

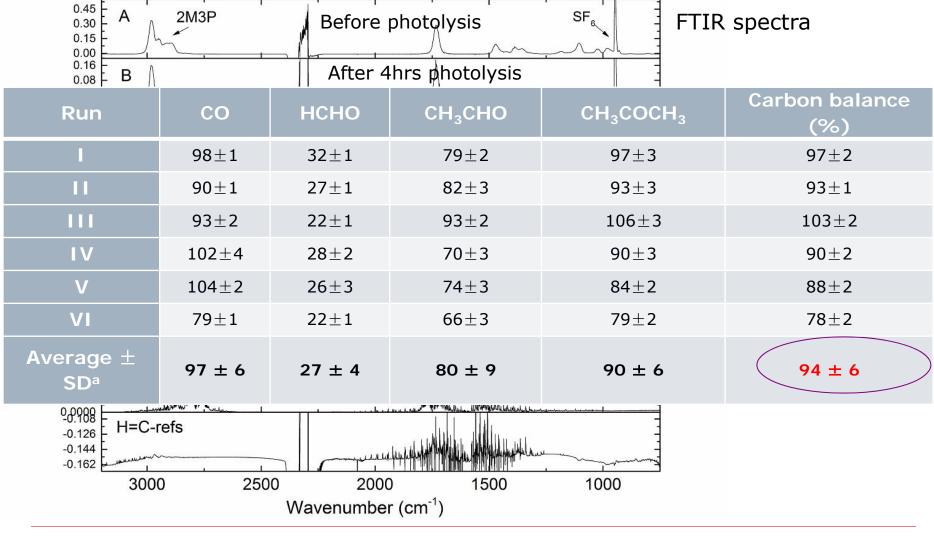
