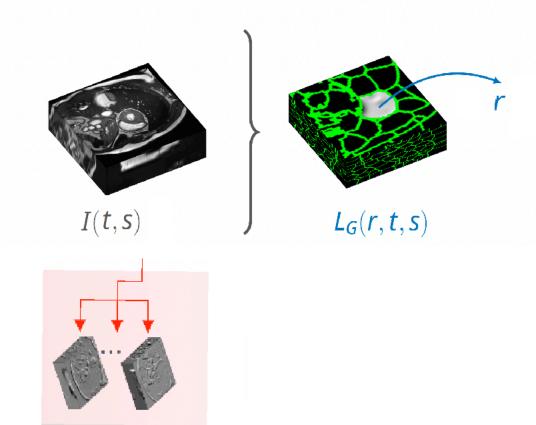
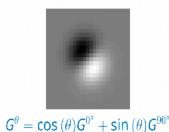
A region r is a set of voxels with homogeneous intensity values (supervoxels) a



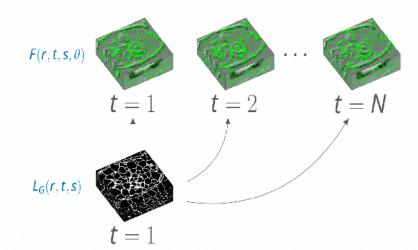
Every scale is also decomposed in oriented features in direction θ

Using a directional kernel G^{θ} that is convolved with the image

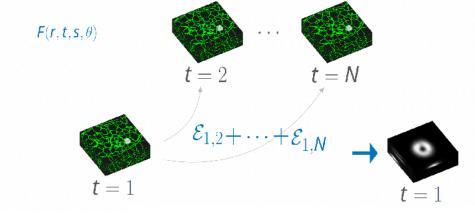


where *G* is the first derivative of the 2D Gaussian function. $\theta = \{0^\circ, 45^\circ, 90^\circ, 135^\circ, 180^\circ, 225^\circ, 270^\circ, 315^\circ\}$

Regions at time t are superimposed to the sequence of oriented features



The local oriented motion for time t is the summation of all differences in orientation θ



$$\mathcal{E}(r, t, s, \theta) = \sum_{\tau=1}^{N} \|\mathbf{F}(r(t, s), t, s, \theta) - \mathbf{F}(r(t, s), \tau, s, \theta)\|^2$$
