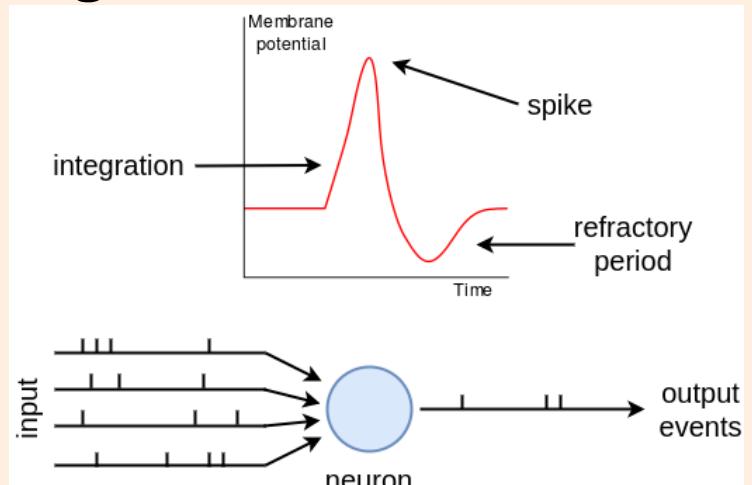

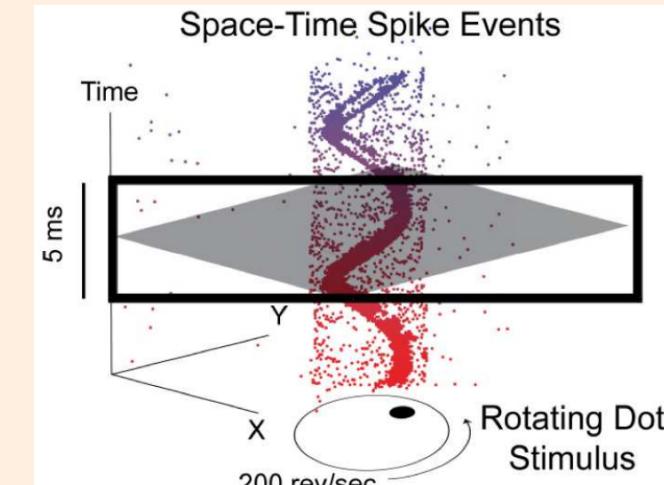

Visual attention: behavioral and cognitive process of selectively focusing on a discrete aspect of sensory cues

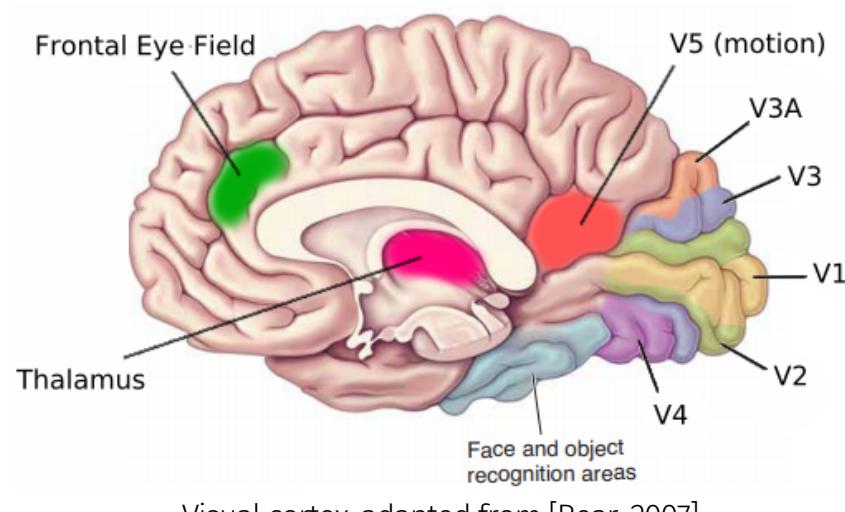
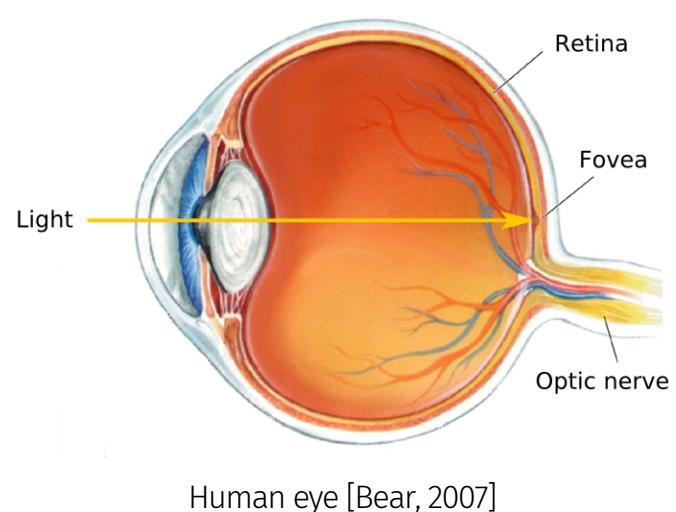
Spiking neural network [Maass, 1997]

3 dichotomies of visual attention [Moore, 2017]:

- top-down and bottom-up
- spatial, temporal and feature-based
- overt and covert

3 neuromodulators in visual attention [Moore, 2017]:

- acetylcholine
- dopamine
- norepinephrine

Attention in multimedia

[Itti, 2001] defines saliency as it is used by most of the multimedia domain.
[Le Callet, 2013] reviewed the exploitation of visual attention in multimedia.

Silicon retina

[Lichtsteiner, 2008] presents the first complete design of a silicon retina.
[Gallego, 2020] surveys event-based vision and its various applications.

Computational models of attention

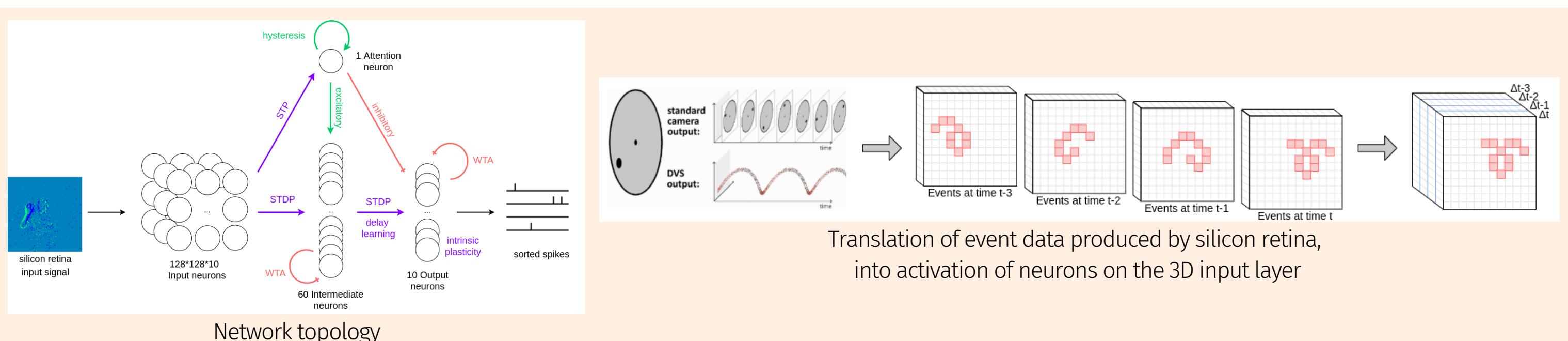
[Renner, 2019] combines spiking neurons and event data to perform object tracking.
[Bennert, 2019] implemented an attention model for pattern recognition.

From biological to computational attention

Our proposals :

- exploit forebrain mechanism to implement top-down attention
- explore the neuromodulators' modus operandi to increase the importance given to visual regions of interest
- harness the relationship between saccadic eye movements and covert attention to implement retinocentric maps of saliency

Simulation results of the network on DVS128 Gesture dataset [Amir, 2017] over 33 400 ms
Hand gesture categories: right hand clockwise (cat. 4) twice then drums (cat. 8) twice
