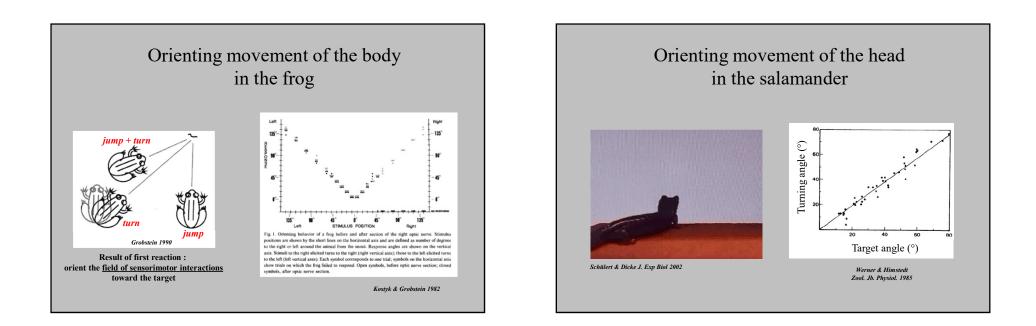


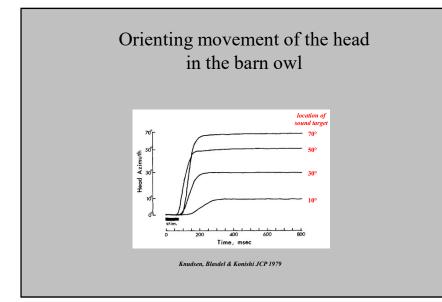


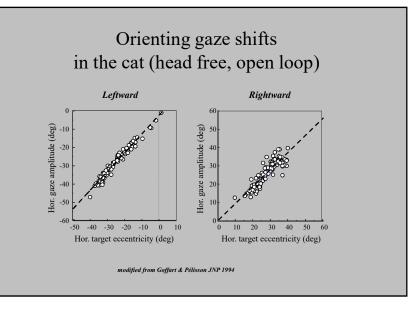
Orienting movement of the body in the goldfish

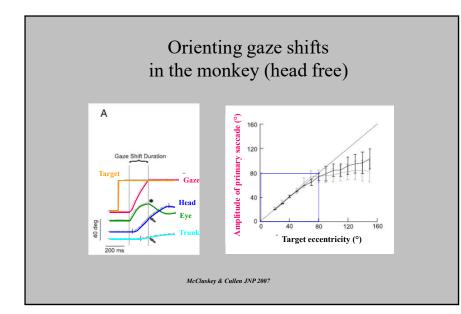


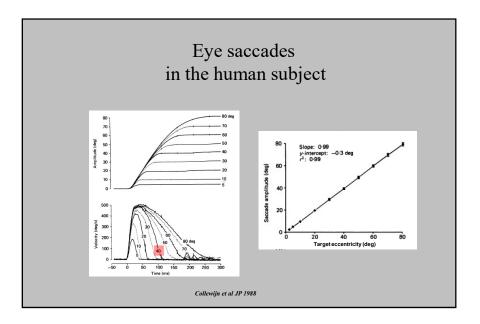

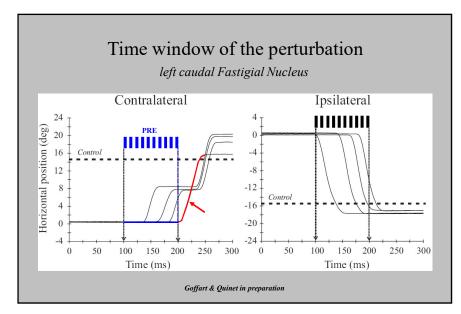


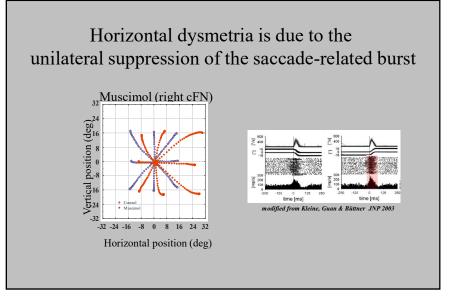


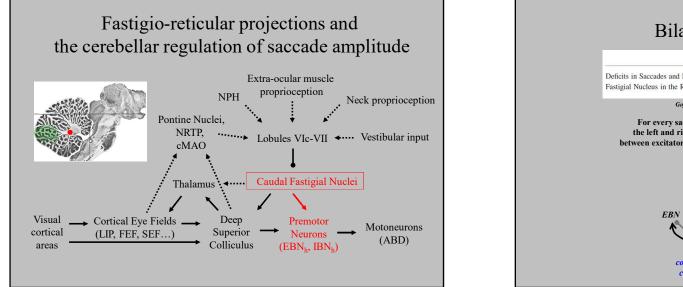


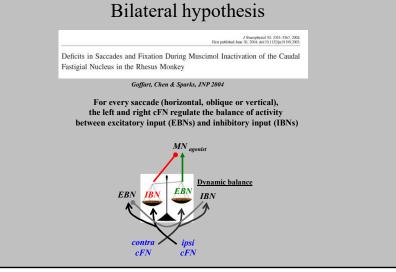


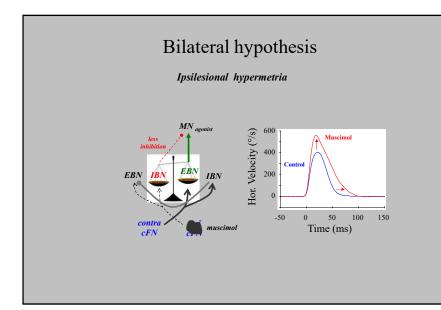


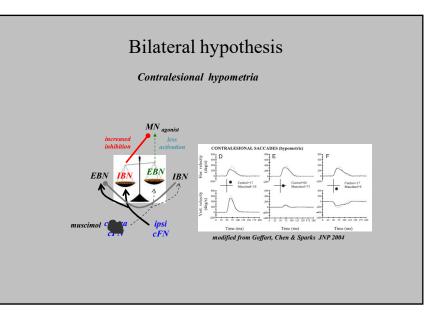


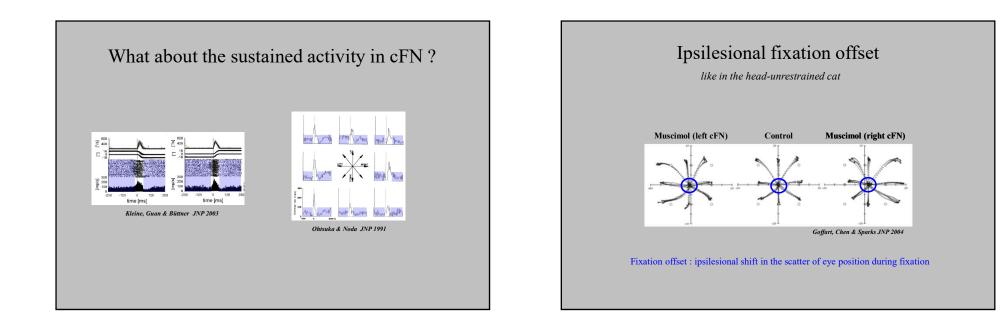


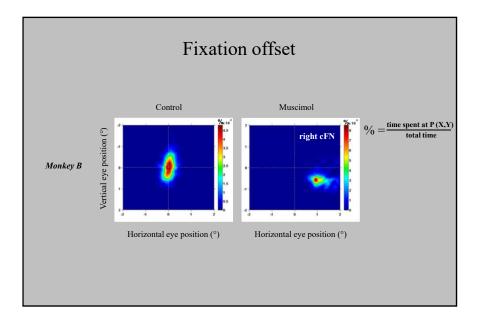


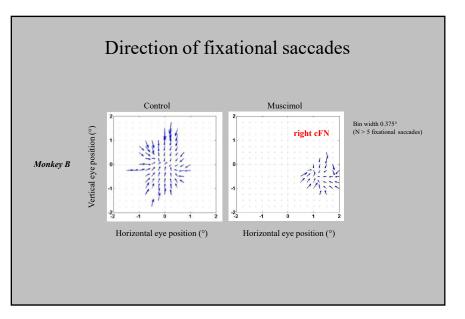


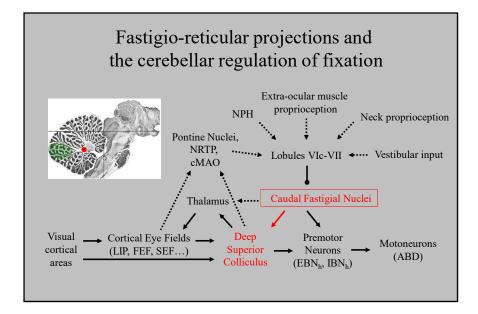








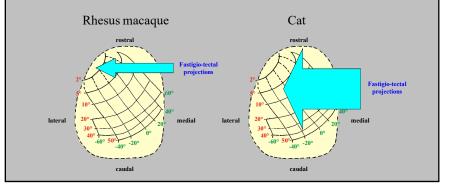




Behavioral and neuro-anatomical differences

In the monkey, a spatial deficit similar to that observed in the cat, is observed when one tests microsaccades generated when a visual target is being fixated.

This distinction could merely result from differences in the extent of fastigio-tectal projections.

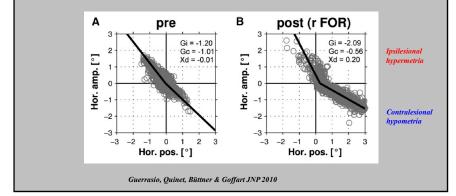


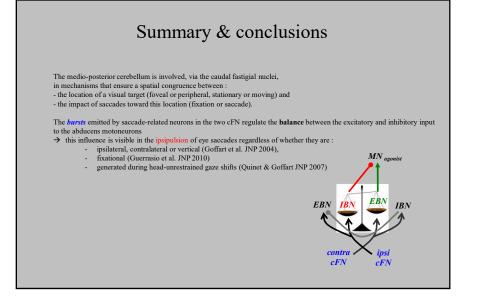
