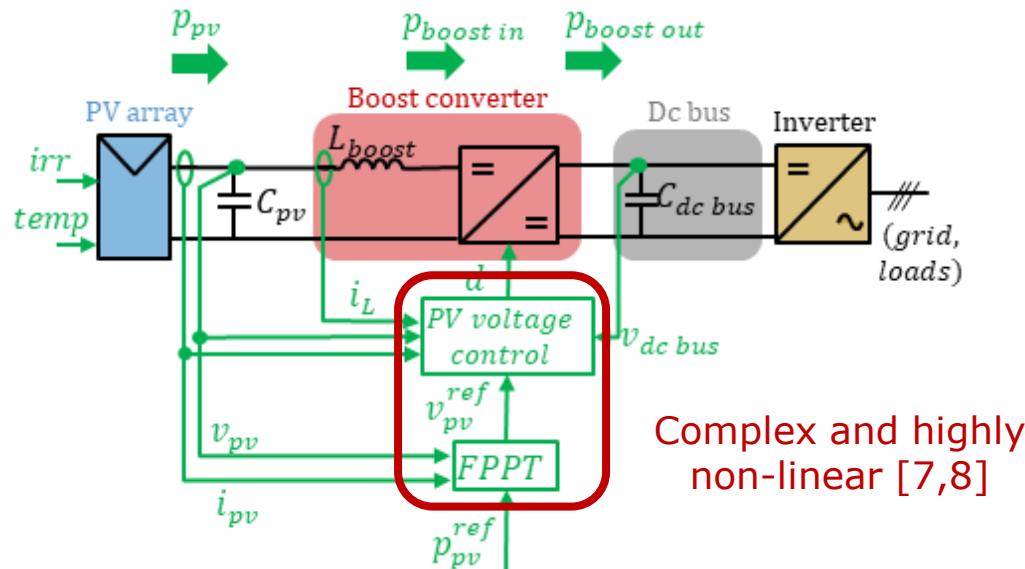

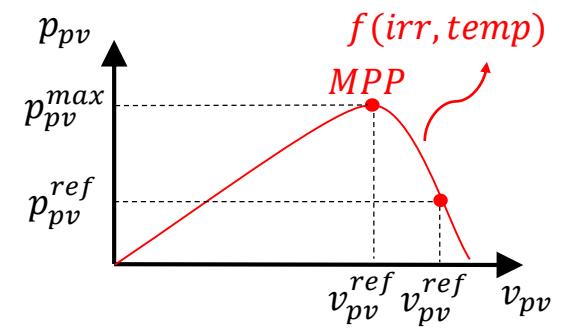

# 1. Introduction

- Electrical grids are experiencing an increased penetration of PV systems
- Traditionally, PVs are operated in grid-feeding mode (with MPPT algorithms)
- However, new uses are emerging:
  - Grid-feeding PVs + power limiting control [1,2]
  - Grid-forming PVs [3,4]
- Both **require substituting MPPTs by FPPTs** [5,6]



Complex and highly non-linear [7,8]

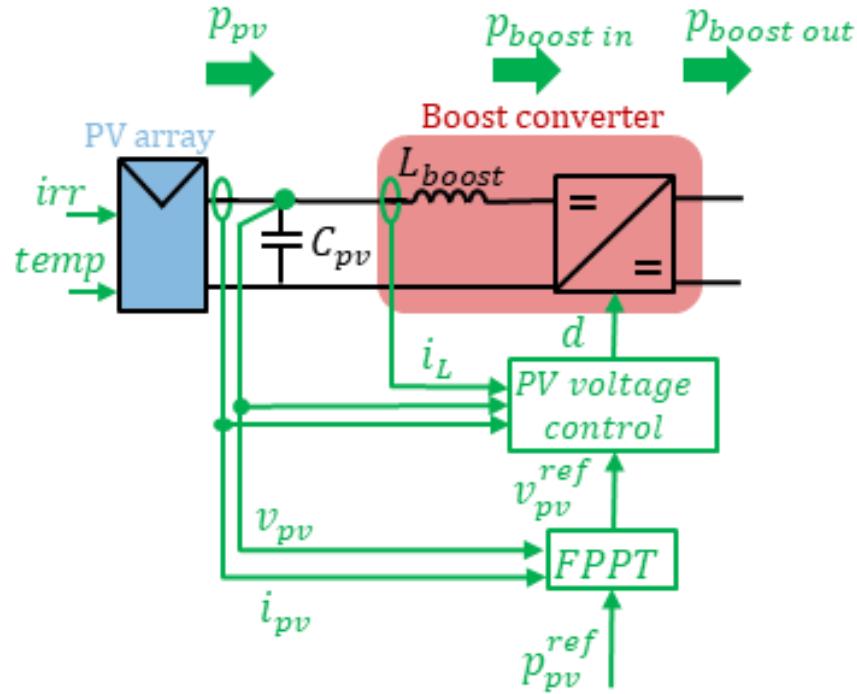


# 1. Introduction

- We propose a **simplified model for FPPT controlled PV systems**

  - Can be translated into differential equations, that can be easily linearized
  - Easy tuning
  - Reduced simulation times

# 4. Conclusions and perspectives

- **Conclusions:**

- The proposed model captures **the main dynamics of a FPPT-controlled PV system**  
(If the FPPT delay can be approximated by a transfer function)
- The main merit of the model is that **enables the linearization of highly non-linear systems**
- In addition, it benefits from an **easy tuning and short simulation times**

- **Perspectives:**

- Introduce the inverter's dc side dynamics in ac stability analyses
- Obtain the equivalent simplified model of other FPPTs

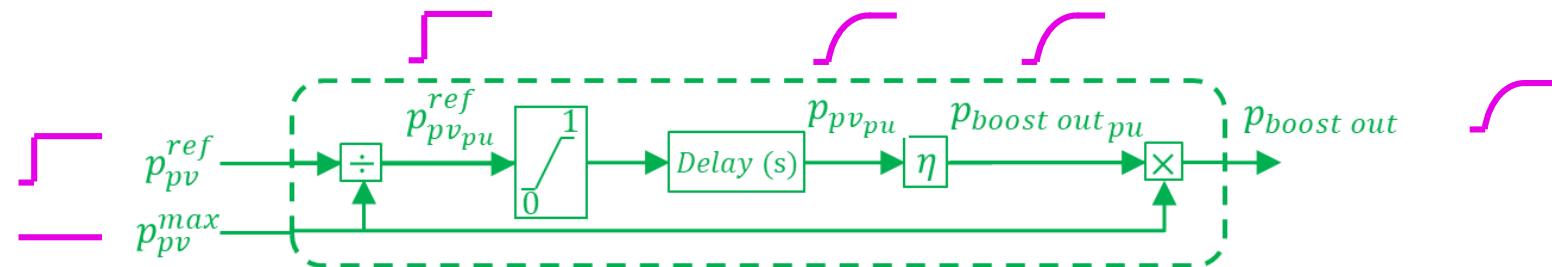
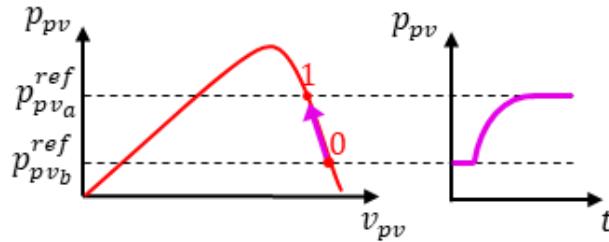
