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What effect does the level of production - Cow-Herd-Cheese Vat - have on the relationship between the detailed physico-chemical composition and the cheese-making properties of milk?

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Objective

To investigate the relationship between the detailed composition and the cheese-making properties (CMAPs) of milk at three levels of production (cow, herd, cheese vat). This study was conducted in Franche-Comté, leading French PDO region, and targeted milk produced by Montbéliarde cows (95% of cows milked in Franche-Comté and 2nd French dairy breed).



Conclusion

The number of explanatory variables decreases with the mix of milks (in connection with a lowest standard deviation of CMAP results). Statistical effects differ according to the level. Size of casein micelles and calcium content have most often a significate effect. Components of milk (calcium, size of casein micelles, etc.), other than protein or fat, explain from 17.7% to 51.0 % CMAP variations of individual milks.
