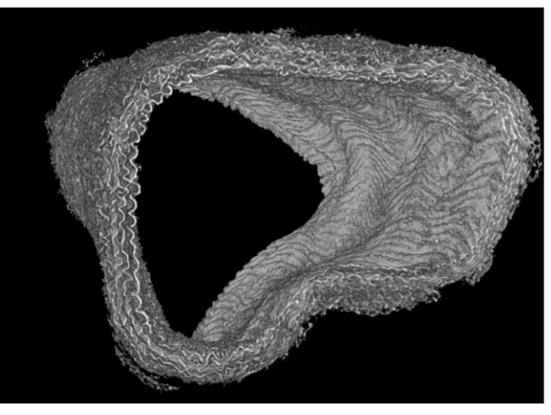






# **Conclusion and perspectives**
