Capillary waves: thermal excitation Surface tension \implies restoring force





Glycerol - a model glass former

- Bulk behavior comprehensively studied
- Easy handling
- Low cooling rate

Capillary wave model:

$$\sigma_{\rm eff}^2 = \sigma_0^2 + \frac{k_B T}{2\pi\gamma(T)} \ln\left(\frac{2q_{\rm max}}{q_z \Delta\beta}\right)$$

for T>T*





Diffuse scattering:



 $\alpha_i \neq \alpha_f$

Wave vector: $q = k_f - k_i$ "In-plane" scattering: (q_x , 0, q_z)

Fixed form of the ACF: $g_2(\tau) = g_0 \exp\left(-\frac{\tau}{\tau_0}\right) + 1$ with $\tau_0 = \frac{1}{\Delta \omega}$ $\Delta \omega = \frac{\gamma q_{||}}{2\eta}$

Theory: τ_0

$$\tau_0 = \frac{1}{\pi} \frac{\eta(T)}{\gamma(T)} x_0$$
