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Ionic transport properties in solid polymer electrolytes: in-plane versus through-plane



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Introduction

- *Context*: Conventional Li-ion batteries can leak and react. [1]. *Solution?* Replace the liquid electrolyte by a non-flammable dry **Solid Polymer Electrolyte (SPE)**.
- \succ Ionic transport properties in SPEs have been largely studied in *through-plane* (*L*) configuration. Conversely, in *In-plane* (//) configuration studies are only dedicated to ionic conductivity (σ) of PEO homopolymer doped with a Li salt [2].

Objectives

• *Goal*:

1- Understanding of the transport properties (conductivity σ , transference number t^+ and **diffusion** *D*) according to **chains morphology, nanostructuration or ionic clusters**.

2- Develop methodology to measure the transport properties in *through-plane* (//) vs. *in-plane* (L).

- *Experiments*: Measurements of various SPEs:
 - Homopolymer of PEO/LiTFSI
 - Copolymer based on PS-PEO-PS
 - *Single-ion* SPE crosslinked-silica hybrid PEO *Vinyl*-TFSILi (SI-CHSPE)
- *Comsol modeling*: Difference of potential (conductivity); relaxation of concentration gradients after a polarization step in // and L.







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 \blacktriangleright Our results demonstrate $\sigma_{output} = \sigma_{input}$ within < 4% of standard deviation
