## Chemical kinetics of representative quinones

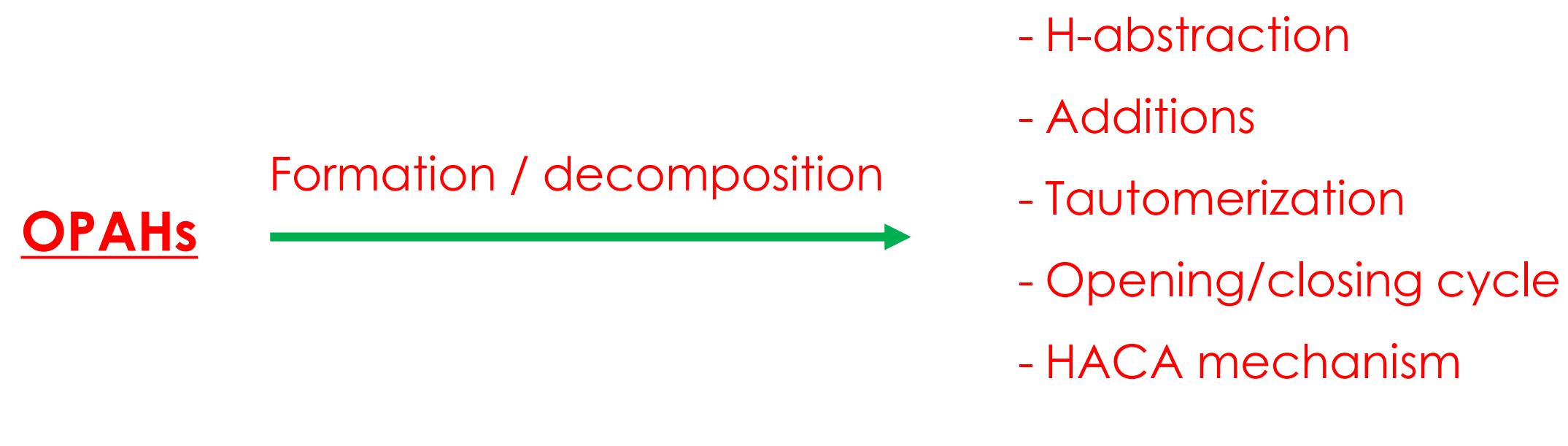

### Context

- ~80 % of global energy production come from the combustion of fossil fuels.
- Inclusion of more sustainable alternative fuels in combustion engines.

Incomplete combustion process: Formation PAHs / OPAHs  
 → Impact on the environment and human health  
 → Fundamental still not understood

- From literature [1-2], OPAHs with larger ring sizes and involving chemical structures that include not only furans, but also fluorenones, aromatic ketones or quinones.



### Quantum chemical calculations: Gaussian 16

- Optimisation + frequencies: CAM-B3LYP/6-311+G(2d,p)
- CBS limit energy: modified CBS-QB3 composite method (denoted CBS-Q')

### Thermokinetic data: ThermRot [3]

- The rate constants were determined from the Transition State Theory (TST):

$$k(T) = \kappa \sigma \frac{k_B T}{h} \frac{Q_{TS}(T)}{Q_R(T)} \exp\left(-\frac{E_a}{RT}\right)$$

- The partition function of internal rotations were computed using a modified 1-DHR approach by using the ThermRot software [3]
- Rate coefficients were fitted over the temperatures ( $\alpha$ ,  $n$ ,  $E_a$ ) range 500 - 2000 K, with a three parameters Arrhenius expressions:

$$k(T) = AT^n \exp\left(-\frac{E_a}{RT}\right)$$

### Symbols:

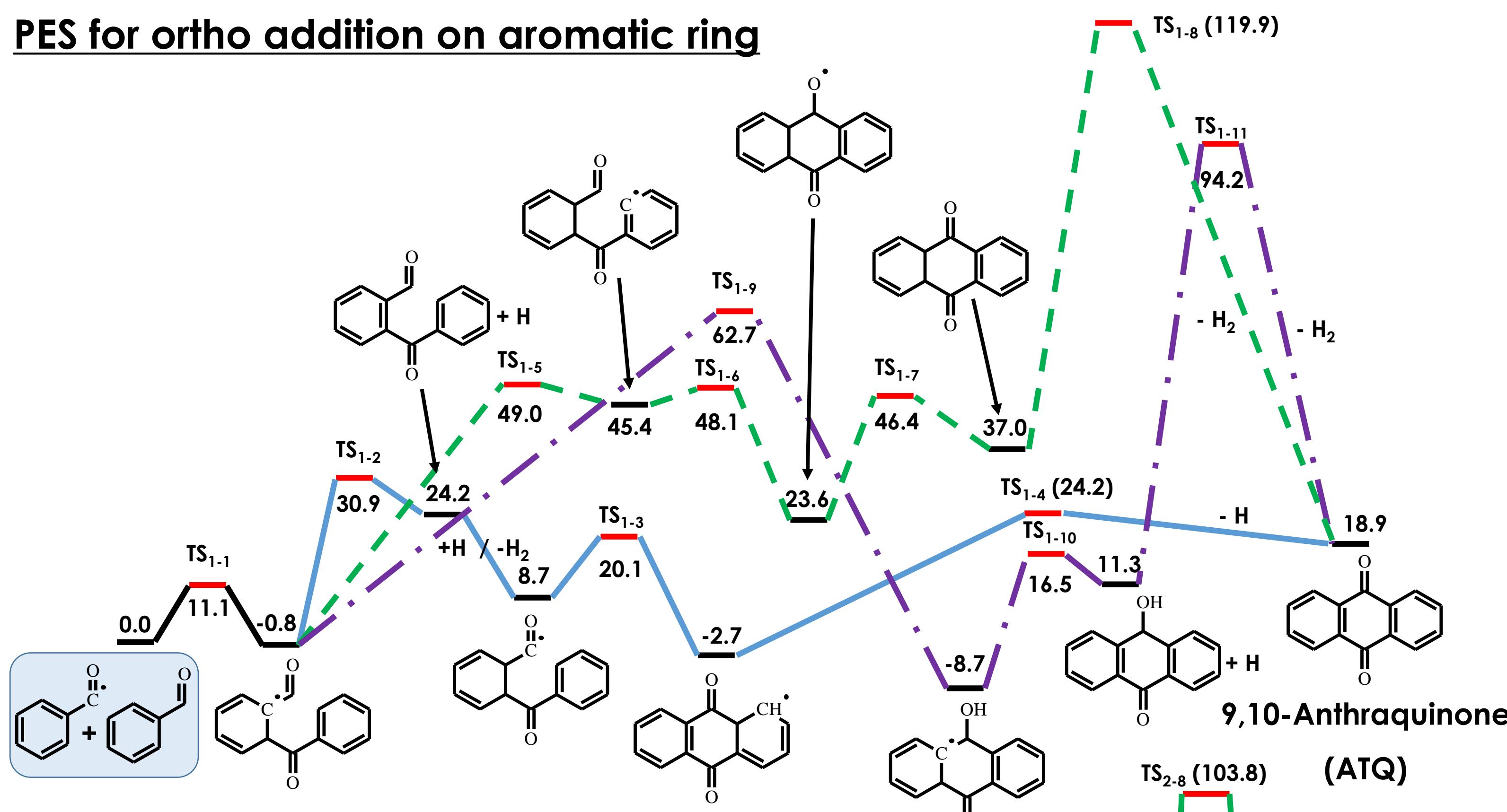
- $Q_R$ ;  $Q_{TS}$ : global partition function of reactants and TSs;
- $E_a$ : barrier height at 0K;
- $\kappa$ : transmission coefficient (Eckart 1-D);
- $\sigma$ : reaction path degeneracy.

### Aim

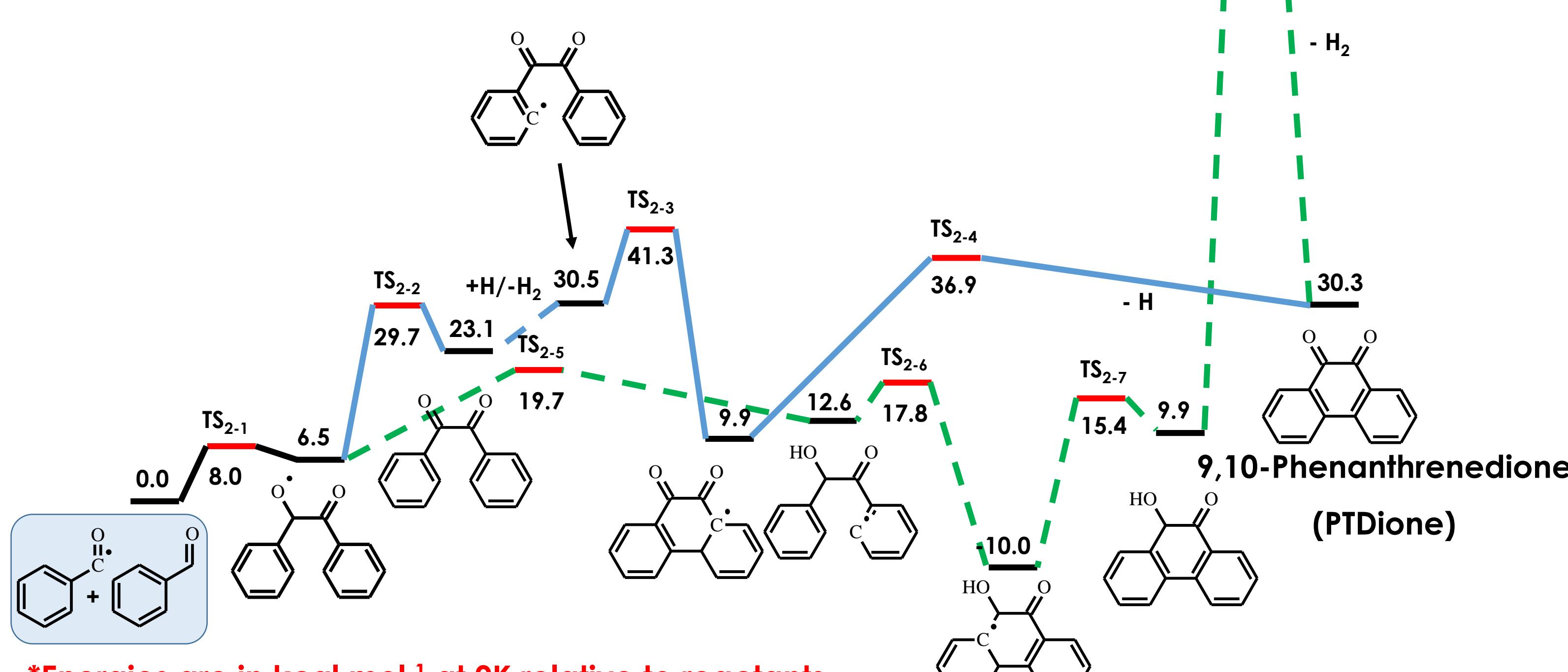
Calculate and evaluate the kinetic constants for the formation of quinones

### Results

#### PES for ortho addition on aromatic ring



#### PES for addition on carbonyl site

### Conclusion

- We have studied the chemistry of formation of representative quinones by recombination of the benzoyl radical and benzaldehyde, leading to the formation of anthraquinone and phenanthrenedione.
- The different pathway include: addition, isomerisation, H-abstraction, closing cycle and  $\beta$ -scission reactions.
- The pathways conducting to 9,10-anthraquinone is the most favourable.
