## Introduction

- Speech production and speech perception abilities are closely linked and shaped in relation with individual variability<sup>1,2</sup>.
- This individual variability can be related to differences in developmental trajectories<sup>3,4</sup>.
- Recent studies<sup>5,6</sup> showed that orofacial somatosensory inputs modulate the speech perception and this effect can be also attributed to their role in speech production.
- We thus hypothesized that individual variability of speech production performance can represent the size of somatosensory effect in speech perception.

## Aim

To examine whether the individual difference of somatosensory effect in speech perception were correlated with individual difference of speech production.

## Methods

- > Twenty-two French native speakers participated in both perception and production test.
- > Correlation analysis was carried out between speech perception and production indexes.
- **Perception index:** Change of categorical boundary due to somatosensory stimulation.
- **Production index:** Difference in the first, second and third formant (F1,F2,and F3) between /e/ and /ø/.
- Speech perception test with somatosensory stimulation
- Vowel identification test between /e/-/ø/ continuum.
- The facial skin-stretch was applied when the stimulus sound was presented.
