- Normal thermal behavior (max .150 mW realeased)
- . Abnormal thermal behavior (max. 650 mW realeased)
- **b** Detection and quantification of the unexpected heat release



- . Usual AE events (2.1 fJ / AE event)
- . Abnormal AE events (44 fJ / AE event)

#### **b** high energy acoustic events early detected during heat release



- . Color gradient (waveform evolution) with SoC
- . Specific signal noticed during abnormal thermal behavior

 $\clubsuit$  Significant change in the material's sound wave transportation properties
