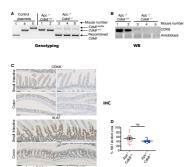
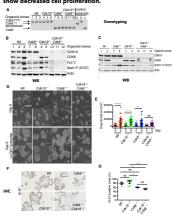


Fig 5. (A) Genotyping confirms the loss of Cddd exen 2 in intestine apthelium from Ape. "Cddd" risec. Control plannists is, but and a lex described in Fig 14. (B) of Cdd exercised in Cdd exercised in

Fig 7. Double CDK8/CDK19 knockout intestinal organoids show decreased cell proliferation.



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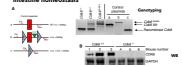


Fig 1. Mouse Cdk8 conditional knockout by Lov/Cre targeting of exon 2. (A) Left, scheme representing the control plasmids (a, b, and c) for Wil. filtered and recombined Cdk8 exon 2. Reft) genotyping of Cdk8 exon 2. Reft mouse testeral algorithmian. All mice were treated with Tampalien to induce recombination of the Loxer black. The recombination recombination of the Loxer black. The recombination of the Codk Left and C

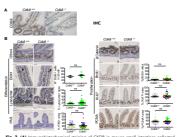
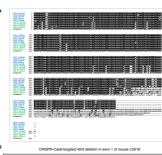


Fig. 2. (A) immunohistochemical staining of CXDB in mouse small intentines collected two months after tamoufien treatment. (B) Analysis of coil differentiation (field) and profileration (right) in the intensine after CXDB deletion (in a N, Olfind, Lypomine, PMS of the CXDB deletion (in a N, Olfind, Lypomine, PMS of the CXDB deletion (in a N, Olfind, Lypomine, PMS of the CXDB deletion (in a N, Olfind, Lypomine, PMS of the CXDB deletion (in a N, Olfind, Lypomine, PMS of the CXDB deletion (in a Notice of the CXDB deletion (in a Notice of the CXDB deletion (in a Notice of the CXDB deletion of cancer cells (cytoplasmic or nuclear bodization) cells represent the percentage of the area stained by each antibody (relative to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area analysed. For policy of the area stained by each antibody freshive to the area and analysed for policy of the area and analysed for policy of the area and analysed. For policy of the area analysed for policy of the area and analysed for policy of the area

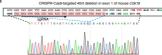


Fig 8. Functional redundancy between CDK8 and CDK19 in regulation of gene expression -Significant alteration of genes also modulated in intestinal KOs of the Cystic Fibrosis Transmembrane conductance Regulator (CFTR) in the Cdk8+/Cdk19+/KO

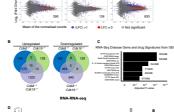




Fig. 8. (A) Dot plot analysis of differentially expressed genes (DEGs). Red dots: DEGs with proble is 0.05; purple dots: Deg (bid charge (EFG) 5 or <1; proble is 0.05; gray docks not significant humbers insight place in Modical the number of genes densighable docks not significant humbers insight place in the degree of the place in the place of the place in the place

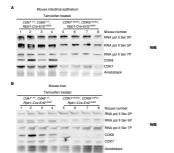


Fig 4. CDK8 loss does not affect chemically-induced intestinal carcinogenesis.

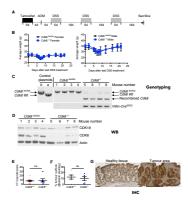
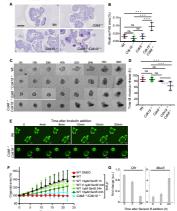


Fig. 4. (A) Scheme showing the steps of the AOM/DSS carcinogenesis experiment. (B)
