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# Complex vs etale Abel Jacobi map for higher Chow groups and algebraicity of the zero locus of etale normal functions

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#### Abstract

We prove, using $p$-adic Hodge theory for open algebraic varieties, that for a smooth projective variety over a field $k \subset \mathbb{C}$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$, the complex abel jacobi map vanishes if the etale abel jacobi map vanishes. This implies that for a smooth projective morphism $f: X \rightarrow S$ of smooth complex algebraic varieties over a field $k \subset \mathbb{C}$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ and $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)^{f, \partial=0}$ an algebraic cycle flat over $S$ whose cohomology class vanishes on fibers, the zero locus of the etale normal function associated to $Z$ is contained in the zero locus of the complex normal function associated to $Z$. From the work of Saito or Charles, we deduce that the zero locus of the complex normal function associated to $Z$ is defined over $\bar{k}$ if the zero locus of the etale normal function associated to $Z$ is not empty. We also prove an algebraicity result for the zero locus of an etale normal function associated to an algebraic cycle over a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. By the way, we get that the Hodge conjecture implies the Tate conjecture for smooth projective variety over fields of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ (in particular we get Tate conjecture for divisors), and a for a smooth projective morphism $f: X \rightarrow S$ of smooth complex algebraic varieties over a field $k \subset \mathbb{C}$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$, the locus of Hodge Tate classes inside the locus of Hodge classes of $f$.


## 1 Introduction

Let $X$ be a connected smooth projective variety over $\mathbb{C}$. The Abel-Jacobi map associates to a cycle $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$ homologically equivalent to 0 of codimension $d$, a point $A J(X)(Z) \in J^{d}(X)$ in the intermediate Jacobian of $X$. In family, if $f: X \rightarrow S$ is a smooth projective morphism of smooth connected complex varieties and $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$ is a relative cycle on $S$ of codimension $d$ homologicaly trivial on fibers, the Abel-Jacobi map provides a holomorphic and horizontal section of the relative intermediate Jacobian : $\nu_{Z}: S \rightarrow J^{d}(X / S)$ called the associated normal function. By a Brosnan-Pearlstein theorem, the zero-locus $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset S$ and more generally the torsion locus $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset V_{\text {tors }}\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset S$ of $\nu_{Z}$ is an algebraic subvariety ([3]). If $X / S$ and $Z$ are defined over a subfield $k \subset \mathbb{C}$, we conjecture in the spirit of the Bloch-Beilinson conjectures, that the zero-locus of the normal function is also defined over $k$ (see [7]).

On the other hand, if $k$ is of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}, X$ is a connected smooth projective variety over $k$, and $p$ is a prime number, we can define via the continuous étale cohomology with $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$ coefficients an etale Abel-Jacobi map which associate to a cycle $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)$ homologically equivalent to 0 of codimension $d$, an element $A J^{\text {et,p }}(X)(Z) \in H^{1}\left(G, H^{2 d-1-n}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)\right)$ of the first degree Galois cohomology of the absolute galois group $G:=\operatorname{Gal}(\bar{k} / k)$ with value in the etale cohomology of $X_{\bar{k}}$ with $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$ coefficients. In family, we get, for $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth projective morphism of smooth connected varieties over $k$ and $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)$ a relative cycle on $S$ of codimension $d$ homologicaly trivial on fibers, a normal function $\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}$ associated to $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)$ and thus a zero-locus $V\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right) \subset S$ and more generally a torsion locus $V\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right) \subset V_{\text {tors }}\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right) \subset S$ of $\nu_{Z}^{e t}$ which are subsets of closed points of $S$. For $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding, and $V \subset S$ a subset, we denote $V_{\mathbb{C}}:=\pi_{k / \mathbb{C}}(S)^{-1}(V) \subset S_{\mathbb{C}}$ where $\pi_{k / \mathbb{C}}(S): S_{\mathbb{C}} \rightarrow S$ is the projection.

Let $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ and $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth projective morphism of smooth connected varieties over $k$. Let $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$ a relative cycle. F. Charles then proves that for any embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$

- assuming that $R^{2 d-1} f_{*}^{a n}(\mathbb{C})$ has no global sections then $V\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right)_{\mathbb{C}}=V\left(\nu_{Z}\right)([7])$
- if $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right)(\bar{k})$ is non-empty then it is defined over $k([8])$.

In this work, we show that, for a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}, X$ a connected smooth projective variety over $k, Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, *)$ an (higher) algebraic cycle homologically equivalent to 0 of codimension $d$, and $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number, if $A J^{e t, p}(X)(Z)=0$ then $A J_{\sigma}(X)(Z):=A J\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}\right)\left(Z_{\mathbb{C}}\right)=0$ for any embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ (c.f. theorem 6). This implies by definition that for $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth projective morphism of smooth connected varieties over a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$, and $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, *)$ a relative cycle on $S$ of codimension $d$ homologicaly trivial on fibers,

for any embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ without any assumption (c.f. corollary $3(\mathrm{i})$ ). We deduce that if $V\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right)$ is not empty, $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right)$ is defined over $k$ (c.f. corollary 3(ii)).
The proof of theorem 6 uses $p$-adic Hodge theory for open varieties to relate de Rham cohomology and its Hodge filtration to $p$-adic étale coholomogy with its Galois action. Theorem 6 follows indeed from the fact that by proposition $2(\mathrm{ii})$ and proposition 1 , we have for a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}, U \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$, and embeddings $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}, \sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ for a prime $p \in \mathbb{N}$, for each $j, l \in \mathbb{Z}$, a canonical injective map

which is by construction functorial in $U \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ (see theorem 1 ). In fact for the proof theorem 6 , we only need point (i) of proposition 2. More precisely, if the étale Abel-Jacobi image of a cycle $Z$ is zero,

- there exist a Galois invariant class $\alpha$ in the étale cohomology of $\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash Z\right)_{\bar{k}}$ with non-zero boundary, where $\bar{k}$ is an algebraic closure of $k$,
- then, by $p$ adic Hodge theory for $\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash Z, \alpha$ define a logarithmic de Rham class $w(\alpha)$ laying inside the right degree of the Hodge filtration of $\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash Z\right)_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ (c.f.proposition 2(i)) where $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ is the completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$, this class $w(\alpha)$ is defined over $k^{\prime} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ of finite type over $k$
- taking the image of this class by the complex period map with respect an embedding $\sigma^{\prime}: k^{\prime} \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ extending the given embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$, we get a Betti cohomology class ev $\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash Z\right)(w(\alpha))$ of $\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash Z\right)_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}$ with $2 i \pi \mathbb{Z}$ coefficients (c.f. proposition 1 ),
- this last class $(1 / 2 i \pi) \operatorname{ev}\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash Z\right)(w(\alpha))$ induce a splitting of the localization exact sequence of mixed Hodge structures :

which means that the complex Abel-Jacobi image de $Z$ is zero.
By the way, since for $X \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k), \iota_{p, e v}^{G, d}(X)$ is compatible with cycle class maps, we get in particular that Hodge conjecture implies Tate conjecture. In particular, we get Tate conjecture for divisors for smooth projective varieties over fields of characteristic zero.
In section 6 , we show that, for $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth projective morphism of connected smooth varieties over a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}, Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, *)$ an (higher) algebraic cycle homologically equivalent to 0 of codimension $d$, and $p$ a prime number for all expect finitely many prime numbers $p \in \mathbb{N}$

where $T \subset S$ is the image of closed points of a constructible algebraic subset of

by the projection $p_{S}: E_{D R}^{2 d-1}\left(\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash|Z|\right)_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} / S_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}\right) \rightarrow S_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$, where $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ is the completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$ (c.f. definition 6 and theorem $7(\mathrm{i})$ ). We also give a local version for $V_{\text {tors }}\left(\nu_{Z, \sigma_{p}}^{e t, p}\right) \subset S$ (c.f. theorem $7(\mathrm{ii})$ ). The proof use De Yong alterations to get a stratification $S=\sqcup_{\alpha \in \Lambda} S^{\alpha}$ by locally closed subsets and alterations $\pi^{\alpha}:\left(X_{S^{\alpha}} \times \square^{n}\right)^{\alpha} \rightarrow X_{S^{\alpha}} \times \square^{n}$ such that

f \circ \pi^{\alpha}:\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right)_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\alpha}, \pi^{\alpha,-1}(|Z|)\right) \rightarrow S_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\alpha}

is a semi-stable morphism. We then use the $p$ adic semi-stable comparison theorem for semi-stable morphisms $f^{\prime}:\left(X^{\prime}, D^{\prime}\right) \rightarrow S^{\prime}$, with $S^{\prime}, X^{\prime}, D^{\prime} \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}\left(\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)$, that is satisfying

- $f^{\prime}: X^{\prime} \rightarrow S$ is smooth projective, $D^{\prime} \subset X^{\prime}$ is a normal crossing divisor,
- for all $s \in S^{\prime}, D_{s}^{\prime} \subset X_{s}^{\prime}$ is a normal crossing divisor and ( $X_{s}^{\prime}, D_{s}^{\prime}$ ) has integral model with semi-stable reduction,
(or more generally for log smooth morphism of schemes over $\left(O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}, N_{\mathcal{O}}\right)$ ), which gives, for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ a canonical filtered isomorphism

which is for each $s \in S^{\prime}$ compatible with the action of the Galois group $\operatorname{Gal}\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} / k(s)\right)$, the Frobenius and the monodromy: for all but finitely many primes $p, \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}(s)$ is unramified for all embeddings $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ and all $s \in S^{\prime}$, so that we get a Frobenius action on $R^{j} f_{* H d g}^{\prime}\left(O_{U^{\prime}}, F_{b}\right)_{s}=H_{D R}^{j}\left(U_{s}^{\prime}\right)$ for all $s \in S^{\prime}$.

This also give (see theorem 8) together with theorem 1, for $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth projective morphism, with $S, X$ smooth over a field $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$, and $p$ any but finitely many prime numbers, the locus of Hodge-Tate classes $\left(H^{j} R f_{* \mathbb{Q}_{p, X \frac{e t}{k}}}(d)\right)^{G}$ where $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ and $\bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}$ is its algebraic closure

inside the locus of Hodge classes $H L_{j, d, \sigma}(X / S):=H L_{j, d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}} / S_{\mathbb{C}}\right) \subset E_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}} / S_{\mathbb{C}}\right)$, which is a countable union of algebraic subvarieties by the work of Deligne, Catani and Kaplan, where

- $E_{D R}^{j}(X / S):=H^{j} \int_{f}\left(O_{X}, F_{b}\right)=R^{j} f_{*} \Omega_{X / S}^{\bullet}$ and $E_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}} / S_{\mathbb{C}}\right):=H^{j} \int_{f}\left(O_{X_{\mathbb{C}}}, F_{b}\right)$ are the filtered algebraic vector bundles over $S$ and $S_{\mathbb{C}}$ respectively which have the Gauss-Manin integrable connexion,
- $S=\sqcup_{\alpha \in \Lambda} S^{\alpha}$ is a stratification by locally closed algebraic subsets, $\Lambda$ being a finite set,
- $\pi^{\alpha}: X^{\alpha} \rightarrow X_{S^{\alpha}}$ being alterations, in particular we get sub vector bundles $\pi^{\alpha, *}: E_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{S^{\alpha}} / S^{\alpha}\right):=$ $E_{D R}^{j}(X / S)_{\mid S^{\alpha}} \hookrightarrow E_{D R}^{j}\left(X^{\alpha} / S^{\alpha}\right)$,
- $E_{D R}^{j}(X / S) \subset E_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} / S_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}\right)$ is the canonical subset of closed points,

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## 2 Preliminaries and Notations

- Denote by Top the category of topological spaces and RTop the category of ringed spaces.
- Denote by Cat the category of small categories and RCat the category of ringed topos.
- For $\mathcal{S} \in$ Cat and $X \in \mathcal{S}$, we denote $\mathcal{S} / X \in$ Cat the category whose objects are $Y / X:=(Y, f)$ with $Y \in \mathcal{S}$ and $f: Y \rightarrow X$ is a morphism in $\mathcal{S}$, and whose morphisms Hom $\left(\left(Y^{\prime}, f^{\prime}\right),(Y, f)\right)$ consists of $g: Y^{\prime} \rightarrow Y$ in $\mathcal{S}$ such that $f \circ g=f^{\prime}$.
- For $\mathcal{S} \in$ Cat denote $\operatorname{Gr} \mathcal{S}:=\operatorname{Fun}(\mathbb{Z}, \mathcal{S})$ is the category of graded objects.
- Denote by Ab the category of abelian groups. For $R$ a ring denote by $\operatorname{Mod}(R)$ the category of (left) $R$ modules. We have then the forgetful functor $o_{R}: \operatorname{Mod}(R) \rightarrow \mathrm{Ab}$.
- Denote by AbCat the category of small abelian categories.
- For $\left(\mathcal{S}, O_{S}\right) \in$ RCat a ringed topos, we denote by

- For $\mathcal{X} \in$ Cat a (pre)site and $p$ a prime number, we consider the full subcategory

$-X^{s m} \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / X$ the full subcategory consisting of objects $U / X=(X, h) \in \operatorname{Sch} / X$ such that $h: U \rightarrow X$ is a smooth morphism.

For a field $k$, we consider $\operatorname{Sch} / k:=\operatorname{Sch} / \operatorname{Spec} k$ the category of schemes over Spec $k$. We then denote by

For a morphism of field $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow K$, we have the extention of scalar functor

For $X=\left(X, a_{X}\right) \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$, we have $\operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / X=\operatorname{Var}(k) / X$ since for $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ a morphism of schemes of finite type, $\left(X^{\prime}, a_{X} \circ f\right) \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ is the unique structure of variety over $k$ of $X^{\prime} \in$ Sch such that $f$ becomes a morphism of algebraic varieties over $k$, in particular we have

A morphism $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ with $X, X^{\prime} \in \operatorname{Var}(K)$ is said to be defined over $k$ if $X \simeq X_{0} \otimes_{k} K$ and $X^{\prime} \simeq X_{0}^{\prime} \otimes_{k} K$ are defined over $k$ and $\Gamma_{f}=\Gamma_{f_{0}} \otimes_{k} K \subset X^{\prime} \times X$ is defined over $k$, so that $f_{0} \otimes_{k} K=f$ with $f_{0}: X_{0}^{\prime} \rightarrow X_{0}$.

- For $X \in$ Sch and $s \in \mathbb{N}$, we denote by $X_{(s)} \subset X$ its points of dimension $s$, in particular $X_{(0)} \subset X$ are the closed points of $X$.
- For $X \in \operatorname{Sch}$ and $k$ a field we denote by $X(k):=\operatorname{Hom}_{S c h}(\operatorname{Spec} k, X)$ the $k$ points of $X$. We get $X(k)_{i n} \subset X$ the image of the $k$-points of $X$. For $k \subset k^{\prime}$ a subfield, $\mathbb{A}_{k^{\prime}}^{N}(k)_{i n}=k^{N} \subset k^{\prime N} \subset \mathbb{A}_{k^{\prime}}^{N}$ and $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{N}\left(k^{\prime}\right)_{i n}=\pi_{k / k^{\prime}}\left(\mathbb{A}_{k}^{N}\right)\left(k^{\prime N}\right) \subset \mathbb{A}_{k}^{N}$.
- For $X \in$ Sch, we denote $X^{\text {pet }} \subset$ Sch $/ X$ the pro etale site (see [2]) which is the full subcategory of Sch / $X$ whose object consists of weakly etale maps $U \rightarrow X$ (that is flat maps $U \rightarrow X$ such that $\Delta_{U}: U \rightarrow U \times_{X} U$ is also flat) and whose topology is generated by fpqc covers. - Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero and $k_{0} \subset k$ a subfield. We say that $k$ is of finite type over $k_{0}$ if $k$ is generated as a field by $k_{0}$ and a finite set $\left\{\alpha_{1}, \ldots, \alpha_{r}\right\} \subset k$ of elements of $k$, that is $k=k_{0}\left(\alpha_{1}, \ldots, \alpha_{r}\right)$. If $k$ is of finite type over $k_{0}$ then it is of finite transcendence degree $d \in \mathbb{N}$ over $k_{0}$ and $k=k_{0}\left(\alpha_{1}, \ldots, \alpha_{d}\right)\left(\alpha_{d+1}\right)$ with $\left\{\alpha_{1}, \ldots, \alpha_{d+1}\right\} \subset k$ such that $k_{0}\left(\alpha_{1}, \ldots, \alpha_{d}\right)=k_{0}\left(x_{1}, \ldots, x_{d}\right)$ and $\alpha_{d+1}$ is an algebraic element of $k$ over $k_{0}\left(\alpha_{1}, \ldots, \alpha_{d}\right)$. Note that if $k$ is of finite type over $k_{0}$ then it is NOT algebraicly closed. We denote $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$. Then $\bar{k}$ is also transcendence degree $d$ over $k$.
- Let $C$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(C)$. Then there exist a subfield $k \subset C$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ such that $X$ is defined over $k$ that is $X \simeq X_{0} \otimes_{k} \mathbb{C}$ with $X_{0} \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$.
- Let $k \subset \overline{\mathbb{Q}}$ be a number field, i.e. a finite extension of $\mathbb{Q}$. There exists a finite set of prime number $\delta(k)$ such that for all prime number $p \in \mathbb{N} \backslash \delta(k)$ we have for all each embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ $\mathbb{Q}_{p} \cap k=\mathbb{Q}$.
- Let $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in$ RCat a ringed topos, we have in $C(X)$ the subcomplex of presheaves of abelian group

- Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}:=D R(X)\left(O_{X}\right)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H_{D R}^{j}(X):=\mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$. If $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$, then $H_{D R}^{j}(X)=\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$ since $\Omega^{\bullet} \in C(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ is $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ local and admits transfert (see [5]).
- Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover. For $I \subset[1, \ldots, s]$, we denote $X_{I}:=\cap_{i \in I} X_{i}$. - For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ irreducible and $d, n \in \mathbb{N}$, we denote by $\mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)_{h o m}^{\partial=0} \subset \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, \bullet)^{\partial=0}$ the the subabelian group consisting of algebraic cycles which are homologicaly trivial.
- For $f: X \rightarrow S$ a dominant morphism with $S, X \in \operatorname{Sch}$ noetherian irreducible and $d \in \mathbb{N}$, we denote by $\mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, \bullet)^{f} \subset \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, \bullet)$ the subcomplex consisting of algebraic cycles which are flat over $S$.
- For $f: X \rightarrow S$ a dominant morphism with $S, X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ irreducible and $d, n \in \mathbb{N}$ we denote by $\mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)_{f h o m}^{f, \partial=0} \subset \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)^{f, \partial=0}$ the subabelian group consisting of algebraic cycles which are flat over $S$ and homological trivial on fibers.
- We denote $\mathbb{I}^{n}:=[0,1]^{n} \in \operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R})$ (with boundary). For $X \in \operatorname{Top}$ and $R$ a ring, we consider its singular cochain complex

- For $X \in \operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R})$, the restriction map

Since a convex open subset of $\mathbb{C}^{d}$ is biholomorphic to an open ball we have $\mathbb{D}_{I}:=\cap_{i \in I} \mathbb{D}_{i} \simeq D(0,1)^{d}$ (where $d$ is the dimension of a connected component of $X)$. We get $\mathbb{D}_{\bullet} \in \operatorname{Fun}(P([1, \ldots, r]), \operatorname{AnSm}(\mathbb{C}))$.
- For $k$ a field, we denote by $\operatorname{Vect}(k)$ the category of vector spaces and $\operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(k)$ the category of filtered vector spaces. Let $k \subset K$ a field extension of field of characteristic zero.
- For $(V, F) \in \operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(k)$, we get a filtered $K$ vector space $\left(V \otimes_{k} K, F\right) \in \operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(K)$ by $F^{j}\left(V \otimes_{k}\right.$ $K):=\left(F^{j} V\right) \otimes_{k} K$. In this case, we say that the filtration $F$ on $V \otimes_{k} K$ is defined over $k$.
- For $\left(V^{\prime}, F\right) \in \operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(K)$ and $h: V \otimes_{k} K \xrightarrow{\sim} V^{\prime}$ and isomorphism of $K$ vector space, we get $\left(V, F_{h}\right) \in \operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(k)$ by $F_{h}^{j} V:=h^{-1}\left(F^{j} V^{\prime}\right) \cap V$ (considering the canonical embedding $\left.n: V \hookrightarrow V \otimes_{k} K, n(v):=v \otimes 1\right)$.
- For $(V, F) \in \operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(k)$, we have $F^{j}\left(V \otimes_{k} K\right) \cap V=F^{j} V$.
- For $\left(V^{\prime}, F\right) \in \operatorname{Vect}_{f i l}(K)$ and $h: V \otimes_{k} K \xrightarrow{\sim} V^{\prime}$ and isomorphism of $K$ vector space, we have $h\left(\left(F_{h}^{j} V\right) \otimes_{k} K\right) \subset F^{j} V^{\prime}$. Of course this inclusion is NOT an equality in general. The filtration $F$ on $V^{\prime}$ is NOT defined over $k$ in general.

- $\mathrm{RTop}_{2}$ the category whose objects are couples $(X, Y)$ with $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in$ RTop and $Y \subset X$ a subset and whose set of morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Y^{\prime}\right),(X, Y)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ of ringed spaces such that $Y^{\prime} \subset f^{-1}(Y)$,
- Top ${ }^{2}$ the category whose objects are couples $(X, Z)$ with $X \in \operatorname{Top}$ and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset and whose set of morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right),(X, Z)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ continuous such that $f^{-1}(Z) \subset Z^{\prime}$ (i.e. $\left.f\left(X^{\prime} \backslash Z^{\prime}\right) \subset X \backslash Z\right)$, in particular we have the canonical functor $\mathrm{Top}^{2} \rightarrow \mathrm{Top}_{2},(X, Z) \mapsto(X, X \backslash Z)$,
- RTop ${ }^{2}$ the category whose objects are couples $(X, Z)$ with $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in$ RTop and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset and whose set of morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right),(X, Z)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ of ringed spaces such that $f^{-1}(Z) \subset Z^{\prime}$, in particular we have the canonical functor $\mathrm{RTop}^{2} \rightarrow$ $\mathrm{RTop}_{2},(X, Z) \mapsto(X, X \backslash Z)$.

A (generalized) cohomology theory is in particular a functor $H^{*}: \operatorname{Top}_{2} \rightarrow \operatorname{GrAb}$, e.g singular cohomology

- Denote $\mathrm{Sch}^{2} \subset \mathrm{RTop}^{2}$ the subcategory whose objects are couples $(X, Z)$ with $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in \mathrm{Sch}$ and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset and whose set of morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right),(X, Z)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow$ $X$ of locally ringed spaces such that $f^{-1}(Z) \subset Z^{\prime}$.
- Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Denote $\operatorname{SmVar}{ }^{2}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}^{2}(k) \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{2} / k$ the full subcategories whose objects are $(X, Z)$ with $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$, resp. $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$, and $Z \subset X$ is a closed subset, and whose morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right) \rightarrow(X, Z)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ of schemes over $k$ such that $f^{-1}(Z) \subset Z^{\prime}$.

of the first row exact sequence. In particular the second row is also an exact sequence.

- We denote by $\log$ Sch the category of $\log$ schemes whose objects are couples $(X, M):=(X, M, \alpha)$ where $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in \operatorname{Sch}, M \in \operatorname{Shv}(X)$ is a sheaf of monoid and $\alpha: M \rightarrow O_{X}$ is a morphism of sheaves of monoid. In particular we have a canonical functor

- An affine scheme $U \in$ Sch is said to be $w$-contractible if any faithfully flat weakly etale map $V \rightarrow U$, $V \in$ Sch, admits a section. We will use the facts that (see [2]):
- Any scheme $X \in$ Sch admits a pro-etale cover $\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{i \in I}$ with for each $i \in I, X_{i}$ a $w$-contractile affine scheme and $r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X$ a weakly etale map. For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ with $k$ a field, we may assume $I$ finite since the topological space $X$ is then quasi-compact.
- If $U \in$ Sch is a $w$-contractible affine scheme, then for any sheaf $F \in \operatorname{Shv}\left(U^{p e t}\right), H_{p e t}^{i}(U, F)=0$ for $i \neq 0$ since $\Gamma(U,-)$ is an exact functor.

Let $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ a subfield of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Consider $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}$ the algebraic closure of $k$. Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Let $p$ a prime number. Let $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ an embedding. We have then for $k^{\prime} / k$ a field extension and $\sigma^{\prime}: k^{\prime} \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ and $\sigma_{p}^{\prime}: k^{\prime} \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ field embedding such that $\sigma_{\mid k}^{\prime}=\sigma$ and $\sigma_{p \mid k}^{\prime}=\sigma_{p}$, the following diagram in $C\left(\mathbb{N} \times X^{e t}\right)$

with as above

Let $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ and $\alpha \in H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)$. Then $\alpha \in H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)^{G}$ if and only if

## 3 Integral complex and $p$-adic periods of a smooth algebraic variety over a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$

### 3.1 Complex integral periods

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$.
Let $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ a smooth variety. Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover. We have for $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ the evaluation period embedding map which is the morphism of bi-complexes

given by integration. By taking all the affine open cover $\left(j_{i}: X_{i} \hookrightarrow X\right)$ of $X$, we get for $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$, the evaluation period embedding map

It induces in cohomology, for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the evaluation period map
$H^{j} \operatorname{ev}(X)=H^{j} \operatorname{ev}(X)_{\bullet}^{\bullet}: H_{D R}^{j}(X)=H^{j} \Gamma\left(X_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X_{\bullet}}^{\bullet}\right) \rightarrow H_{\text {sing }}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}, \mathbb{C}\right)=H^{j}\left(\operatorname{Hom}_{\operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R})}\left(\mathbb{I}^{\bullet}, X_{\mathbb{C}, \bullet}^{a n}\right)^{\vee} \otimes \mathbb{C}\right)$.
which does NOT depend on the choice of the affine open cover by acyclicity of quasi-coherent sheaves on affine noetherian schemes for the left hand side and from Mayer-Vietoris quasi-isomorphism for singular cohomology of topological spaces and Whitney approximation theorem for differential manifolds for the right hand side.

Remark 1. We also have for $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ the composition

Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover with $X_{i}:=X \backslash D_{i}$ with $D_{i} \subset X$ smooth divisors with normal crossing. Let $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding and $X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}=\cup_{i=1}^{r} \mathbb{D}_{i}$ an open cover with $\mathbb{D}_{i} \simeq D(0,1)^{d}$. is the canonical isomorphism induced by the analytical functor and $\alpha(X): \mathbb{C}_{X_{\mathbb{C}}{ }^{a_{n}}} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}}^{\bullet}$, which gives the periods elements $H^{*} \operatorname{ev}(X)\left(H_{D R}^{*}(X)\right) \subset H_{\text {sing }}^{*}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}, \mathbb{C}\right)$. On the other side the induced map

is NOT surjective in general since the left hand side is invariant by the action of Galois group $G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ whereas the right hand side is not.

## $3.2 \quad p$ adic integral periods

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Denote $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ and $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ the absolute Galois group of $k$. Let $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ a smooth variety. Take a compactification $\bar{X} \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$ of $X$ such that $D:=\bar{X} \backslash X \subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor, and denote $j: X \hookrightarrow \bar{X}$ the open embedding. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$, where $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$ is the $p$-adic field which is the completion of $k$ with respect the $p$ adic norm given by $\sigma_{p}$. Denote $\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}=\operatorname{Gal}\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} / \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)=\operatorname{Gal}\left(\overline{\mathbb{Q}}_{p} / \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)$ the Galois group of $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$. Recall (see section 2$)$ that $\underline{\mathbb{Z}}_{X_{X_{p}}}:=$ $\lim _{n \in \mathbb{N}} \nu_{X}^{*}\left(\mathbb{Z} / p^{n} \mathbb{Z}\right)_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}} \in \operatorname{Shv}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{p e t}\right)$ and $\Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\text {pet }}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet}:=\lim _{n \in \mathbb{N}} \nu_{X}^{*} \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p} / p^{n} O_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}}^{\bullet p e t}}, \log \in C\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{p e t}\right)$. Consider its completion $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ with respect to the $p$ adic norm induced by $\sigma_{p}$. Then $\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}:=\operatorname{Gal}\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} / \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right) \subset G:=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$.

(ii): Assume by absurd that $\lambda w(\alpha) \notin H_{D R}^{j}(X)$ for all $\lambda \in \mathbb{Q}_{p}$. There exist a finite type extenion $k^{\prime} / k$, $k^{\prime} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ (depending on $w(\alpha)$ ) such that $w(\alpha) \in H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{k^{\prime}}\right)$. By assumption the orbit $A u t\left(k^{\prime} / k\right) \cdot \lambda w(\alpha) \subset$ $H_{D R}\left(X_{k^{\prime}}\right)$ of $\lambda w(\alpha)$ under $A u t\left(k^{\prime} / k\right)$ is non trivial (i.e. contain more then one element). Note that since $\pi_{\bar{k}^{\prime} /\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} \otimes_{k^{\prime}} \mathbb{C}_{l}\right)}\left(X_{\bar{k}^{\prime}}\right): X_{\mathbb{C}_{p} \otimes_{k^{\prime}} \mathbb{C}_{l}} \rightarrow X_{\bar{k}^{\prime}}$ is flat $((-) \otimes 1) \circ \pi_{\bar{k}^{\prime} /\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} \otimes_{k^{\prime}} \mathbb{C}_{l}\right)}\left(X_{\bar{k}^{\prime}}\right)^{*}$ and $((-) \otimes$ 1) $\circ \pi_{\bar{k}^{\prime} /\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} \otimes_{k^{\prime}} \mathbb{C}_{l}\right)}\left(X_{\bar{k}^{\prime}}\right)^{*}$ are injective, (the morphism involved in the base change are without torsion). Denote $d=\operatorname{dim}(X)$. Consider the canonical projection

Let $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ an embedding. For each $j, l \in \mathbb{Z}$, we get from proposition 2(ii) and proposition 1 a canonical injective map

Proof. Follows from proposition 2(ii) and proposition 1.

Remark 3. Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ be a prime number. Let $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ and $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ be embeddings. Note that for $w \in \mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X^{e t}}^{\bullet}\right)$ such that ev $(X)(w) \in$ $H_{\text {sing }}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}, 2 i \pi \mathbb{Q}\right), w$ is NOT logarithmic in general and $\gamma(X)(e v(X)(w)) \in H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Q}_{p}\right)$ is NOT $G=$ $\operatorname{Gal}(\bar{k} / k)$ equivariant in general, where

Corollary 1. Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$. The the Hodge conjecture for $X$ implies the Tate conjecture for $X$. In particular we get Tate conjecture for divisors of $X$.

Proof. Follows from theorem $1:$ for $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$ and $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)^{\partial=0}$, we get $H^{2 d-n} \iota_{p, e v}^{G, d}(X)([Z])=$ [ $Z$ ], hence the Hodge conjecture for $X$ implies the Tate conjecture for $X$ since $H^{2 d-n} \iota_{p, e v}^{G, d}(X)$ is injective. Since we have by the exponential sequence Hodge conjecture for divisors, we get Tate conjecture for divisors of $X$.

## 4 The complex and etale Abel Jacobi maps and normal function

### 4.1 The complex Abel Jacobi map for higher Chow group and complex normal functions

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Consider an embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}$, where $\bar{k}$ is the algebraic closure of $k$. We have then the quasi-isomorphism $\alpha(X): \mathbb{C}_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}}^{\bullet}$ in $C\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}\right)$.

By GAGA $\Sigma\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset \bar{S}_{\mathbb{C}}$ is algebraic subvariety. Hence $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset S_{\mathbb{C}}$ is an algebraic subvariety.

### 4.2 The etale Abel Jacobi map for higher Chow group and etale normal functions

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ and denote by $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ its galois group. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime integer.

## 5 The vanishing of the etale Abel Jacobi map implies the vanishing of the complex Abel Jacobi map

The $p$ adic Hodge theory for open varieties implies the following main theorem :
Theorem 6. Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Denote $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ and $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ its absolute Galois group. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$. Consider an embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ be a prime number. Let $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ be an embedding. Denote $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ the completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$. Let $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)_{h o m}^{\partial=0}$. Consider the exact sequences

Then (i) is equivalent to (i)', (i)' implies (ii0) and (ii), (ii0) implies (iii), (ii) implies (iii), (iii) is equivalent to (iii)'. Hence (i) implies (iii)'.

(ii0) implies (iii):follows from proposition 1: $w$ is defined over a subfield $k^{\prime}=k^{\prime}(w) \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ (depending on $w$ ) of finite type over $k$ and we take an embedding $\sigma^{\prime}: k^{\prime} \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ such that $\sigma_{\mid k}^{\prime}=\sigma$, and $w:=$ $\pi_{k^{\prime} / \mathbb{C}}\left(\left(\left(X \times \square^{n}\right) \backslash|Z|\right)_{k^{\prime}}\right)^{*} w$,

Then we have $\bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}$ the canonical algebraic closure of $k$ inside $\mathbb{C}$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Then for $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)_{\text {fhom }}^{f, \partial=0}$, we have

Proof. (i):Follows immediately from theorem 6 since for $s \in S_{(0)}, k(s)$ is of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ and for $s^{\prime} \in \pi_{k / \mathbb{C}}(S)^{-1}(s)$ denoting $\sigma^{\prime}: k(s) \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ the embedding given by $s^{\prime}$, we have by definition

(ii): Since $V\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right) \subset S$ contain a $\bar{k}$ point, $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset S_{\mathbb{C}}$ contain a $\bar{k}$ point by (i). Hence by the work of [17] or [8], $V\left(\nu_{Z}\right) \subset S_{\mathbb{C}}$ is defined over $\bar{k}$.


## 6 Algebraicity of the zero locus of etale normal functions

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth proper morphism with $S, X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ connected. Let $p$ a prime number. Let $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)_{h o m}^{\partial=0, f}$. By the definition, we have

In this section, we investigate the algebraicity of $V_{\text {tors }}\left(\nu_{Z}^{e t, p}\right) \subset S$ and of $V_{\text {tors }}\left(\nu_{Z, \sigma_{l}}^{e t, p}\right) \subset S, \sigma_{l}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{l}$.
Remark 4. Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $f: X \rightarrow S$ a smooth proper morphism with $S, X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ connected. Let $p$ a prime number. Let $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X, n)_{h o m}^{\partial=0, f}$. We can show, using [13], that we have in fact

We don't need this result so we don't give the details.
Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $p$ be a prime number. Let $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ be an embedding. We have then $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$ the completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$ and we denote $O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$ its ring of integers. We then consider the canonical functor of Huber (see section 2)

We have then $f:=f_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}:(X, Z)_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \rightarrow S_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ the morphism in $\operatorname{SmVar}^{2}\left(\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)$ induced by the scalar extension functor and

where $\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U, \mathcal{O}}\right)^{\text {Falt }}$ denote the Falting site, and for $(Y, N) \in \operatorname{logSch},(Y, N)^{\text {ket }} \subset \operatorname{logSch} /(Y, N)$ is the small Kummer etale site. If $\left(X_{\hat{\mathcal{k}}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U, \mathcal{O}}\right)$ is $\log$ smooth, we consider an hypercover
