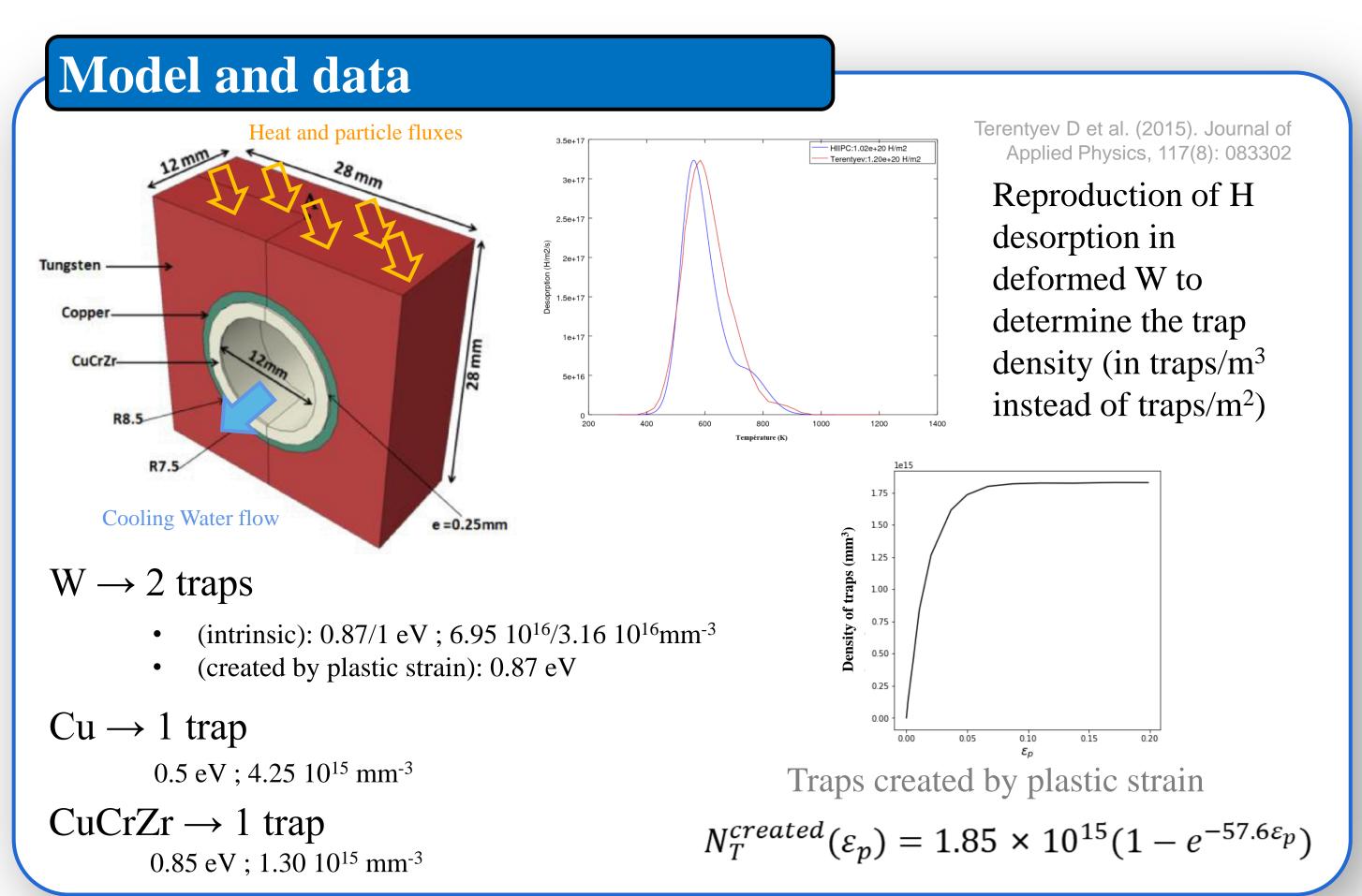

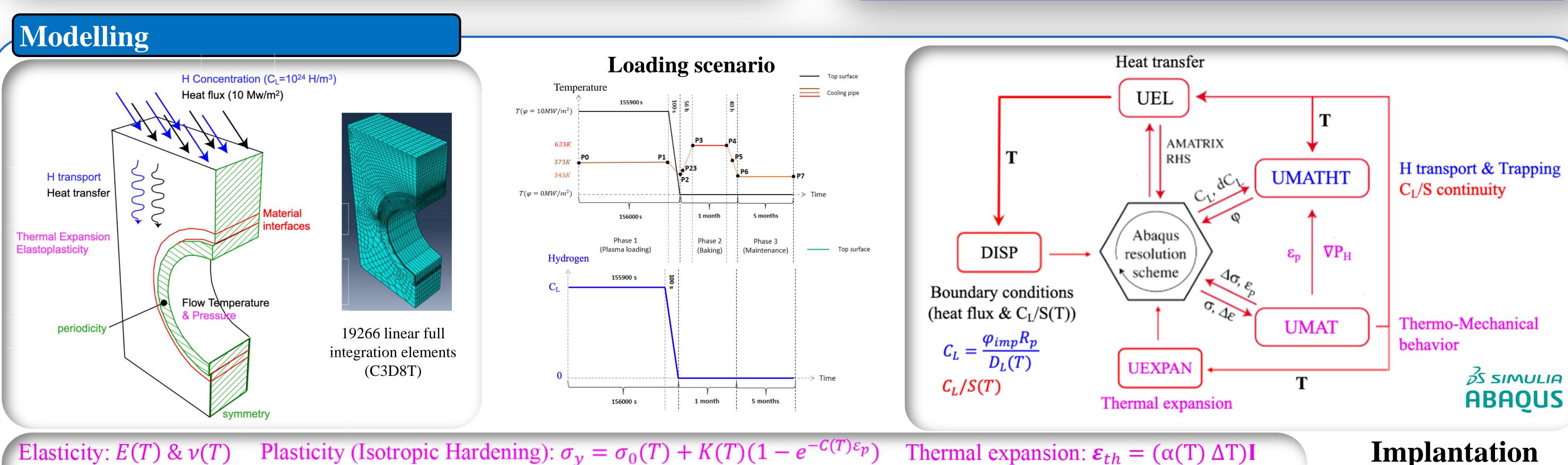

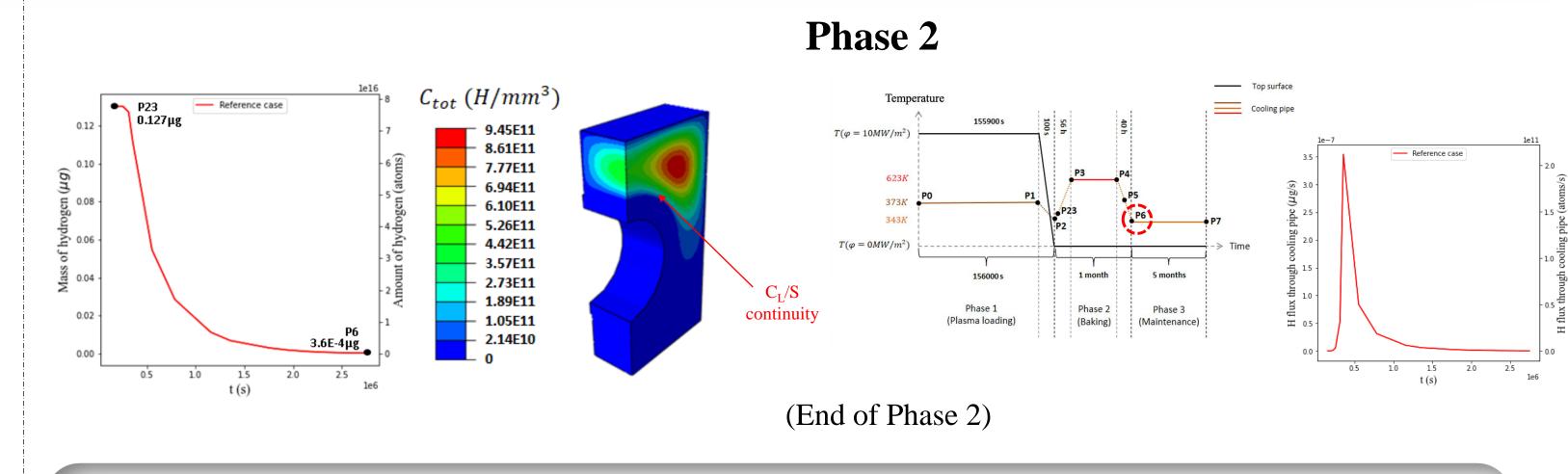

Ctot (H/mm³)

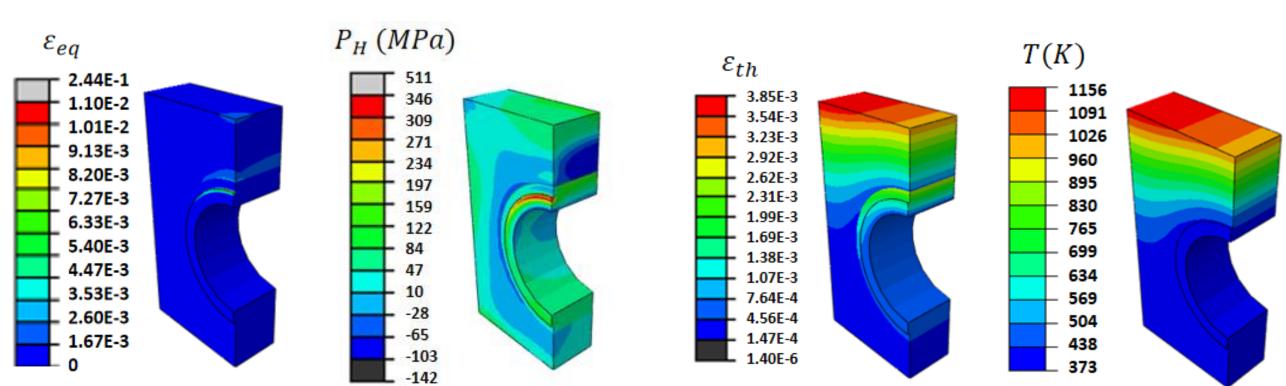

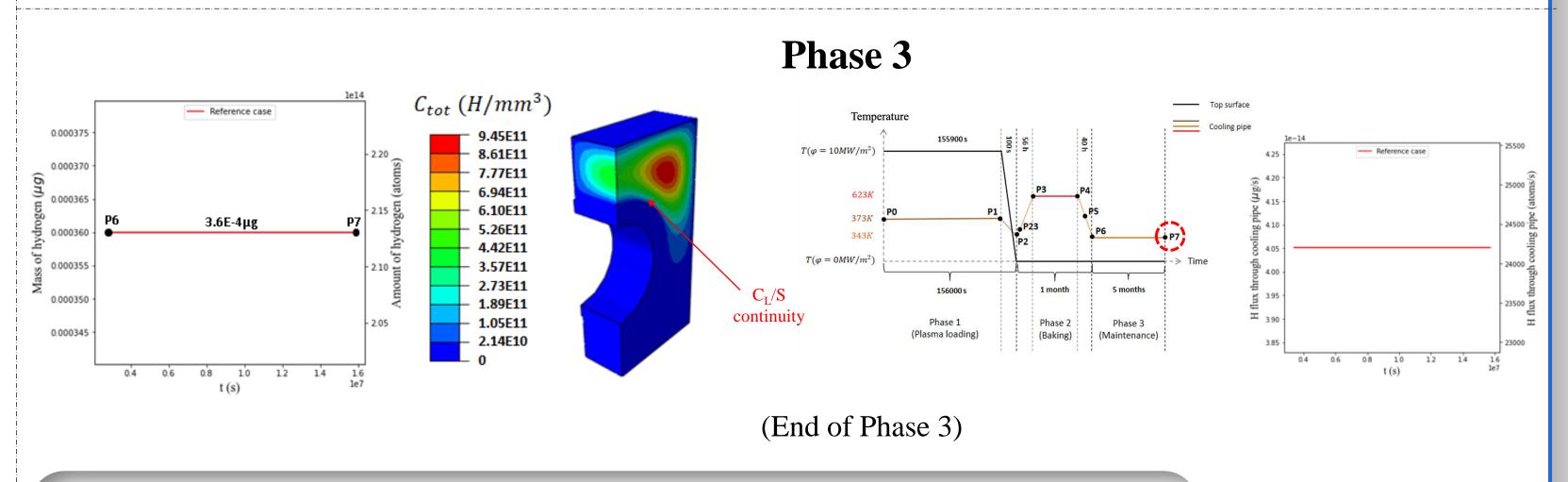
- * H stored in W, near the W/Cu interface
- * Estimation of total H for all divertor monoblocks (assuming same exposure conditions): 10 mg

- 1.98E14 - 6.10E13



- * ϵ_{th} mismatches at bi-material interfaces \rightarrow plastic strain
- * T gradient & plastic strain \rightarrow stress field (P_H)

- * 0.3% of H remained mainly in the half upper part of W
- * 47% of H passed towards cooling pipe



* No impact of the maintenance phase on remaining amount of H
