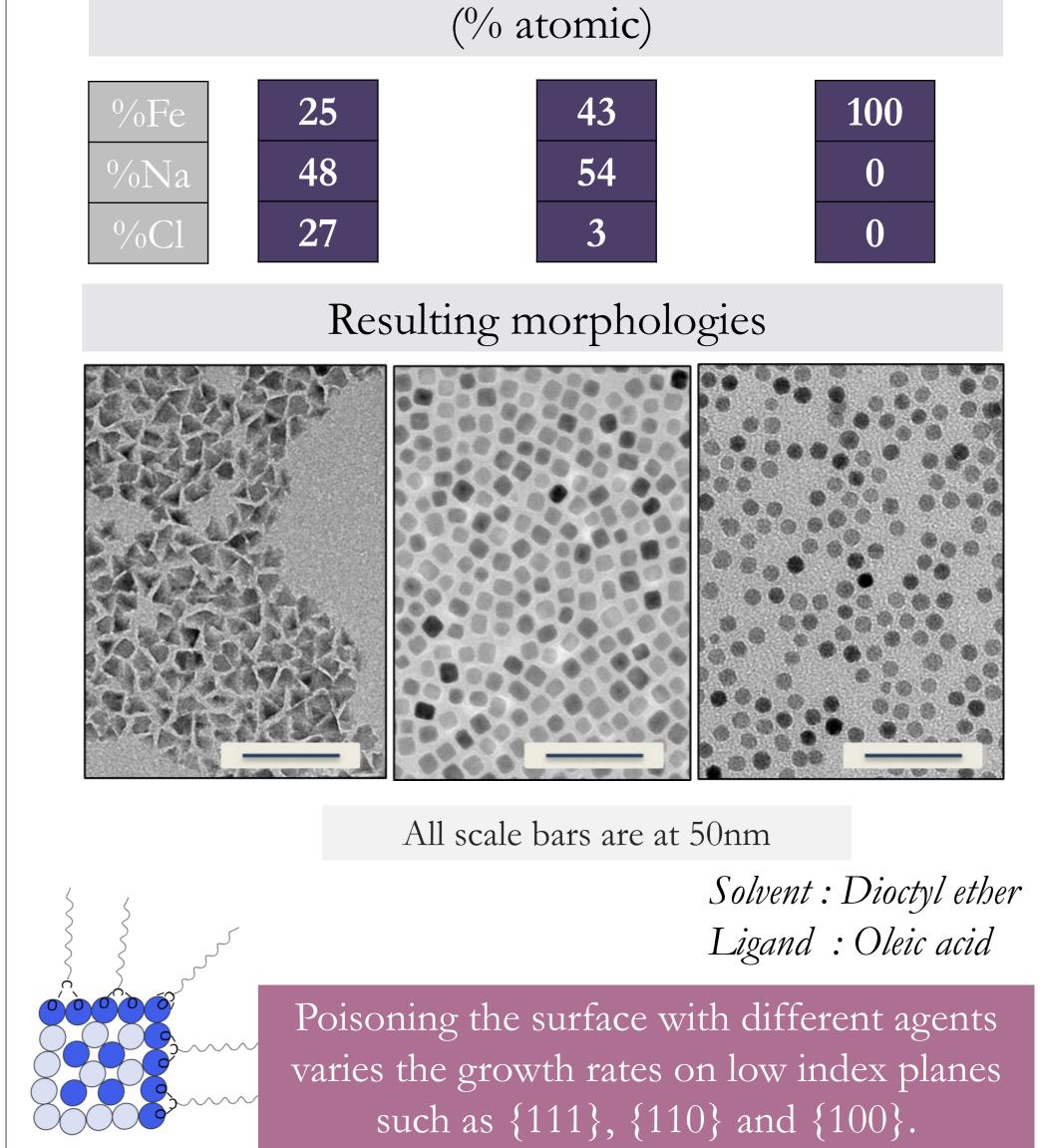


Key parameters for controlling nanoparticles growth









E Conclusion

Series of experiments are conducted to understand the growth mechanism of iron oxide nanoparticles synthesised by thermal decomposition of an organometallic precursor.

The effects of trace of water, temperature & reflux time, impurities in the precursor were observed.

The understanding of the growth mechanism of the nanoparticles will be extended by studying the other key parameters mentioned in the "synthesis" section, and will be supported by a theoretical study on the solubility of the synthesis reagents.

Perspectives

- The study of control parameters will be explored to produce nanoparticles with controlled size, surface chemistry and morphology with low size dispersion to serve as nanofillers for a polymer matrix.
- The incorporation of nanoparticles into a polymer will reveal the evolution of the mechanical and thermal properties of the nanocomposite according to the characteristics of the inserted nanoparticles.
