

Marine Genomics Observatories

Marine Genomics Observatories provide tools and protocols for long-term monitoring of marine ecosystems located in a well-defined and usually limited geographical area, in order to allow the study of their evolution over time. Hence, they yield a significant amount of data (metabarcoding data, "classical" (morphology-base) biodiversity data, supplemental physico-chemical data), which needs to be organized and stored to enable interested parties to carry out downstream analyses.

MyGOD project

The MyGOD project (Manipulate Your Genomic Observatory Data) aims to explore and interpret the data of genomic observatories projects, by providing an integrated and user-friendly web-based visualization tool.

The key component of the interface is a dashboard enabling users to assemble various graphical representations according to their needs. The user interface taps into a database for which specific integration tools, as well as (meta)data formats have been developed and/or adapted in the framework of the MyGOD project, aiming to achieve a high degree of automated ingestion.

Dashboard

The dashboard uses the **Vue.js** Javascript framework with the vue-grid-layout plugin. Graphical representations are dynamically generated with the **D3.js** Javascript library.


The MyGOD dashboard is a multi-taxonomic search tools with save/reload functionality


Search Panels

- High-level search criteria: dataset, date range and taxon
- Multiple independent search panels for easy comparison
- Dynamical update of dashboard graphs and plots when search criteria change

Dashboard Controls

- Allow selection of graph types to be displayed in the dashboard
- For authenticated users, allow saving and loading of dashboards

Samba is a metabarcoding analysis workflow developed by SeBimer. Collaboration on MyGOD project, lead to integration of biostatistical processing parts of the pipeline in the visualisation tool.

- Computation of normalized data (by rarefaction)

Standardized Data Format

- Definition of a lightweight, flexible format for importing tabular data:
 - One file with sampling event descriptions (event identifiers)
 - One file with metabarcode read data (linked through event identifiers) • One file with physico-chemical data (linked through event identifiers)



Search - Use search criteria to design composite and

dynamic visualisations

Datasets

For each project, presentation of context, sampling methods is

provided...

- A personal user space to: • Access previously saved searches • Access previously saved dashboards • Edit dataset metadata (dataset owners) Abims Station Biologique So Mit Station Biologique
- for the visualization tool
- Defining the relevant types of representations for the data
- Handling varying taxonomical frameworks (fixed or variable number of levels, explicitly named ranks or unnamed ranks)

Technical Challenges:

- Making the best of the reactive framework : Vue/vuex/grid layout.
- Integrating third-party (R) components for analysis
- Accompanying JSON metadata files specify the column structure and contents of the data tables: sample name patterns, index mapping for physico-chemical parameters.

What's Next ?

Upcoming Developments:

- Addition of graphical representations of normalized data : β-diversity (with R and Javascript)
- Enable promotion of "showcases" (dashboards with extensive comments) on portal
