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# De Rham logarithmic classes and Tate conjecture

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#### Abstract

We introduce the notion of De Rham logarithmic classes. We show that the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle of a smooth algebraic variety over a field of characteristic zero is logarithmic and conversely that a logarithmic class of bidegree $(d, d)$ is the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle (of codimension $d$ ). We deduce the Tate conjecture for smooth projective varieties over fields of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ and over $p$-adic fields for $\mathbb{Q}_{p}$ coefficients, under good reduction hypothesis.


## 1 Introduction

### 1.1 De Rham logarithmic classes

In this work, we introduce for $X$ a noetherian scheme, the definition of logarithmic De Rham cohomology classes which are for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the subgroup $H^{j} O L_{X}\left(\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}\right)\right) \subset \mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)=: H_{D R}^{j}(X)$ of the De Rham cohomology abelian group. The subcomplex $O L_{X}: \Omega_{X, \log }^{\infty} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X}^{*}$ of abelian sheaves on $X$ consisting of logarithmic forms is introduced in definition 1.

Let $X$ be a smooth algebraic variety over a field $k$ of characteristic zero. To an algebraic cycle $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$, we associate its De Rham cohomology class $[Z] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$, which is by definition, as for any Weil cohomology theory, the image of the fundamental class $[Z] \in H_{D R, Z}^{2 d}(X)$ by the canonical morphism $H_{D R, Z}^{2 d}(X) \rightarrow H^{2 d}(X)$. In section 3, we show (c.f. theorem 1(i)) that $[Z] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$ is logarithmic of bidegree ( $d, d$ ), that is

[Z]=H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left([Z]_{L}\right) \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X),[Z]_{L} \in H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)
$$

where $H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right) \subset \mathbb{H}_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}\right)$ is the canonical subspace, as all the differentials of $\Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}$ vanishes since by definition a logarithmic form is closed. This fact is a consequence of two properties :

- the Euler class of a vector bundle of rank $d$ over an algebraic variety is logarithmic of bidegree $(d, d)$ (c.f. proposition 2)
- the motivic isomorphisms applied to De Rham cohomology preserve logarithmic classes (c.f. proposition 1). The key point is that logarithmic De Rham forms on algebraic varieties over $k$ are closed, (trivially) $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}$ invariant and compatible with the transfers maps induced by finite morphisms of algebraic varieties and in particular finite correspondences. Since $\Omega_{\log }^{l} \subset \Omega^{l}$ are (trivially) $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}$ invariant presheaves with transfers on the category of smooth algebraic varieties over $k$, by a theorem of Voevodsky the cohomology presheaves of $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}$ invariant presheaves with transfers are $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}$ invariant.

Conversely, we show (c.f. theorem 1(ii)), that a logarithmic class $w \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$ of bidegree $(d, d)$ is the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle (of codimension $d$ ).
The proof works as follows : A logarithmic class of bidegree $(p, q)$ is locally acyclic for the Zariski topology of $X$ since it is the etale cohomology of a single sheaf. This allows us to proceed by a finite induction using the crucial fact that the purity isomorphism for De Rham cohomology preserve logarithmic classes (c.f. proposition 3). The proof of proposition 3 follows from the fact that the purity isomorphism is
motivic (see [5]), that the Euler class of a vector bundle of rank $d$ over an algebraic variety is logarithmic of bidegree $(d, d)$ (c.f. proposition 2 ) and that the motivic isomorphisms applied to De Rham cohomology preserve logarithmic classes (c.f. proposition 1). At the final step, we use, for simplicity, the fact that for a scheme $Y, H_{e t}^{1}\left(Y, \Omega_{Y, \text { log }}^{1}\right)=H^{1}\left(Y, O_{Y}^{*}\right)$ is the Picard group of $Y$. In the case $X$ projective, we also get a vanishing result (c.f. theorem $\left.1(\mathrm{iii})^{\prime}\right): H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d-k}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d+k}\right)\right)=0$ for $k>0$.

### 1.2 Tate conjecture

Let $X$ be a smooth projective variety over a field $k$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $p$ be a prime number unramified over $k$ such that $X$ has good reduction at $p, \sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ a fixed embedding and $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ inside $\mathbb{C}_{p}$. Denote by $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ the $p$ adic completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$. We show (c.f. proposition 7) that Tate classes $\alpha \in H_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)(d)^{G}$ of $X$ gives by the $p$-adic crystalline comparison isomorphism

a $\mathbb{Q}_{p}$ linear combination of logarithmic classes

with for each $1 \leq i \leq s, \lambda_{i} \in \mathbb{Q}_{p}$ and $w(\alpha)_{L, i} \in H^{2 d} O L_{X} \mathbb{H}_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{\bar{X}_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \log }^{d}\right)$, using a result of [6] together with results of [8] on the pro-etale topology, and a GAGA result on logarithmic De Rham classes (c.f. proposition 5) whose proof is motivic and similar to the proof of theorem 1 . We deduce, by theorem 1(ii) and (iii)', the Tate conjecture for $X$ with $\mathbb{Q}_{p}$ coefficient (c.f. theorem 2).

Note that for a $p$-adic field $K \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}, \operatorname{dim} H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{l}\right)^{G}>\operatorname{dim} H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)^{G}$ for $l \neq p$ in general. Hence it is not clear whether Tate conjecture holds for smooth projective varieties over finite fields $k_{0}$, since the base change for etale cohomology for $f: X \rightarrow O_{K}, O_{K}=W\left(k_{0}\right)$ only holds for $\mathbb{Z}_{l}$ coefficients, $l \neq p$.

Let $X$ a smooth projective variety over $\mathbb{C}$. Then $X$ is defined over a subfield $k \subset \mathbb{C}$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$, that is $X=X_{k} \otimes_{k} \mathbb{C}$. Take an isomorphism $\mathbb{C} \simeq \mathbb{C}_{p}$ with $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number such that $X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}$ has good reduction at $p$. As Tate conjecture holds for $X_{k}$ with $\mathbb{Q}_{p}$ coefficients, the standards conjectures holds for $X$ and any absolute Hodge class of $X$ is the class of an algebraic cycle (corollary 2).

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## 2 Preliminaries and Notations

- Denote by Top the category of topological spaces and RTop the category of ringed spaces.
- Denote by Cat the category of small categories and RCat the category of ringed topos.
- For $\mathcal{S} \in$ Cat and $X \in \mathcal{S}$, we denote $\mathcal{S} / X \in$ Cat the category whose objects are $Y / X:=(Y, f)$ with $Y \in \mathcal{S}$ and $f: Y \rightarrow X$ is a morphism in $\mathcal{S}$, and whose morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(Y^{\prime}, f^{\prime}\right),(Y, f)\right)$ consists of $g: Y^{\prime} \rightarrow Y$ in $\mathcal{S}$ such that $f \circ g=f^{\prime}$.
- For $\left(\mathcal{S}, O_{S}\right) \in \mathrm{RC}$ at a ringed topos, we denote by
- $\operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S})$ the category of presheaves of $O_{S}$ modules on $\mathcal{S}$ and $\mathrm{PSh}_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$ the category of presheaves of $O_{S}$ modules on $\mathcal{S}$, whose objects are $\operatorname{PSh}_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})^{0}:=\left\{(M, m), M \in \operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S}), m: M \otimes O_{S} \rightarrow M\right\}$, together with the forgetful functor $o: \operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S}) \rightarrow \operatorname{PSh}_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$,
$-C(\mathcal{S})=C(\operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S}))$ and $C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})=C\left(\mathrm{PSh}_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})\right)$ the big abelian category of complexes of presheaves of $O_{S}$ modules on $\mathcal{S}$,

- Let $\left(\mathcal{S}, O_{S}\right) \in \mathrm{RCat}$ a ringed topos with topology $\tau$. For $F \in C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$, we denote by $k: F \rightarrow E_{\tau}(F)$ the canonical flasque resolution in $C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$ (see [3]). In particular for $X \in \mathcal{S}, H^{*}\left(X, E_{\tau}(F)\right) \xrightarrow{\sim}$ $\mathbb{H}_{\tau}^{*}(X, F)$.
- For $f: \mathcal{S}^{\prime} \rightarrow \mathcal{S}$ a morphism with $\mathcal{S}, \mathcal{S}^{\prime} \in$ RCat, endowed with topology $\tau$ and $\tau^{\prime}$ respectively, we denote for $F \in C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$ and each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$,

- For $\mathcal{X} \in$ Cat a (pre)site and $p$ a prime number, we consider the full subcategory

- Denote by Sch $\subset$ RTop the subcategory of schemes (the morphisms are the morphisms of locally ringed spaces). We denote by PSch $\subset$ Sch the full subcategory of proper schemes. For a field $k$, we consider Sch $/ k:=\operatorname{Sch} / \operatorname{Spec} k$ the category of schemes over Spec $k$, that is whose object are $X:=\left(X, a_{X}\right)$ with $X \in \operatorname{Sch}$ and $a_{X}: X \rightarrow$ Spec $k$ a morphism and whose objects are morphism of schemes $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ such that $f \circ a_{X^{\prime}}=a_{X}$. We then denote by
$-\operatorname{Var}(k)=\operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / k \subset \operatorname{Sch} / k$ the full subcategory consisting of algebraic varieties over $k$, i.e. schemes of finite type over $k$,
$-\mathrm{PVar}(k) \subset \mathrm{QPVar}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}(k)$ the full subcategories consisting of quasi-projective varieties and projective varieties respectively,

- For $X \in$ Sch, we denote $X^{\text {pet }} \subset$ Sch $/ X$ the etale site and $X^{\text {pet }} \subset$ Sch / $X$ the pro etale site (see [2]) which is the full subcategory of Sch / $X$ whose object consists of weakly etale maps $U \rightarrow X$ (that is flat maps $U \rightarrow X$ such that $\Delta_{U}: U \rightarrow U \times_{X} U$ is also flat) and whose topology is generated by fpqc covers. We then have the canonical morphism of site

- An affine scheme $U \in S$ ch is said to be $w$-contractible if any faithfully flat weakly etale map $V \rightarrow U$, $V \in$ Sch, admits a section. We will use the facts that (see [2]):
- Any scheme $X \in$ Sch admits a pro-etale affine cover $\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{i \in I}$ with for each $i \in I, X_{i}$ a $w$-contractile affine scheme and $r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X$ a weakly etale map. For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ with $k$ a field, we may assume $I$ finite since the topological space $X$ is then quasi-compact.
- If $U \in \operatorname{Sch}$ is a $w$-contractible affine scheme, then for any sheaf $F \in \operatorname{Shv}\left(U^{\text {pet }}\right), H_{p e t}^{i}(U, F)=0$ for $i \neq 0$ since $\Gamma(U,-)$ is an exact functor.
- Let $X \in$ Sch. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}:=D R(X)\left(O_{X}\right)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H_{D R}^{j}(X):=\mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$. For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$, the differentials of $\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}:=\Omega_{X / k}^{\bullet}$ are by definition $k$-linear, thus $H_{D R}^{j}(X)$ has a structure of a $k$ vector space. If $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$, then $H_{D R}^{j}(X)=\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$ since $\Omega_{/ k}^{\bullet} \in C(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ is $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ local and admits transfers where

- Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover. For $I \subset[1, \ldots, s]$, we denote $X_{I}:=\cap_{i \in I} X_{i}$. We get $X_{\bullet} \in \operatorname{Fun}(P([1, \ldots, s]), \operatorname{Var}(k))$. Since quasi-coherent sheaves on affine noetherian schemes are acyclic, we have for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}, H_{D R}^{j}(X)=\Gamma\left(X_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X_{\bullet}} \bullet\right)$.
- For $X \in$ Sch noetherian irreducible and $d \in \mathbb{N}$, we denote by $\mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$ the group of algebraic cycles of codimension $d$, which is the free abelian group generated by irreducible closed subsets of codimension $d$.
- For $K$ a field which is complete with respect to a $p$-adic norm, we consider $O_{K} \subset K$ the subring of $K$ consisting of integral elements, that is $x \in K$ such that $|x| \leq 1$.
- For $X \in \operatorname{PVar}(K)$, we will consider $X^{\mathcal{O}} \in \mathrm{PSch} / O_{K}$ a (non canonical) integral model of $X$, i.e. satisfying $X^{\mathcal{O}} \otimes_{O_{K}} K=X$
- For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(K)$, we will consider $X^{\mathcal{O}} \in$ Sch $/ O_{K}$ a (non canonical) integral model of $X$, i.e. $X^{\mathcal{O}}=\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}} \backslash Z^{\mathcal{O}}$ for $\bar{X} \in \mathrm{P} \operatorname{Var}(K)$ a compactification of $X, Z:=\bar{X} \backslash X$, where $\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \mathrm{PSch} / O_{K}$ is an integral model of $\bar{X}$ and $Z^{\mathcal{O}} \in \mathrm{PSch} / O_{K}$ is an integral model of $Z$.

For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(K)$, we will consider $X^{\mathcal{O}} \in \operatorname{Sch} / O_{K}$ a (non canonical) integral model of $X$, we then have the commutative diagram of sites


- For $X \in$ Sch and $p$ a prime number, we denote by $c: \hat{X}^{(p)} \rightarrow X$ the morphism in RTop which is the completion along the ideal generated by $p$.
- Let $K$ a field which is complete with respect to a $p$-adic norm and $X \in \operatorname{PVar}(K)$ projective. For $X^{\mathcal{O}} \in \mathrm{PSch} / O_{K}$ an integral model of $X$, i.e. satisfying $X^{\mathcal{O}} \otimes_{O_{K}} K=X$, we consider the morphism in RTop

We have then, by GAGA (c.f. EGA 3), for $F \in \operatorname{Coh}_{O_{X}}(X)$ a coherent sheaf of $O_{X}$ module, $c^{*}: H^{k}\left(X^{\mathcal{O}}, F\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{k}\left(\hat{X}^{\mathcal{O},(p)}, c^{* \bmod } F\right)$ for all $k \in \mathbb{Z}$, in particular

Denote by CW $\subset$ Top the full subcategory of $C W$ complexes. Denote by $\operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R}) \subset$ RTop the full subcategory of differentiable (real) manifold.
- Denote $\mathrm{Sch}^{2} \subset \mathrm{RTop}^{2}$ the subcategory whose objects are couples $(X, Z)$ with $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in$ Sch and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset and whose set of morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right),(X, Z)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow$ $X$ of locally ringed spaces such that $f^{-1}(Z) \subset Z^{\prime}$.
- Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Denote $\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}^{2}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}^{2}(k) \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{2} / k$ the full subcategories whose objects are $(X, Z)$ with $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$, resp. $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$, and $Z \subset X$ is a closed subset, and whose morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right) \rightarrow(X, Z)\right)$ consists of $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ of schemes over $k$ such that $f^{-1}(Z) \subset Z^{\prime}$.

- For $X \in \operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R})$, the restriction map

Let $F \in \operatorname{PSh}(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$. If $F$ is $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ invariant and admits transfers, then for all $j \in \mathbb{Z}, H^{j} E_{e t}^{\bullet}(F) \in \mathrm{PSh}(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ are $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ invariant. That is, if $F$ is $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ invariant and admits transfers then $F$ is $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ local.

We introduce the logarithmic De Rham complexes

the sub-abelian group generated by. By definition, for $w \in \Omega_{X}^{p}\left(X^{o}\right), w \in \Omega_{X, \log }^{p}\left(X^{o}\right)$ if and only if there exists $\left(n_{i}\right)_{1 \leq i \leq s} \in \mathbb{Z}$ and $\left(f_{i, \alpha_{k}}\right)_{1 \leq i \leq s, 1 \leq k \leq p} \in \Gamma\left(X^{o}, O_{X}\right)^{*}$ such that

We have then the morphisms of sites $r: X^{e t} \rightarrow X^{\mathcal{O}, e t}$ and $r: X^{\text {pet }} \rightarrow X^{\mathcal{O}, p e t}$ such that $\nu_{X} \circ \circ r=r \circ \nu_{X}$. ## 3 De Rham logarithmic classes

### 3.1 The De Rham classes of algebraic cycles vs De Rham logarithmic classes

Let $X \in$ Sch. Recall we have the canonical sub-complex $O L_{X}: \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}$ in $C\left(X^{e t}\right)$ (c.f. definition 1). All the differential of $\Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}$ vanishes since by definition the logarithmic forms are closed. For $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the De Rham logarithmic classes consist of the image

The filtered complex $\Gamma\left(X, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X^{e t}, \log }^{\bullet}, F_{b}\right)\right) \in C_{f i l}(\mathbb{Z})$ has its differentials at the $E_{1}$ level vanishes since the logarithmic forms are closed, hence we have a canonical splitting

Hence $H_{e t}^{1}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }\right)=$ $H_{e t}^{1}\left(X, O_{X}^{*}\right)$ and $H_{e t}^{q}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }\right)=H_{e t}^{q}\left(X, O_{X}^{*}\right)=0$ for $q \leq 2$. Let $X \in$ Sch a noetherian proper scheme. We have $H^{0}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \text { log }}^{l}\right)=0$.

Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. We get (see definition 1) the embedding in $C(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$

The sheaf $O_{k}^{*} \in \operatorname{PSh}(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ admits transfers : for $W \subset X^{\prime} \times X$ with $X, X^{\prime} \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ and $W$ finite over $X^{\prime}$ and $f \in O(X)^{*}, W^{*} f:=N_{W / X^{\prime}}\left(p_{X}^{*} f\right)$ where $p_{X}: W \hookrightarrow X^{\prime} \times X \rightarrow X$ is the projection and $N_{W / X^{\prime}}: k(W)^{*} \rightarrow k\left(X^{\prime}\right)^{*}$ is the norm map. This gives transfers on $\Omega_{/ k, \log }^{1} \in \operatorname{PSh}(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ compatible with transfers on $\Omega_{/ k}^{1} \in \mathrm{PSh}(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ : for $W \subset X^{\prime} \times X$ with $X, X^{\prime} \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ and $W$ finite over $X^{\prime}$ and $f \in O(X)^{*}$,

where where $p_{X}: W \hookrightarrow X^{\prime} \times X \rightarrow X$ is the projection and $\operatorname{Tr}_{W / X^{\prime}}: O_{W} \rightarrow O_{X}$ is the trace map. Note that $d(f g) / f g=d f / f+d g / g$. We get transfers on

since $\otimes_{\mathbb{Q}}^{l} \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{1}=H^{0}\left(\otimes_{\mathbb{Q}}^{L, l} \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{1}\right)$ and $\otimes_{O_{k}}^{l} \Omega_{/ k}^{1}=H^{0}\left(\otimes_{O_{k}}^{L, l} \Omega_{/ k}^{1}\right)$. This induces transfers on $\wedge_{\mathbb{Q}}^{l} \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{1}:=\operatorname{coker}\left(\oplus_{I_{2} \subset[1, \ldots, l]} \otimes_{\mathbb{Q}}^{l-1} \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{1} \xrightarrow{\oplus_{I_{2} \subset[1, \ldots, l]} \Delta_{I_{2}}:=\left(w \otimes w^{\prime} \mapsto w \otimes w \otimes w^{\prime}\right)} \otimes_{\mathbb{Q}}^{l} \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{1}\right) \in \operatorname{PSh}(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$. and

Hence $H_{e t}^{1}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }\right)=H_{e t}^{1}\left(X, O_{X}^{*}\right)$ and $H_{e t}^{q}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }\right)=H_{e t}^{q}\left(X, O_{X}^{*}\right)=0$ for $q \leq 2$. For $X \in \operatorname{PVar}(k)$, we have $H^{0}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right)=0$.

- Let $(X, Z) \in \operatorname{Sch}^{2}$ with $X \in \operatorname{Sch}$ a noetherian scheme and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset. We have the deformation $\left(D_{Z} X, \mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}\right) \rightarrow \mathbb{A}^{1},\left(D_{Z} X, \mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}\right) \in \operatorname{Sch}^{2}$ of $(X, Z)$ by the normal cone $C_{Z / X} \rightarrow Z$, i.e. such that

We denote by $i_{1}:(X, Z) \hookrightarrow\left(D_{Z} X, \mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}\right)$ and $i_{0}:\left(C_{Z / X}, Z\right) \hookrightarrow\left(D_{Z} X, \mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}\right)$ the closed embeddings in Sch ${ }^{2}$.

- Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. For $Z \subset X$ a closed subset of pure codimension $c$, consider a desingularisation $\epsilon: \tilde{Z} \rightarrow Z$ of $Z$ and denote $n: \tilde{Z} \xrightarrow{\epsilon} Z \subset X$. We have then the morphism in $\mathrm{DA}(k)$

where $D: \operatorname{Hom}_{\mathrm{DA}(k)}\left(M_{c}(\tilde{Z}), M_{c}(X)\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} \operatorname{Hom}_{\mathrm{DA}(k)}(M(X), M(\tilde{Z})(c)[2 c])$ is the duality isomorphism from the six functors formalism (moving lemma of Suzlin and Voevodsky) and $\mathbb{Z}(n):=$ $\operatorname{ad}\left(n_{!}, n^{!}\right)\left(a_{X}^{!} \mathbb{Z}\right)$, noting that $n_{!}=n_{*}$ since $n$ is proper and that $a_{X}^{!}=a_{X}^{*}\left[d_{X}\right]$ and $a_{\tilde{Z}}^{!}=a_{\tilde{Z}}^{*}\left[d_{Z}\right]$ since $X$, resp. $\tilde{Z}$, are smooth (considering the connected components, we may assume $X$ and $\tilde{Z}$ of pure dimension).

We recall the following facts (see [5] and [3]):
Proposition 1. Let $k$ a field a characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ and $i: Z \subset X$ a smooth subvariety of pure codimension d. Then $C_{Z / X}=N_{Z / X} \rightarrow Z$ is a vector bundle of rank d.
(i) The closed embeddings $i_{1}:(X, Z) \hookrightarrow\left(D_{Z} X, \mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}\right)$ and $i_{0}:\left(C_{Z / X}, Z\right) \hookrightarrow\left(D_{Z} X, \mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}\right)$ in $\operatorname{SmVar}^{2}(k)$ induces isomorphisms of motives $\mathbb{Z}\left(i_{1}\right): M_{Z}(X) \xrightarrow{\sim} M_{\mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}}\left(D_{Z} X\right)$ and $\mathbb{Z}\left(i_{0}\right): M_{Z}\left(N_{Z / X}\right) \xrightarrow{\sim}$ $M_{\mathbb{A}_{Z}^{1}}\left(D_{Z} X\right)$ in $\mathrm{DA}(k)$. We get the excision isomorphism in $\mathrm{DA}(k)$

preserve logarithmic De Rham classes, that is for each $l \in \mathbb{Z}$,

Proof. (i): See [5].
(ii): The de Rham complex $\Omega_{/ k}^{\bullet} \in C(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ admits transfers using trace map for commutative rings, that is $\Omega^{\bullet} \in C(\operatorname{Cor} \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ (see [7]) and the inclusion $O L: \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{l}[-l] \hookrightarrow \Omega_{/ k}^{\bullet}$ in $C(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ is compatible with transfers. Since $\Omega_{/ k, \log }^{l} \in \operatorname{PSh}(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ is $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}$ invariant $\left(O_{\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}}^{*}=k^{*}\right.$ and for $\lambda \in k^{*}$ we have $d \lambda=0$ ) and admits transfers, for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the presheaves $H_{e t}^{j-l} \Omega_{/ k, \log }^{l} \in \operatorname{PSh}(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ are $\mathbb{A}_{k}^{1}$ invariant by a theorem of Voevodsky (c.f. [5] for example). It then follows from (i) (see [5] or [3]) that

Remark 1. Let $k$ a field a characteristic zero.
(i) The statement of proposition 1 (ii) also holds for the subcomplex $\Omega_{/ k}^{\bullet, \partial=0} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{/ k}^{\bullet}$ of closed forms by the same argument since the inclusion $\Omega_{/ k}^{l, \partial=0}[-l] \hookrightarrow \Omega_{/ k}^{\bullet}$ in $C(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ is compatible with transfers.
(ii) The statement of proposition 1 (ii) does NOT hold for presheaves which do not admits transfers (they are $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ invariant but not $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ local in general). Note that the result of proposition 1(ii) does NOT hold for the embedding in $C(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$, associated to an embedding $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$,

of the subsheaf of harmonic differential forms, the sheaves of differential forms $\mathcal{A} \in C(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$ does NOT admits transfers (finite algebraic correspondences are not smooth and for $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ a morphism with $X^{\prime}, X \in \operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R})$ vector fields on $X$ only lift if $f$ is a smooth morphism i.e. if the differential of $d f$ is surjective), transfers maps are only defined on cohomology.

Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ and $Z \subset X$ a smooth subvariety of pure codimension d. We have for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the purity isomorphism given by $H^{j} \Omega\left(P_{Z, X}\right)$ (see proposition 1) and the cup product with the Euler class of of the normal tangent bundle $N_{Z / X} \rightarrow Z$ :

Proposition 2. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $p: E \rightarrow X$ a vector bundle of rank $d \in \mathbb{N}$ with $X, E \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ connected. Then
(i) the Euler class $e(E) \in H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)$ is logarithmic of type $(d, d)$, that is $e(E)=H^{2 d} O L_{E}(e(E)) \in$ $H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)$ with $e(E) \in H_{X, e t}^{d}\left(E, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)$,
(ii) the Euler class $e(E) \in H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)$ induces for each $i, j \in \mathbb{Z}$ an isomorphism

((-) \cdot e(E)): H^{i+j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{i}\right)\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{2 d+i+j} O L_{E}\left(H_{e t}^{j+d}\left(E, \Omega_{E, \log }^{i+d}\right)\right) .

Proof. (i):Let $X=\cup_{i} X_{i}$ an open affine cover such that $E_{i}:=E_{\mid X_{i}}$ is trivial : $\left(s_{1}, \cdots, s_{d}\right): E_{\mid X_{i}} \xrightarrow{\sim}$ $X_{i} \times \mathbb{A}^{d}$ with $s_{j} \in \Gamma\left(X_{i}, E\right)$. Then

e(E)_{\mid X_{i}}=\partial\left(d s_{1} / s_{1} \wedge \cdots \wedge d s_{d} / s_{d}\right) \in H^{2 d} O L_{E_{i}}\left(H_{X_{i}}^{d}\left(E_{i}, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)\right)
$$

where $\partial: H^{d-1}\left(E_{i} \backslash X_{i}, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right) \rightarrow H_{X_{i}}^{d}\left(E_{i}, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)$ is the boundary map. Hence

$$

(ii):Follows from (i) and Kunneth formula for De Rham cohomology : let $X=\cup_{i} X_{i}$ an open affine cover such that $E_{i}:=E_{\mid X_{i}}$ is trivial and consider the morphism of bi-complexes of abelian groups

((-) \cdot e(E)): O L_{X}\left(\Gamma\left(X_{\bullet}, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X, \log }^{i}\right)\right)\right) \rightarrow O L_{E}\left(\Gamma\left(E_{\bullet}, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{E, \log }^{i+d}\right)\right)\right)[2 d]
$$

By $(i)$ an Kunneth formula for De Rham cohomology, $((-) \cdot e(E))$ induces an isomorphism on the $E_{1}$ level of the spectral sequences for the filtrations associated to bi-complex structures on the total complexes. Hence, $((-) \cdot e(E))$ is a quasi-isomorphism. This proves (ii).

We deduce from proposition 1 and proposition 2, the following key proposition
Proposition 3. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ and $Z \subset X$ a smooth subvariety of codimension d. For each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the purity isomorphism

preserve logarithmic De Rham classes, that is for each $l \in \mathbb{Z}$,

Proof. Follows from proposition 1(ii) and proposition 2(ii).
Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. For $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$, we have the cycle class map for De Rham cohomology

and, as for any Weil cohomology theory, we have the isomorphism given by purity : if $X^{o} \subset X$ is an open subset such that $Z^{o}:=X^{o} \cap Z$ has smooth components we have the isomorphism

where the first equality follows from dimension reason : for $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ and $Z^{\prime} \subset X$ smooth, we have $H_{D R, Z^{\prime}}^{i}(X)=0$ for $i<2 \operatorname{codim}\left(Z^{\prime}, X\right)$ by the purity isomorphism $H^{i} D R\left(P_{Z^{\prime}, X}\right)$.

The main result of this section is the following :
Theorem 1. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Let $d \in \mathbb{N}$.
(i) The De Rham cohomology class of an algebraic cycle is logarithmic and is of type (d,d), that is, for $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$

[Z]:=H^{2 d} \Omega\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right)([Z]) \subset H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right) \subset H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)
$$

(ii) Conversely, any $w \in H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right)$ is the class of an algebraic cycle. Note that it implies $w \in W_{0} H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$ as it is easily seen for $d=1$ by the Chow moving lemma since $j^{*}: \operatorname{Pic}(\bar{X}) \rightarrow$ $\operatorname{Pic}(X)$ is surjective if $j: X \hookrightarrow \bar{X}$ is a smooth compactification of $X, \bar{X} \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ and since $H_{e t}^{1}\left(Y, \Omega_{Y, \log }^{1}\right)=\operatorname{Pic}(Y)$ for $Y \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$.
(iii) We have $H^{j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j-l}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right)\right)=0$ for $j, l \in \mathbb{Z}$ such that $2 l<j$.
(iii)' If $X \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$, we also have $H^{j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j-l}\left(X, \Omega_{X, l o g}^{l}\right)\right)=0$ for $j, l \in \mathbb{Z}$ such that $2 l>j$. That is, if $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$, we only have logarithmic classes in bidegree $(d, d)$ for $d \in \mathbb{N}$, in particular there is no non trivial logarithmic classes for odd degree De Rham cohomology $H_{D R}^{2 d+1}(X)$.

since if $X^{o} \subset X$ is a Zariski open subset such that $Z^{o}:=X^{o} \cap Z$ has smooth components and $N_{Z^{o} / X^{o}} \rightarrow Z^{o}$ is the normal tangent bundle, we have by proposition 3 the isomorphism

As $\Omega_{X, l o g}^{d} \in \operatorname{PSh}\left(X^{e t}\right)$ consist of a single presheaf, that is a complex of presheaves concentrated one degree, there exist an etale open cover $r=r(w)=\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{1 \leq i \leq s}$, depending on $w$, such that $r_{i}^{*} w=0 \in H_{e t}^{d}\left(X_{i}, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)$ for each $i$. Choose $i=1$ and denote $j: U:=r_{1}\left(X_{1}\right) \hookrightarrow X$ the corresponding (Zariski) open subset. As $\Omega_{X, \log }^{d}$ has no torsion and admits transfers, we have $j^{*} w=0 \in H_{e t}^{d}\left(U, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)$. Hence, denoting $D:=X \backslash U$, we have

(iii) ${ }^{\prime}$ :Let $j<2 l$. Let $w \in H^{j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j-l}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right)\right)$. By the proof of (ii) there exists $Z \subset X$ a closed subset of pure codimension $j-l$ such that

where $D: \operatorname{Hom}_{\mathrm{DA}(k)}\left(M_{c}\left(\tilde{Z}^{\prime}\right), M_{c}(X)\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} \operatorname{Hom}_{\mathrm{DA}(k)}\left(M(X), M\left(\tilde{Z}^{\prime}\right)(c)[2 c]\right)$ is the duality isomorphism from the six functor formalism (moving lemma of Suzlin and Voevodsky) and $\mathbb{Z}(n):=\operatorname{ad}\left(n_{!}, n^{!}\right)\left(a_{X}^{!} \mathbb{Z}\right)$, is given by a morphism in $C(\operatorname{SmVar}(k))$

Let $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ a smooth variety. Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover. We have for $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding, the evaluation period embedding map which is the morphism of bi-complexes

w_{I}^{l} \in \Gamma\left(X_{I}, \Omega_{X_{I}}^{l}\right) \mapsto\left(e v(X)_{I}^{l}\left(w_{I}^{l}\right): \phi_{I}^{l} \in \mathbb{Z} \operatorname{Hom}_{\operatorname{Diff}}\left(\mathbb{I}^{l}, X_{\mathbb{C}, I}^{a n}\right)^{\vee} \otimes \mathbb{C} \mapsto e v_{I}^{l}\left(w_{I}^{l}\right)\left(\phi_{I}^{l}\right):=\int_{\mathbb{I}^{l}} \phi_{I}^{l *} w_{I}^{l}\right)

given by integration. By taking all the affine open cover $\left(j_{i}: X_{i} \hookrightarrow X\right)$ of $X$, we get for $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$, the evaluation period embedding map

It induces in cohomology, for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the evaluation period map

which does NOT depend on the choice of the affine open cover by acyclicity of quasi-coherent sheaves on affine noetherian schemes for the left hand side and from Mayer-Vietoris quasi-isomorphism for singular cohomology of topological spaces and Whitney approximation theorem for differential manifolds for the right hand side.

Proposition 4. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Let $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding.

(ii) Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number and $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ an embedding. Let $j \in \mathbb{Z}$. Let $w \in H_{D R}^{j}(X):=$ $\mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)=\mathbb{H}_{\text {pet }}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$. If

then $H^{j} e v(X)(w) \in H_{\operatorname{sing}}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}, 2 i \pi \mathbb{Q}\right)$. Recall that $\mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\text {pe }}\right)=\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}\right)$.

Then by definition $H^{j} \operatorname{ev}(X)(w)=H^{j} e v\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}\right)\left(j_{\bullet}^{*} \circ\right.$ $\left.\operatorname{an}_{X .}^{*} w\right)$ with

By [4] lemma 2, we may assume, up to take a desingularization $\pi: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ of $\left(X, \cup_{i}\left(r_{i}\left(X \backslash X_{i}\right)\right)\right)$ and replace $w$ with $\pi^{*} w$, that $r_{i}\left(X_{i}\right)=r_{i}\left(X_{i}(w)\right)=X \backslash D_{i}$ with $D_{i} \subset X$ smooth divisors with normal crossing For $1 \leq l \leq j$, we get

Taking an embedding $\sigma^{\prime}: k^{\prime} \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ such that $\sigma_{\mid k}^{\prime}=\sigma$, we then have

We have by a standard computation, for each $(I, J, l)$ with $\operatorname{card} d+\operatorname{card} J+l=j$,

where for $1 \leq i \leq \operatorname{cardI}, \gamma_{i} \in \operatorname{Hom}\left(\Delta^{*}, X_{I, \mathbb{C}}^{a n} \cap \mathbb{D}_{J}\right)$ are products of loops around the origin inside the pointed disc $\mathbb{D}^{1} \backslash 0$. On the other hand,

- $w_{L, I, J}^{l, j-l}=j_{J}^{*}\left(\sum_{\nu} d f_{\nu_{1}} / f_{\nu_{1}} \wedge \cdots \wedge d f_{\nu_{l}} / f_{\nu_{l}}\right) \in \Gamma\left(X_{I, \mathbb{C}}^{a n} \cap \mathbb{D}_{J}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}}^{l}\right)$ for $1 \leq l \leq j$,
- $w_{L, I, J}^{0, j}=\lambda_{I}$ is a constant.

Hence, for $\mu \in P([1, \cdots, s])$ with $\operatorname{card} \mu=l$, we get, for $l=0 H^{l} e v\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}\right)_{I, J}\left(w_{L, I, J}^{0, j}\right)=0$ and, for $1 \leq l \leq j$,

where $\gamma_{\mu}:=\gamma_{\mu_{1}} \cdots \gamma_{\mu_{l}}$. We conclude by [4] lemma 1.
(ii):It is a particular case of (i). See [4] proposition 1.

Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover with $X_{i}:=X \backslash D_{i}$ with $D_{i} \subset X$ smooth divisors with normal crossing. Let $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding. By proposition 4 , we have a commutative diagram of graded algebras

is NOT surjective in general since the left hand side is invariant by the action of the group $A u t(\mathbb{C})$ (the group of field automorphism of $\mathbb{C}$ ) whereas the right hand side is not. The fact for a de Rham cohomology class of being logarithmic is algebraic and invariant under isomorphism of (abstract) schemes.

Corollary 1. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(\mathbb{C})$. Then the Hodge conjecture holds for $X$ if and only if the Hodge classes are given by logarithmic De Rham classes.

Proof. Follows from theorem 1.

### 3.3 Rigid GAGA for logarithmic de Rham classes

Let $K$ a field of characteristic zero which is complete for a $p$-adic norm. Let $n \in \mathbb{N}$. There exists $i_{n} \in I$ (depending on $n$ ) such that $\eta_{n}=r_{i_{n}}^{*} \tilde{\eta}_{n}$, with $\tilde{\eta}_{n} \in \Omega_{\hat{X}^{(p)}}^{j+1}\left(U_{i_{n}}\right)$. Then, there exists $a_{i j}: U_{j_{n}} \rightarrow U_{i_{n}}, j_{n}, a_{i j} \in I$ such that

Since the closed subset of $U$ are given by irreducible components of closed subsets given by global equations, we get $\theta_{I}=\tilde{\theta}_{I^{\prime} \mid Y_{I}}$ and

- if $j=2 l, \alpha \in \oplus_{1 \leq t \leq s} \mathbb{Z}_{p}\left[Z_{i}\right]$, where $\left(Z_{i}\right)_{1 \leq i \leq t} \subset Z$ are the irreducible components of $Z$.


## 4 Tate conjecture

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Denote $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ and $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ the absolute Galois group of $k$.

Let $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ be a smooth variety. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Denote $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ the $p$-adic completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$. We have the commutative diagram in $C_{\mathbb{B}_{d r} f i l, \hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{a n, p e t}\right)$


Consider an integral model $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \operatorname{Sch}^{i n t} / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ of $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$. If $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}$ has good reduction modulo $p$, we have (see e.g. [1]) the embedding in $C\left(\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}\right)^{\text {Falt }}\right)$

which is a filtered quasi-isomorphism compatible with the action of $\operatorname{Gal}\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} / \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)$ and the action of the Frobenius $\phi_{p}$, where $\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}\right)^{\text {Falt }}$ denote the Falting site.

For $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ and $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$, we denote $\delta(k, X) \subset N$ the finite set consisting of prime numbers such that if $p \in \mathbb{N} \backslash \delta(k, X)$ is a prime number, $k$ is unramified at $p$ and there exists an integral model $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \operatorname{Sch}{ }^{\text {int }} / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ of $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ with good reduction modulo $p$ for all embeddings $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$, $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ being the $p$-adic completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$.
Remark 2. To see that $\delta(k, X)$ is a finite set, considering $k=k_{0}\left(x_{1}, \cdots, x_{d}\right)\left(x_{d+1}\right)$ where $x_{1}, \cdots x_{d}$ are algebraicaly independent and $k_{0}$ is a number field one can take an integral model $Y \rightarrow O_{k_{0}}\left[x_{1}, \cdots, x_{d+1}\right] / f_{d+1}$ of $X$, a desingularization of $Y^{\prime} \rightarrow Y$ of $Y$ and then see that $\delta(k, X)$ is contained in the discriminant of the family $Y^{\prime} \rightarrow Y \rightarrow O_{k_{0}}\left[x_{1}, \cdots, x_{d+1}\right] / f_{d+1}$.

Let $X \in \mathrm{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ be a smooth projective variety. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \backslash \delta(k, X)$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Then $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ has good reduction modulo $p$ and let $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \operatorname{PSch} / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ be a smooth model, i.e. $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \otimes_{O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}} \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}=X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ and $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}$ is smooth with smooth special fiber. The main result of [1] say in this case that the embedding in $C\left(\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}\right)^{\text {Falt }}\right)$

Definition 2. Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Denote $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ and $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ the absolute Galois group of $k$. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \backslash \delta(k, X)$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Denote $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ the $p$-adic completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Denote $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ the p-adic completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$. Consider $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \mathrm{Sch}^{\text {int }} / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ a smooth model of $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$, in particular $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \otimes_{O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}} \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}=X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ and $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}$ is smooth with smooth special fiber. Assume there exist lifts $\phi_{n}: X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} / p^{n} \rightarrow X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} / p^{n}$ of the Frobenius $\phi: X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} / p \rightarrow X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} / p$, such that for $n^{\prime}>n$ the following diagram commutes


Let $l \in \mathbb{Z}$. For each $n \in \mathbb{N}$, the sequence in $C\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}, e t}\right)$

is exact as a sequence of complexes of etale sheaves (i.e. we only have local surjectivity on the right).
Proof. It follows from [6] for $n=1$. It then follows for $n \geq 2$ by induction on $n$ by a trivial devissage.
We have the following key proposition (the projective case of [4]), we state and prove it for smooth projective varieties, the case for smooth varieties is obtained in the same way using a smooth compactification with normal crossing divisors. The projective case suffices for our purpose:

Proposition 7. Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \backslash \delta(k, X)$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Denote $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ the p-adic completion of $k$ with respect to $\sigma_{p}$. Consider $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \mathrm{PSch} / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ a smooth model of $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$, i.e. $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \otimes_{O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}} \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}=X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ and $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}$ is smooth with smooth special fiber.
(i) Let $j, l \in \mathbb{Z}$. We have, see definition 1 (iii),

is exact for the pro-etale topology. Hence the columns of the diagram (1) are exact. This proves (i).
(ii): Follows from (i) and proposition 5.
(ii)': By (ii), if $\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{1 \leq i \leq r}$ is a w-contractile affine pro-etale cover

These propositions, together with the results of section 3 implies the Tate conjecture :

Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$, where $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$ is the $p$-adic field which is the completion of $k$ with respect the $p$ adic norm given by $\sigma_{p}$. Consider $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \in \operatorname{PSch} / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ a smooth model of $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$, i.e. $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}} \otimes_{O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}} \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}=X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ and $X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}$ is smooth with smooth special fiber. Let $\alpha \in H_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)(d)^{G}$. Using definition 2, by proposition 7 (ii)' and proposition 8 there exists $\left(\lambda_{i}\right)_{1 \leq i \leq n} \in \mathbb{Z}_{p}$ and

Let $\Lambda^{j} \in H_{\text {sing }}^{2 d_{X}+2 j}(X \times X, \mathbb{Q})$ inducing the inverse of $L_{j}$ on $H_{\text {sing }}^{d_{X}+j}(X, \mathbb{Q})$ and zero on $H_{\text {sing }}^{i}(X, \mathbb{Q}), i \neq d_{X}+j$. Consider an isomorphism $\sigma_{p}: \mathbb{C} \xrightarrow{\sim} \mathbb{C}_{p}$ such that $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ is unramified and $X$ has good reduction. We have $T(X \times X)\left(L^{j}\right) \in H_{e t}^{2 d_{x}-2 j}\left((X \times X)_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Q}_{p}\right)^{G}$ since it is the class of an algebraic cycle. Hence,

(ii): As $\alpha \in H^{2 d} \Gamma\left(X_{\mathbf{\bullet}}, \Omega_{X}\right)$, where $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ is an open affine cover, there exists a subfield $k \subset k^{\prime} \subset \mathbb{C}$ of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$ over which $\alpha$ is defined, that is $\alpha \in H_{D R}^{2 d}\left(X_{k^{\prime}}\right) \subset H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$, where $X_{k^{\prime}}:=X_{k} \otimes_{k} k^{\prime} \in$ $\operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}\left(k^{\prime}\right)$ satisfy $X_{k^{\prime}} \otimes_{k^{\prime}} \mathbb{C} \simeq X$ in $\operatorname{PSmVar}(\mathbb{C})$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \backslash \delta\left(k^{\prime}, X_{k^{\prime}}\right)$ be a prime number. Consider
