


FIGURE S1 Instantaneous activity profiles over reaction time during the 15-second reactions in the ASFR system.




FIGURE S2 Instantaneous activity profiles over reaction time during the 30-second reactions in the ASFR system.




FIGURE S3 Instantaneous activity profiles over reaction time during the 45-second reactions in the ASFR system.




FIGURE S4 Crystallization and second melting profiles for catalyst S3-a in the ASFR system.





FIGURE S5 Crystallization and second melting profiles for catalyst S1-a in the ASFR system

FIGURE S6 Crystallization and second melting profiles for catalyst S1-b in the ASFR system.




FIGURE S7 Crystallization and second melting profiles for catalyst S3-b in the ASFR system.
