

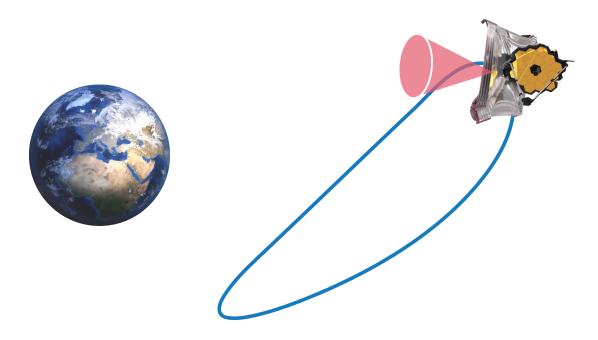

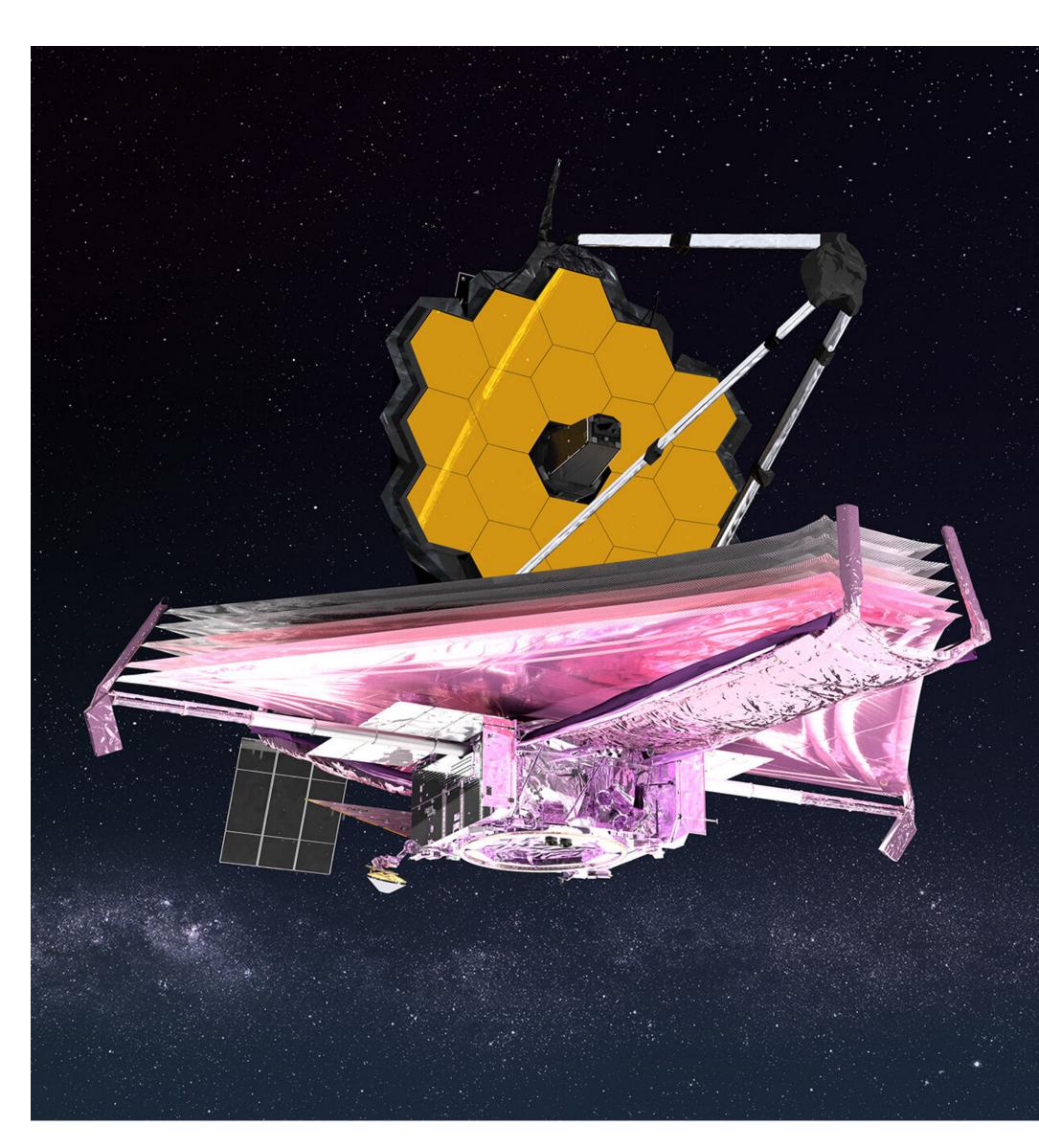

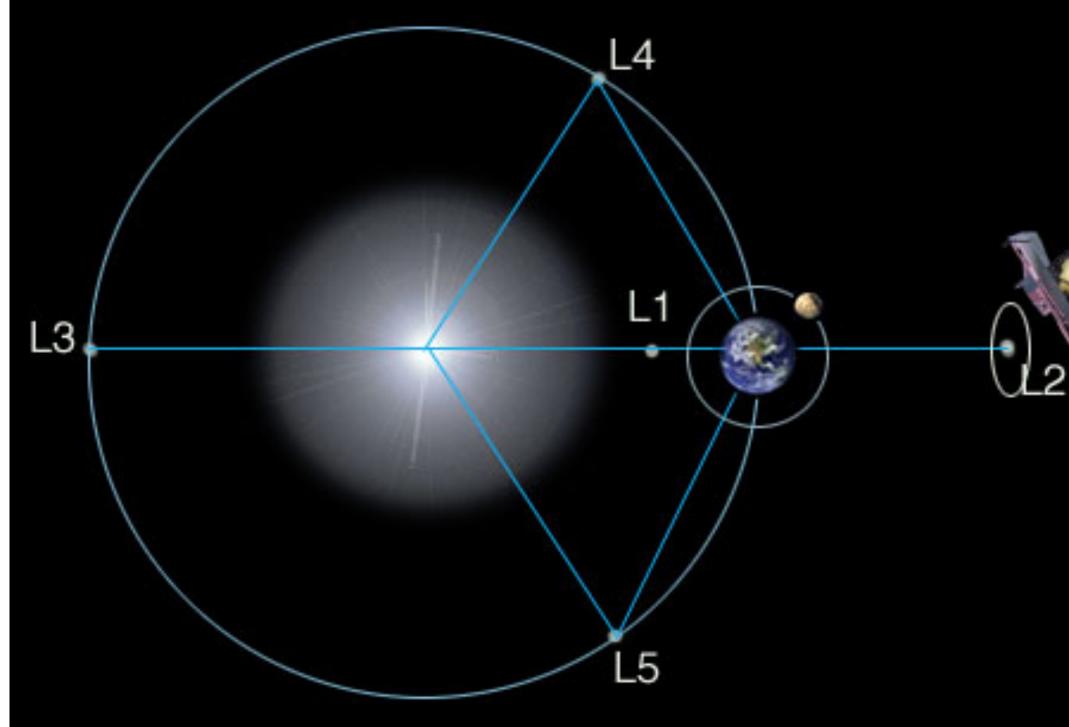

Missions with cone-constrained thrust



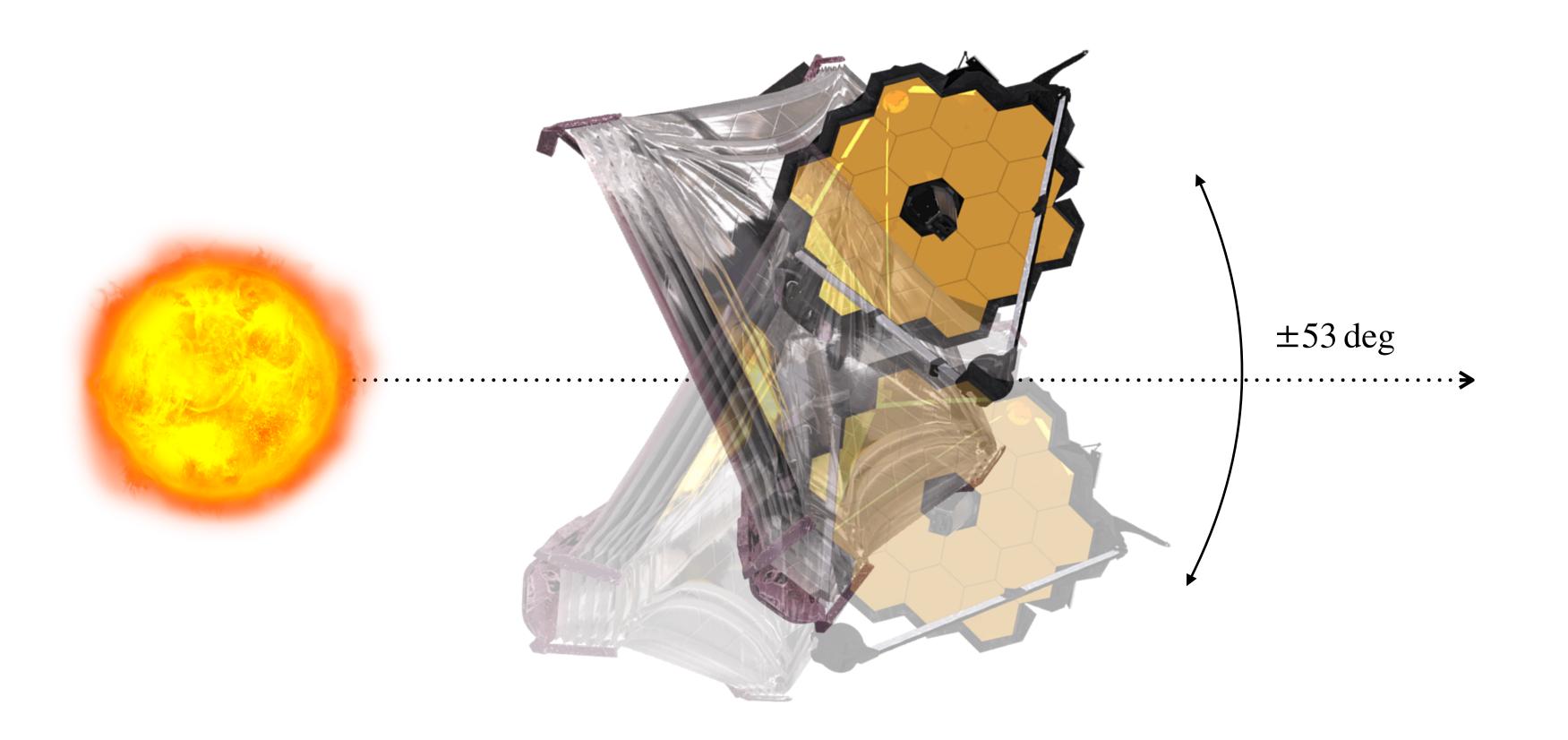

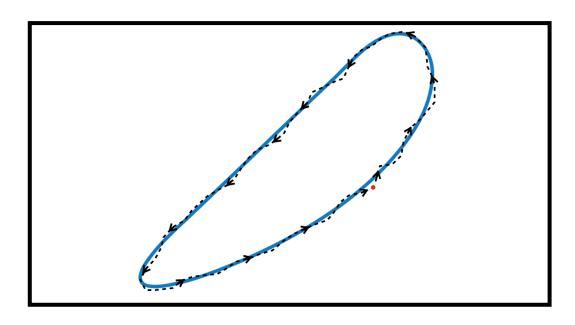
Can these satellites arbitrarily change their orbit?



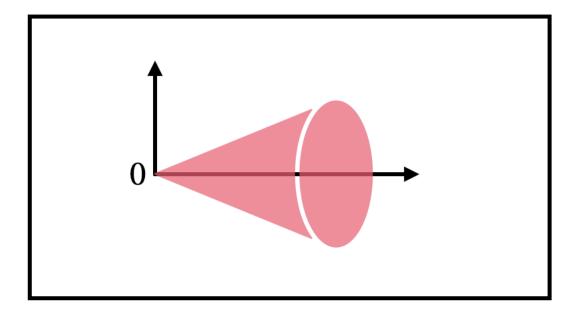

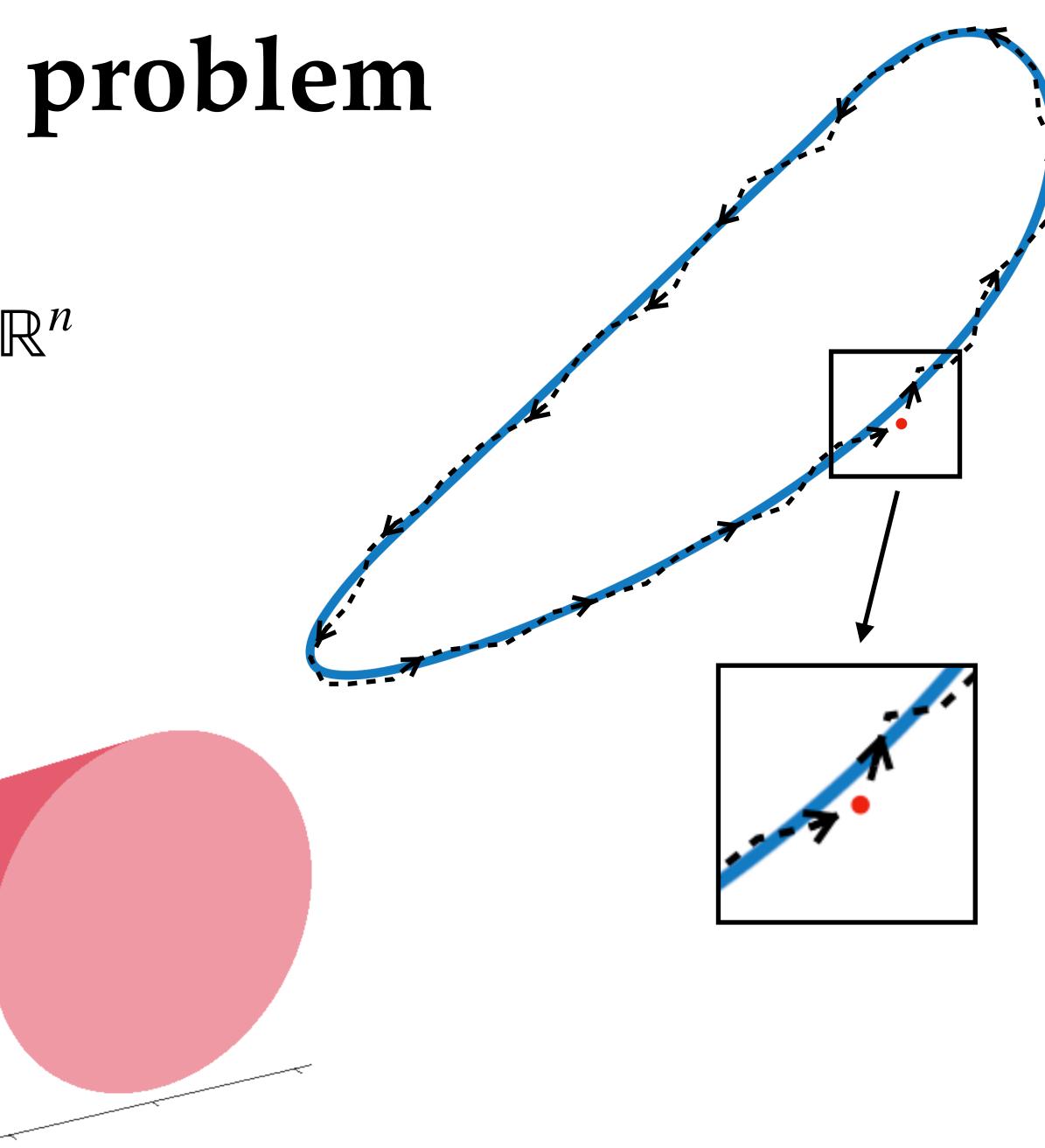

 $\frac{\mathbf{d}x}{\mathbf{d}t} = f(x) + B(x)u, \quad x \in M \subseteq \mathbb{R}^n$

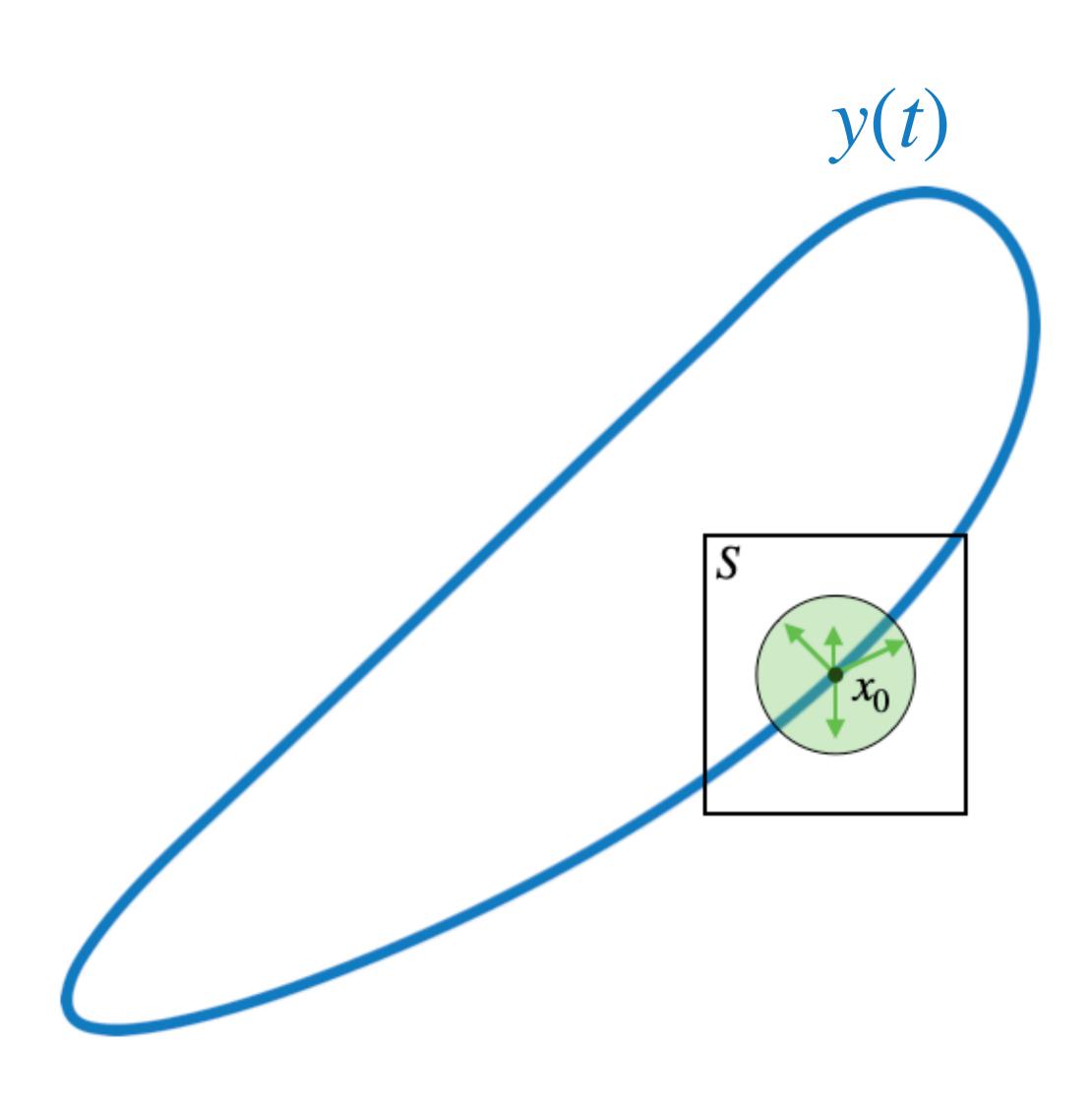
$u \in \underline{K}_{\alpha} \subseteq \mathbb{R}^{m}, \|u\| \leq \varepsilon$

 $\frac{dy}{dt} = f(y)$ $y(0) = y(T) = x_0$ $S(x_0) = 0$

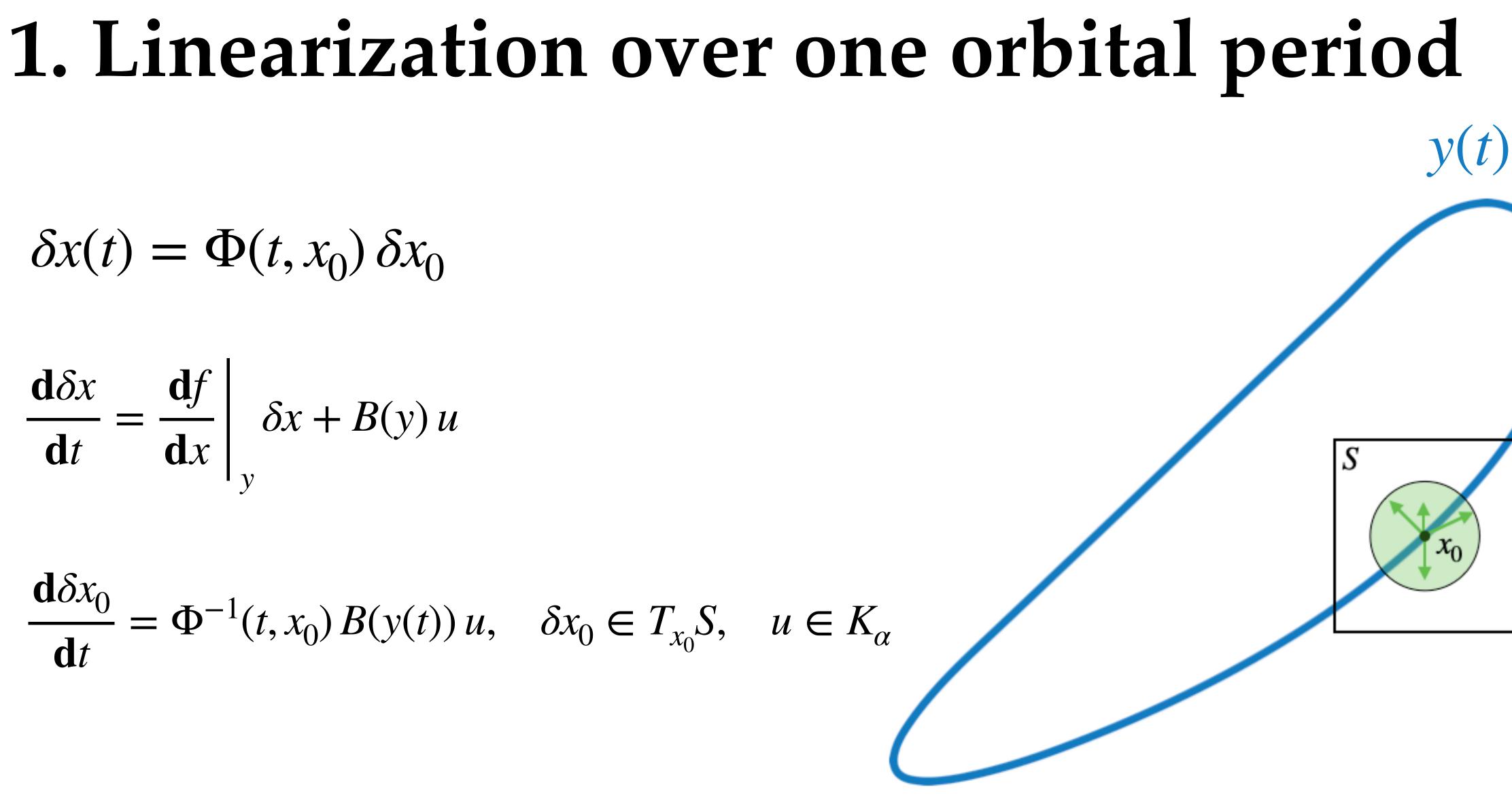




$\delta x(t) = \Phi(t, x_0) \,\delta x_0$

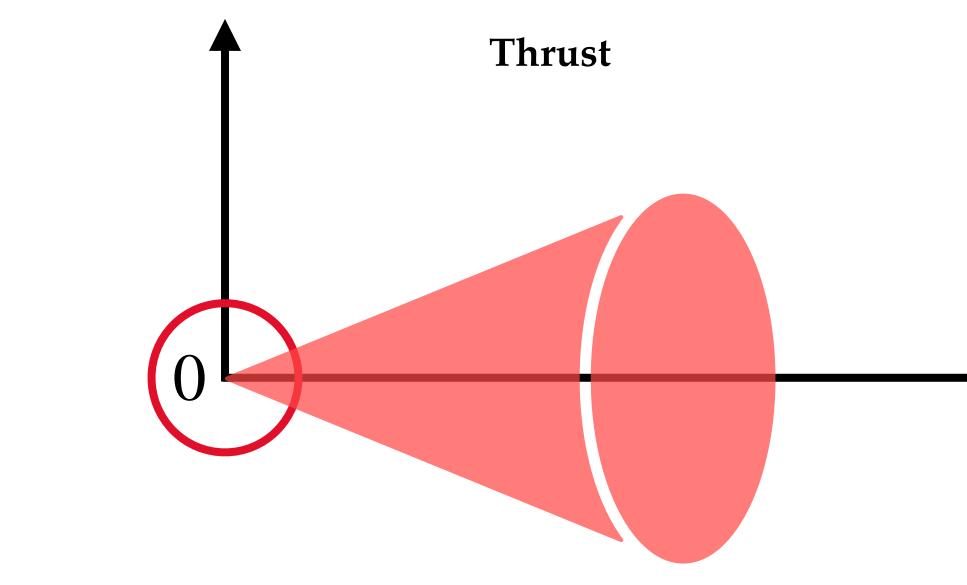


2. Classical approach using Lie brackets

Local controllability if [Jurdjevic, 1996]:

- Periodic drift $\longrightarrow OK$ **i**)
- ii) Bracket generating $\longrightarrow OK$

iii) $\operatorname{Conv}(\mathcal{U})$ is neighbourhood of the origin \longrightarrow **FAIL**



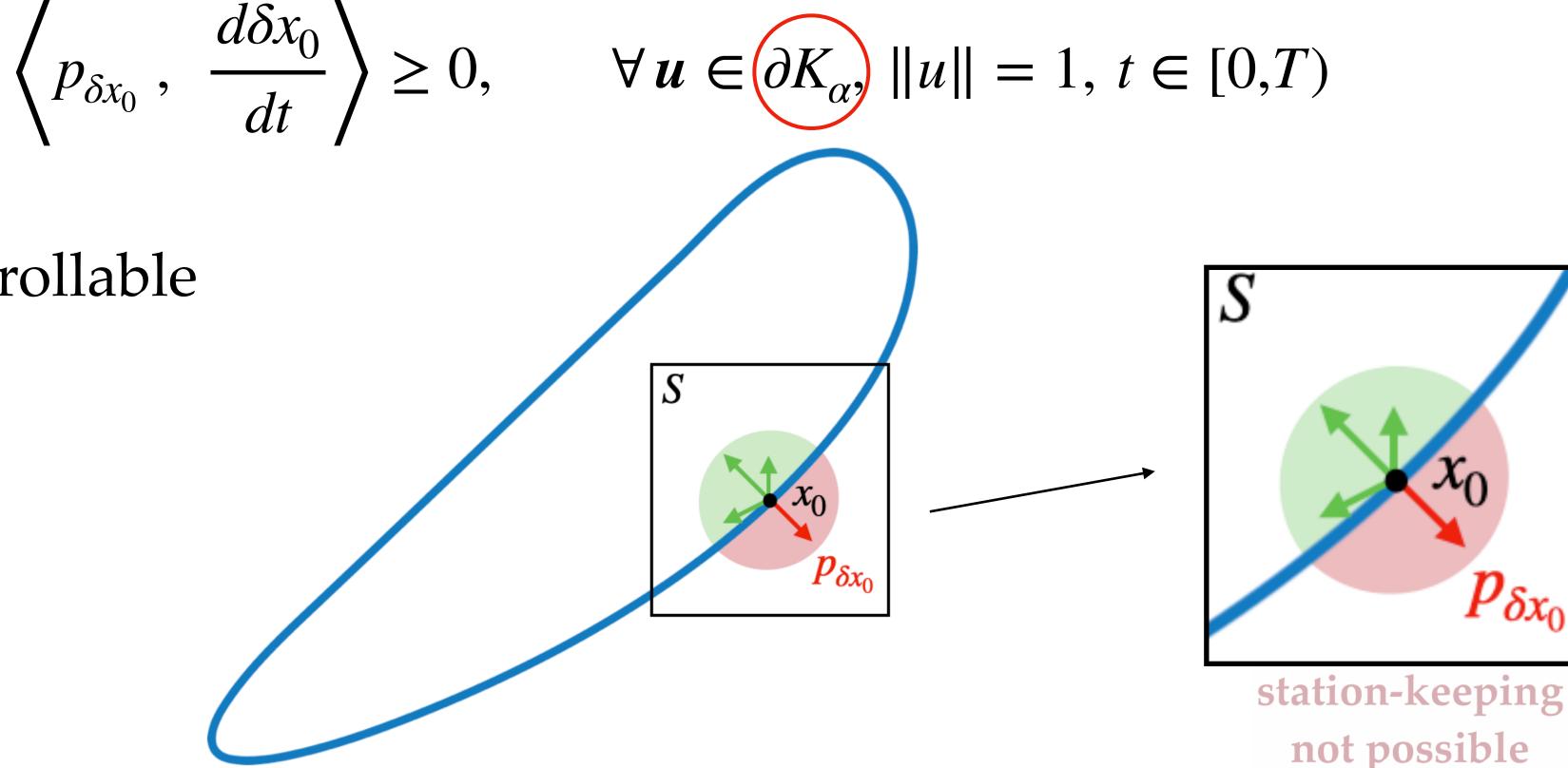


2. Necessary condition for local controllability

If $\exists p_{\delta x_0} \in T^*_{x_0}S$, $p_{\delta x_0} \neq 0$ such that

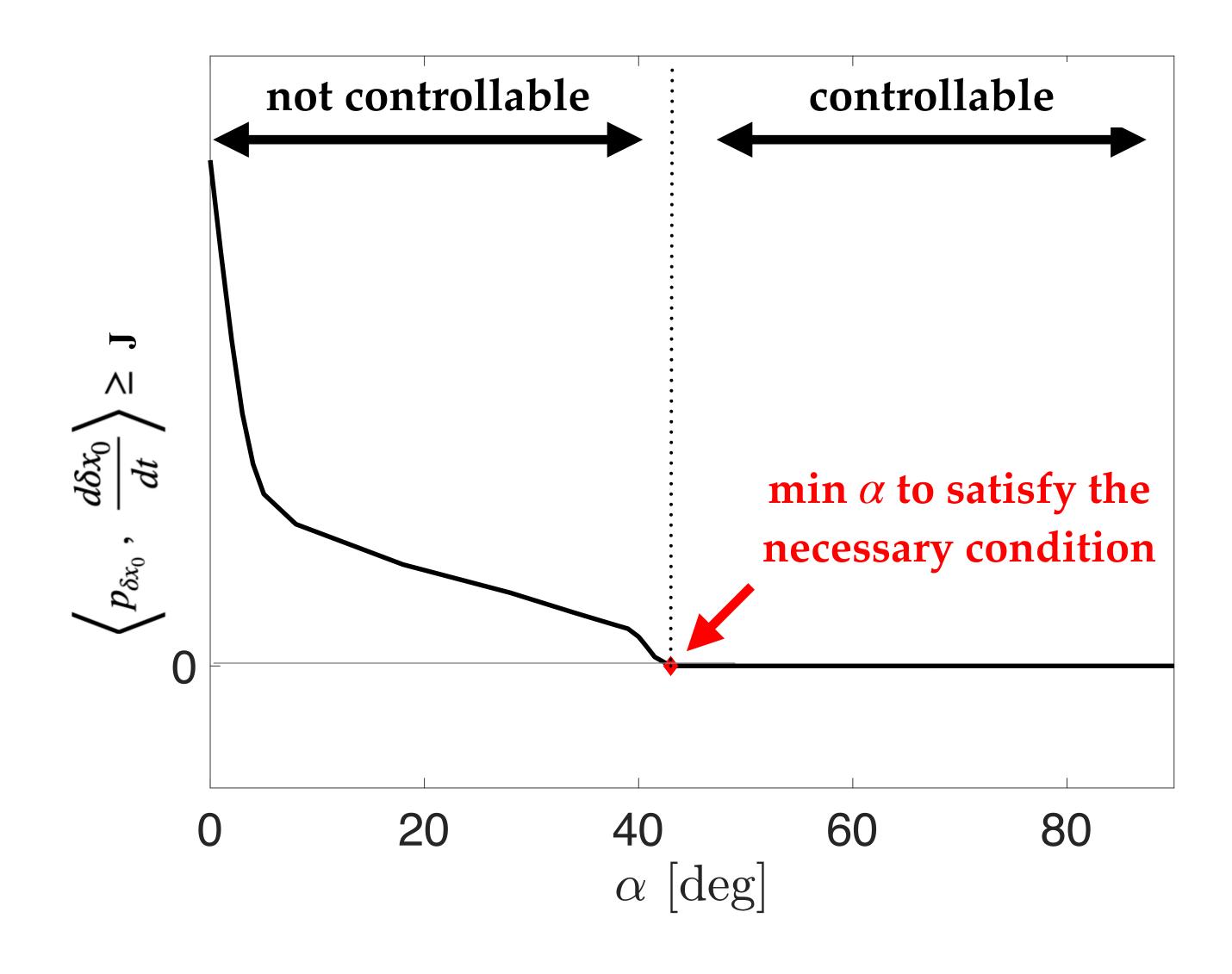
\rightarrow not locally controllable

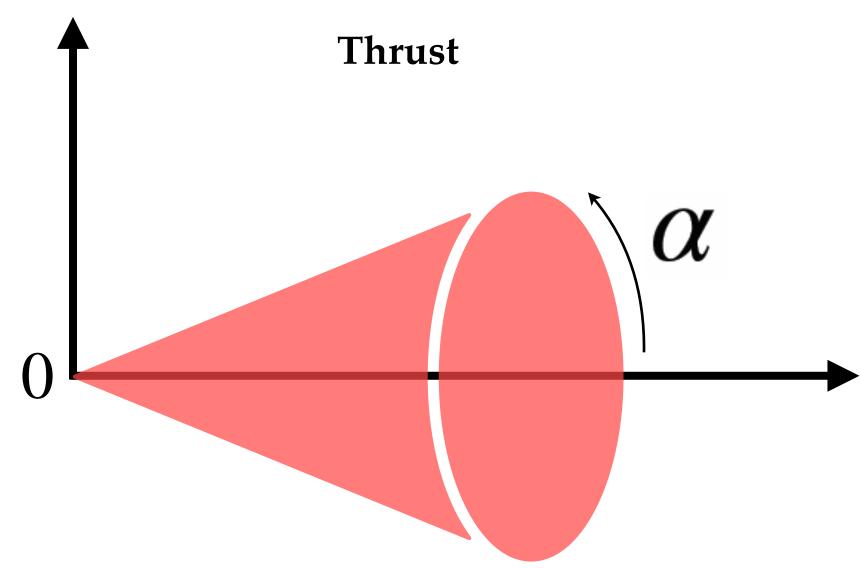
2. Exploitation: minimum requirement on thrust

min α such that the system is controllable $u \in K_{\alpha}$

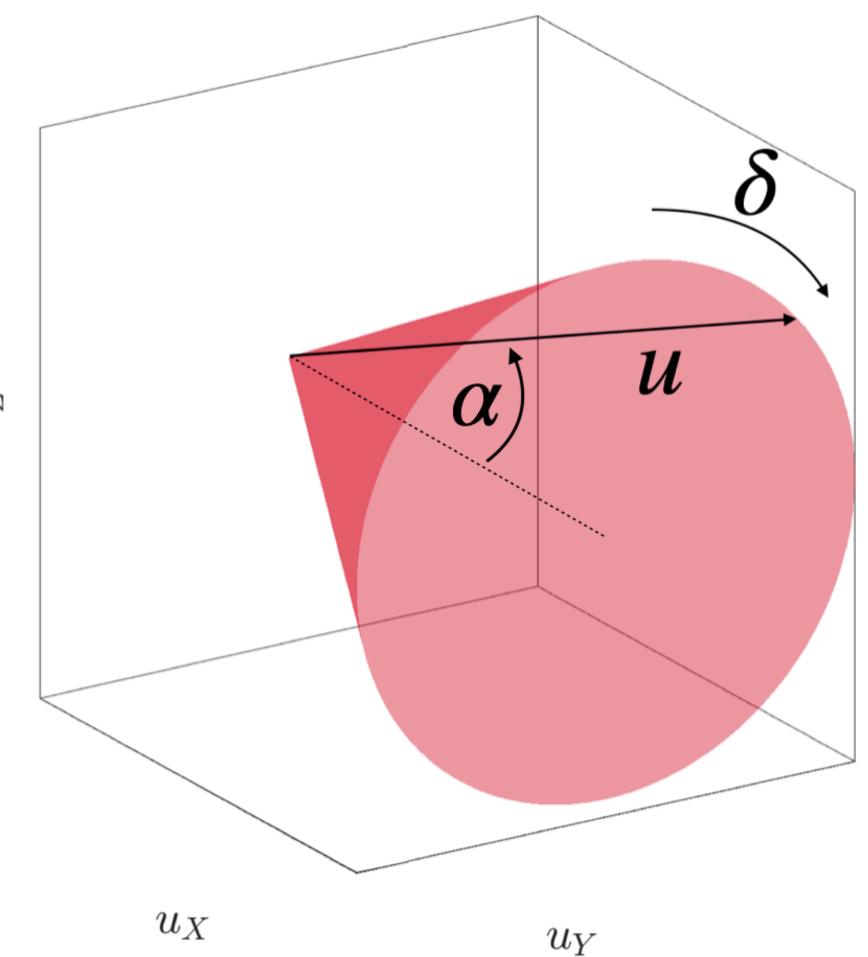




2. Numerical solution of the semi-infinite problem

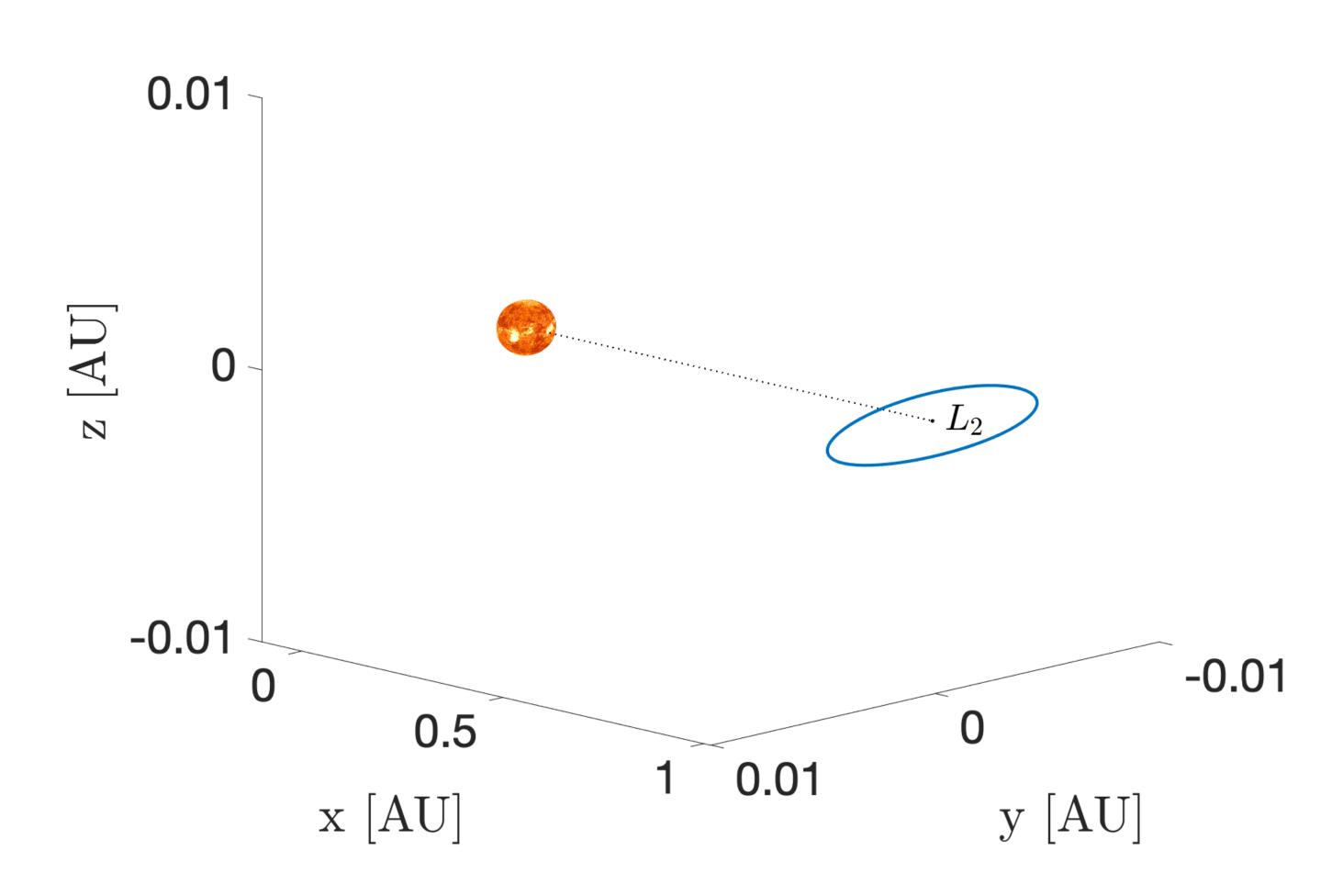

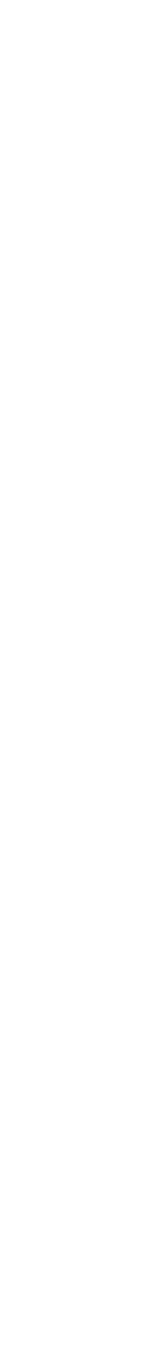
semi-infinite convex problem \iff finite number of LMI



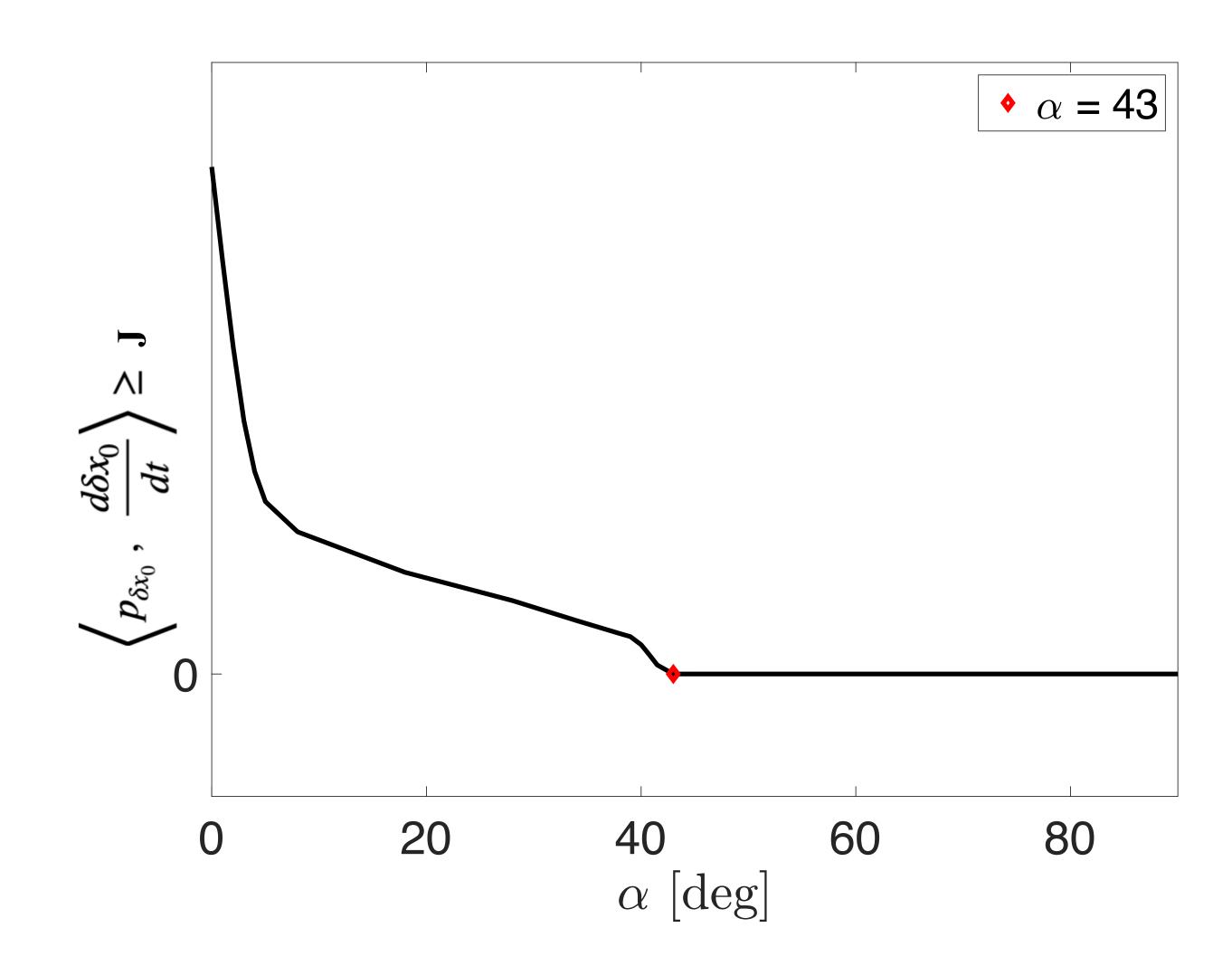


3. Halo orbit around L2

Conclusion

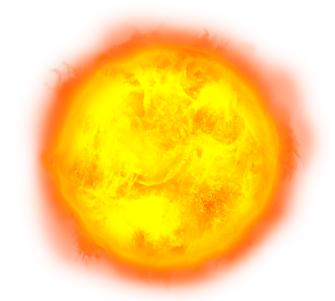
We offer a certificate of non-controllability for station-keeping:
