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Efficient Hyper-Reduction of contact problems treated by Lagrange multipliers.

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Propose a reduced order model for Variational inequalities/Saddle-point problems.

- Propose a solution to the challenging task of reducing the dual basis with a positivity **constraint** (see Figure extracted from [3]).
- **Ensure an efficient reduced order model** (accuracy and low order)

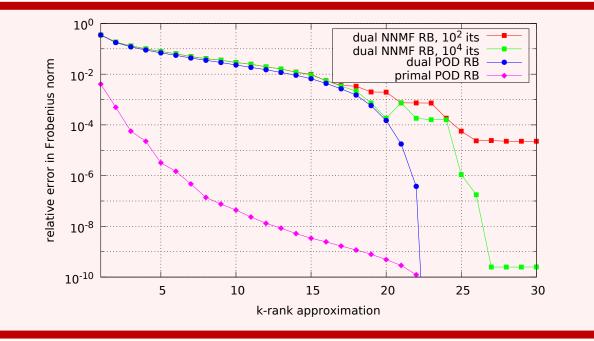
Saddle-point problem \Rightarrow Inf-sup/LBB condition (solvability and stability) Solvability condition : <u>B</u> must be of full row rank

Clustering on the parametric space

For large parametric spaces, reaching low errors on the whole parametric space could lead to low data-compression (increasement of the RBs size) \Rightarrow interest of clustering the parametric space

The nonlinear solution is searched in a piecewise linear manner Methodology ([2]):

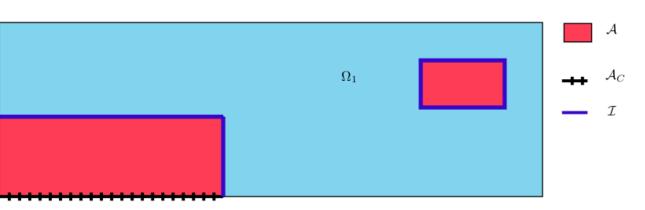
- Create clusters on the parametric space: Grassmann distance, k-medoids algo.

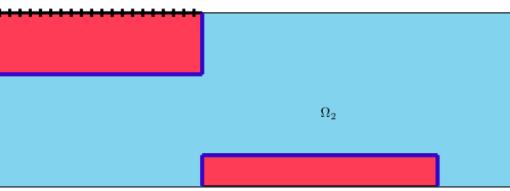




Hybrid Hyper-reduced (HHR) order model

- Hyper-reduction via Reduced Integration **Domain (RID)**: \mathcal{A} primal DOFs of the RID, $\mathcal{A}_C \subset \mathcal{A}$ primal DOFs on the RID contact surface (see Figure 1).
- **Primal reduced basis (RB)**: $\underline{V} \in \mathbb{R}^{N \times l}$ obtained by POD ($l \ll N$).
- the FE dual basis to \mathcal{A}_{λ} dual DOFs of the RID $(N_{\lambda}^C \ll N_{\lambda}).$
- \Rightarrow **Dual variable well approximated** (see [3]).

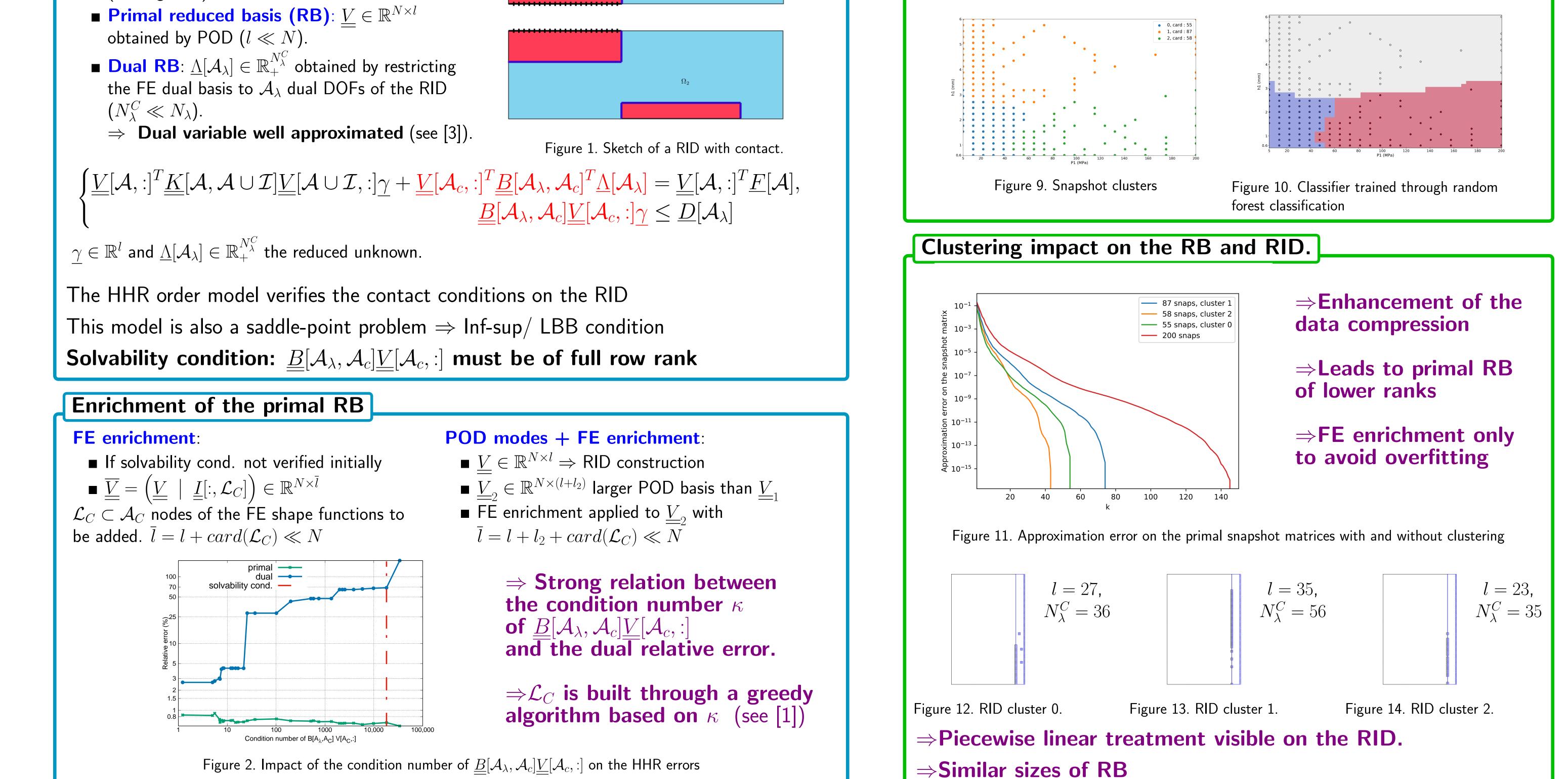
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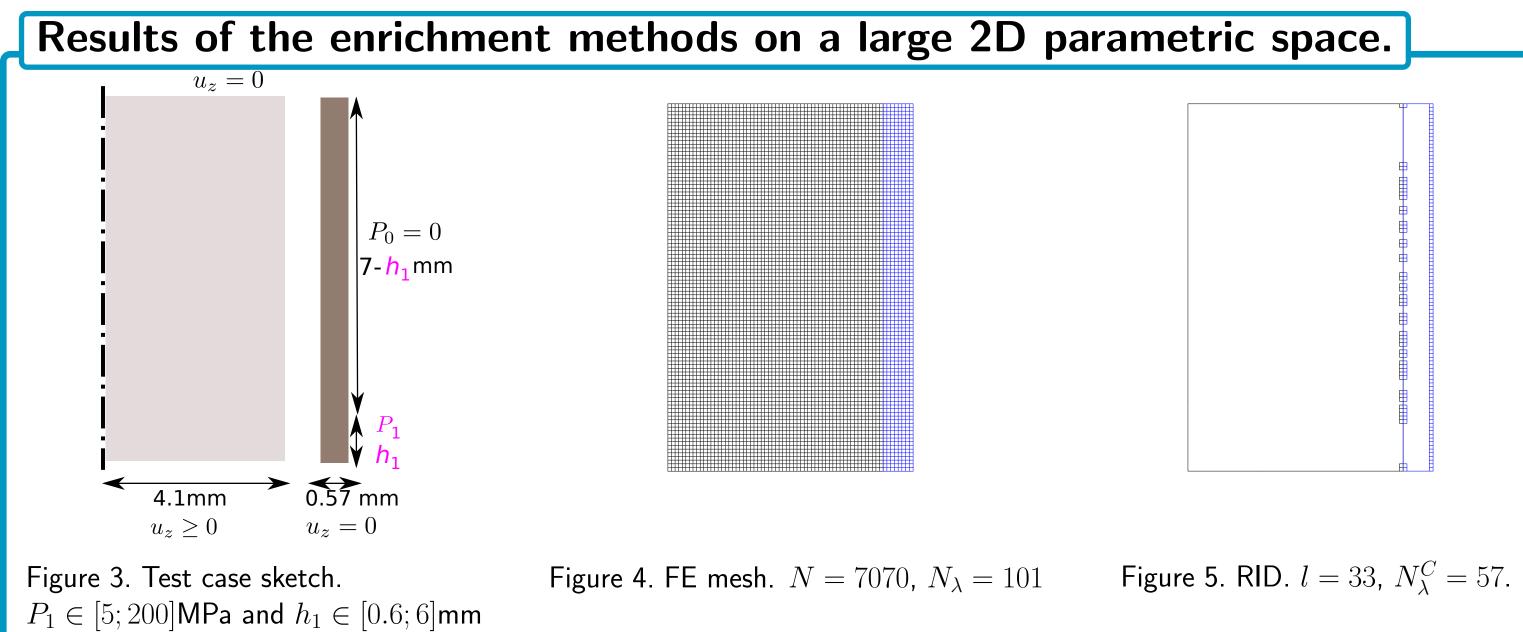
Goals

- Build local low-rank ROMs on each cluster
- Train a supervised classifier: Random forest algo.
- Solve the problem with the local ROM selected by the classifier

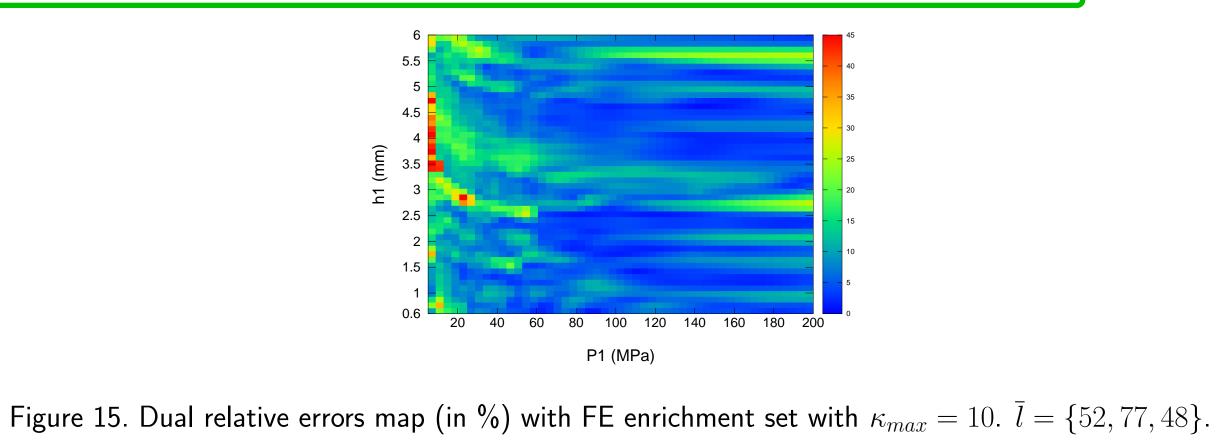
 \Rightarrow increase the solution's (primal and dual) precision without increasing the **RB** order.

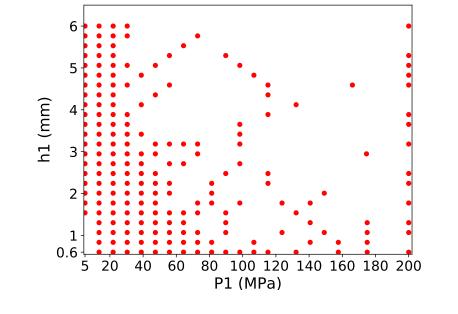
Clustering of a 2D parameter space and classifier.











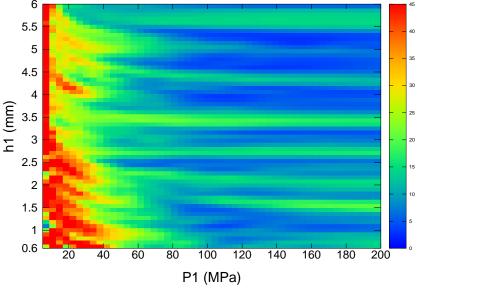


Figure 6. Snapshots positions.

P1 (MPa)

- \Rightarrow Robust strategies for large parametric spaces
- \Rightarrow Better results with POD+FE enrichment but higher primal RB size
- \Rightarrow Still high relative errors for low contact pressure parametric zones

- \Rightarrow Clustering strategy helps smoothening the dual errors
- \Rightarrow Errors considerably reduced for local RBs compared to a global RB

 \Rightarrow High accuracy on the whole parametric space, even for low contact pressures
