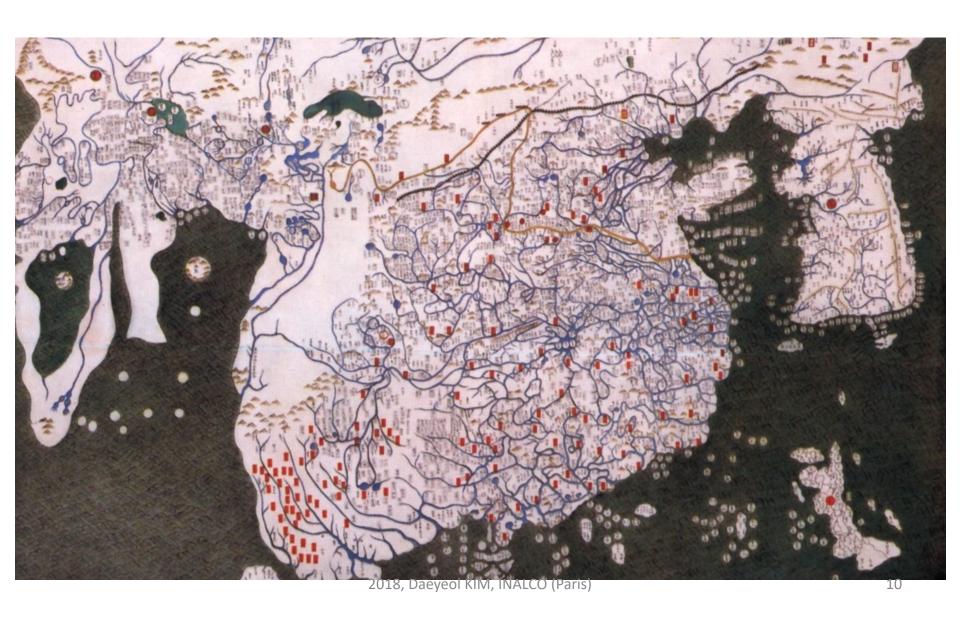

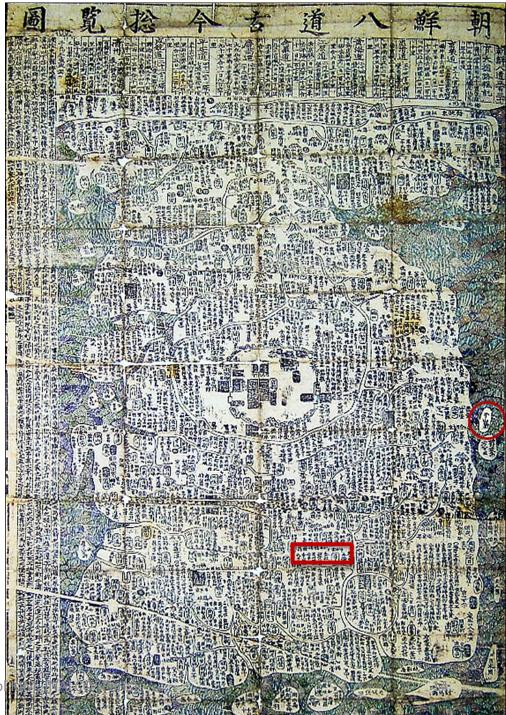

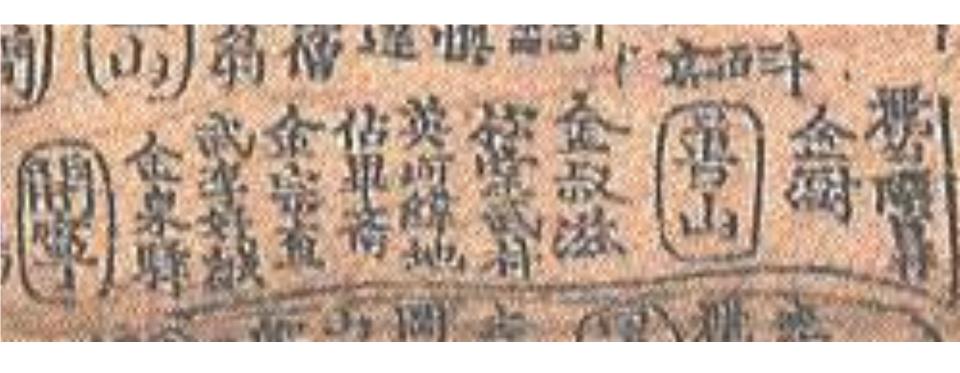

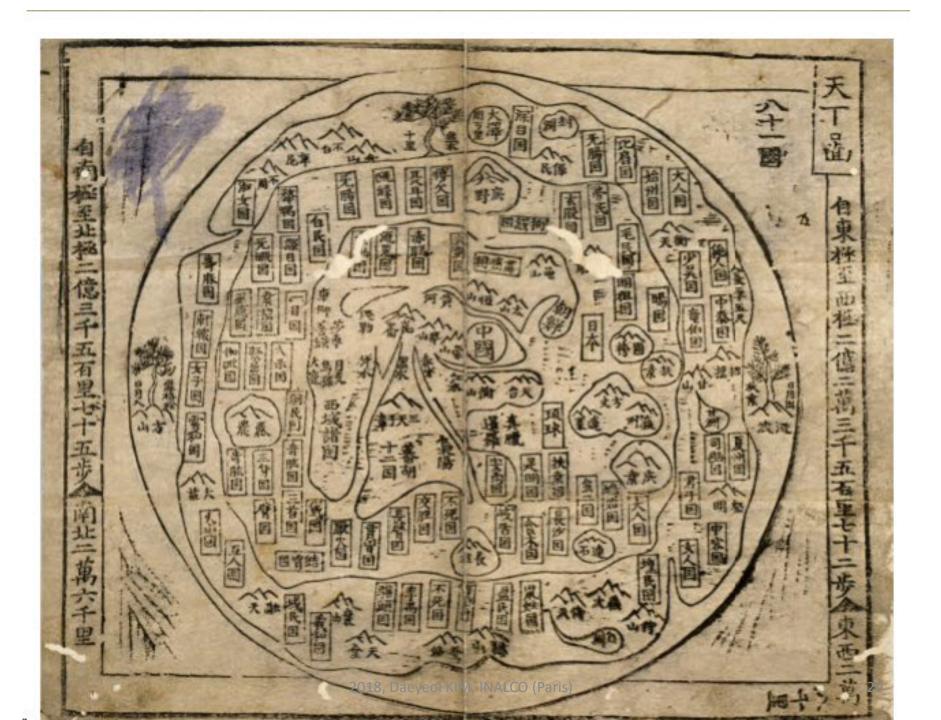

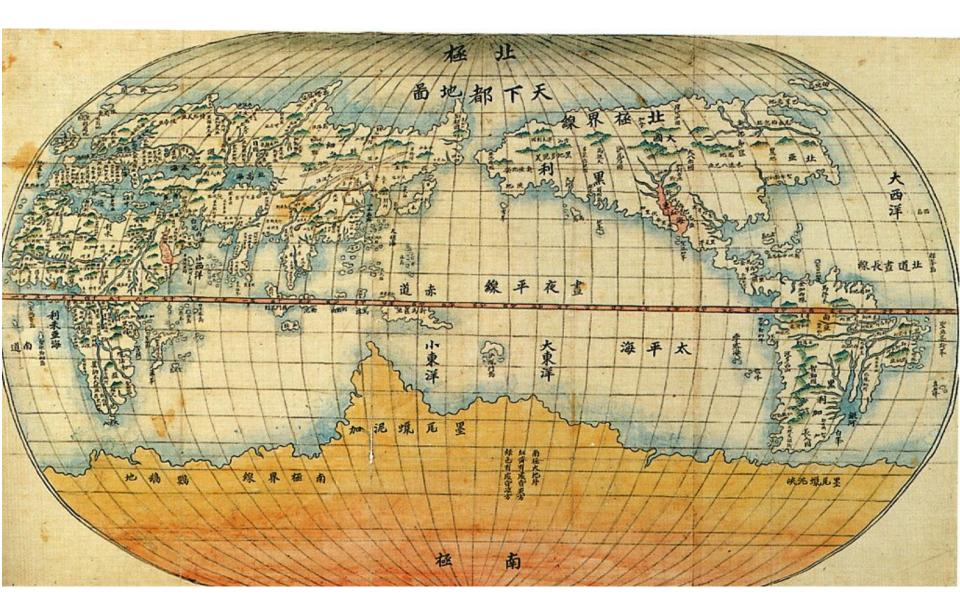

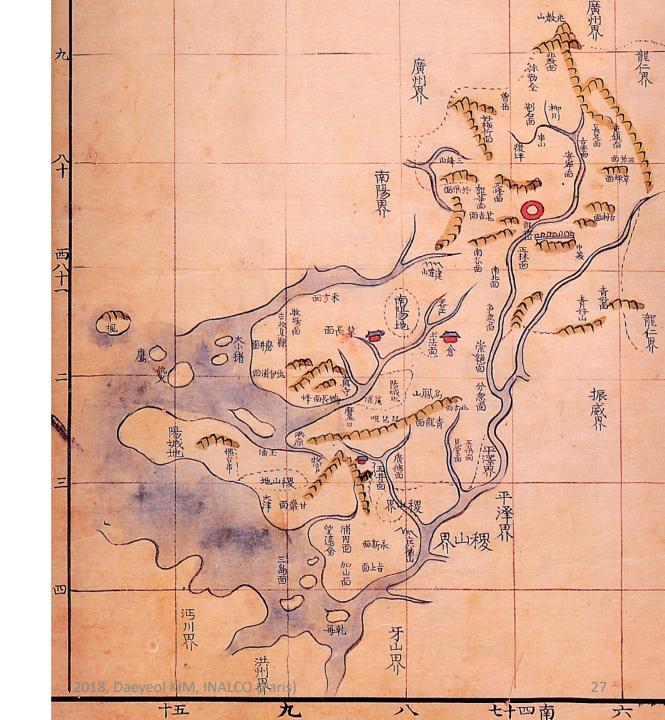

What is reading?

knowledge management

practice for social distinction

Evolution in reading culture in Choson time

- In the beginning: reading to prepare for the state examination
- In the middle: reading in search of the "way" to acquire a moral authority
- Towards the end: reading to solve problems of society and life

Changes in relationship with Qing China

- Evolution in Qing China
 - Inside stability and openness toward outside
- Evolution in Choson Korea
 - No longer a China to "down" (북벌 北伐) but to "learn" (북학 北學)
- Significant import from Qing China

In the 17th and 18th c.

Flood of knowledge and information from outside into Korean society

Economic development and social changes

Confucian and sino-centric dogma challenged

"Things"

Before means to study

In the 18th c. object of study

Changes in study

From moral principle

to social concern

and extraordinary curiosity as cultural standing

Passion, curiosity for knowledge

New paradigm of knowledge

Release from dogma

Before: Confucian spirit

완물상지 (玩物喪志)

"In indulging his tastes in things, he finally looses his wills"

In the 18th c.: Curiosity, passion, mania

"The man without mania is useless" (박제가)

벽(癖, mania) and 치(痴, crazy) : cultural distinction and privilege

"It is only maniacs who can have an original mind and understand a particular technique. Ah! These cowardly people who spoil the major business but who themselves did not suspect anything, they have to be wary of themselves in reading this book!"

Collection and ordering mania

- Curiosity and knowledge mania
 - → Gathered and sorted informations
 - − → Compilation & edition
- 이서구 (李書九 1754-1825) : 녹앵무경 (綠鸚鵡經 *The Classic on Parrot*)
- 유득공 (柳得恭 1749- 1807) : 발합경 (鵓鴿經 The Classic on Dove)
- 이옥 (李鈺 1760-1812) : 연경 (烟經 The Classic on Tobacco)

Evolution in reading culture

Before

- To prepare for the state examination
- In search of the way to acquire a morality or moral authority

In the 18th c.

- To solve problems of society and life
- To satisfy curiosity
- To get a social distinction

Changes in reading culture

Before

- slow and intensive reading
- reading for exegesis
- simple libraries

In the 18th century

- speedy and extensive reading
- reading for review
- libraries of "ten thousands books"

Two fundamental social layers

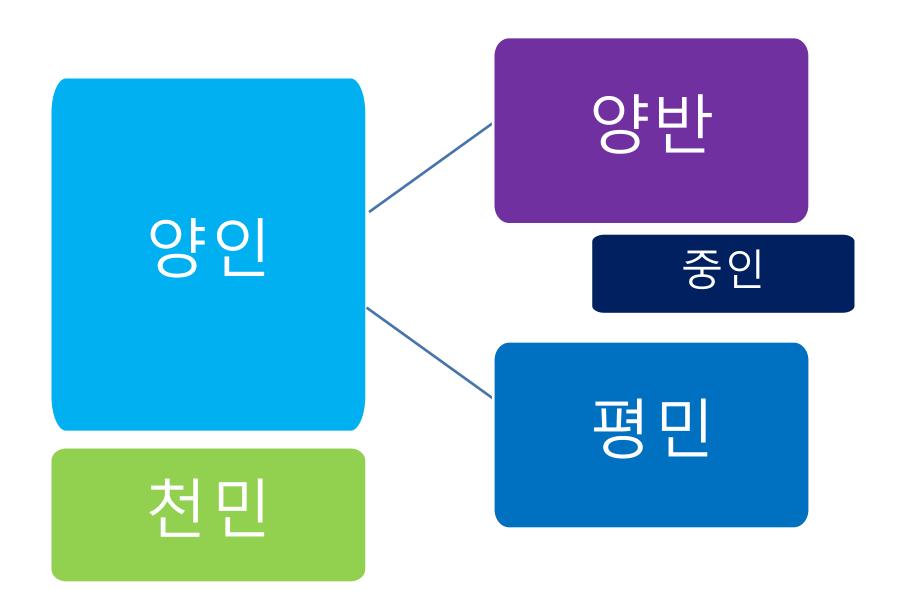
양인(良人) = "good people"

천민(賤民) = "base people"

양인

양반(兩班) = literati, higher civil and military officials

평민(平民) or 상민(常民) = "common people"



In the upper layer

Discrimination of secondary groups of *yangban* families

Secondary groups ---> 중인

Since the 2nd half of the 17th c.

중인 (中人) "Middle people" as social layer

Between "common people" and yangban elite

중인 (中人)

- Subaltern officials as 향리 (鄕吏)
- 서얼 (庶孼) : descendants out of illegitimate birth
- Higher officials in technical or specialized fields
 - Medical doctors 의원 (醫院)
 - Interpreter 역관 (譯官)
 - Expert in calendar 일관 (日官)
 - Accountant 계사 (計士)
 - Jurist 율관 (律官)

Middle people's cultural roles

- Educated people
- Economic power in the Capital
- Artistic activities
- Educational activity
- Bidirectional role

Economic power in the Capital

Officials with steady salary

Free of ideological constraint \rightarrow possibility of economic activity

Discriminated but sometimes in demand

Artistic activities

Poetry, calligraphy, painting, music

시사 (詩社, societies of poets)

Resistance against and dependency in the culture of noble literati

Educational activities

For common people as well as for people of upper layer

Publishing books

Bidirectional role

Dissemination of higher culture and imported knowledge

Introduction of popular culture to higher layer

---> cultural diffusion

Women's culture

- To educate their children
- To attend the literary activities of their husbands
- To develop their own writing talent

Women's writings

- A variety of genre
- With Korean alphabet in most cases
- In some cases: in a mixed style of Korean and classical Chinese or purely in classical Chinese ---> their education in Chinese classics.

Resistance to social system

- First draft in Korean by female member
- Transcription in classical Chinese by male member
- Trace of women's lives through women's care
- Division of work

Autobiographies

- 惠慶宮 洪氏 (혜경궁 홍씨, 1735-1816), 閑中錄 (한중록) or The Memoire of Lady Hyegyŏng
- 豊壤趙氏 (풍양조씨, 1772-1825), 자기록 or Autobiographical memoirs
- 烈女傳 (열녀전) Biographies of women who sacrifice their lives for marital fidelity

Political or ritual debates

- 任允摯堂 (임윤지당 1721-1793), 允 摯堂遺稿 (윤지당유고)
- 姜靜一堂 (1772-1832), 靜一堂遺稿 (정일당유고)

Extended literature

- 憑虛閣 李氏 (빙허각 이씨, 1759-1824), 閨閣叢書 (규합총서) ou Collections of gynaecium
- Poetry and prose
- Translation of Chinese texts in Korean

4. BOOK TRADE – KOREAN « BIBLIOTHÈQUE BLEUE »

Book trade

• Previously:

- Printing and distribution of books by the State >
 negative effect on commercial publication
- Woodblock printing in the private sector

• From the 18th c.:

- Development of market and growing social demande
- Circulation of knowledge integrates into the commercial economy

Diffusion in 2nd half of Choson

- Book brokers 서쾌 (書儈) or 책쾌
 - imported chinese books, reproduction by hand copies

Bookstore :

- rental
- popular books and learning materials
- pharmacy-bookstore 약계책사 藥契冊肆
- women's clubs of higher society in Seoul

A type of popular literature published in Early modern France

Prints in low quality and small format

With blue paper cover

Korean « bibliothèque bleue »

- 방각본 (坊刻本) "book printed in village"
- Commercial publication of popular book at low price in low quality
- Existence of book market





2018, Daeyeol KIM, INALCO (Paris)

- 간식류편 (簡式類編) Formulas of lettres
 - published in 1739
 - by 이인석 (李寅錫)
 - in Seoul
- A set of books
 - published between 1796-1808
 - by 전이채 (田以采) and 박치유 (朴致維)
 - at 태인 (泰仁)

• At the beginning:

- Book with practical aims and manual for learning
- Principal consumers : people of middle or lower class capable of reading written Chinese
- From the middle-19th c. :
 - novels
 - Clients: men from lower class or women from middle and lower class

Cultural roles

- Manual for learning of written chinese for children
- Books on history
- > Extension of literate population
- Certain publication only in panggakpon
- Appropriation by peuple (intermediary of lower class) of the culture of the higher class
