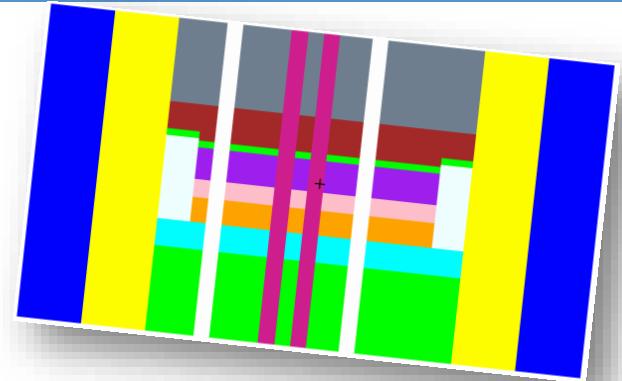

Context & objectives

I Dynamic fuel cycle simulations with SFR

- Sodium Fast Reactor (SFR) design
 - ASTRID-CFV concept (*Pu breeder, break-even, burner*)
- Simulation with CLASS : integration of new SFR models
 - Dynamic fuel irradiation

 - Dynamic fuel fabrication
 - Fabrication from a priori unknown spent fuels
 - Conservation of reactor specificities

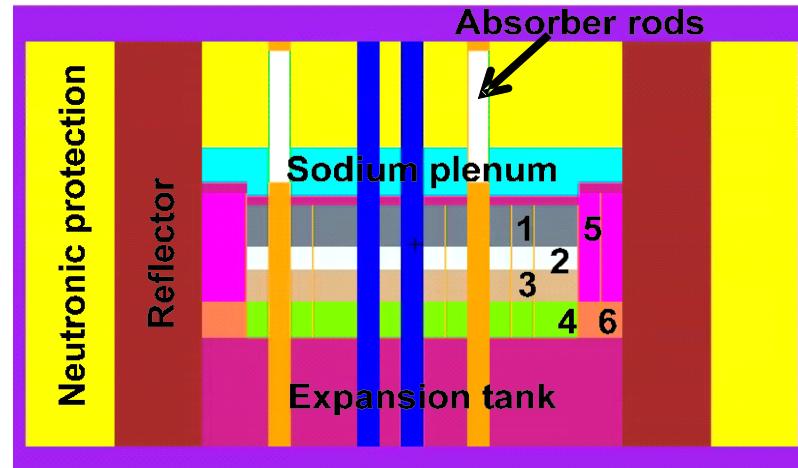
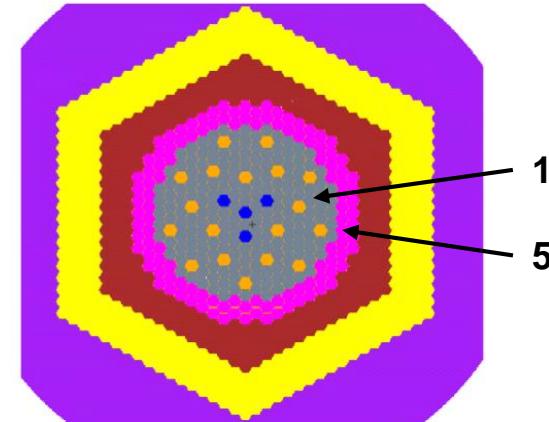

I ASTRID-like modeling

- ASTRID: 600 MW_e, Pu break-even concept (*O.Fabbris, Ph.D. Thesis, CEA, 2014*)
 - Core with low void effect
 - Heterogeneous
 - 2 Pu contents (internal & external fissile fuels)
 - Fissile fuel zones 1, 3, 5
 - Fertile fuel zones 2, 4, 6
 - Full core simulation with MCNP6 and VESTA
 - 100% fresh fuel
 - Control assemblies extracted

Axial and radial layouts

Multi-zone fuel loading model

Internal and external Pu contents

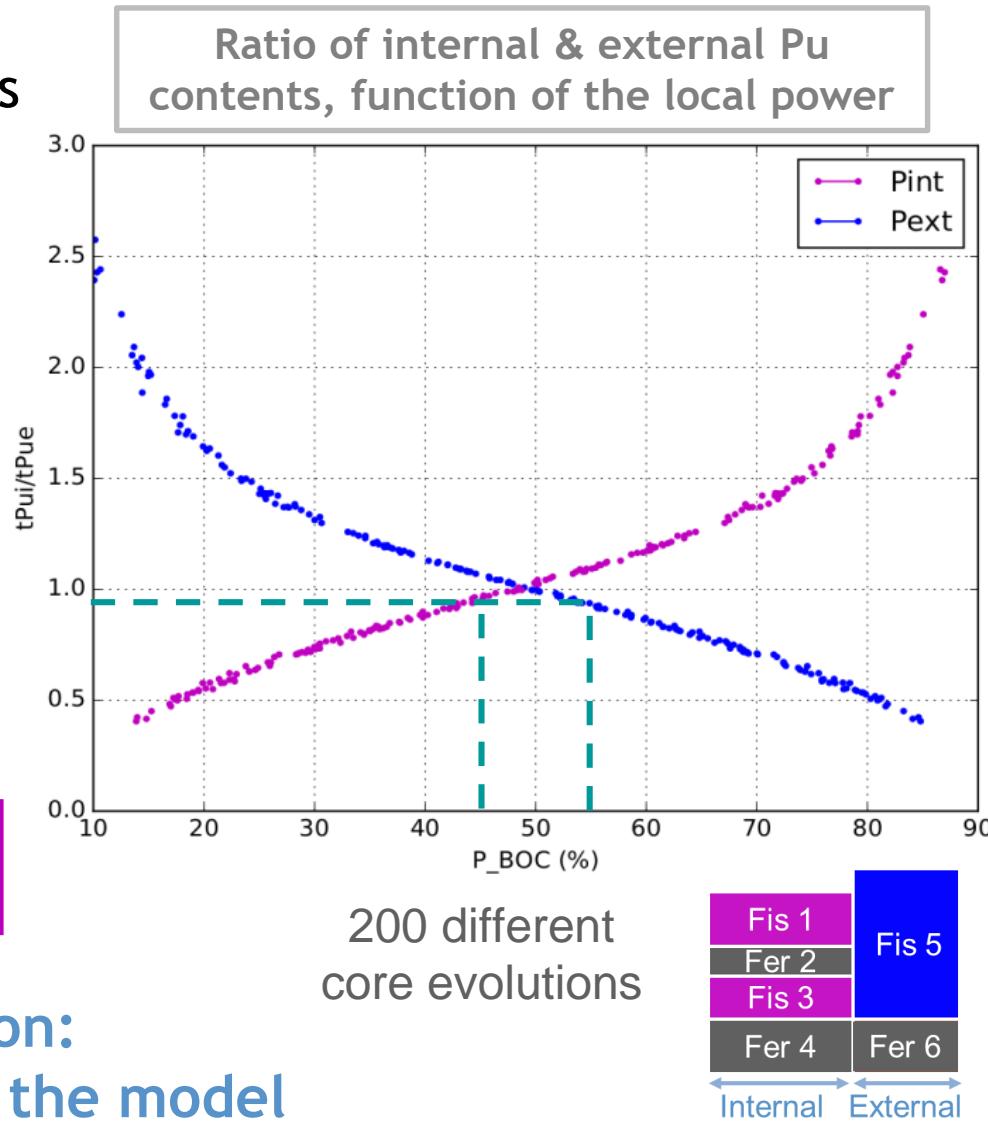
- Required 2 criteria to determine the fresh fuel compositions

Reactor power distribution

- Relation between P_{int} or P_{ext} and the Ratio of T_{Pu_int} & T_{Pu_ext}
 - The model must conserve this relation
 - Set P_{int} or P_{ext} , set R

$$P_{int} \text{ and } P_{ext} \propto R = \frac{T_{Pu\ int}}{T_{Pu\ ext}}$$

↗ Reactor power distribution:
Operational criterion for the model



Multi-zone fuel loading model

Internal and external Pu contents

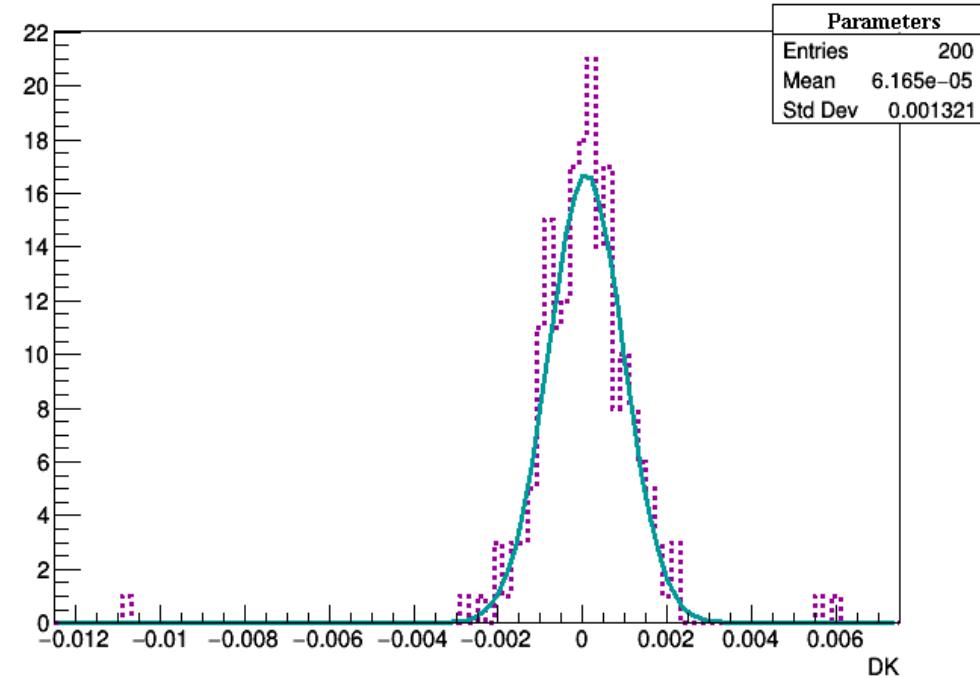
- Required 2 criteria to determine the fresh fuel compositions

Multiplication factor

- Reactor must be critical
 - $k_{\text{eff-BOC}} \sim 1.025$ for the reference fuel (100% fresh fuel)
- k_{eff} predictor (ANN)
 - Databank of 1000 different fuels for ANN generation
 - Prediction standard deviation $\sigma \sim 130 \text{ pcm}$

↗ Multiplication factor:
Operational criterion for the model

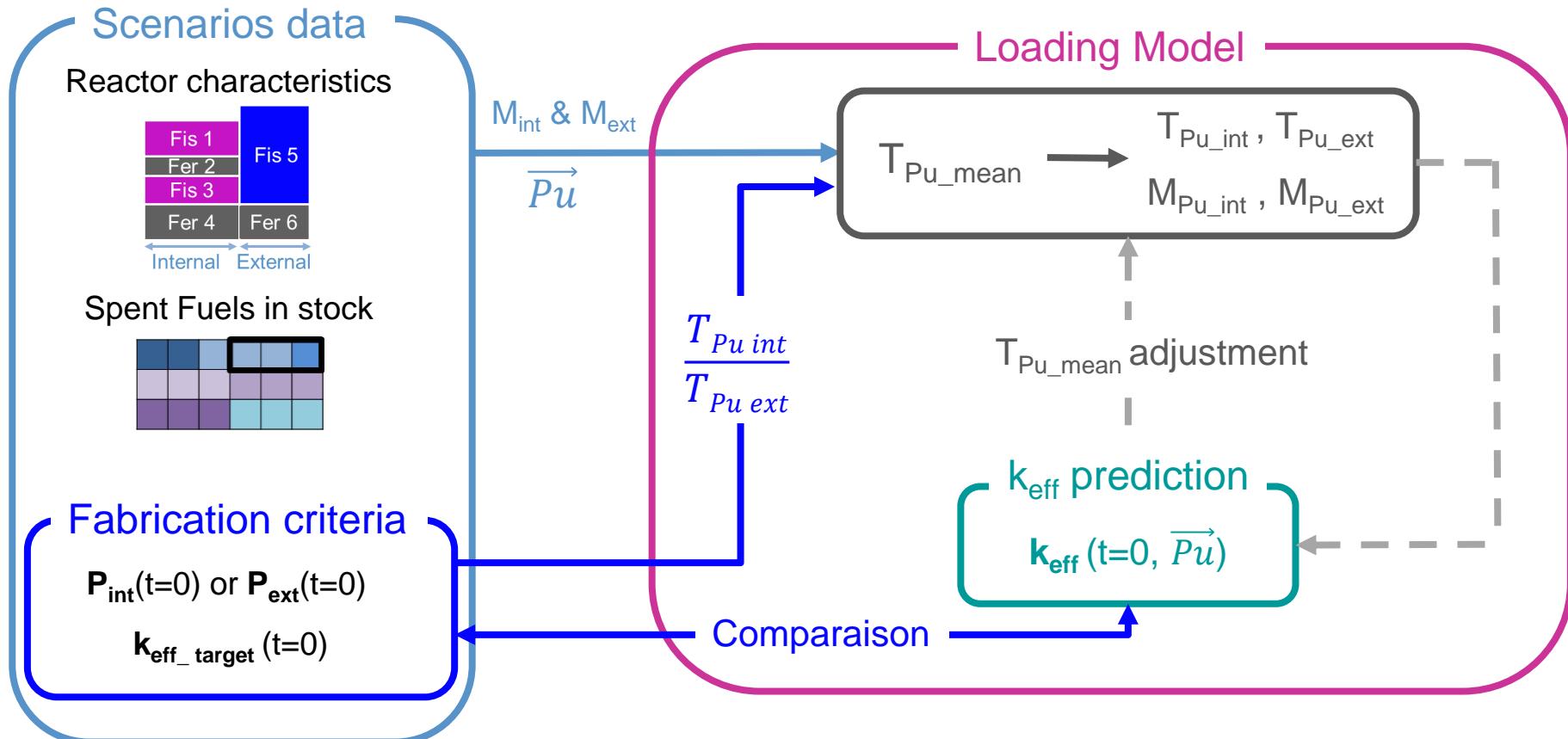
Predictor induced deviations
on k_{eff} at 0 GW.d/t



200 different fuels
independent of the databank

$$D_k = \frac{k_{\text{eff}}^{\text{pred}} - k_{\text{eff}}^{\text{MCNP}}}{k_{\text{eff}}^{\text{MCNP}}}$$

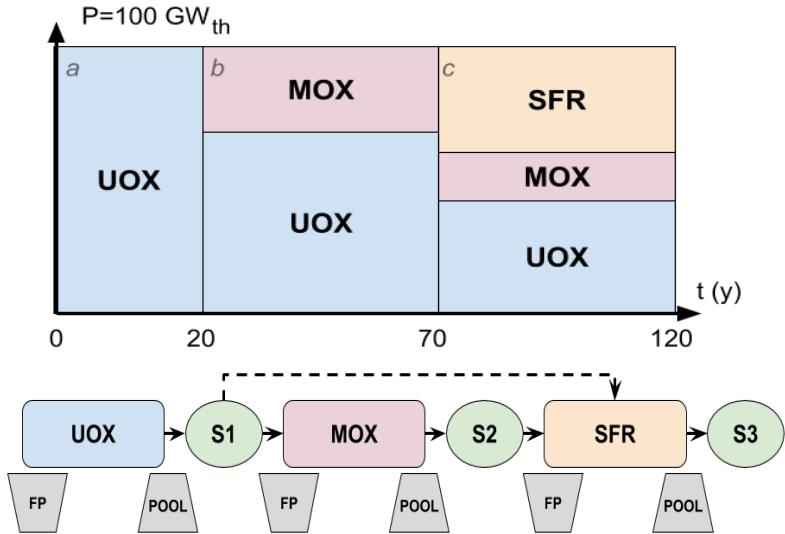
Multi-zone fuel loading model



One fuel cycle application case

Simple scenario

- Constant total fleet power
- 3 phases :
 - PWR-UOX
 - PWR-UOX + PWR-MOX
 - PWR-UOX + PWR-MOX + SFR-MOX
- Power fraction PWR-MOX / PWR-UOX kept constant during phases 2 and 3
- Sample parameters ~ 1000 simulations
 - PWR-UOX Burn-Up
 - Fleet composition
 - Reprocessing strategies



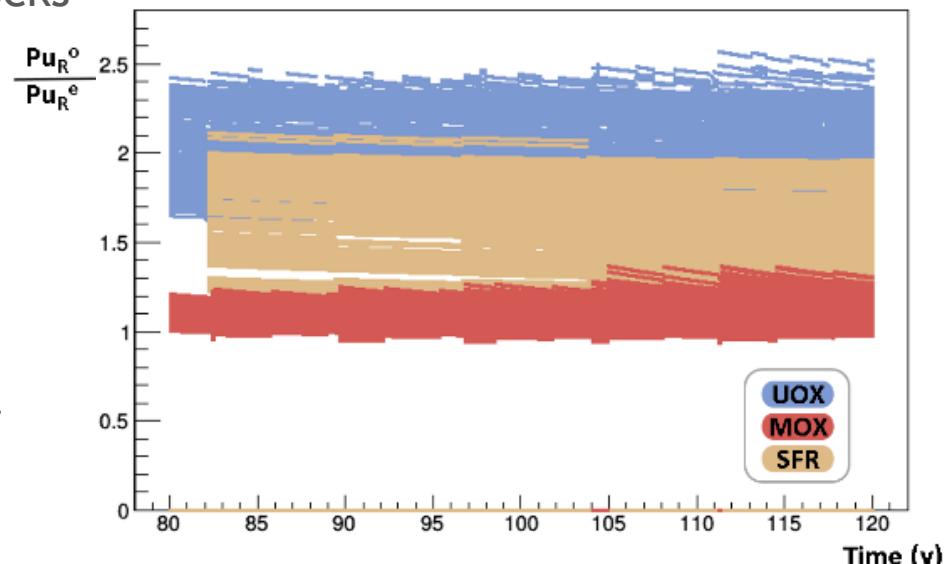
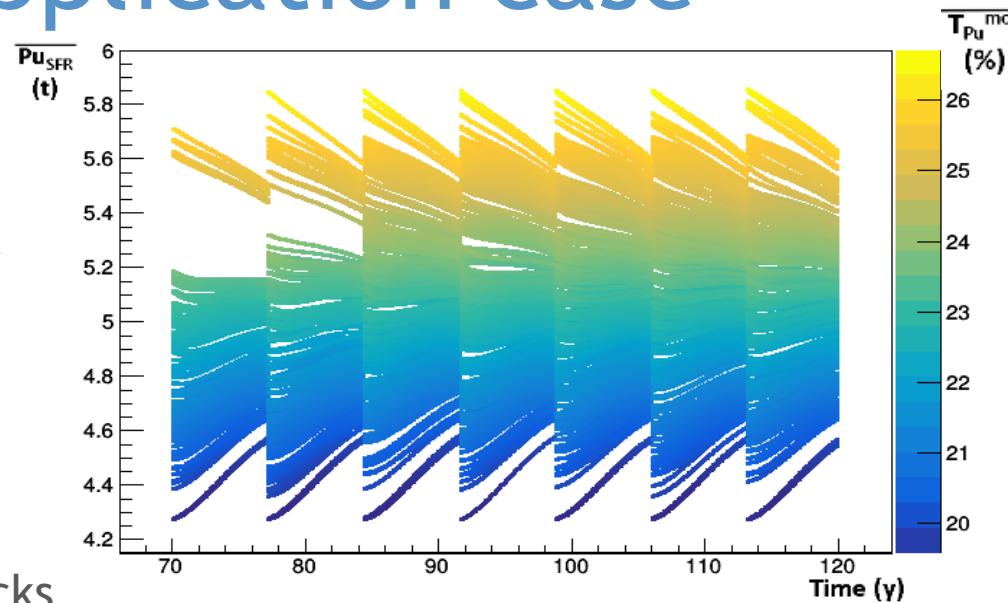
Variables	Case
BU_{UOX} (GWd/t)	[30 ; 65]
F_{MOX}^b (%)	[5 ; 15]
F_{SFR}^c (%)	[0 ; 30]
SM_{SFR}	LIFO – FIFO
S_{SFR}^{in}	S2 – (S1,S2)

One fuel cycle application case

Simple scenario

- For the break-even design the reactor behavior depends on \overrightarrow{Pu}
 - T_{Pu_mean} [19 ; 27] %
 - Pu breeder to burner
 - [-170 ; +280] kg/GWh_e
- Pu quality (Q) in spent fuel stocks
 - S1: PWR-UOX [1.6 ; 2.5]
 - S2: PWR-MOX [0.9 ; 1.4]
 - S3: SFR-MOX [1.2 ; 2.1]

$$Q = \frac{N_{239}Pu + N_{241}Pu}{N_{238}Pu + N_{240}Pu + N_{242}Pu}$$



Conclusion & perspectives

| Simulations of ASTRID-like reactor integration into a PWR fleet

- New multi-zone models for dynamic fuel irradiation & fabrication
- Usable for Pu break-even & burner designs



| Multi-zone fuel loading model

- Reactor heterogeneity & fuel zone interactions maintained
- 2 beginning of cycle criteria
 - k_{eff} target
 - Power distribution (P_{int} or P_{ext})
- Induced deviations on k_{eff} predictions by ANN: $\sigma \sim 130$ pcm

| One fuel cycle application case

- Simple example
 - SFR behavior depends on \overrightarrow{Pu}
 - Large variability of Pu quality in SFR spent fuels
