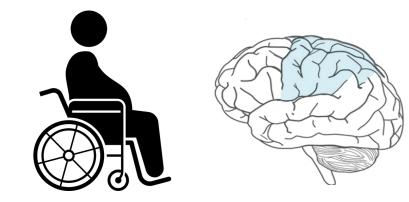

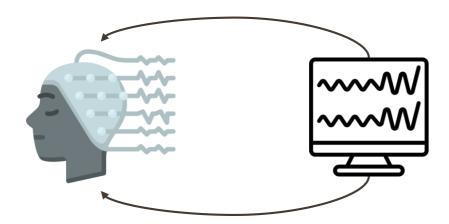

BCI acceptability mostly assessed as an attribute of users' satisfaction (i.e., a di - With *post-stroke patients*: Morone et al., 2015

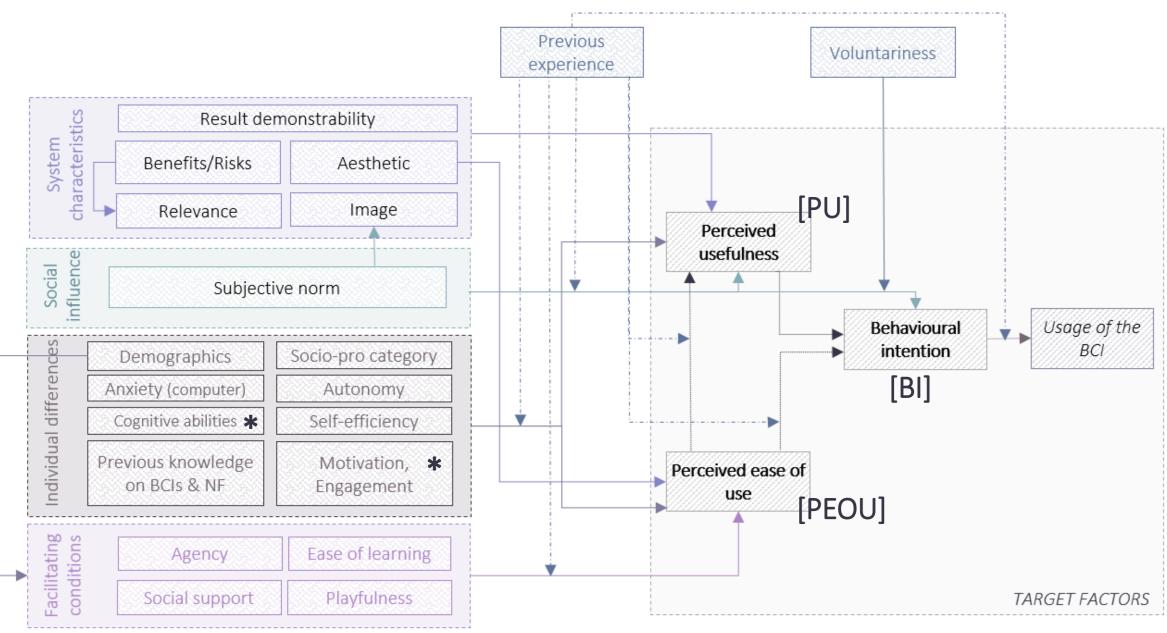

BCI-based training procedures are globally well-accepted. BCI acceptability has personal (physical, physiological, psychological) & relational factors (corport EEG cap characteristics (gel, montage, time to set up) (Morone et al., 2015/

Limited number of studies and absence of a theoretical framework \rightarrow need for BCI training to each patient

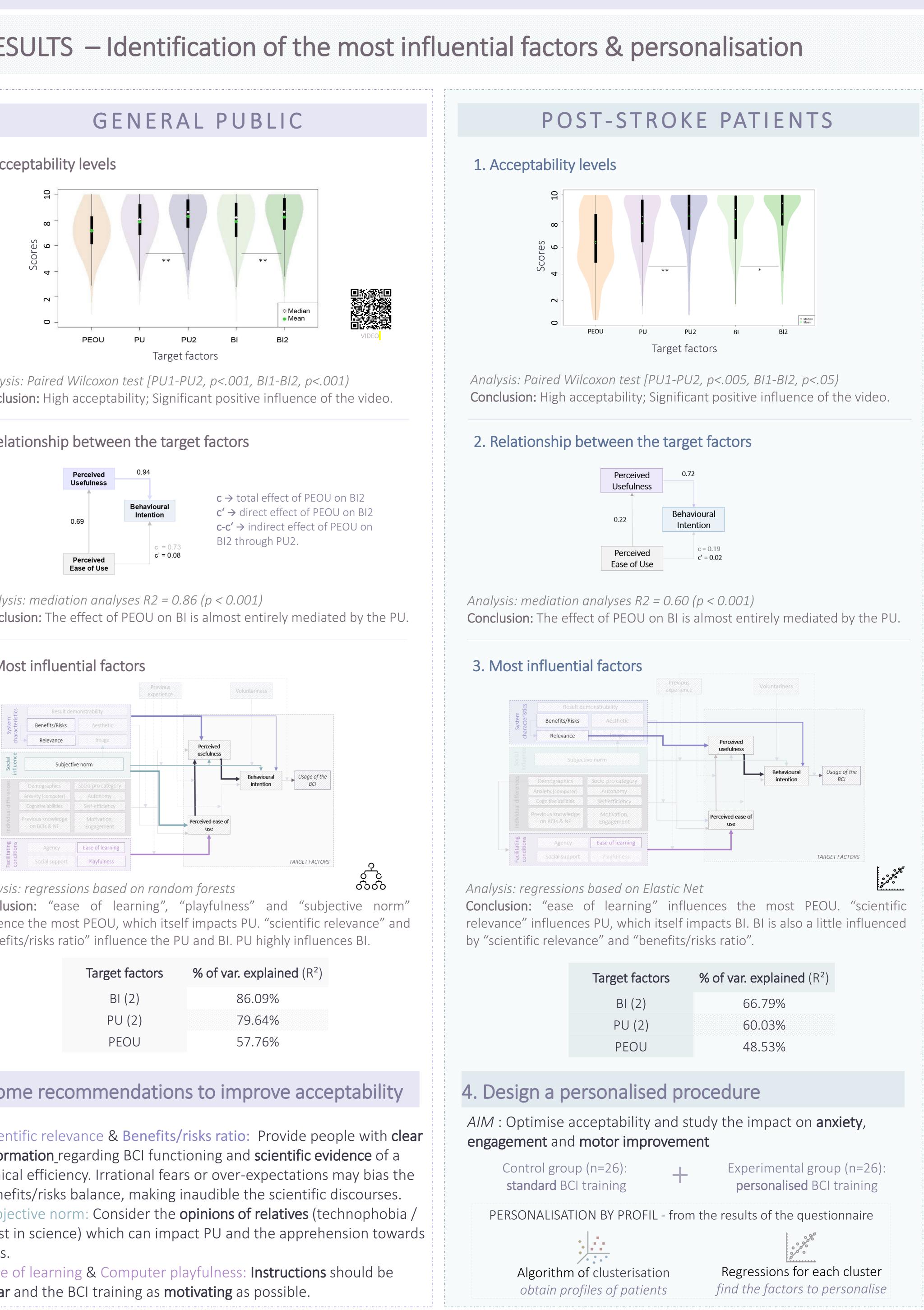
