Results

Cognitive Flexibility

the ability to flexibly switch between tasks (2)

"Changes in mission objective occur as frequent as 2-3 times a week"

"Difficulties with reprioritizing ."

"Not mentally prepared for the change in objective"

Vigilance decrement

decreased cognitive efficiency in response to monotonous stimuli (3)

"Strategies to divert attention away from fatigue"

Cognitive Fatigue

temporary decrease in mental resources over time due to sustained cognitive effort (reaction time & accuracy, 4)

"Sluggishness after intense mission phases"

Situational Awareness

the perception of environmental elements and events with respect to time or space (5)

" Difficulties with reprioritizing ."

"Not mentally prepared for the change in objective"

Top Down Attention

the voluntary allocation of attention to certain features, objects, or regions in space. (7)

"Forgetting to check systems"

" Not reacting to or not attending radio messages "

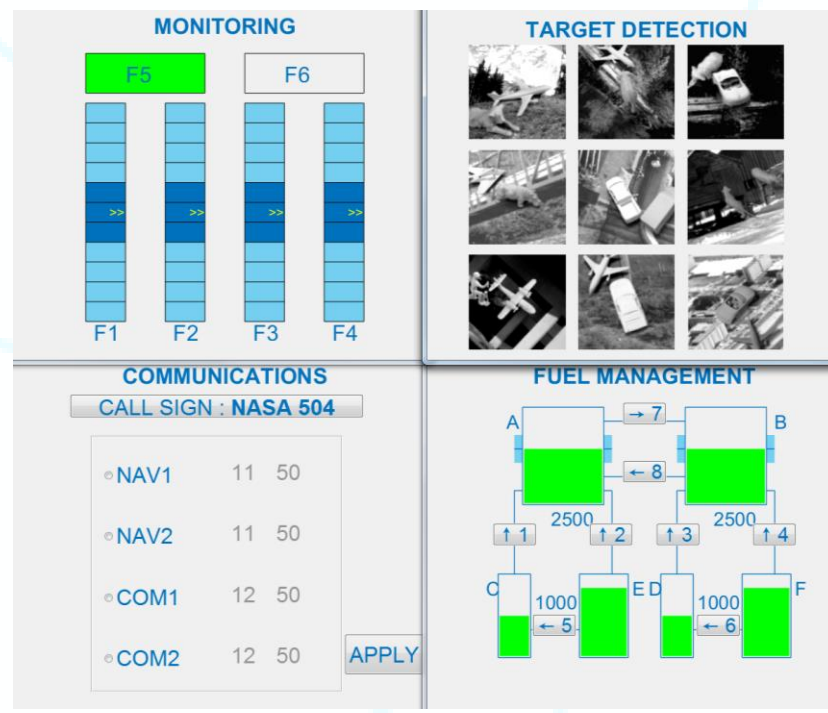
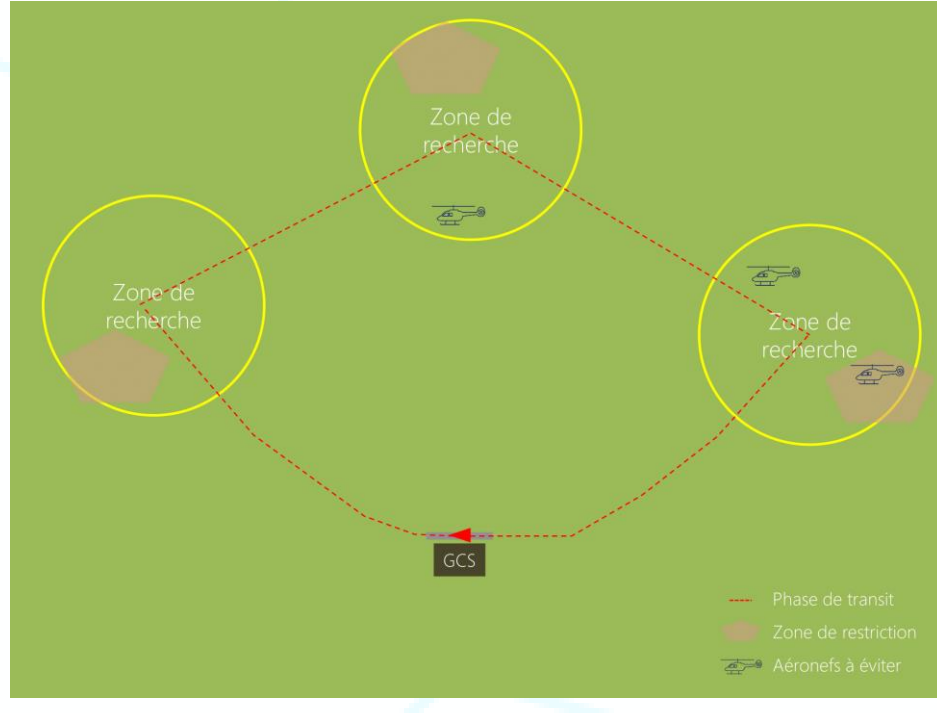
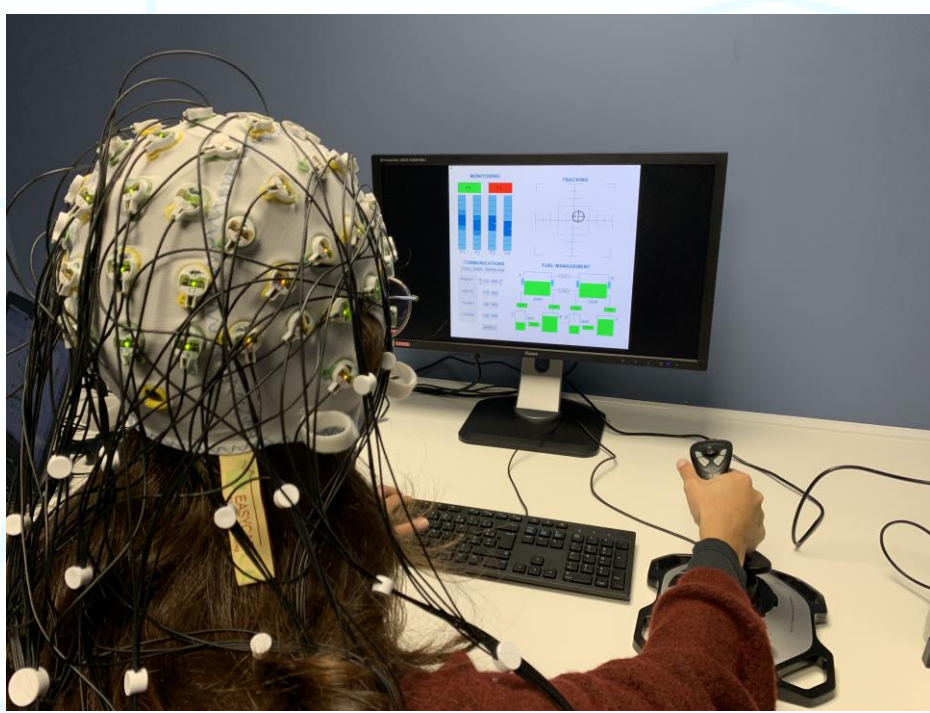
Mental/Cognitive Fatigue
