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# A lack of accessible river discharge data



At the African scale, there is a lack of coordination for hydrological data collection and dissemination: hydrological data is often scattered, heterogeneous or incomplete

Numerous public, semi-public and private organizations produce and manage data, but often they do not have the resources to exchange, standardize, summarize and capitalize on the data they generate


There is not enough partnership between the national hydrological services, in many countries licensing issues prevent the distribution of the data collected. There is also a more general problem of a widespread reluctance to share information

There is need to develop links between data producers and users to reinforce capacities for accessing, processing and take benefit from existing data.

As a consequence, the African continent is largely under-represented in global scale studies




# The largest assembled database of daily discharge data in Africa - ADHI

A new streamflow dataset of about 1500 gauging stations, from station data of GRDC and SIEREM databases with a minimum of 10 years of daily discharge

It extend from 1950 to 2018

Accessible to the scientific community

Most complete existing dataset of the African continent.





# Hydrometric indices and signatures

Different indices and signatures are representing mean flow characteristics and extremes (low flows and floods) are provided in ADHI, allowing to :

- study the long-term evolution of hydrology in Africa
- characterize of the hydrological regime and applications linked to the management of water resources and hydrological risks
- support the modelling efforts that aim at reducing the vulnerability of African countries to hydro-climatic variability.


<b>Basic indices</b>	Mean, Max, Min, STD, percentiles of daily streamflow, mean monthly runoff...
<b>Hydrologic signatures</b>	Baseflow index, half-flow date, autocorrelation of runoff, flow duration curve, Flashiness index, variability index, master recession curves, Skewness, rising limb density....
<b>Time series</b>	Annual mean, max, min of 7-day runoff Monthly mean, max, min runoff





# Catchment attributes

4. Dams and reservoirs (GrandD)
