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Quasi-rational solutions to the cylindrical nonlinear Schrödinger equation

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Abstract

Quasi-rational solutions to the cylindrical nonlinear Schrödinger equation (CNLS) in terms of wronskians and Fredholm determinants of order $2N$ depending on $2N - 2$ real parameters are given. We get multi-parametric families of quasi-rational solutions to the CNLS equation and we construct explicitly solutions of order 1 to 5.

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1 Introduction

We consider the one dimensional cylindrical nonlinear Schrödinger equation (CNLS) which can be written in the form

$$iu_{\tilde{t}} + u_{\tilde{x}\tilde{x}} + i\frac{u}{2\tilde{t}} - 2|u|^2u = 0, \quad (1)$$

where u is a function of \tilde{x} and \tilde{t} and the subscripts denote partial derivatives. This equation plays a role in the theory of light wave envelopes in dispersive media with nonlinear refractive index [1, 2]. In particular, it describes the cylindrically diverging quasi-plane envelope waves in a nonlinear medium.

Different approaches have been made to solve this equation. For example, Lax pair for this equation has been derived through the Painlevé analysis [3]. The one-soliton solution has been given via the Bäcklund transformation corresponding to the Lax pair.

It is known that there exist solutions of (1) which have a singularity in finite time and there has been much interest in the determination of the structure of this singularity: we can quote for example, the works of Ablowitz and Segur [4] in 1979 , Landman [5] in 1988, Smirnov and Fraiman [6] in 1991...

Optical solitons find application in distortionless signal transmission along optical fibres. Such applications occur in long-distance data transmission.

Here we present solutions to the cylindrical nonlinear Schrödinger equation (CNLS) of order N depending on $2N - 2$ real parameters in terms of wronskians and Fredholm determinants. Families of quasi-rational solutions to the CNLS equation are obtained. We construct explicitly solutions of order 1 to 5.

2 Different representations of quasi-rational solutions to the CNLS equation

2.1 Quasi-rational solutions of the CNLS equation in terms of Fredholm determinant

We use the following notations. The terms $\kappa_\nu, \delta_\nu, \gamma_\nu$ and $x_{r,\nu}$ are functions of the parameters λ_ν , $1 \leq \nu \leq 2N$; they are defined by the formulas :

$$\begin{aligned}\kappa_\nu &= 2\sqrt{1 - \lambda_\nu^2}, & \delta_\nu &= \kappa_\nu \lambda_\nu, & \gamma_\nu &= \sqrt{\frac{1 - \lambda_\nu}{1 + \lambda_\nu}}; \\ x_{r,\nu} &= (r - 1) \ln \frac{\gamma_\nu - i}{\gamma_\nu + i}, & r &= 1, 3.\end{aligned}\tag{2}$$

The parameters $-1 < \lambda_\nu < 1$, $\nu = 1, \dots, 2N$, are real numbers such that

$$\begin{aligned}-1 < \lambda_{N+1} < \lambda_{N+2} < \dots < \lambda_{2N} < 0 < \lambda_N < \lambda_{N-1} < \dots < \lambda_1 < 1 \\ \lambda_{N+j} = -\lambda_j, & \quad j = 1, \dots, N.\end{aligned}\tag{3}$$

Complex numbers e_ν , $1 \leq \nu \leq 2N$ are defined by :

$$\begin{aligned}e_j &= i \sum_{l=1}^{N-1} a_l(j\epsilon)^{2l+1} - \sum_{l=1}^{N-1} b_l(j\epsilon)^{2l+1}, \\ e_{j+N} &= i \sum_{l=1}^{N-1} a_l(j\epsilon)^{2l+1} + \sum_{l=1}^{N-1} b_l(j\epsilon)^{2l+1}, \\ 1 \leq j &\leq N-1.\end{aligned}\tag{4}$$

$\epsilon, a_\nu, b_\nu, \nu = 1 \dots 2N$ are arbitrary real numbers.

Let I be the unit matrix, and

$$\epsilon_j = j \quad 1 \leq j \leq N, \quad \epsilon_j = N + j, \quad N + 1 \leq j \leq 2N.\tag{5}$$

We consider the following matrix $D_r = (d_{jk}^{(r)})_{1 \leq j,k \leq 2N}$ defined by :

$$d_{\nu\mu}^{(r)} = (-1)^{\epsilon_\nu} \prod_{\eta \neq \mu} \left| \frac{\gamma_\eta + \gamma_\nu}{\gamma_\eta - \gamma_\mu} \right| \exp(i\kappa_\nu x - 2\delta_\nu t + x_{r,\nu} + e_\nu).\tag{6}$$

With these notations, the solution to the CNLS equation takes the form

Theorem 2.1 Let v be the following expression

$$v(x, t) = \frac{\det(I + D_3(x, t))}{\det(I + D_1(x, t))} e^{2it - i\varphi}, \quad (7)$$

then the function u defined by

$$u(X, T) = \frac{1}{T} v(-\frac{X}{T}, -\frac{1}{T}) e^{\frac{iX^2}{4T}} \quad (8)$$

is a solution to the cylindrical CNLS equation (1) depending on $2N - 1$ real parameters a_j, b_j, ϵ , $1 \leq j \leq N - 1$ with the matrix $D_r = (d_{jk}^{(r)})_{1 \leq j, k \leq 2N}$ defined by

$$d_{\nu\mu}^{(r)} = (-1)^{\epsilon_\nu} \prod_{\eta \neq \mu} \left| \frac{\gamma_\eta + \gamma_\nu}{\gamma_\eta - \gamma_\mu} \right| \exp(i\kappa_\nu x - 2\delta_\nu t + x_{r,\nu} + e_\nu).$$

where $\kappa_\nu, \delta_\nu, x_{r,\nu}, \gamma_\nu, e_\nu$ being defined in (2), (3) and (4).

2.2 Wronskian representation

We define the following notations :

$$\phi_{r,\nu} = \sin \Theta_{r,\nu}, \quad 1 \leq \nu \leq N, \quad \phi_{r,\nu} = \cos \Theta_{r,\nu}, \quad N + 1 \leq \nu \leq 2N, \quad r = 1, 3, \quad (9)$$

with the arguments

$$\Theta_{r,\nu} = \kappa_\nu x/2 + i\delta_\nu t - ix_{r,\nu}/2 + \gamma_\nu y - ie_\nu/2, \quad 1 \leq \nu \leq 2N. \quad (10)$$

The functions $\phi_{r,\nu}$ are defined by

$$\phi_{r,\nu} = \sin \Theta_{r,\nu}, \quad 1 \leq \nu \leq N, \quad \phi_{r,\nu} = \cos \Theta_{r,\nu}, \quad N + 1 \leq \nu \leq 2N, \quad r = 1, 3, \quad (11)$$

We denote $W_r(y)$ the wronskian of the functions $\phi_{r,1}, \dots, \phi_{r,2N}$ defined by

$$W_r(y) = \det[(\partial_y^{\mu-1} \phi_{r,\nu})_{\nu, \mu \in [1, \dots, 2N]}]. \quad (12)$$

We get the following result :

Theorem 2.2 Let v be the expression defined by

$$v(x, t) = \frac{W_3(\phi_{3,1}, \dots, \phi_{3,2N})(0)}{W_1(\phi_{1,1}, \dots, \phi_{1,2N})(0)} e^{2it - i\varphi},$$

then the function u defined by

$$u(X, T) = \frac{1}{T} v(-\frac{X}{T}, -\frac{1}{T}) e^{\frac{iX^2}{4T}} \quad (13)$$

is a solution to the cylindrical CNLS equation (1) depending on $2N - 1$ real parameters a_j, b_j, ϵ , $1 \leq j \leq N - 1$ with ϕ_ν^r defined in (11)

$$\begin{aligned} \phi_{r,\nu} &= \sin(\kappa_\nu x/2 + i\delta_\nu t - ix_{r,\nu}/2 + \gamma_\nu y - ie_\nu/2), \quad 1 \leq \nu \leq N, \\ \phi_{r,\nu} &= \cos(\kappa_\nu x/2 + i\delta_\nu t - ix_{r,\nu}/2 + \gamma_\nu y - ie_\nu/2), \quad N + 1 \leq \nu \leq 2N, \quad r = 1, 3, \end{aligned}$$

$\kappa_\nu, \delta_\nu, x_{r,\nu}, \gamma_\nu, e_\nu$ being defined in (2), (3) and (4).

Another representation of the solutions to the CNLS equation depending only on terms γ_ν , $1 \leq \nu \leq 2N$ can be also given. From the relations (2), we can express the terms κ_ν , δ_ν and $x_{r,\nu}$ in function of γ_ν , for $1 \leq \nu \leq 2N$ and we obtain :

$$\begin{aligned}\kappa_j &= \frac{4\gamma_j}{(1+\gamma_j^2)}, \quad \delta_j = \frac{4\gamma_j(1-\gamma_j^2)}{(1+\gamma_j^2)^2}, \quad x_{r,j} = (r-1) \ln \frac{\gamma_j - i}{\gamma_j + i}, \quad 1 \leq j \leq N, \\ \kappa_j &= \frac{4\gamma_j}{(1+\gamma_j^2)}, \quad \delta_j = -\frac{4\gamma_j(1-\gamma_j^2)}{(1+\gamma_j^2)^2}, \quad x_{r,j} = (r-1) \ln \frac{\gamma_j + i}{\gamma_j - i}, \quad N+1 \leq j \leq 2N.\end{aligned}\tag{14}$$

We have the following result

Theorem 2.3 *Let v be the expression defined by*

$$v(x, t) = \frac{\det[(\partial_y^{\mu-1} \tilde{\phi}_{3,\nu}(0))_{\nu, \mu \in [1, \dots, 2N]}]}{\det[(\partial_y^{\mu-1} \tilde{\phi}_{1,\nu}(0))_{\nu, \mu \in [1, \dots, 2N]}]} e^{2it-i\varphi},\tag{15}$$

then the function defined by

$$u(X, T) = \frac{1}{T} v(-\frac{X}{T}, -\frac{1}{T}) e^{\frac{iX^2}{4T}}\tag{16}$$

is a solution to the cylindrical CNLS equation (1) depending on $2N-1$ real parameters a_j , b_j , ϵ , $1 \leq j \leq N-1$. The functions $\tilde{\phi}_{r,\nu}$ are defined by

$$\begin{aligned}\tilde{\phi}_{r,j}(y) &= \sin \left(\frac{2\gamma_j}{(1+\gamma_j^2)} x + i \frac{4\gamma_j(1-\gamma_j^2)}{(1+\gamma_j^2)^2} t - i \frac{(r-1)}{2} \ln \frac{\gamma_j - i}{\gamma_j + i} + \gamma_j y - ie_j \right), \\ \tilde{\phi}_{r,N+j}(y) &= \cos \left(\frac{2\gamma_j}{(1+\gamma_j^2)} x - i \frac{4\gamma_j(1-\gamma_j^2)}{(1+\gamma_j^2)^2} t + i \frac{(r-1)}{2} \ln \frac{\gamma_j - i}{\gamma_j + i} + \frac{1}{\gamma_j} y - ie_{N+j} \right),\end{aligned}\tag{17}$$

where $\gamma_j = \sqrt{\frac{1-\lambda_j}{1+\lambda_j}}$, $1 \leq j \leq N$.

λ_j is an arbitrary real parameter such that $0 < \lambda_j < 1$, $\lambda_{N+j} = -\lambda_j$, $1 \leq j \leq N$.

The terms e_ν are defined by (4),

where a_j and b_j are arbitrary real numbers, $1 \leq j \leq N-1$.

2.3 Families of quasi-rational solutions of the CNLS equation in terms of a quotient of two determinants

We define the following notations :

$$X_\nu = \kappa_\nu x/2 + i\delta_\nu t - ix_{3,\nu}/2 - ie_\nu/2,$$

$$Y_\nu = \kappa_\nu x/2 + i\delta_\nu t - ix_{1,\nu}/2 - ie_\nu/2,$$

for $1 \leq \nu \leq 2N$, with κ_ν , δ_ν , $x_{r,\nu}$ defined in (2).

Parameters e_ν are defined by (4).

We define the following functions :

$$\begin{aligned}\varphi_{4j+1,k} &= \gamma_k^{4j-1} \sin X_k, & \varphi_{4j+2,k} &= \gamma_k^{4j} \cos X_k, \\ \varphi_{4j+3,k} &= -\gamma_k^{4j+1} \sin X_k, & \varphi_{4j+4,k} &= -\gamma_k^{4j+2} \cos X_k,\end{aligned}\quad (18)$$

for $1 \leq k \leq N$, and

$$\begin{aligned}\varphi_{4j+1,N+k} &= \gamma_k^{2N-4j-2} \cos X_{N+k}, & \varphi_{4j+2,N+k} &= -\gamma_k^{2N-4j-3} \sin X_{N+k}, \\ \varphi_{4j+3,N+k} &= -\gamma_k^{2N-4j-4} \cos X_{N+k}, & \varphi_{4j+4,N+k} &= \gamma_k^{2N-4j-5} \sin X_{N+k},\end{aligned}\quad (19)$$

for $1 \leq k \leq N$.

We consider the functions $\psi_{j,k}$ for $1 \leq j \leq 2N$, $1 \leq k \leq 2N$ in the same way, the term X_k is only replaced by Y_k .

$$\begin{aligned}\psi_{4j+1,k} &= \gamma_k^{4j-1} \sin Y_k, & \psi_{4j+2,k} &= \gamma_k^{4j} \cos Y_k, \\ \psi_{4j+3,k} &= -\gamma_k^{4j+1} \sin Y_k, & \psi_{4j+4,k} &= -\gamma_k^{4j+2} \cos Y_k,\end{aligned}\quad (20)$$

for $1 \leq k \leq N$, and

$$\begin{aligned}\psi_{4j+1,N+k} &= \gamma_k^{2N-4j-2} \cos Y_{N+k}, & \psi_{4j+2,N+k} &= -\gamma_k^{2N-4j-3} \sin Y_{N+k}, \\ \psi_{4j+3,N+k} &= -\gamma_k^{2N-4j-4} \cos Y_{N+k}, & \psi_{4j+4,N+k} &= \gamma_k^{2N-4j-5} \sin Y_{N+k},\end{aligned}\quad (21)$$

for $1 \leq k \leq N$.

Then we have the following result

Theorem 2.4 Let v be the expression defined by

$$v(x, t) = \frac{\det((n_{jk})_{j,k \in [1, 2N]})}{\det((d_{jk})_{j,k \in [1, 2N]})} e^{2it - i\varphi}, \quad (22)$$

then the function defined by

$$u(X, T) = \frac{1}{T} v(-\frac{X}{T}, -\frac{1}{T}) e^{\frac{iX^2}{4T}} \quad (23)$$

is a quasi-rational solution of the cylindrical CNLS equation (1) depending on $2N - 2$ real parameters a_j, b_j , $1 \leq j \leq N - 1$, where

$$\begin{aligned}n_{j1} &= \varphi_{j,1}(x, t, 0), 1 \leq j \leq 2N & n_{jk} &= \frac{\partial^{2k-2} \varphi_{j,1}}{\partial \epsilon^{2k-2}}(x, t, 0), \\ n_{jN+1} &= \varphi_{j,N+1}(x, t, 0), 1 \leq j \leq 2N & n_{jN+k} &= \frac{\partial^{2k-2} \varphi_{j,N+1}}{\partial \epsilon^{2k-2}}(x, t, 0), \\ d_{j1} &= \psi_{j,1}(x, t, 0), 1 \leq j \leq 2N & d_{jk} &= \frac{\partial^{2k-2} \psi_{j,1}}{\partial \epsilon^{2k-2}}(x, t, 0), \\ d_{jN+1} &= \psi_{j,N+1}(x, t, 0), 1 \leq j \leq 2N & d_{jN+k} &= \frac{\partial^{2k-2} \psi_{j,N+1}}{\partial \epsilon^{2k-2}}(x, t, 0), \\ 2 \leq k \leq N, 1 \leq j \leq 2N\end{aligned}$$

The functions φ and ψ are defined in (18), (19), (20), (21).

3 Some examples of quasi-rational solutions to the CNLS equation

Within fluid physics-based models, one family of nonlinear equations is recurrent known as the cylindrical nonlinear Schrödinger equation. It describes very different kinds of processes and physical mechanisms.

The previous representations of the solutions to the CNLS equation give efficient methods to construct and study them. In the following, we give explicit solutions of order 1 until 5.

3.1 Solutions of order 1 to the CNLS equation

Example 3.1 *The function $v_k(x, t)$ defined by*

$$v_k(X, T) = \frac{(4X^2 - 3T^2 + 16iT + 16)e^{\frac{1/4i(-8+x^2)}{T}}}{T(4X^2 + 16 + T^2)} \quad (24)$$

is a solution to the (CNLS) equation (1).

3.2 Solutions of order 2 to the CNLS equation

Example 3.2 *The function $v_k(x, t)$ defined by*

$$v_k(x, t) = \frac{N(X, T)}{D(X, T)}, \quad (25)$$

with

$$D(X, T) = T(9T^6 + 1584T^4 + 108X^2T^4 + 4096 + 384T^3b_1 + 3072X^2 + 48X^3a_1T^3 + 9a_1^2T^6 + 768X^4 + 216b_1T^5 - 36Xa_1T^5 - 1152X^2T^2 - 576Xa_1T^3 - 288X^2b_1T^3 + 9b_1^2T^6 + 64X^6 + 6912T^2 + 48X^4T^2)$$

is a solution to the (CNLS) equation (1).

3.3 Solutions of order 3 to the CNLS equation

Example 3.3 *The function $v_k(x, t)$ defined by*

$$v_k(x, t) = \frac{N(X, T)}{D(X, T)} \quad (26)$$

with

is a solution to the (CNLS) equation (1).

We could go on and present more explicit quasi-rational solutions, but they become very complicated. It will be relevant to study in detail the structure of these solutions.

4 Conclusion

Different representations of quasi-rational solutions to the cylindrical nonlinear Schrödinger equation have been given. First quasi rational solutions in terms of wronskians of order $2N$ depending on $2N - 2$ real parameters have been presented. Another representation in terms of Fredholm determinants are given depending on $2N - 2$ real parameters. So we get a hierarchy of families of quasi-rational solutions of order N to the CNLS equation depending on $2N - 2$ real parameters.

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
