


The LISA France collaboration




Context

- LISA based on heterodyne laser interferometry -> measure tiny change distance between free-falling mirrors
- LISA strain sensitivity: $1 \cdot 10^{-20} / \sqrt{\text{Hz}}$
- LISA displacement sensitivity: $10 \cdot 10^{-12} \text{ m} / \sqrt{\text{Hz}}$ over $2.5 \cdot 10^9 \text{ m}$
- France is in charge of the Interferometric Detection System (IDS) tests and Optical Test System (OTS)
- Specific test equipments to verify the requirements




MIFO: Metallic InterFerOmeter




ZIFO: Zerodur InterFerOmeter


Dimensions: 530 x 450 x 47 mm




- 3 interferometers:

Conclusions & prospects

- France is in charge of the IDS tests and OTS
- Several OGSEs are needed to test the IDS and the MOSA
- First prototypes are under development to test:
 - The sub-systems as laser, injectors, phasemeters, control/command
 - Assess the limits on sensitivity of the set-up and the precision of the path length measurements achievable on ground
 - Identify the noise sources
 - Measure the TTL coupling
 - Measure the straylight at system level, component by component
- Further investigation are ongoing to validate all the objectives
- Preparation of the final OGSE are in progress
