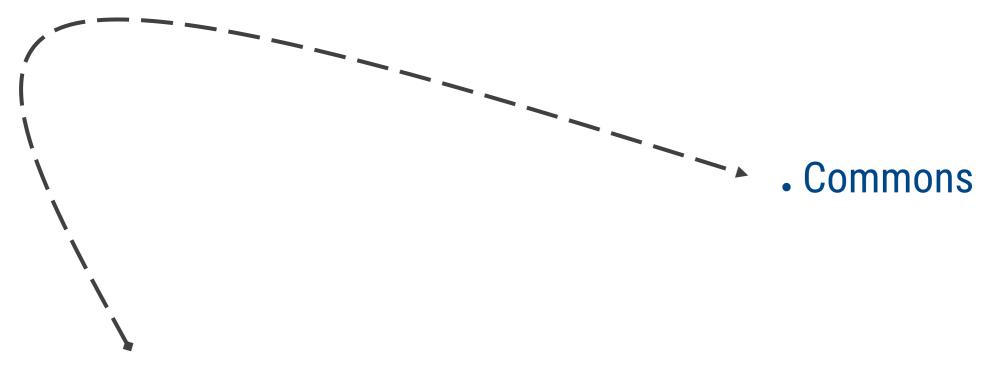

- Semantic question: Low-Tech = Tech...
- "Not using the most recent equipment or methods" Cambridge Dictionary
- 1970's: Appropriate (E.F. Schumacher); Conviviality (I. Illich); Autonomous (A. Gorz);
   Liberatory (M. Bookchin); Democratic (L. Mumford).
- Small scale, sufficient, environmentally-friendly, labour-intensive
  - → Non-neutrality of technology

#### Plural definition of Low-Tech

- <u>Low-Tech Lab</u> (2014): **useful, sustainable, accessible**;
- ADEME (2022): ...& local, favouring autonomy;
- Philippe Bihouix: sufficient, dignified, societal concept [Bihouix 2014].

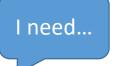

#### Trust crisis from citizens and politicians

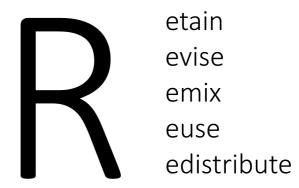
Barriers to adoptions from public institutes and bodies that cannot access commercial knowledge and tools

#### **Open Science definition**

#### Open Science is [FOS]:

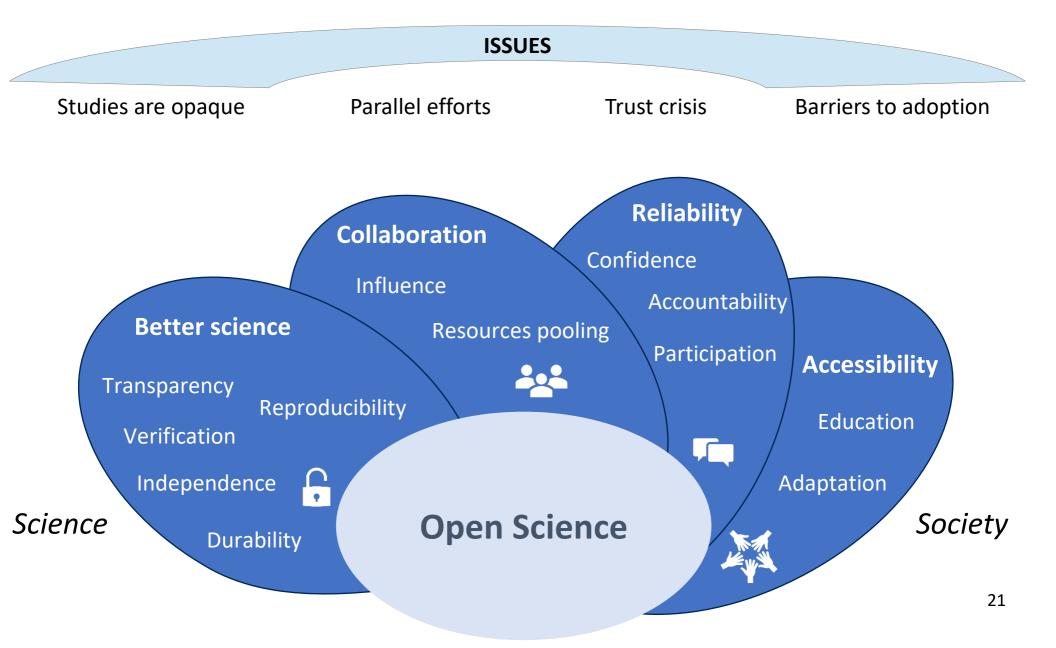
- A movement to make scientific research, data and dissemination accessible to all levels of a questioning society.
- Knowledge that is transparent and accessible, shared and developed via collaborative networks.

The 5 Rs of open content definition



In concrete terms: opening the whole research process, both in practice and legally.

**Energy modelling field** 

- •Transparency is new compared to mainstream practices

## The limits of (open) science

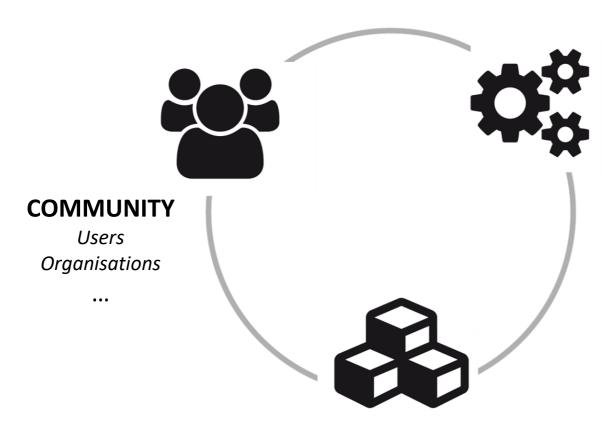
#### Making science open, is it enough to face crises?

- 1. Open science enables reflexivity and research assesment, but does not ensure a responsible research.
  - → Probably necessary, but not sufficient.
- 2. We are facing social and ecological crises = complex issues
- Mutually influencing variables,
- A context of great uncertainty,
- Multiple players with divergent value systems.
  - → Science appears to be ineffective for decision-making in situations of conflict of interest and high uncertainty [Pielke 2007].

**Decision making is a political process** → **governance tools.** 

#### Preliminary thinking...

Collective exploitation mode can be efficient, just and sustainable [Ostrom 1990]

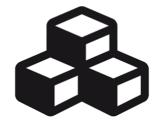

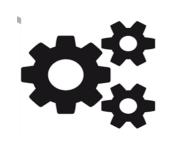

#### Materiality of informational Commons

In the governance, a tension between [Broca 2015] ...

- Knowledge produced via the scientific research
- → **Information Commons:** <u>free</u> circulation of knowledge favours its enrichment
- Major research instruments and digital infrastructures [Roussilhe; Monnin]
- → **Negative Commons:** need for democratic choices about what is disposed of.

#### Some takeaways

- Low-Tech as socio-technical alternatives
- Democratising technological choices
- Open science seems necessary and needs to be developped in research
- Need to raise awareness

- Question of the role of researchers facing crises
- Governance is necessary; Commons can be a path.

#### In terms of

- Knowledge: open hardware principles, make knowledge open, accessible and understandable for anyone.
- **Skills**: the design is doable with limited skills.
- Finance: the Low-Tech can be developed for free or with limited budget.

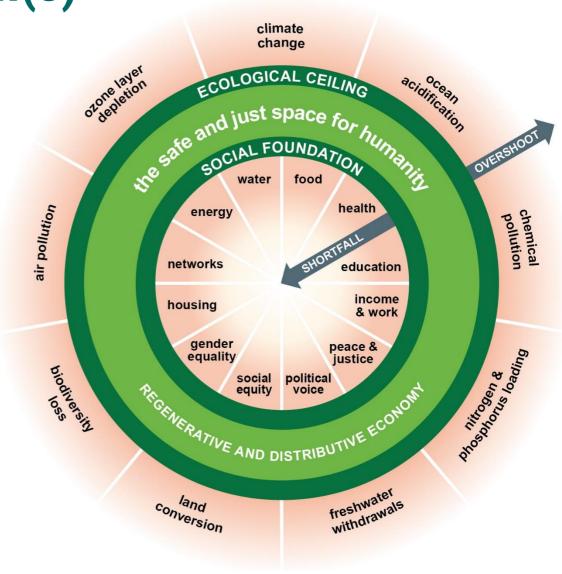
#### **Open Hardware principles**

A low-tech must be one that as many people as possible can make their own – both technologically and financially. As such, you must be able to make it and/or repair it locally, so its functioning principles must be simple to understand and its costs adapted to a large part of the population. It encourages the population to be more independent on all levels, and value or work are more evenly distributed
