


- * 1980-2000, before the closure of the mine (disruptive event), the changes mainly affected the periphery of the (suburbanization, microelectronics).
- Since 2003 (the disruptive event) the changes affected the center of the basin: it is the end of the coal power plant; the end of the Bayer process in the alumina factory, the end of the communist municipality ...





Major trends of the Socio-Ecosystem (SES): the multiplication of disruptions

Rather well balanced and giving rise to many interdisciplinary projects








Science/society interface implemented

Graph showing word associations at threshold 3

Research content structured by two main topics: soil analysis and environment

Concerning these two topics, the association graph shows the importance of related dimensions: objectivation through methodologies, and issues at stake: humanenvironment relation, territorial development, pollution, health.

Conclusion: Towards which new equilibrium?

We can imagine at least two scenarios for the former Provence mining basin: -The first would lead to a strong deindustrialization with a rejection of heavy industry -The second would lead to a more negotiated balance between economic activities, residential needs and environmental protection.
