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# Introduction

- Aquatic ecosystems undergo an increase of temperature and light intensity that can affect their functioning [1]
- Increasing evidence about the effect of light and temperature on the physiology of micro-algae that play a key role in the aquatic trophic chain of both freshwater and marine ecosystems [2].
- Need to gain understanding of the molecular/biochemical mechanisms underlying the acclimation and adaptation of these organisms towards their resilience in a multi-stress environment
- Untargeted metabolomics is a cutting-edge approach to provide a comprehensive picture of the molecular phenotype in response to changing environmental conditions [3]

<u>Aim:</u> To unravel the molecular/biochemical responses of Scenedesmus costatus to increasing temperature and light intensity and their combination along the time through the implementation of untargeted metabolomics

# Conclusions

✓ Strong effect of the time on the metabolome de *Scenedesmus costatus* compared to light intensity and temperature

- No significant combined effect of time, light intensity and temperature
- $\checkmark$  ASCA overestimates the significance of the temperature effect
- ✓ ASCA & AMOPLS prioritize the same features
- $\checkmark$  The most contributing features are factor specific:
  - Metabolite Class specific  $\rightarrow$  Functional pathways specificity?
  - Relevant potential biomarkers ?

- Natural fluctuation of S costatus metabolome along its life cycle? *Consequence on its « sensibility » to environmental stressors?*
- Actual influence of temperature vs light following acclimation?
