- impacts in river channels below dams
- regulate particle displacements and design restoration scenarios

- Slope: 0,0011 m/m Q_{mean} : 120 m³/s Q_2 : 760 m³/s
- starved and paved ($D_{50} \sim 80$ mm vs. 30 mm on the unaffected reach)
