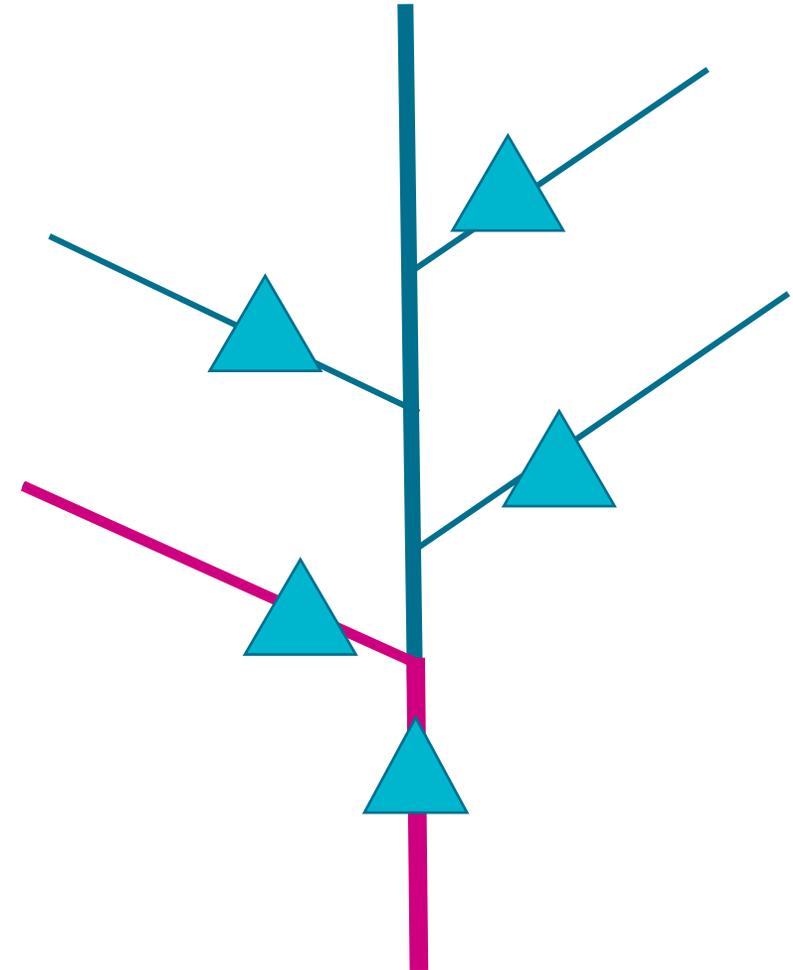

Low-Cost Sensor Networks

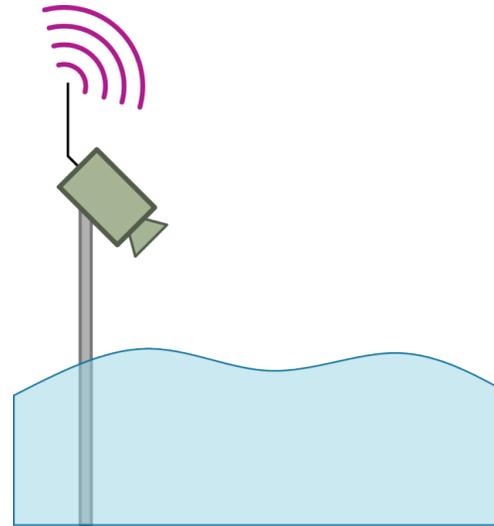
Monitoring sewer & urban water systems

- Turbidity: indicator of health
- Real-time network alerts
 - Illicit connections
- Data for real time control
 - Constructed wetlands
- Prediction models
 - TSS temporal dynamics
- Commercial Solutions:
 - Expensive
 - In-water: high maintenance
 - ⇒ Low resolution
- Sensor network: high resolution
 - Need low-cost low-maintenance turbidity sensors



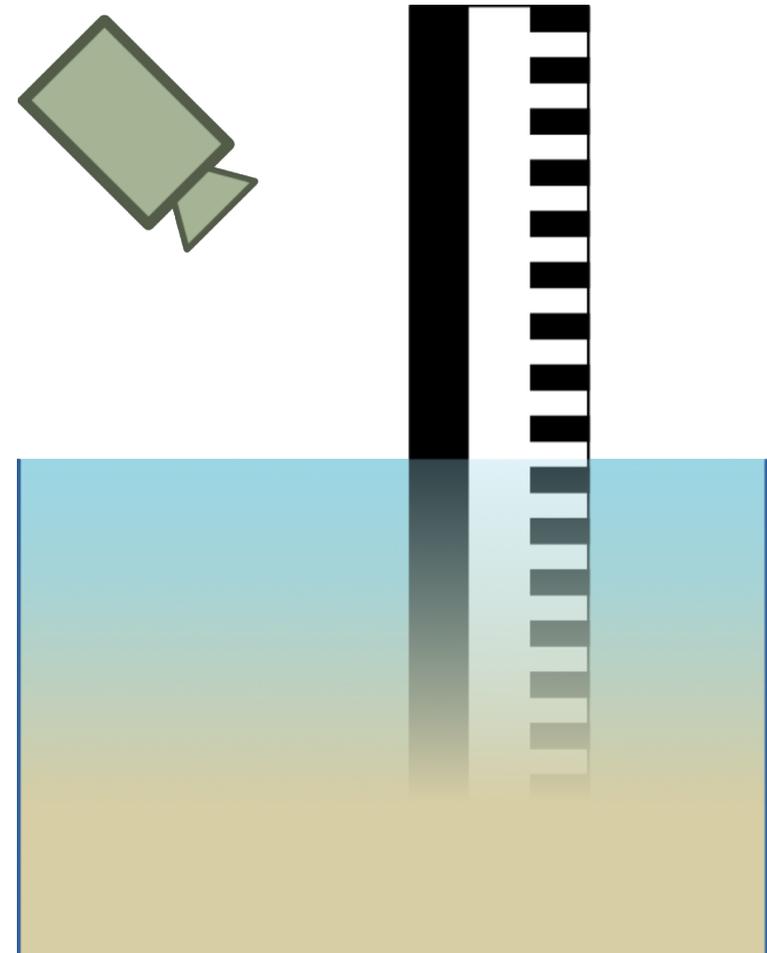
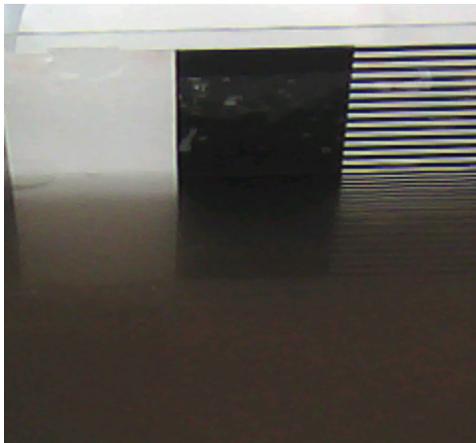
Out-of-water sensing

- Installation: no confined space entry
- Reliability: no water ingress
- Performance: no biofilm
- Connectivity: cellular reception
- Out-of-water \Rightarrow lower costs, lower maintenance



Out-of-water turbidity

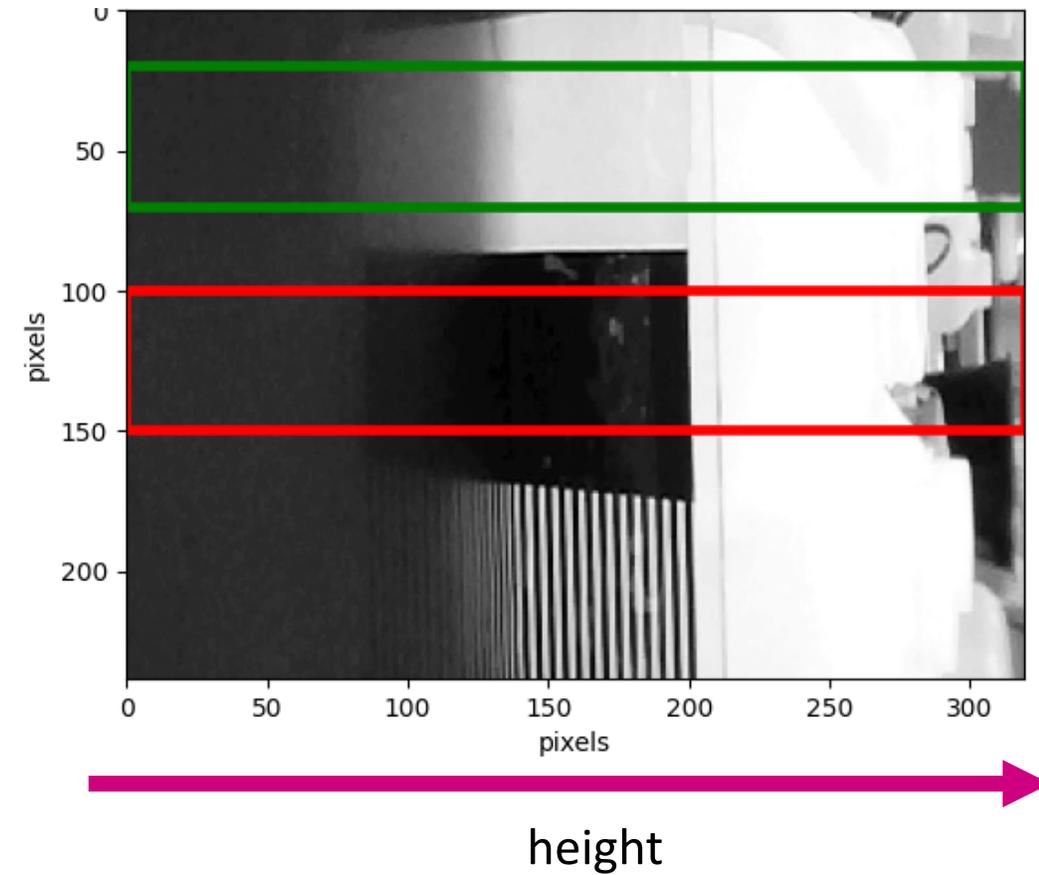
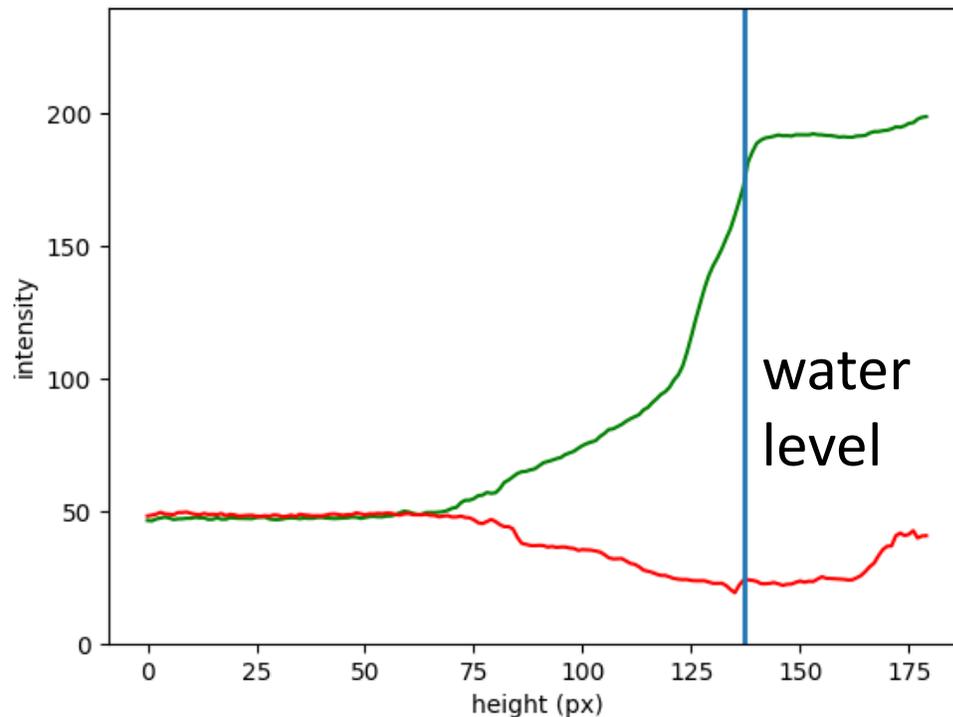
- Colour changes
 - Complications:
 - Water level
 - Light level
 - Surface turbulence
 - “Secchi disk” principle
- } Reference background biofilm?



Algorithms

- Low power \Rightarrow simple algorithms:
 - Low memory usage
 - Short processing time

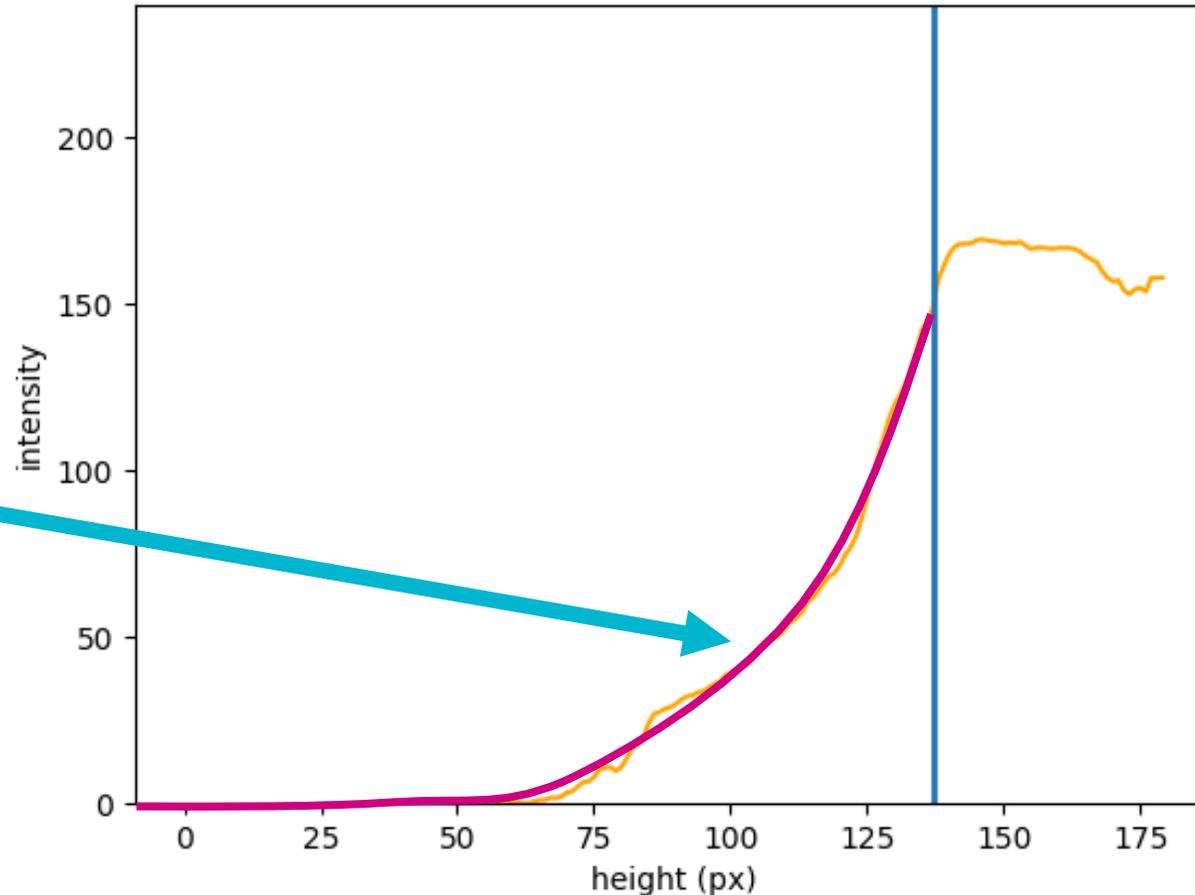
Exponential Fit

- Beer-Lambert's law
- White - black:
compensate for
illumination
- Fit exponential:

$$Ae^{-Bd_{\text{pixel}}}$$



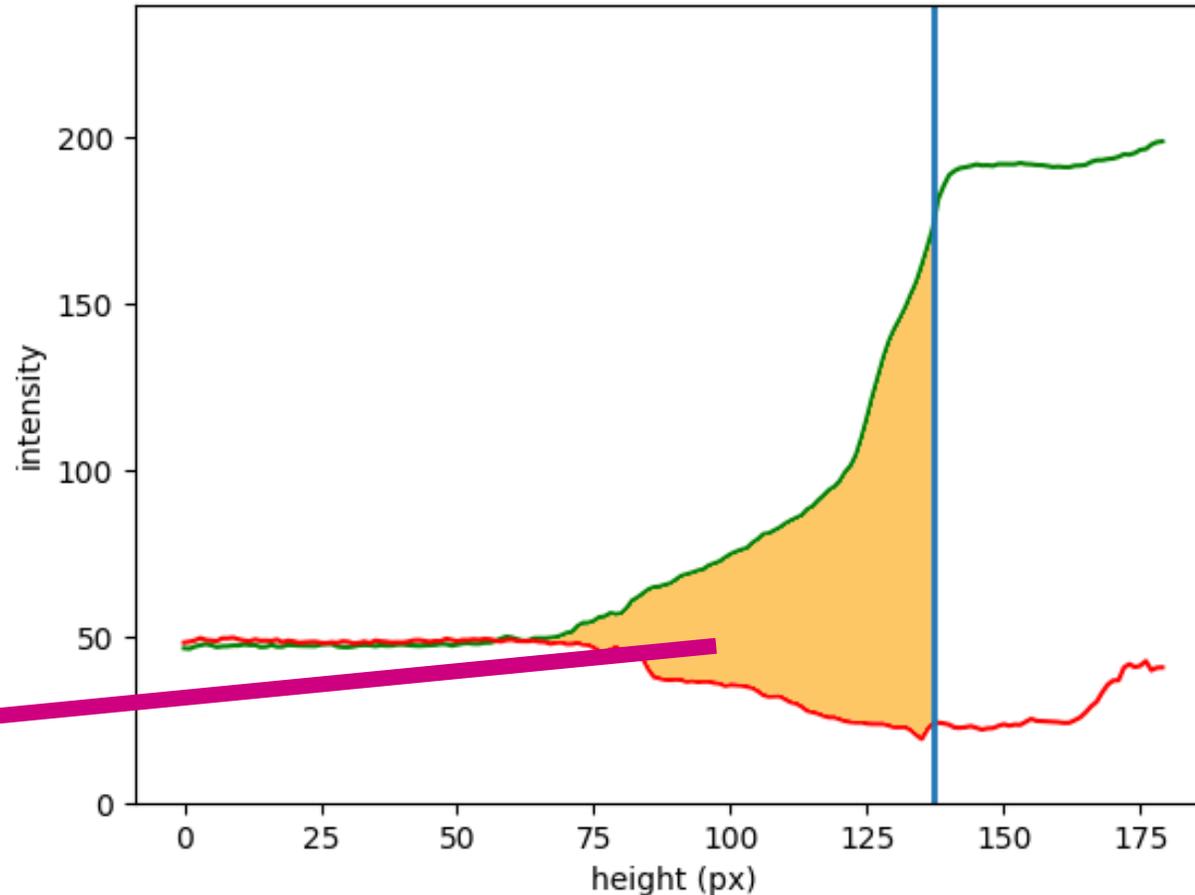
turbidity



Contrast Integral

- Bounded area up to water surface
- Integral:
 - robust to turbulence

turbidity ←

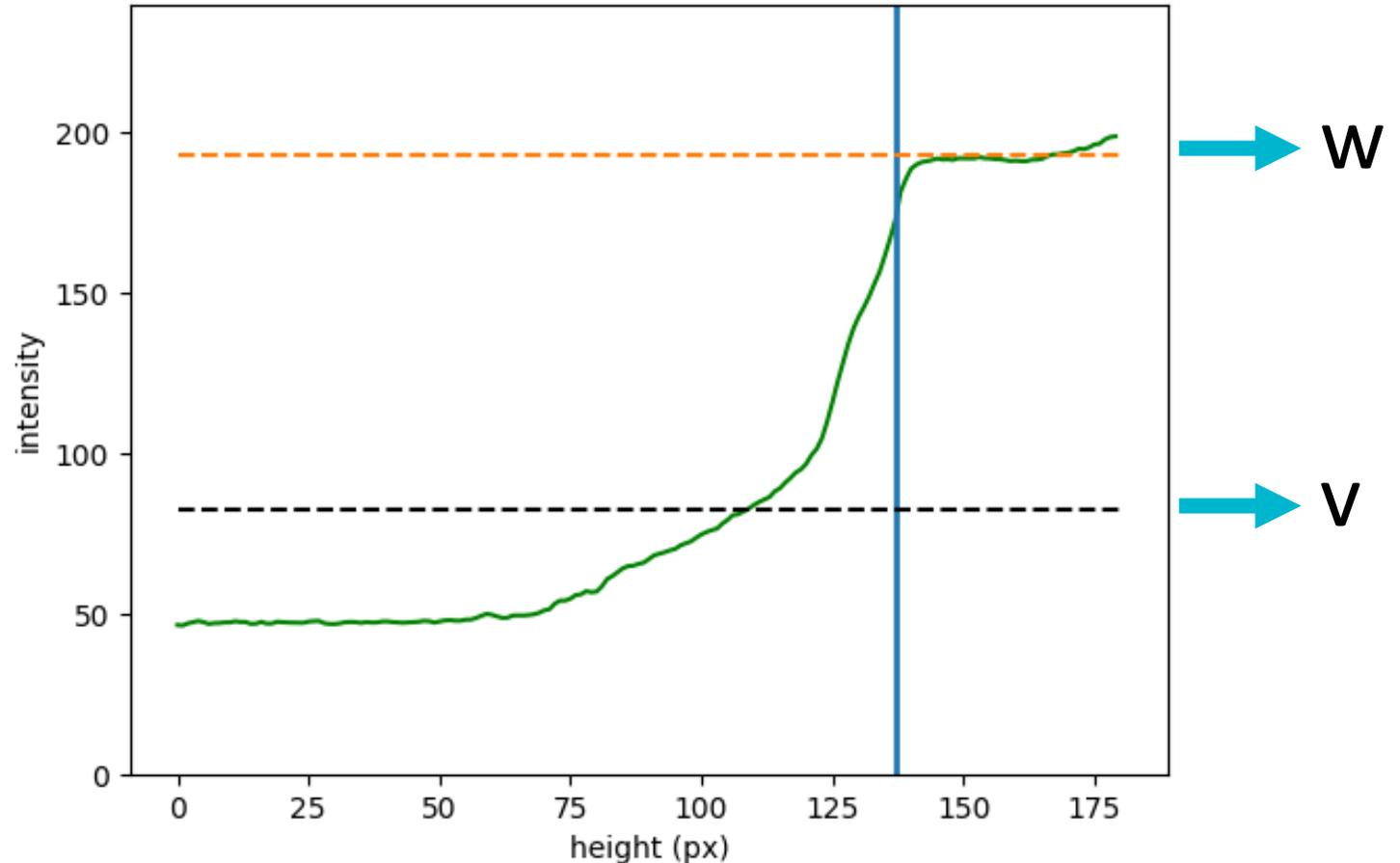


Contrast Ratio

- Ratio out/in water
- Large region:
 - robust to turbulence
- Simplest

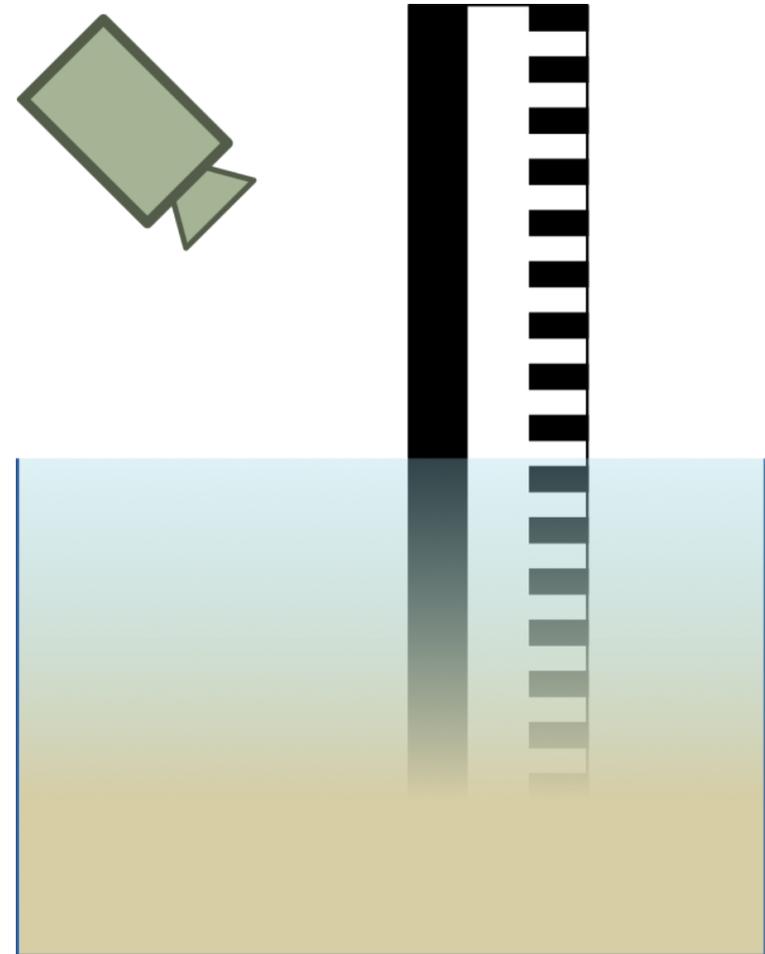
w/v

Method

- OV7675 QVGA camera
- 1 – 200 NTU
 - Expected in stormwater
- Orion AQ4500 turbidity meter
- Still and turbulent surface

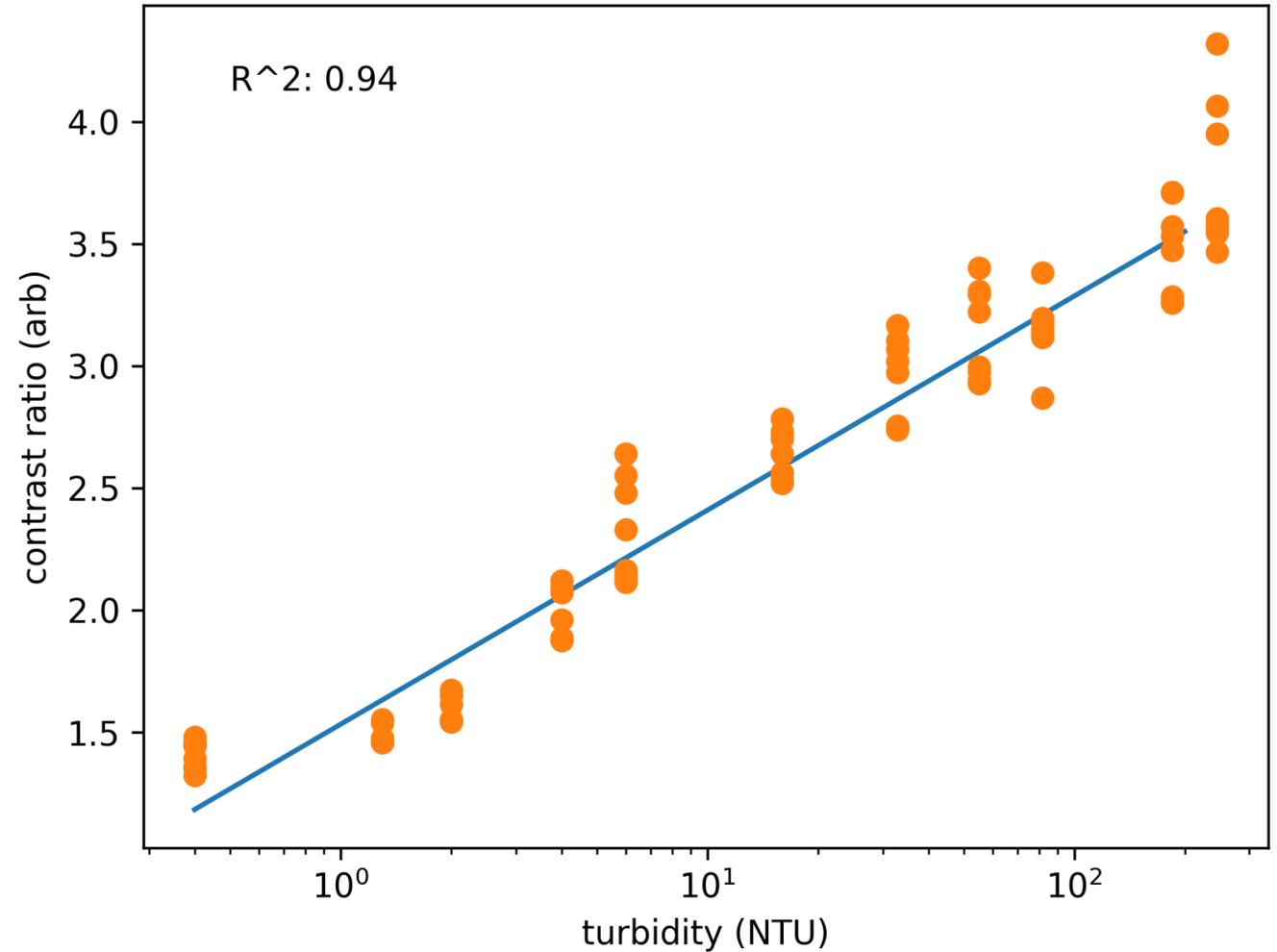

Contrast Ratio

- Output-turbidity correlation
- Turbulence \Rightarrow spread
- Spread large
 - Useful for event detection
- Lab illumination

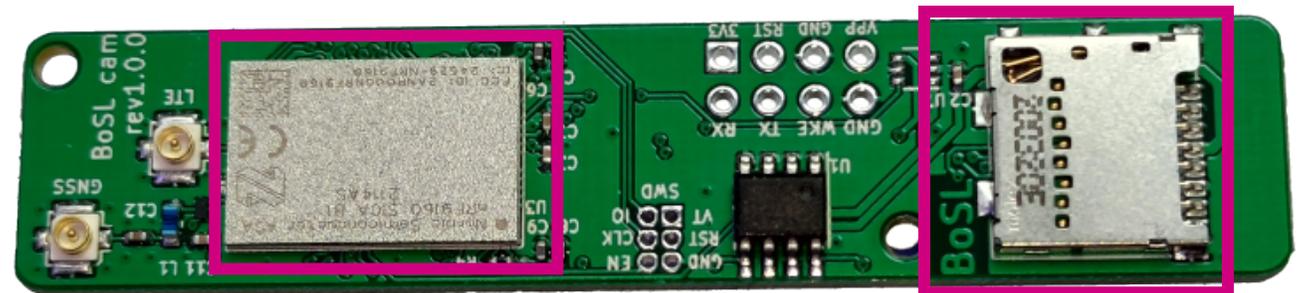
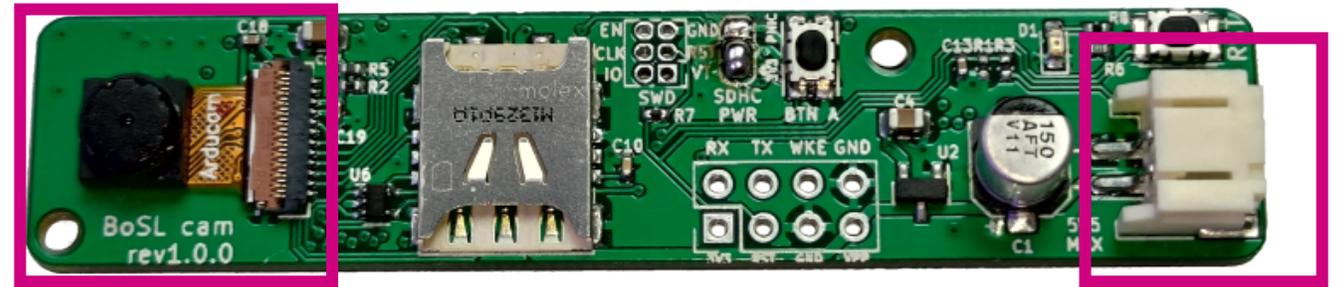


Next Steps

- Field testing

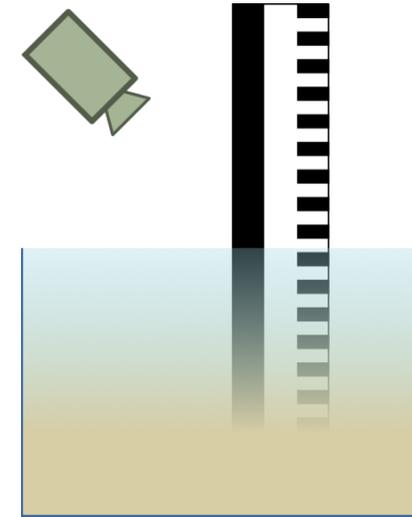
BoSLcam

- Cellular connected camera datalogger
- OV7675 camera
- nRF9160 MCU+LTE modem
 - CAT-M1
 - NB-IoT
- SD card
- Low power: 3.7 V Li-ion battery
- User programmable
- Open-source
- Total cost: < 50 EUR

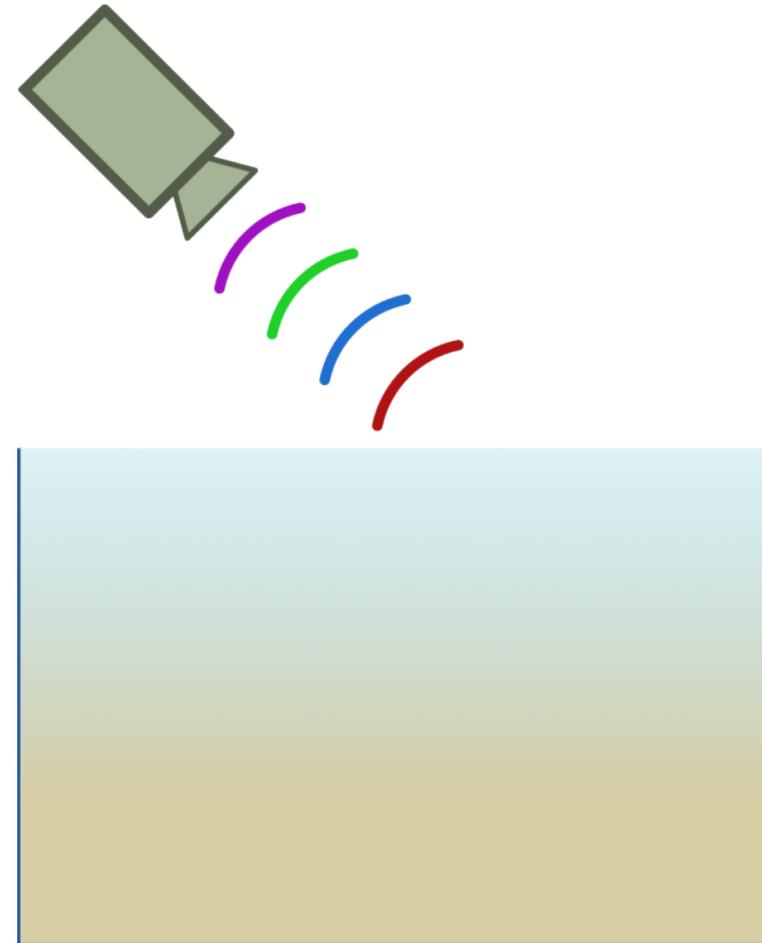

Hyperspectral Sensor

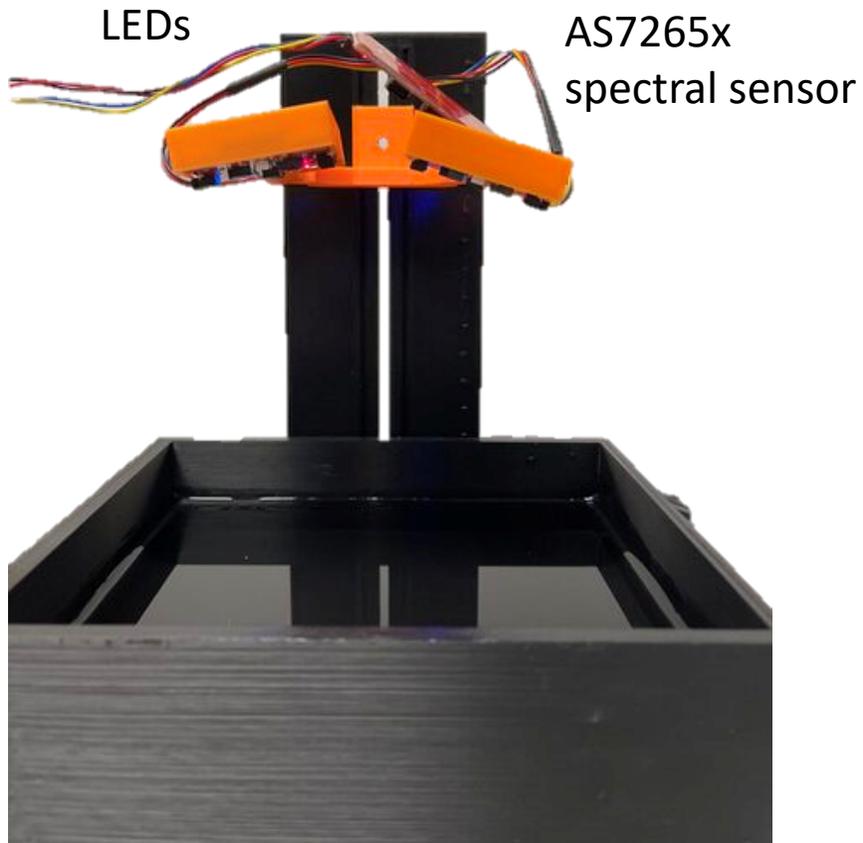

 - Turbidity

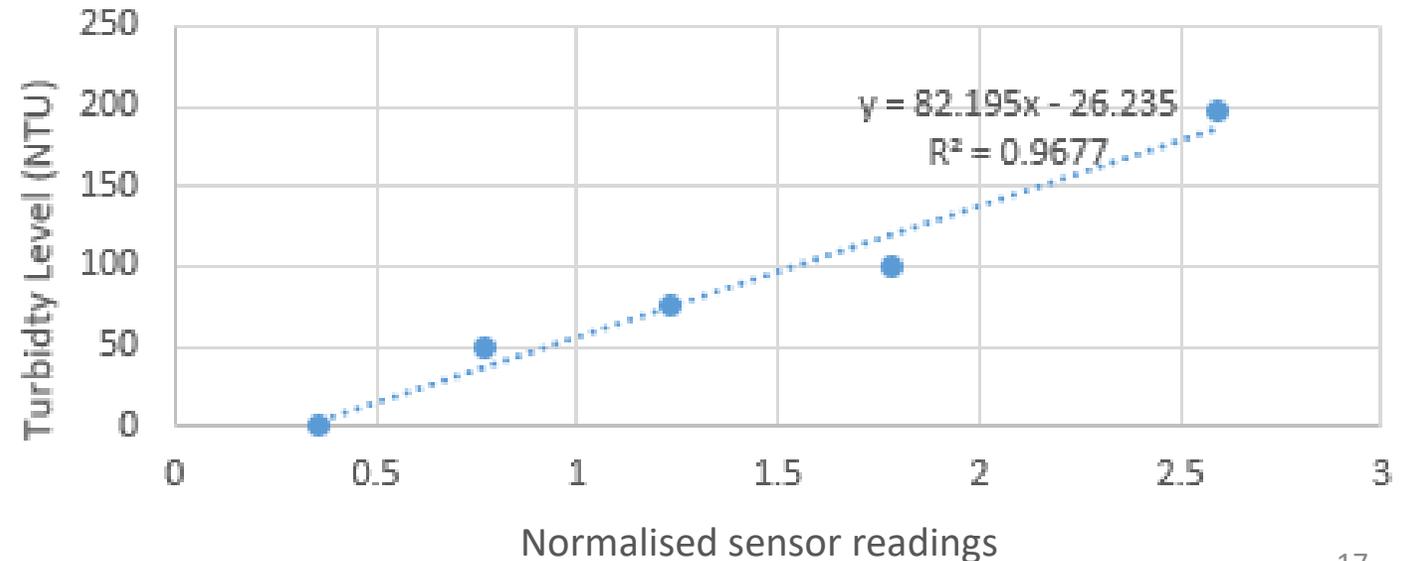


Hyperspectral Sensor

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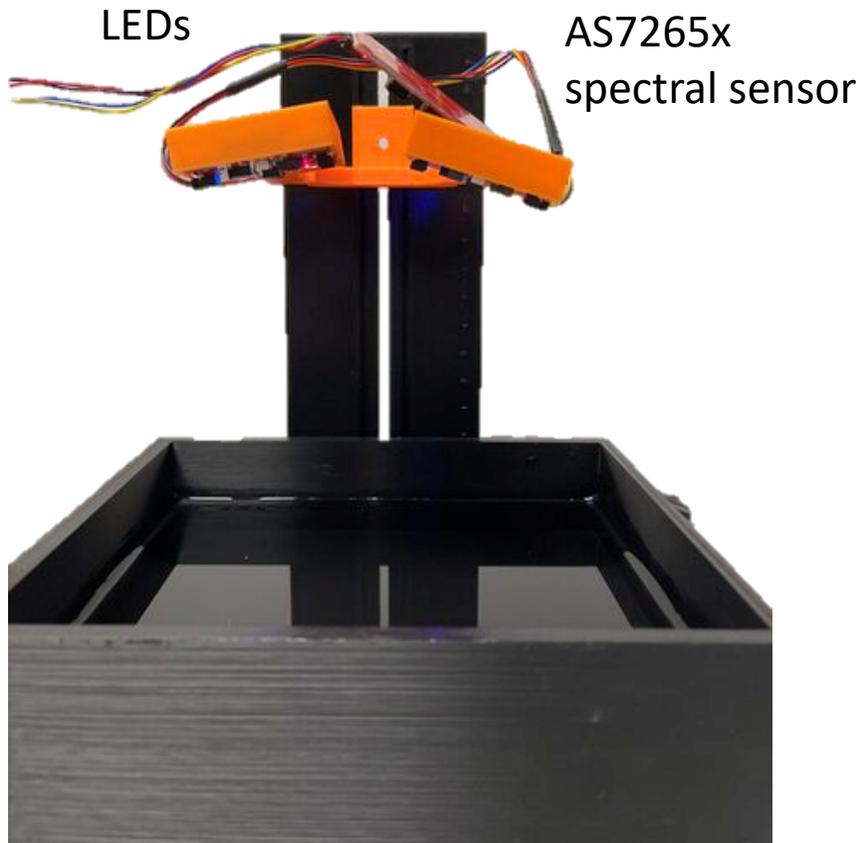


- 988 nm – 350 nm
- 875 nm, visible, and 405 nm LEDs
- Early development
- Low cost
- Promising turbidity results @ 645 nm:

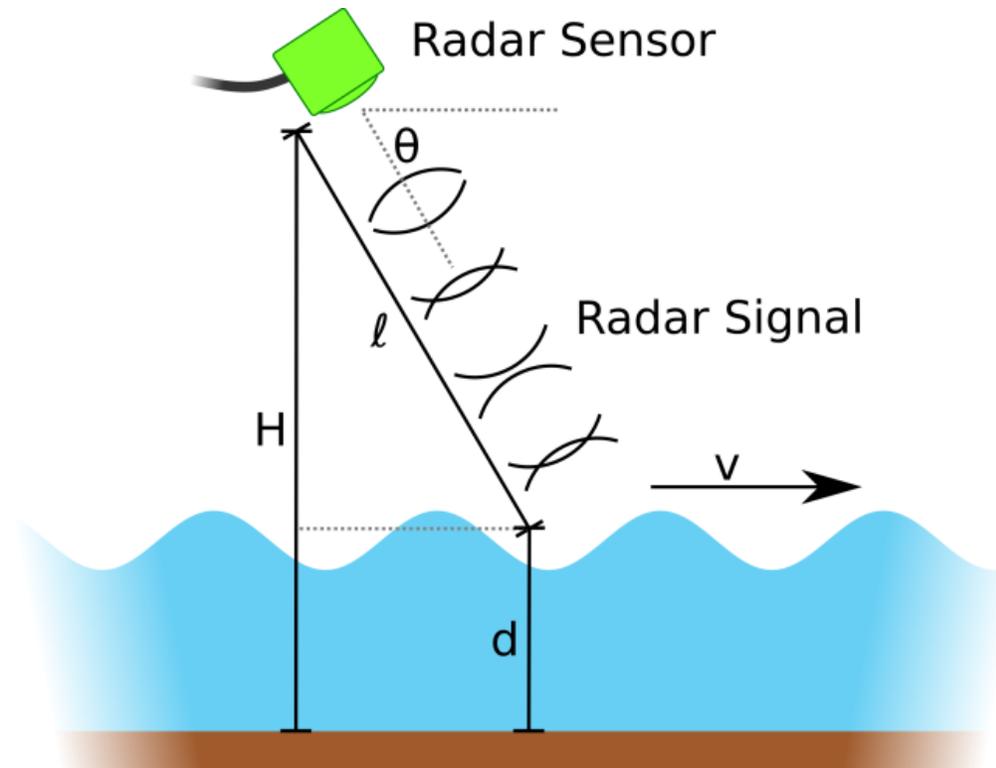

Out-of-water velocity + depth

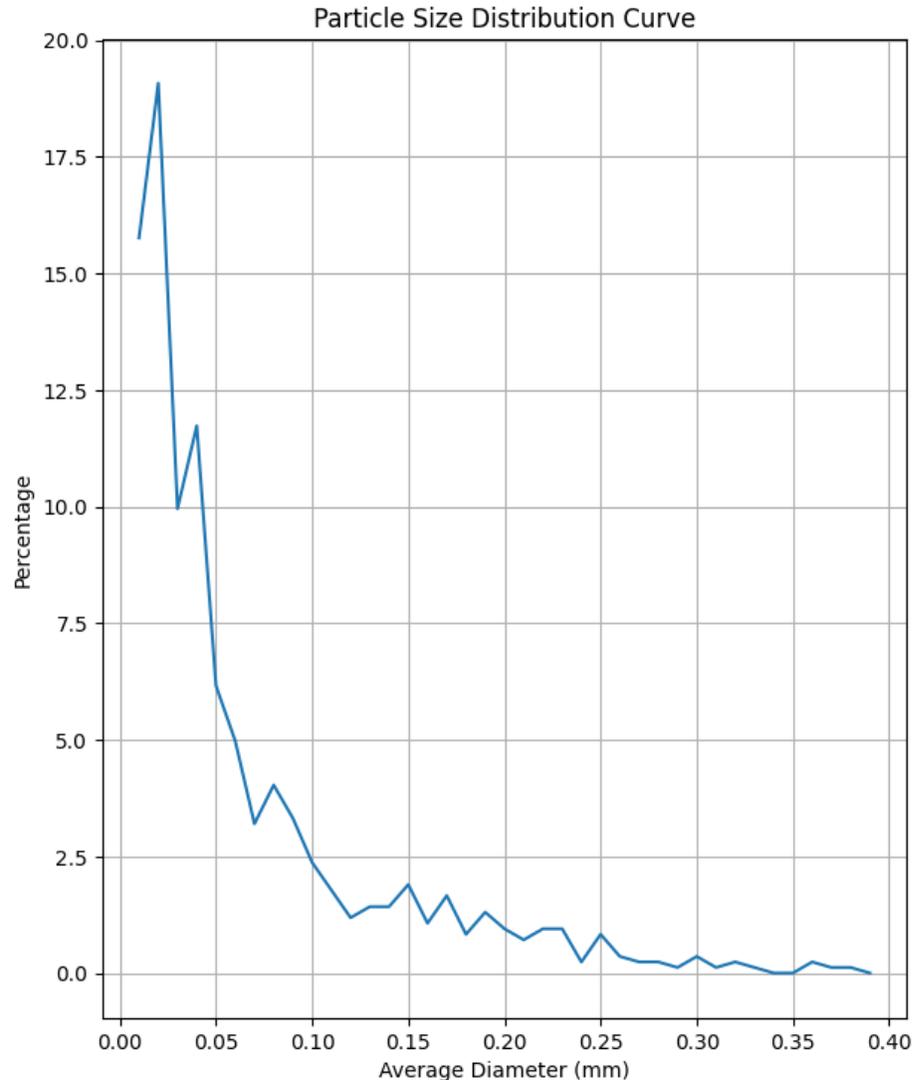
- Radar based
- Water velocity $\pm 36\%$
- Water depth $\pm 6\%$
- Field verified
- Low cost $< 30\text{€}$
- 3D printed
- Open source



Particle Size Distribution

Canwei Pang

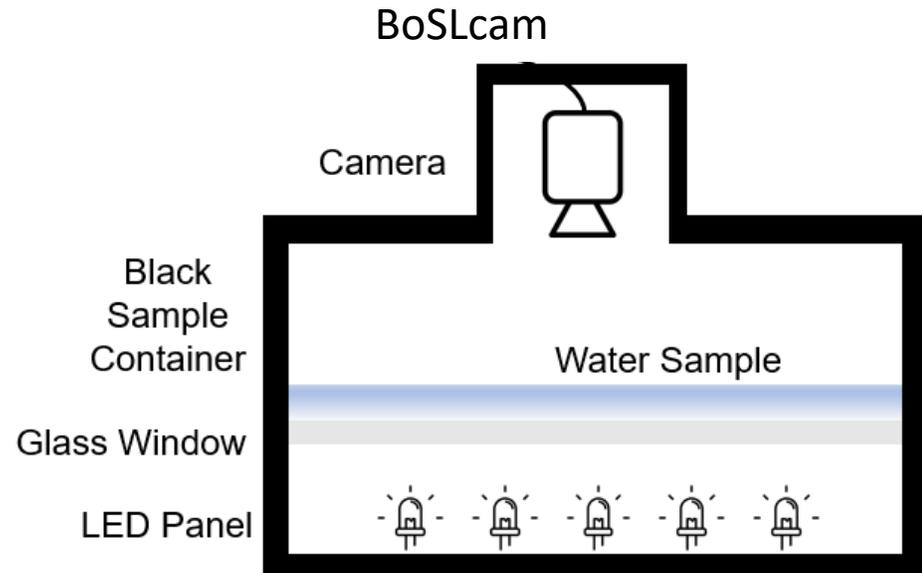
- In-water turbidity:
 - Enhance with imaging
- More than just turbidity:
 - Particle size distribution
 - Real time measurement
- Understand sediments:
 - Pollutant associations
 - Clogging
- Understand biofilm
 - Improve robustness



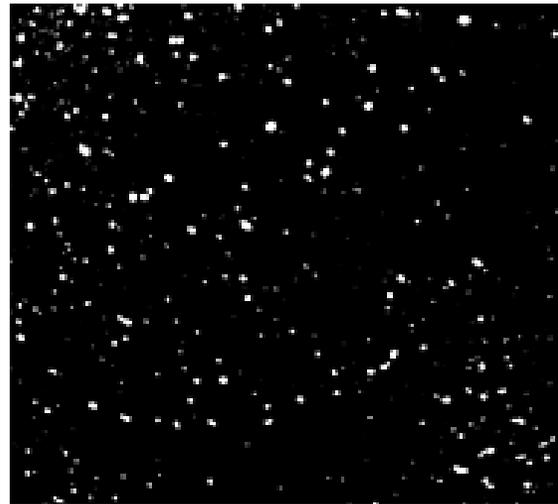
Particle Size Distribution

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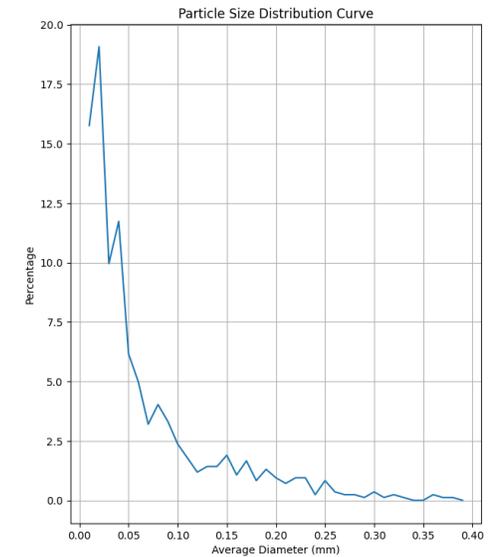

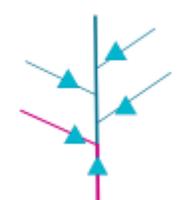

- Low resolution

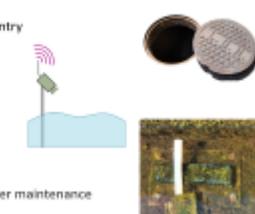
