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# *In vitro* activity of hydroxychloroquine in combination with antibiotics against uropathogenic *Escherichia coli* intracellular bacterial colonies

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## INTRODUCTION

**Recurrent cystitis (RC)** is common and responsible for a high consumption of antibiotics (ATBs). Some RC are due to a relapse from UPEC persistence within the superficial urothelial cell as intracellular bacterial communities (IBCs) [1].

The aim of this study was to investigate the *in vitro* activity of HCQ in combination with intracellularly acting ATBs on IBCs in a urothelial cell culture model

**Hydroxychloroquine (HCQ)** is a lysosomotropic agent that increases endosomal pH inhibiting lysosomal enzymes and block autophagy. Doxycycline-HCQ combination is effective against intracellular *Coxiella burnetti* [2].

## METHODS

### Strains

- RC clinical strains: 2206 & 2157

- Reference strain: UTI89


### ATBs

- Ciprofloxacin (CIP), Doxycycline (DC), Azithromycin (AZT), Fosfomycin (FF)

- Hydroxychloroquine (HCQ)

### Cell culture

- HTB9 cell line (ATCC 5637) : superficial urothelial cell monolayer





## RESULTS

**Figure 2: Violin plots of change in IBC count ( $\log_{10}$  CFU per  $10^6$  cells) compared to controls at H42 post-infection according to antibiotics and HCQ combination.**


IBC: intracellular bacterial communities, HCQ: hydroxychloroquine, orange: antibiotic alone, blue: HCQ-antibiotic combination, circle dot: 2157 strain, triangle dot: 2206 strain, square dot: UTI89 strain, AZT 20: azithromycin 20 mg/L, CIP 100: ciprofloxacin 100 mg/L, CIP 2: ciprofloxacin 2 mg/L, DC 10: doxycycline 10 mg/L, FF 100: fosfomycin 100 mg/L, FF 500: fosfomycin 500 mg/L, red line: IBC median change, p-value above bracket were calculated between antibiotic alone and HCQ-antibiotic combination group by Wilcoxon adjusted test.

## CONCLUSION

**HCQ exposure didn't enhance antibiotics activity against IBC.**

Further works are needed to assess potential efficacy of HCQ-antibiotics combination with new models as mature stratified urothelium or organoid model.
