## Magnetic field dependence of the frequency:

- Observation of the strong coupling regime via the anticrossing fingerprint described by:

$$F_{1,2} = \frac{1}{2} \Big[ (F_0 + F_r) \pm \sqrt{(F_0 - F_r)^2 + k^4 F_0^2} \Big].$$

## Thermal annihilation of the coupling strength

The charge current dependence of the transmission spectra of our system suggests a control of the magnetic losses ( $\alpha$ eff in our case). It should be noted  $\stackrel{\text{\tiny (2)}}{=}$ that our notch filter features remain unchanged as function of the current density sent into the Pt strip. The effect of the Pt heating is not only a shift of 🝶 the resonance (tuning) but also an increased broadening (decoupling) caused by inhomogeneous heating.
