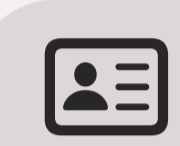
What is the problem?

When dealing with disruptive products such as **autonomous vehicles**, designers and decision-makers face a challenge in predicting their long-term impact, unlike with traditional products. This can result in an "open-loop" design process that may have irreversible consequences for people, the environment, and society in the long run.

How to use this knowledge to help designers and decision-makers?

AutoVision is a digital platform anticipating the long-term socio-economic and environmental impacts of autonomous vehicles concepts thanks to existing knowledge. It was designed to help users imagine future autonomous vehicles (stimulation) and test the impacts of their proposals (simulation).

Impact Guesser

The Impact Guesser mode enables the user to define a scenario for an autonomous vehicle and generates a weighted list of possible impacts.

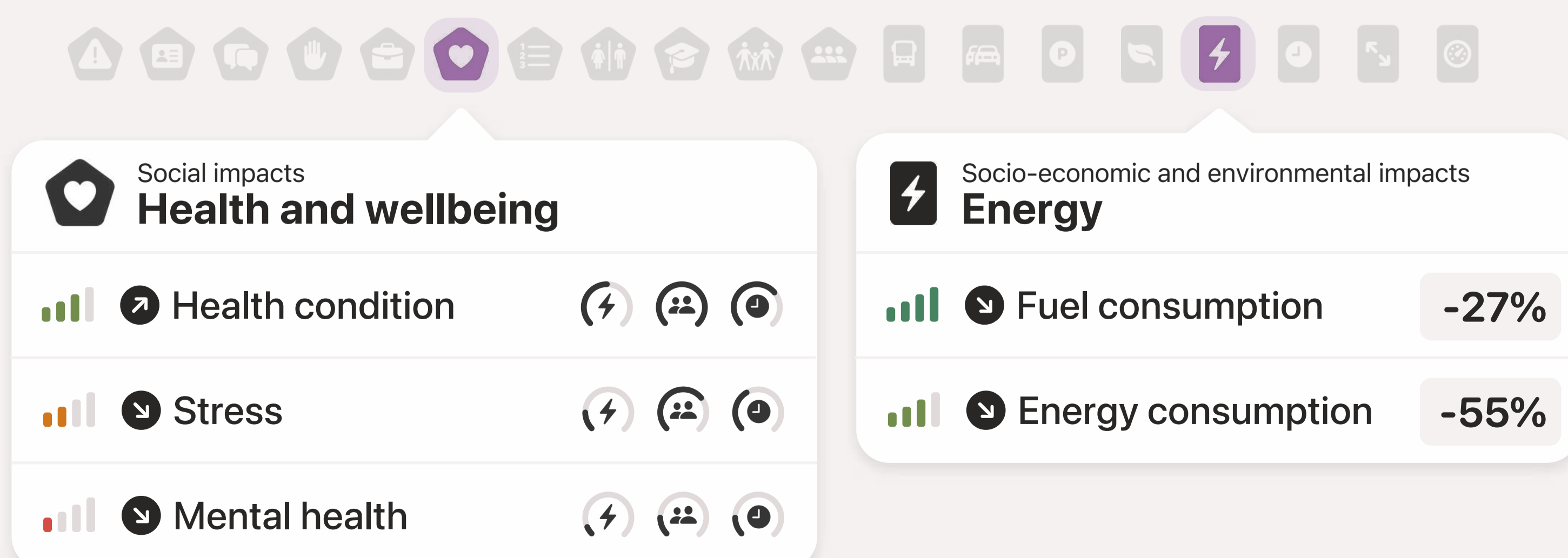

Level of confidence Intensity (low-high) Depth (few people-everyone) Occurrence (rare-systematic)

Advisor

The Advisor mode allows the user to choose which impacts are most important to avoid or prioritize and provides a list of suggestions accordingly.
