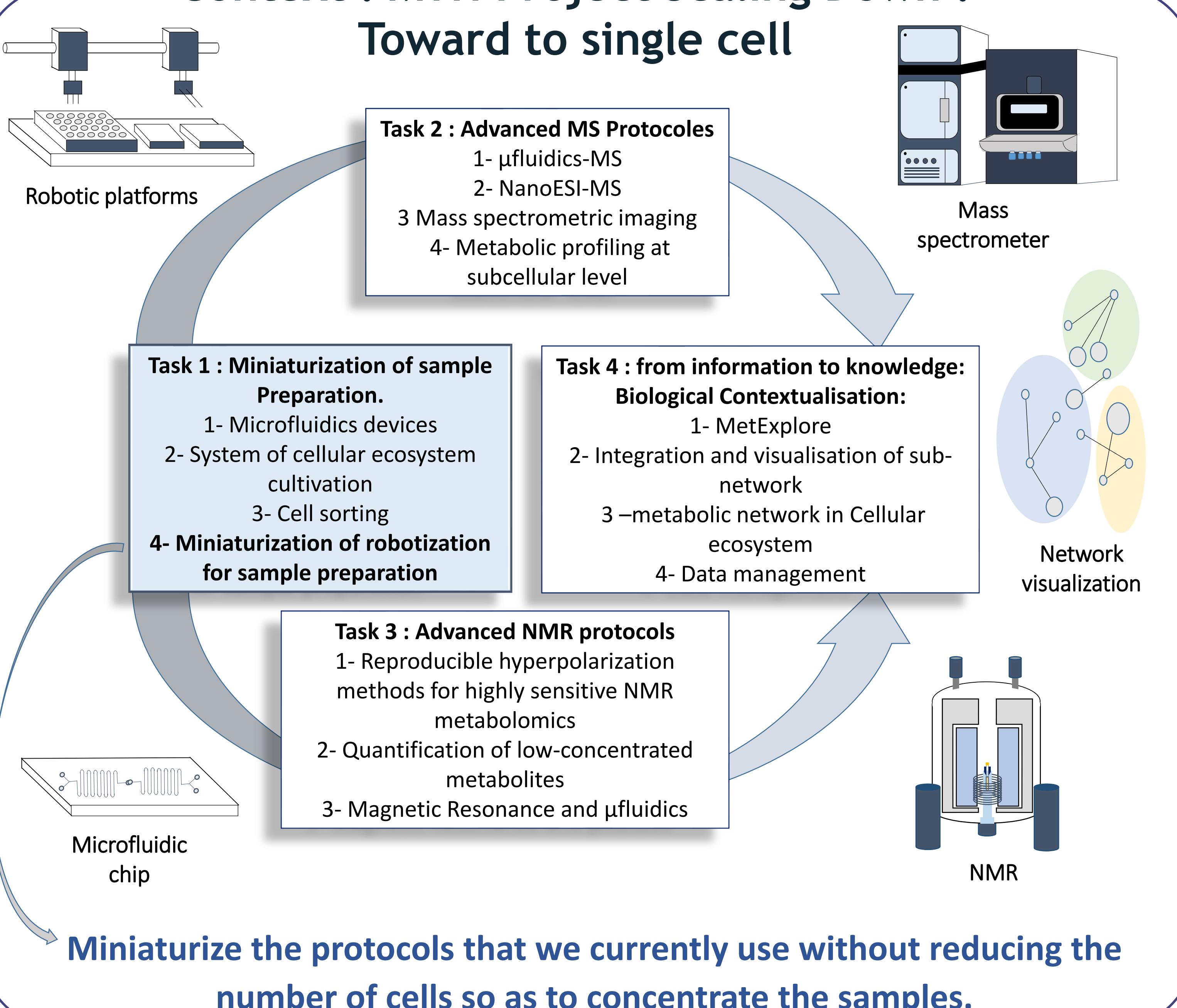

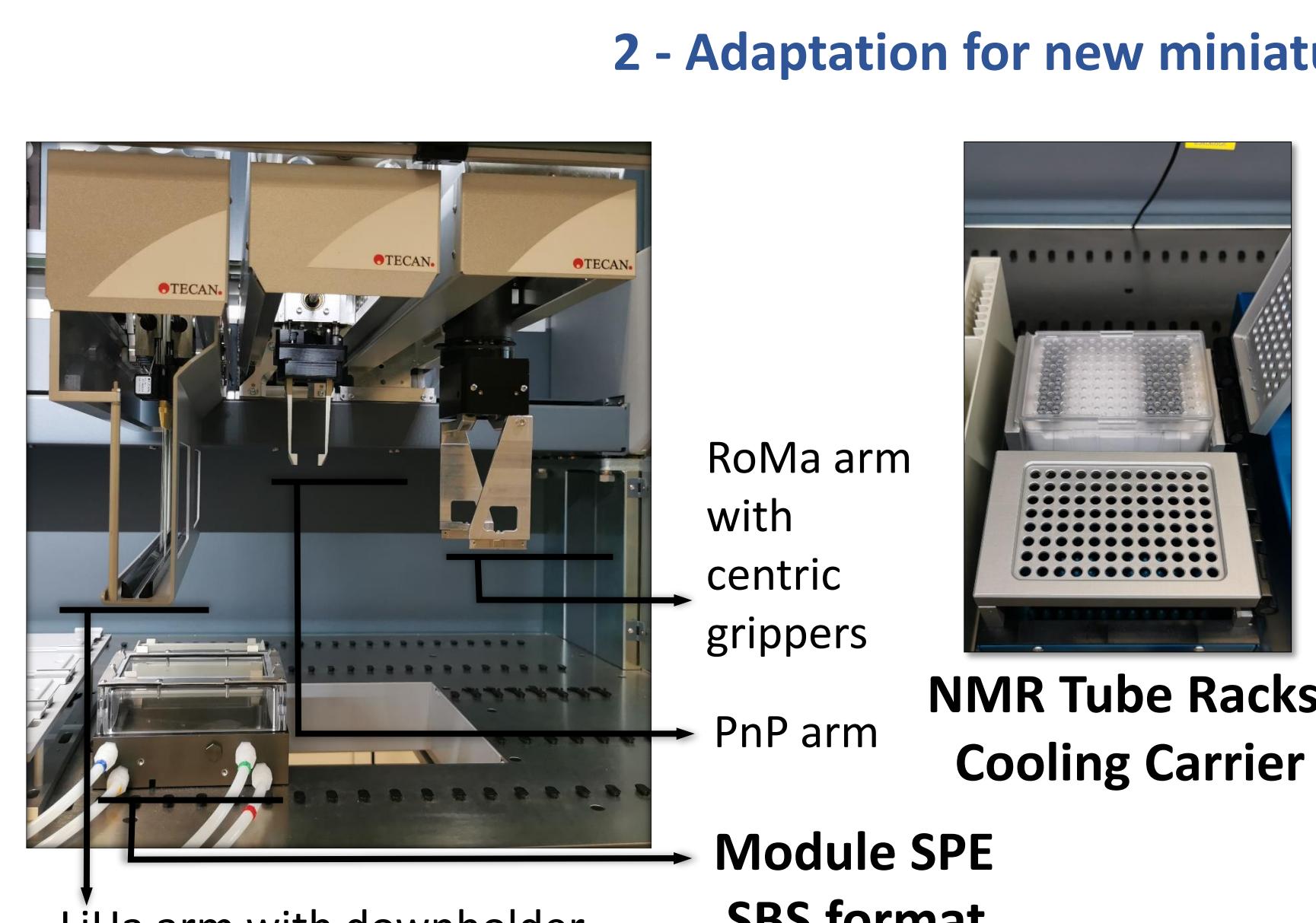
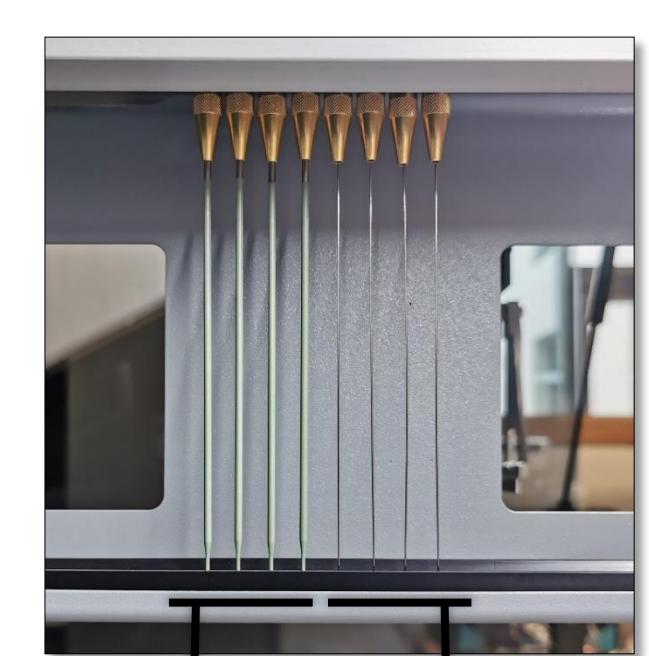

Robotic platform for miniaturized sample preparation

1 - Improvement of pipetting system



Results and discussion

1 - Improvement of pipetting of miniaturized volumes :

→ Development of a liquid handling robotic system suitable for pipetting 1 μL with a CV < 10%

Replace 1000 μL syringes by 500 μL syringes and optimization of various parameters:

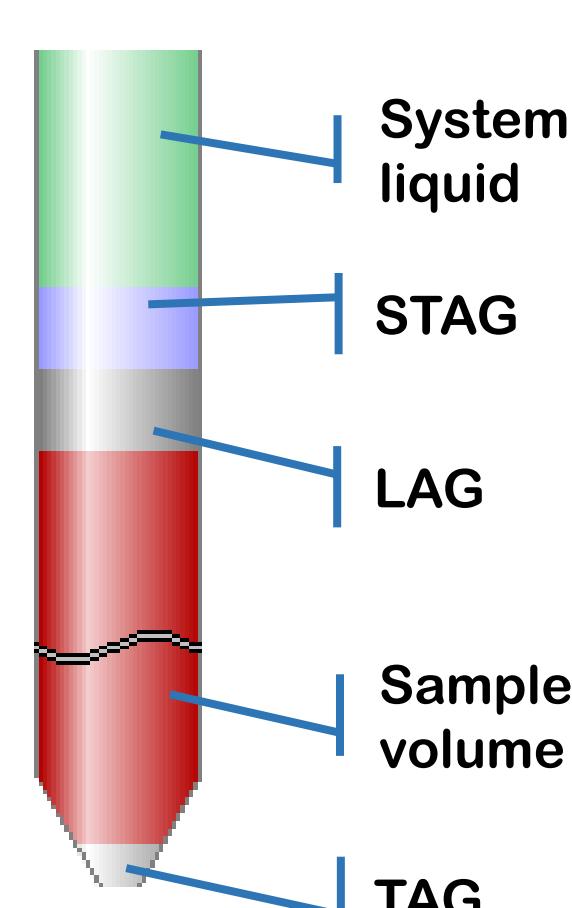
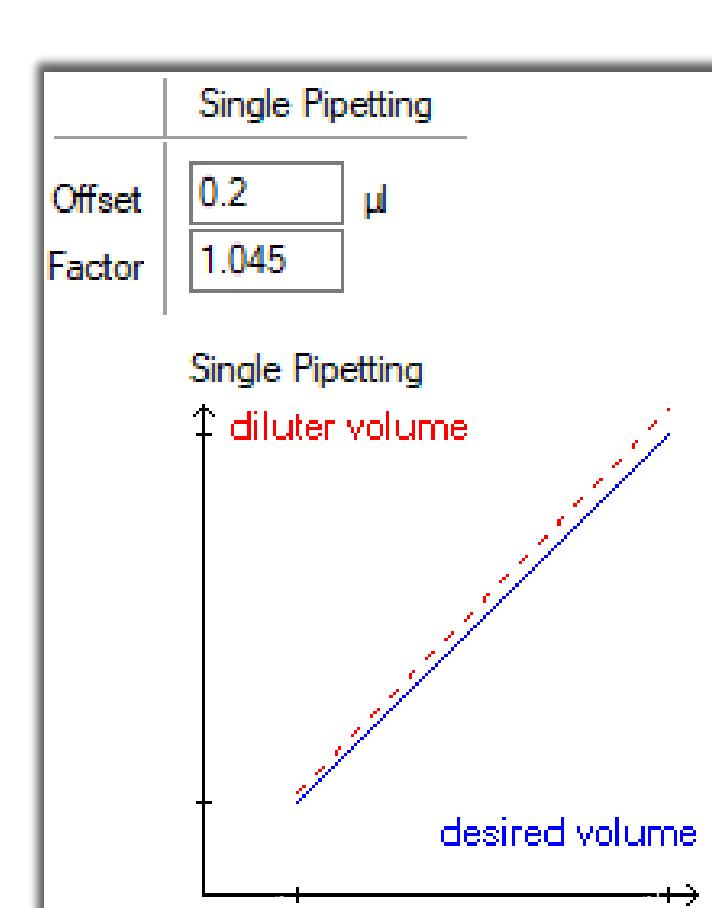
Calibration parameters :

- The factor
- The offset

$$y = ax + b$$

Factor

Offset



Airgap volume during pipetting :

- STAG : system trailing airgap : to prevent contamination by liquid system
- LAG : Leading Airgap : optimize accurate pipetting
- TAG : Trailing Airgap : to prevent liquid dripping

Pipetting speed :

- The aspiration speed : lower aspiration improve pipetting accuracy
- The distribution speed : high dispense speed is needed to achieve a proper free dispense
- The needle position : in contact or not with the tube

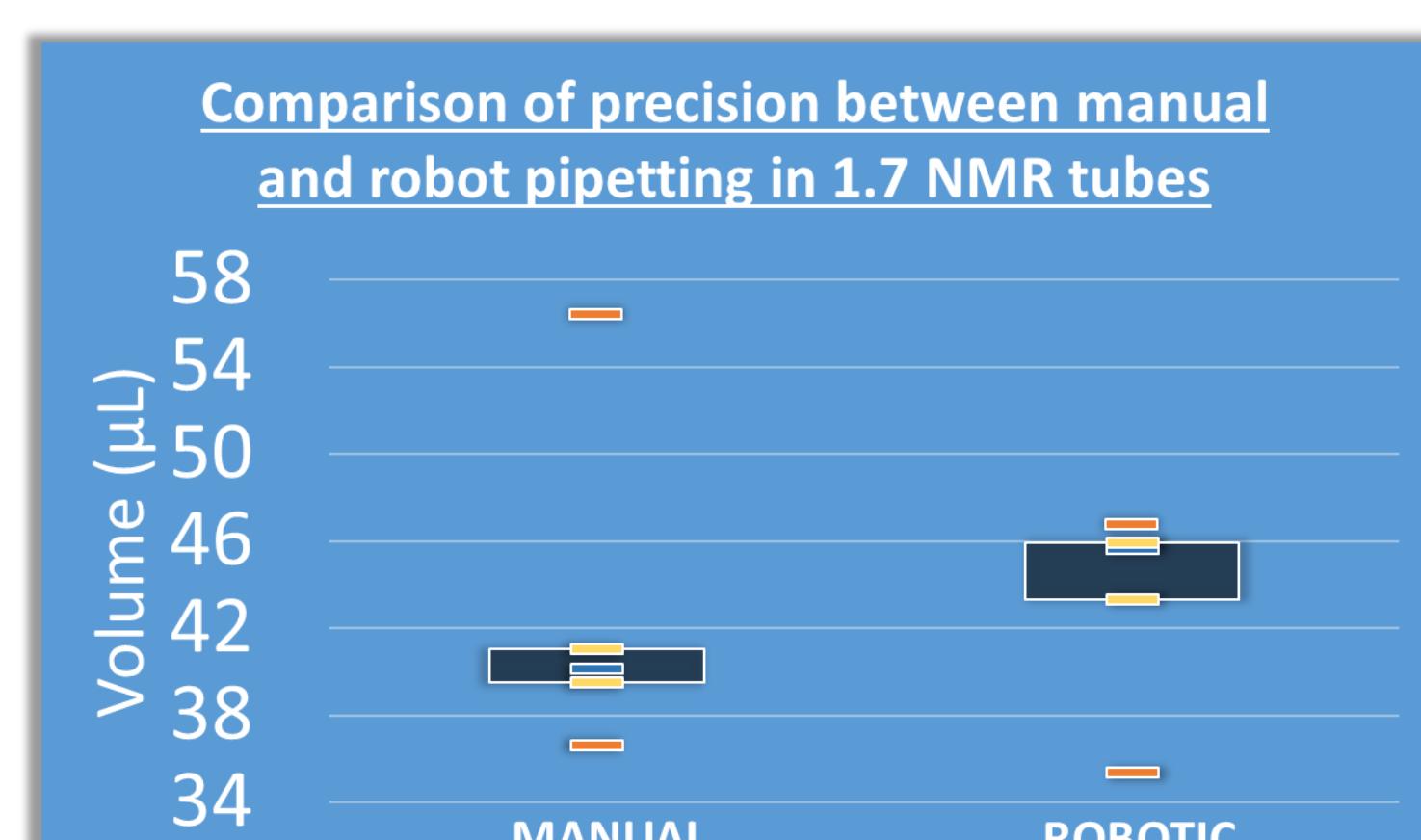

→ Better precision and accuracy with 500 μL syringes

2 - Adaptation for new miniaturized devices :

→ Development of robotic platform protocol to be able to pipet in 1.7 mm and 1 mm NMR tubes

Implementation and validation of a script with use of capillary needles for final dispense of 20 and 45 μL NMR tubes



NMR tubes filling : measure of final volume in the tube :

	Manual	Robot
MEAN	41 μL	44 μL
SD	4.3 μL	2.6 μL
MIN	36 μL	35 μL
MAX	56 μL	47 μL

→ Better precision and reproducibility with robot

→ Faster with robot



Conclusions

- Pipetting capabilities : range 3 – 480 μL with a CV max of 4 %.

- Our robotic platform is now capable to fill 5, 3, 1.7 mm and 1 mm NMR tubes

APPLICATIONS :

- High throughput screening
- Provide access to metabolism of cells subpopulation
- Replaces humans for repetitive tasks
